- 730 ZP 7 Asuncion, PARAGUAY, "Radio Guarani" operates with about 1000 watts depending on the level of the available voltage. Their schedule is 0400-2200. (LBC)
- CX 10 Montevideo, URUGUAY, "Radio Ariel" finally came through with a verie. The v/s is as listed by ELK in the 9 February DXWW. I would suggest that all reports be sent to him, not Sr. Goliardi. (LBC)
- 750 -JBC- Port Maria, JAMAICA was heard at their 0446 s/on on MM 2/1 with the NA. Heard the previous two MMs clear before WSB's s/on at 0500, but no ID was given. Should be a cinch on this clear channel. Report out despite the disappointing news that they don't verify ! (MRS)

- 775 TIW San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio City" verified with a friendly letter from Jose J. Vargas R. for my report of 1/31. Costa Rican # 3, and they also sent a card depicting their famous volcano ! (DJ)
- 780 CMHB Sancti Spiritus, CUBA was heard with an ID as "La Voz de Cuba" at 0245 on 2/15. R 5, S 6 solid. Where ? (SGS) (Here, Doc. - ed)
- LRA 8 Formosa, ARGENTINA, "Radio Nacional" operates from 0557-2200 until 1 April or so, when DST goes off; then from 0657-2100. Might have been on late or AN on MM 2/8 for their 7th. anniversary. (LBG)
- 785 Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA was the only audible outlet on 2/15. (RJS)
- 800 XELO Ciudad Juarez, MEXICO was heard at s/off on 2/15 at 0105. Rarely hear them here. (SGS)
- PJB Bonaire, NETHERLANDS ANTILLES was heard with a very solid S 9 signal on 2.15 at 2150, in English. (SGS) "Trans World Radio" is heard very well in Asuncion as early as 1745. (LBG)
- 810 WKVM San Juan, PUERTO RICO was heard on 2/15 at their 0528 s/on during a 5 second pause by WGY. (RJS)
- 820 HJED Cali, COLOMBIA was heard with an excellent signal on 2/13 from 0104, with no QRM at all ! Taped for about 15 minutes. (HMM)
- ???? An UnID LA station was here on 2/14 from 0610-0634, but never good enough for an ID. I don't think it was HJED; maybe the YV ? (RJS)
- 830 LT 8 Rosario, ARGENTINA, "Radio Rosario" (not the slogan listed in FBIS) operates from 0430-2300 with 10 kws.. They will have 25 kws. in July. The previous v/s, Sr. Pavia, has left the station which may account for the un-answered reports. This station runs // to LR 3 on 950 kcs. at times. (LBG) Sent a v/l for my 2/64 report, thanks to Larry Godwin ! Country # 36 verified. Address is Cordoba 1825 and the v/s is Diogenes Hernandez, Director. Their letterhead says they are affiliated with LR 3. (BN) Sent a v/l for my reception of last March. (DJ)
- 850 HJKC Bogota, COLOMBIA was logged on tape beginning on 2/12 at 2354 and continuing until 0010 on 2/13. Very good signal but often heavy QRM from WEAT. They had a boxing match. (HMM) Is the best LA station here in the early morning. Noted on 2/15 at 0505. (RJS)
- 854 OAX 4 A Lima, PERU, "Radio Nacional" was heard again on 2/15 from 0606-0608 fade-out. Also IDed from the tape of the NA; thanks Ed. (RJS)
- 870 LRA Buenos Aires, ARGENTINA, "Radio Nacional" is extremely strong in Asuncion which accounts for ZP 14's move (see 1020 kcs.). From 2100-2300 LRA features classical music. (LBG)
- 920 ZP 1 Asuncion, PARAGUAY, "Radio Nacional" operates from 0700-1300 and 1600-2200 with 10 kws. of power. (LBG)
- 930 HJCS Bogota, COLOMBIA. A good night for Colombians, but this one was washed under by WSOC and local WPAT, the latter having NSP. This was on 2/13 at 0033. (HMM)
- 970 ZP 9 Asuncion, PARAGUAY, "Radio Cumoneros" operates from 0400-2300 with a power of 2 kws.. (LBG)
- 995 HCEW 2 Guayaquil, ECUADOR, "Radio Suceso" was heard on 2/14 with an ID at 2332 - perfect ! New country - # 35 ! (RJS)
- 1000 Peking, CHINA was the outlet I thought I heard on 2/15 at 0408, Gray heard a tone ID which doesn't sound like Pyongyang's to me. (RJS)
- ???? A mystery here. on 2/15 at 0534 I heard "Fascination", an instrumental version, tuned away, and back at 0536 when GSQ (or "America") was in progress, and then what seemed like Spanish. 1 ZD s/off ? WBNB s/on ? CKBW s/on ? (RJS)
- 1015 YSC San Salvador, EL SALVADOR was undoubtedly the one heard here on 2/14 at 2315 and on 2/16 at 0036 with quiet music. (RJS)
- 1020 ZP 14 Asuncion, PARAGUAY, "Radio Nanduti" has moved here from 870 kcs.. (since September) They broadcast from 0430-2200 with 5 kws.. However, on 2/8 they played instrumental music 15 minutes before their s/on, then began

- 1020 ZP 14 Asuncion, PARAGUAY (cont.) a program called "Amanecer Paraguay". The modified theme of their s/on is "Buenos dias Asuncion, buenos dias Paraguay, buenos dias America". The v/s, Sr. Armando Rubin, seems interested in reception reports, but says that he doesn't have the time to answer all of them. They have an attractive pennant. Their address is Antequera 654. (LBG)
- TGUX Guatemala City, GUATEMALA was logged on 2/15 at 0040 and after. IDed as "Radio Panamericana" at 0045. Broadcasted US R & R with a recording of racing automobiles in between. Good solid S 6. Country # 14. (SGS)
- 1040 Peking, CHINA, "Radio Peking" seems to s/off at 0555 Sundays and the VOA s/on at 0600 makes it difficult to tell if they are on after. Heard through WHO on 2/15 after 0500. (RJS)
- 1060 CMBQ Havana, CUBA, "Radio Enciclopedia Popular" was heard again on 2/15 at 0205. R 4, S 3. (SGS)
- 1080 LT 5 Resistencia, ARGENTINA, "Radio Chaco" (Not the slogan listed in FBIS) broadcasts from 0400-2300 with 5 kws.. (LBG)
- 1088 Tirana, ALBANIA may sign on now at 2230. I logged them on 1/11 from 2250 on. (CMS)
- 1130 JOQR Tokyo, JAPAN was fading in and out with CKWX on 2/15 from 0351-0400. (RJS)
- 1142 -AFN- Stuttgart, WEST GERMANY sent the usual QSL card to become my 50th. European verified. They enclosed a sheet, dated 1 December 1964, which indicates that this station only runs 10 kws., but both EBU and Wireless World say 100 kws.. (ELK)
- 1145 YST San Salvador, EL SALVADOR verified with a nice letter from Betty Suarez, mentioning their power as 1000 watts. Also, that they are a fairly new station, and thus reports interest them. They couldn't understand how I got their address, hi Ed ! (DJ)
- 1160 LT 3 Rosario, ARGENTINA, "Radio Crealista" is affiliated with "Radio El Mundo" of Buenos Aires and at times broadcasts in //. It normally operates with 10 kws. from 0500-2300. V/s is Pemetrio Paez. (LBG)
- 1165 "Radio Americas", SWAN ISLAND is a regular here, come heaven or Castro's jammers. Always R 5 copy. Have heard them as high as 1175 kcs., and as low as 1155 kcs.. (SGS)
- 1170 ???? A jammer was heard to sign off here at 0220 on 2/15. This does not sound like a Cuban, rather more like a Russian. Not like 1165 kcs. and 1140 kcs. at all. (SGS)
- 1200 ZP 11 Asuncion, PARAGUAY, "Radio Charitas" seems to be the best bet for this rare country. Their schedule is 0500-1300 and 1500-2200 Monday through Friday and 0500-2200 on Saturday and Sunday. Power is 1/5 kws.. Might make it on a MM with WOAI off. (LBG)
- LU 3 Bahia Blanca, ARGENTINA, "Radio del Sur" sent a definite verie for my tentative report of 7/6 from Boulder for Argentine # 6. V/s is Sr. Herberto E. Long, Socio Director. The WRTVH address is correct. They have a beautiful pennant. (LBG)
- 1210 KZOO Honolulu, HAWAII sent a QSL at last from the Cherry Blossom station. It took a f/up. V/s is Bob Pearson who signed them off last November when I heard them. (DJ)
- ???? A jammer was heard on 2/15 at 0300; S 2. Don't recognize it, but I don't think it's a Cuban. (SGS)
- 1220 PRA 9 Rio de Janeiro, BRAZIL was logged again on MM 2/8 from 0315-0330 in Portuguese. They would have been an easy log but as usual there was a powerful OC on the frequency. My taped report had to be a tentative. (DJ)
- 1230 LT 2 Rosario, ARGENTINA, "Radio Splendid" (Not the slogan in FBIS) operates from 0445-2300 with 15 kws. of power. (LBG)
- 1240 CW 35 Paysando, URUGUAY, "Radio Paysandu" operates from 0500-2200 with a power of 2000 watts. (LBG)
- 1260 CMCI Havana, CUBA was logged on 2/15 at 0210. A "Reloj Nacional" stn.. (SGS)
- LT 9 Santa Fe, ARGENTINA, "Radio Santa Fe" is AN, 7 days with 10 kws.. (LBG)

- 1270 CMJC Camaguey, CUBA was logged here on 2/15 at 0310. A "Reloj Nacional" station, after 0315 they apparently broke the net. Cuba # 11. (SGS)
- 1295 PJD 2 Philipsburg, Sint Maarten, NETHERLANDS WEST INDIES, "The Voice of the Eastern Caribbean" was logged on 2/15 at 1930 with an English religious program. Rough copy, and the English really helped. (CMS)
- 1300 ZP 10 Asuncion, PARAGUAY, "Radio Paraguay" transmits from 0500-2200 with a power of 6000 watts. (LBG)
- 1310 LRA 5 Rosario, ARGENTINA, "Radio Nacional" transmits from 0600-2200 with a power of 7000 watts, and is // LRA at times. (LBG)
- 1320 CW 39 Paysandu, URUGUAY, "Voz de Paysandu" operates from 0455-2200 with a power of 1500 watts. (LBG)
- 1330 ZP 20 Asuncion, PARAGUAY, "Radio Mariscal Lopez" went off the air 3-4 years ago, (LBG)
- 1358 Tirana, ALBANIA sent a QSL card for my report of this frequency, but specified their SW wavelengths, so will have to try again. (CMS)
- 1430 ZP 3 Asuncion, PARAGUAY, "Radio Teleco" operates from 0500-1200 and 1400-2300 with 1500-2000 watts. (LBG)
- LT 10 Santa Fe, ARGENTINA, "Radio Universidad Nacional del Litoral" transmits from 0700-2230 with 1500 watts. (LBG)
- 1460 LT 23 San Jenaro Norte, ARGENTINA, "Radio San Jenaro, La Voz de la Fiesta Provincial del Trigo" is a new station with 250 watts. They operate from 1100-2300. (LBG)
- 1480 ???? "Radio Ye" was heard on 2/11. Does anyone know where this station is or its call ? Was broadcasting in Spanish with US popular music. (AH)
- 1520 "Radio Caroline North", INTERNATIONAL WATERS finally sent a form letter to verify my December reception report. They also enclosed a program schedule. European # 51 here. (ELK)
- 1550 XENU Nuevo Laredo, MEXICO was heard at their s/on at 0730 over the domestic stations. Loud. (RJS)
- 1562 "Radio Veronica", INTERNATIONAL WATERS sent a nice QSL card to complete their verification. The card indicates a power of only 5000 watts, and their schedule is 0100-1900. (ELK)
- 1570 ZP 13 San Lorenzo, PARAGUAY, "Radio Central" has left the air permanently. (LBG)
- NORTH VIETNAM The "Voice of Vietnam" broadcasts in ENGLISH from 2330-2345, 0500-0530, 0830-0900, and 1030-1100 on 1200 kcs.. They broadcast in French from 2315-2330, 0600-0630, and 0900-0930 on this same frequency. (WRTVH)
