Greetings team! A few of those bombs dropped this past week-I'm referring to a few of the impossible type stations. Let me explain this mess: about 15 miles from here are 2 (in particular--WABC-770 and WINS-1010) 50kw stations. Now, in the daytime both of these stations blackout about 30 kc/s on either sideband. Here it comes --- on two separate days (2/25, 2/26) I received 2 stations right on top or up from these stations, which were at least 650 miles away!! They were: WJAG-780 & WMOX-1010. Luck! WJAG-780 is in Norfolk, Nebraska and runs only 1kw! Now down to veries: WNBC-660, WJAG-780, WWL-870, WCFL-1000, WMOX-1010, KYW-1100, WBT-1110 and WRVA-1140 ...that's about all that's important. Oh! I also replaced my E-W antenna--now it's about 70' long. Doesn't work as well now, though. Enough for the ramblings of a diseased mind. 73.

"If anything can possibly go wrong in an electronic component, it invariably will." --MURPHY. For the past two and a half months, I have been fighting this little postulate in that homebrew 7360-Collins filter rx. Got a few stations the first time I fired it up, but discovered that I had a horrendous amount of work yet to do on it. I have it getting WBZ at noon now with a 50' longwire, but our Ford car radio will outdo it in signal/noise ratio. The IF stages sound like frying eggs, and the noise cancels out the quiet front end. I also have problems making the tuner track. A few weeks ago I put up a 120' illicit longwire, which performed beautifully. Local WPAG-1050 put a VOLT of RF on the mixer tube of my Motorola, which blanked the rx from 1010 to 1090. Two weeks later, somebody cut the antenna at the far end (anchored to a staircase window). Next time the far end will be epoxied to the outside wall where nobody will see it. One of my friends suggested putting a slight DC bias on the wire--about 10,000 volts, hi. I also wound up a 4'x4' spiral loop, which really cuts down on the quadie noise. Try one if you can't put up a longwire. Now down to that rarity, DX. I got 1YC-880 and BBC-881 on December 28. BBC had a fair sig, and 1YC was in lousy shape due to rx noise. BUT the filter completely eliminated the heterodyne. The temporary longwire pulled in CBK, KWMT on SSS, and KSD. On 3/3, went out to Frank Merrill's to listen to a few of his tapes, and KFIF came in again on SSS as I twiddled his HQ-129-X. This station should invade the Midwest again on the first few days of April, at 9:00 or 9:15 PM s/off time. Well, have to break off now and work on Murphy some more. 73./ Bob Astmann-WPE2LWS-191 Louvaine Dr.-Kenmore, New York-14223

Veries: KCMO, WVOK (stn #32 veried-Alabama), KNBR, WKAP, WMNI, KDHL, KNX & WINS w/map. Just got Feb. 23 and March 2 issues of DXM DXF looks good Don! One WPE this week from Sandra. Well, now that I've recovered from track practice, I think I'll try some more DX, before this Winter season is over. This winter was predicted in Poptronics to be a record breaking season. I feel that P.E. was right. I logged many new states and many stations more than 1,000 miles away, such as KNX, KNBR, KOA, KOB, KOMA, KRLD, XEWA, XERF, XEB, XEJP, CBK, CKRC, and KFH. Totals are now 20/133 w/states at 36/32, countries at 6/5 and provinces still 6/6. By the way, I don't think I've ever mentioned anything about my rx. I use two. A Philco 9-trans. AM-FM and a Lafayette HE-40 w/S.W. and BCB sections. For the HE-40, I have a home-brew ant. coupler hooked up to a longwire about 100 ft. long and 20 ft. high. Still no luck w/KRMG and KTRH u/CBL. I'll keep trying. 73's and Good DX to all.

Hi gang, I finally received my WPE call letters. They are WPE2NNA. Since there isn't too much to say about DX this week, I will get down to more serious business. I believe having the '66 Convention in Chicago would not be fair to East Coast members. Since the mid-west had a good chance to go to the '64 Convention which was fairly close to them and they also are much closer to San Diego, I therefore feel that the East Coast should be chosen for the Convention in '66. 73. (Murray--your reasoning is somewhat in error. This is one of my challenges to see how many I could hear on 1 frequency. 2--could some kind of list be made periodically of the times that daytime stations in the various time zones or areas sign off. You East Coasters have a big advantage over us Westerners on this. It is hard to keep up with this, since their s/off varies with sunset times. (Roy--a member has considered this--there are problems that might not be realized by the average member while on the other hand sign off for a certain region is the same every year. There are 16 areas across U.S. and they change each month. Would, I believe, require 12 maps for s/off times. More info later--DEE). 3--have any of you noticed that when tuning in to a frequency that the signal will vary so that you can hear one station clearly and DX it, and it will fade and another station either closer or farther away will come in. - 820 HJED Cali, COLOMBIA was noted with a good signal u/ WFAA interference (OC) at 0245 on 3/4 with their 4 note auto horn IS. Does anyone have this verified ? (BW) (A few of us do, Bill, thanks to Dave Gleason who visited the station a few years ago. The co-signer, with Dave, was Sr. Antonio J. Restrepo, CE. - ed)
- ???? SS was noted here mixed with EE on 3/14 at 0435-0450, then an intermittent weak tone at 0450. Wonder who ? SS-HJED, EE-2 GL ?? (RJS)
- 825 TIOS San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio Titania" was fair several nights the week of 3/8. Heard on 823 or so one night. (RJS) Was heard with light music programming 3/13 from 2150-2232. (WWW)
- 828 YNOL Managua, NICARAGUA, "Ondas del Luz" is here and strong most evenings from 2230 or so. (WWW)
- ???? Who has the EE religious programs at 2245 to s/off at 2257 on this frequency or 827 ? Heard on 3/6. (BW) (Sounds undoubtedly like YNOL in Managua, Bill. - ed)
- ???? Who was the SS station with SS and EE popular songs (not RR) at 2330 on 3/6 on 828 or 827 ? Maybe had a SS Pepsi-Cola ad at 0053 on 3/7. Was YNOL on then or not ? (BW) (Sounds to me like TIOS, Bill. Don't believe YNOL has commercials or pop music. - ed)
- 830 JOBB Osaka, JAPAN and 3 GI Sale, AUSTRALIA were in simultaneously u/ WCCO OC on 3/15 at 0531. (RJS)
- 840 (...?), CHINA was heard on 3/14 but not // to 1040. Ruined by WHAS s/on at 0557. (KGS)
- 4 RK Rockhampton, AUSTRALIA was weak but audible on 3/8 at 0530. (WWW) Heard "This is the ABC, the time is 8 o'clock" and 8 pips 3/14 at 0500. (RJS)
- 850 HJKC Bogota, COLOMBIA, "Emisora Nuevo Mundo" is a regular here AMs at around 0500. (WWW)
- 854 OAX 4 A Lima, PERU, "Radio Nacional" was noted at s/on 3/15 at 0601 o/ PJC 2. Clearest yet. (RJS)
- 855 PJC 2 Willemstad, NETHERLANDS ANTILLES was probably the station I heard on 3/15 at 0530, their s/on (?) which I missed. All music until 0547 when they IDed which I couldn't quite grab, but I thought he said Sint Maarten. (RJS)
- 865 HRU Tegucigalpa, HONDURAS, "Radio Centro" is now here. First heard on 3/7 with lots of talk to 2155 s/off - later on week days - Fair signal. (WWW) This hard to hear country is now easy. Mighty good signal 3/15 from 0610-0651. (RJS) Was apparently the SS station noted with a fair signal 3/18 from 2140-45. Play of sorts. (ELK)
- 880 1 YC Auckland, NEW ZEALAND was heard with music 3/15 from 0433-0502 tune-out. They gave no IDs during this time. YVKU was over them at 0525. (RJS) Was noted weakly at 0430 on 3/8. (WWW)
- 885 Plymouth, MONTSERRAT, "Radio Montserrat" was heard on 3/15 with a fantastic signal at 0517. (RJS)
- 922 HJAF Cartagena, COLOMBIA, "Emisora Fuentes" is the one reported here. Noted on 3/11 at 0510. Verifies. (WWW)
- 935 Lvov, UKRAINIAN SSR verified via a "Radio Moscow" card. Definite except it doesn't specify a location. (CMS)
- 940 KAHU Waipahu, HAWAII was presumably the JJ station here 3/15 at 0345. (RJS)
- 970 KHBC Hilo, HAWAII sent a typed card from the CE, Hawaiian Bcstg. System. Three day return. Heard again 3/14 at 0430. (KGS)
- 980 XENR Nueva Rosita, MEXICO was at s/on 0700 on 3/15. They're also heard evenings ruining KFWB. (RJS)
- 998 Kishinev, MOLDAVIAN SSR also verified by a "Radio Moscow" card. Country # 101 ! (CMS)
- 1000 XE?? A Mexican station was noted here with s/off in March at 2018. They gave one call ID then and maybe a "Radio Centro" on "Ceres" ID. Many ads for "Una Esse Emme". NARBA show anything ? Has to be a Western Mexican since they're in an hour before local SD sunset. (RJS) (I have XEFV, Ciudad Juarez listed as "Radio Centro de Cd. Juarez". - ed)
- 1 ZD Tauranga, NEW ZEALAND had a great signal on 3/15 at 0447 with auto

- 1000 1 ZD (cont.) races. Faded at 0532 during "Fascination" and next below. (RJS)
 WBNB Charlotte Amalie, VIRGIN ISLANDS was heard briefly 3/15 at 0532 with s/on announcements. In and out until next below. (RJS)
 TICEC San Ramon, COSTA RICA was noted at s/on (?) 3/15 at 0557. "Radio Cima" ID heard. Held forth until below, WCFL notwithstanding. (RJS)
 XEOY Mexico City, MEXICO, "Radio Mil" was heard 3/15 at 0700 s/on. A call ID was noted. (RJS)
- 1005 ???? An UnID LA was heard very briefly with low voiced man talking at 0555 on 3/15. I should think it was HRVP, "Radio Norte" at this time. (RJS)
- 1015 YSC San Salvador, EL SALVADOR, "Radio 1015" heard at s/on 0600 on 3/15. Beautiful S 5 signal. (RJS)
- 1016 -SWF- Mainz, WEST GERMANY, "Rheinsender" verified my December report with a beautiful QSL card and a colorful program sked (dated 30 Sept 63!). Also sent along a massive and complete list (in GG) of all German AM, FM, SW and TV stations. (ELK)
- 1020 TGUX Guatemala City, GUATEMALA is a regular here evenings. Report off. (WWW)
 1025 TIAC San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio Fides" was very good 3/15 at 2230. (RJS)
 1040 KHVH Honolulu, HAWAII sent a verie card from the SM for my 2/28 reception. (KGS) Is good and usually in the clear from 0300-0500, then Peking. (WWW)
 Peking, CHINA comes in loud and strong. Programming ends temporarily at 0555 but does not s/off! Carrier remains on the air with programming resuming on the hour at 0600. Of course, the VOA blocks this one in East for DXers. (WWW)
- 1045 HOJ 2 Las Tablas, PANAMA, "Ondas del Canajagua" is decent nearly every evening. If you need Panama try it. S 5 on 3/14 at 0420. (RJS)
- 1070 1 ZB Auckland, NEW ZEALAND was up fairly good 3/15 at 0447 in // with 1 ZD on 1000. All Z's in parallel. (RJS)
- 1090 JOHB Sendai, JAPAN had an EE language lesson of the NHK Second Net with a fair signal 3/13 at 0530. (KGS)
- 1100 3 ZB Christchurch, NEW ZEALAND was in // with 1000 and 1070 at 0448. Faded quickly. (RJS)
 HJAT Barranquilla, COLOMBIA is the "Radio Reloj" noted here MM 0400-0500. Believe HJCN is on 1103. Fair signals usually. (WWW)
- 1106 Vilnius, LITHUANIAN SSR verified via yet another "Radio Moscow" card. They were carrying a "Radio Moscow" Home Service News at the time of my reception. (CMS)
- 1129 "Radio London", INTERNATIONAL WATERS is still using 17 kws. from 0100-1600 with US style programming. The jingles were produced in Texas where the program people originate from also. (LAR)
- 1187 Szolnok, HUNGARY, "Petofi I" sent a v/l and v/c for country # 61. Report of last December. V/s is Anna Darvas, North American Service, "Radio Budapest". Enclosed many Hungarian stamps. (ELK)
- 1210 KZOO Honolulu, HAWAII was probably the JJ station I had on 3/11 at 0251. Faded under the LA and WCAU. Rats! (RJS)
 HJFF Pereira, COLOMBIA has good to excellent signals most AMs to 0600. (WWW)
- 1220 HJAV Monteria, COLOMBIA, "Radio Cordobesa" was strong also, but HJFF was superior. Took time for a good log and verie try 3/10 0505-0540. (WWW)
- 1235 ZBM 1 Hamilton, BERMUDA was heard 3/8 from 0443-0455 but too weak for good copy with the QRM from 1230 and 1240. (WWW)
- 1290 JOHR Sapporo, JAPAN is listed as the only JJ station in the new WRTVH. This explains why they were not // to the NHK 2 Program (DXWW, 2 March). Scratch JOIB, Matsue. Letter off to JOHR. (KGS)
- 1370 JORB Kochi, JAPAN and JOKD Kitami, JAPAN - the rain couldn't stop these "old faithfuls" either. Noted 3/15 at 0445. (WWW)
- 1475 YNAG Chinandega, NICARAGUA was heard weak to fair 2110-2135 fade out on 3/10. Rough copy. (WWW)
- 1580 HJAY Galapa, COLOMBIA, "La Voz de la Cordialidad" is another regular here every morning. Fair signals. (WWW)
- 1590 XEHC Ensenada, MEXICO, "Radio Bahia" is indeed the one here. Sometimes noted with a fair signal at around 0100. (RJS)

INTERNATIONAL WATERS "Radio Invicta" is no longer heard on its old 985 spot. It is now under new ownership and renamed "Radio King". A "King Radio" has been heard testing on 1260A around 2200. This may have been the ex-"Radio Invicta". (LAR)

ALBANIA The revised schedule on 1088 is: ENGLISH 0130-0200; GERMAN 1530-1630 and 1630-160; FRENCH 1230-1300. (SCDX)

HUNGARY The MW stations here, per my recent v/1, are as per WRTVH-65, except: Budapest-872 power is 25 kws.; Gyor and Szolnok are on 1340 not 1349 (Gyor is 222.4 meters, Szolnok is 223.8 meters); Foreign Service only listed for 1250. (ELK)
