 Hi gang! Greetings from San Salvador. I have visited the following stations for veries, but will wait until we get back to the States to mail them (letters lose themselves easily down here): TIRSHB, TISS, TILX, TICA, TIRS, TIRICA, TIRU, YNQ, YNM, YNOL, YSC, YSAX. Any members who sent me reports to f/up at that stations will receive their veries in about 2 weeks. I'm afraid we will be spending only a night in Guatemala City (a Sunday at that), and I won't have time to f/up there. I especially wanted to visit TGJ. Also sorry I wasn't able to f/up YNC in Leon, but there is no affiliate in Managua and Leon was off our route. Here are a couple of notes I thought were interesting: According to the Director of YSS, the maximum power for BCB allowed in Central America (excludes Mexico) is 10 kw., and stations like TIRICA which claim more power are lying! YSC used to be called "Radio 1025", but now it has changed to "Radio Internacional" on 1015 kc/s. Kermit, TISS told me they just answered your recent report so I didn't follow up. Bill N., TIAC promised to send you a letter immediately. Dal, your 875 kc/s tape apparently isn't TISS, but when I played it at YNW, the manager couldn't identify anything definite either. YNOL is opening an affiliate on BCB in Honduras, but more information was not available. John Callarman, YNQ just received your report and say it is the most complete they have received in 21 years on the air! A verie has already been sent. IRCA SPECIAL FEATURE

Many members ask questions about what date to mail their report and other general question about the mail service. Mail service is, in general, divided into 4 classes. 1st class includes regular letters, air mail, special delivery, etc. 2nd class is used by magazines. 3rd and 4th classes are in many ways the same. 3rd class is for items UNDER ONE POUND. 4th is items over 1 pound. Now a list of various services: Special Delivery is 30¢ plus regular postage; members are advised NOT to use it; I've yet to receive, out of 15 Spec. Del. ltrs a single one a full day earlier. They must be signed for; if no one is home; they are delayed till next day. So again suggest you not send stuff Spec. Delivery--it just doesn't get there quicker--one exception is inter-city delivery and that doesn't concern most of us. Remember that spec. del. stuff is given so special treatment until it arrives at the PO of addressee. Now, air mail. Requires generally 2 days to get a letter from anyplace in the US to any other place. Often 1 day to go 1/2 way 'cross the country. Cost is 8¢ including Alaska, Hawaii, Mexico and Canada. First Class is 5¢. It requires up to 4 days to go across the country. Allow 3 days to your editor; those on East to Park; on West to myself. Most of So. Calif. has 1 day service. (Note that rates are for 1st oz. or fraction thereof; for add. oz or fraction thereof, add 8¢ or 5¢ as the case may be). Third class mail must be under 1 pound but not over and MAY NOT have any personal messages, handwriting, typing, or such. 3" tapes can be sent this way; legally no message may be sent along on paper or on the box. Rate is a flat 4¢ for first 2 ounces and 2¢ per additional ounce. Service is very slow; sometimes weeks to get across the country; DXF rpts obviously can not be sent this way--no personal messages. 4th class is for items 1 pound or over. Rates vary on distance; consult your postmaster if interested. 4th class is generally more dependable and often faster. One further thing of interest to IRCA tapesponders, there is a "Special 4th Class Rate" for "educational matter"---tapes fall into this category and can be sent for 10¢ up to 2 POUNDS and 5¢ per additional pound--a real saving to those using 7" reels. You MUST mark "Special 4th class rate--educational material--tape recording matter" and hope your Post Office understands--some postmasters don't even know about it and many clerks are in the dark. It is hoped that this compendium of the services of our Post Office will aid you. It was compiled and editor by your WC DXF editor---(DEE).

- 600 YNSR Managua, NICARAGUA, "Radio Satellite" will be a new station early in 1966, on approximately this frequency. The present 3 kw. transmitter of YNQ, an affiliate, will be utilized. (LBG)
- 615 YNM Managua, NICARAGUA, "Radiodifusora Nacional" operates with 12½ kws. from 0700-2400, but in July they plan to run from 0600-0100. The station has an attractive pennant. V/s is Sr. Benjamin J. Guerra L. (LBG)
- 625 TIRICA San Jose, COSTA RICA, "La Voz de la Victor" was heard on 3/29 after their 0600 s/on. A mystery hat was noted at 0542; maybe this station had an OC on, or maybe it was a Pyongyang outlet which WRTVH lists. (RJS) Sked is 0600-2400 (0700-2300 Sundays). Present power is 50 kws., with no plans to increase in the near future. It has an attractive QSL card and pennant. Address is Apartado Postal 1079. (LBG)
- 645 ???? This is still an UnID as far as I'm concerned. Noted on 3/29 at 0524, and 0642 not // to 655, but possibly // to 840 Peking. Both had what seemed to be the same woman announcer. (RJS)
- 650 TIBAS San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio Monumental" broadcasts from 0600-2400. Has repeaters on 1050 and 1150. (LBG)
- 670 CMAF Pinar del Rio, CUBA, "Radio Progreso" is here from 680 according to my loop. (RFS)
- 700 TIHB San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio Reloj" broadcasts AN-7 days with 3 kws. until 0100, and then 1 kw. until sunrise. Power will be increased to 10 kws. in 2 months. It is affiliated with "Radio Popular" (See 1125); the two form "Sistema Radiofonico HB". Reports for both stations should be sent to Apartado Postal 341. - 740 CM.. (...?), CUBA (CMQ relay) - loop points to new outlet in Sancti Spiritus - Ciego de Avila area. Daytime signal improved over CMJK alone. Doesn't carry "Voz de Cuba". (RFS)
- 750 ???? An UnID LA station was heard on 3/29 at 0631. It seemed to be giving a list of stations. I thought it was YN.., but the "list" doesn't figure. (RJS) (How about YSKLA, Randy ? - ed)
- 760 .... Peking, CHINA - this outlet was heard for the first time 3/29 at around 0654. (RJS)
- XEABC Los Reyes, MEXICO was loud and clear at s/on, 3/29, at 0709. (RJS)
- 770 ???? Another UnID LA station was noted on 3/29 at 0635. YSKLB ? (RJS)
- 775 YNW 2 Matagalpa, NICARAGUA, "Radio Mundial" is the location of this one. (See also 930). Power is 1 kw.. (LBG)
- 780 4 YA Dunedin, NEW ZEALAND is always the best DU. Was noted at S 5 on 3/29 at 0516. (RJS)
- 800 YSAX San Salvador, EL SALVADOR, "Voz de Panamericana" was probably the SS station here at 0600, but no positive ID. (RJS)
- .... CUBA - This frequency is now clear of Cuban stations. The new frequencies for CMJS and CMKL are unknown. (RFS)

- 865 HRU Tegucigalpa, HONDURAS was noted here at 2005 with music on 3/18. (JC)  
YNSC Managua, NICARAGUA, "Radio Aeropuerto" is a new station here with 1 kw., according to a recent government publication. (LBG)
- 875 TISS San Jose, COSTA RICA, "La Voz del Tropico" broadcasts from 0530-2330 with 3 kws.. The v/s is Sr. Juan Bautista Araujo Fernandez, and he is interested in reports, which should be sent to their new address, Apartado 910. (LBG)
- YNW 1 Leon, NICARAGUA, "Radio Mundial" is the location of this one. (See also 930). Power is 1 kw.. (LBG)
- 877 ..... Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA - this outlet was S 5 at 0700 on 3/29. Pips and tone then. As loud as TGJ next door. (RJS)
- 880 CM.. (..?..), CUBA, "Radio Musical Nacional" is in faintly days, with a throbbing signal. Probably CMAG alone on the frequency. (RFS)
- 885 YNHM Managua, NICARAGUA, "Radio Pacifico" is a new station here with 1 kw., according to the new government list. (LBG)
- 900 TI?? San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio Atenea" (ex-TICS, "La Voz de America") is not // to 550 or 975. Power is 5 kws., and their sked is 0400-2400. Call letters have not yet been assigned. (See 975 kcs.) (LBG)
- 910 YVRQ Maiquetia, VENEZUELA, "Radio Aeropuerto" was noted at 0520 with music. What's their power? (JC) (Listed as 10 kws., Jody. - ed)
- 920 CMJB Camaguey, CUBA, "Radio Musical Nacional" - loop indicates this station is here from 880. (RFS)
- 930 YNW Managua, NICARAGUA, "Radio Mundial" operates from 0600-2400 with a power of 10 kws.. (LBG)
- 970 CM.. An unidentified Cuban is reported here; no more info available. (RFS)

- 1043 DDR 1 Dresden, EAST GERMANY verified with a pretty yellow QSL card to become country # 62. Reception was on November 1, so it took a little time (no f/up) to get here, but much appreciated anyway ! (ELK)
- 1050 YSU San Salvador, EL SALVADOR was noted fighting it out with XEG at 2030 on 3/21. (JC)
- 1060 YNSV Managua, NICARAGUA, "Radio El Mundo" will begin operation March 29 as an affiliate of YNAV-850. Power is 5 kws., and their sked will be 0300 (when YNAV signs off) to 2400. (LBG)
- 1070 LR 1 Buenos Aires, ARGENTINA has to be the "Radio El Mundo" with Argentine ballads noted around 0205 on 3/29. (RFS) (Any possibility it was the above, Ron ? - ed)
- 1 ZB Auckland, NEW ZEALAND had a fair signal on 3/29 at 0430 but it dipped under the Colombian soon after. (RJS)

- 1285 YNRPS Granada, NICARAGUA, "Radio Granada" is here, ex-1575, with 2 kws., according to the latest government list. (LBG)
