Due to a bit of luck, I now have my rf amplifier operating. I asked the local TV repairman what he thought of the circuit; he said that I would not need 2 stages of rf amplification and that I could use a 6SK7 tube instead of a 6SJ7. I threw a 12SK7 tube in, connected a wire from the B plus of my Heathkit GR-91 receiver, connected a wire from each terminal of the train transformer to the filament, and connected my antenna through the rf amplifier. The results were astonishing. Last night I was listening to WNBC in New York with the amplifier turned on. Signal strength was 40 db over S-9 plus plus plus. Although much of the signal strength was probably due to noise, I would say that in half-hour I listened, the signal strength never dropped below 10 db over S-9. Most of the time it was at least 40 db over S-9. At the best WNBC sounded like a local stn with a bit of a squeal. I have been trying various adjustments on my antenna tuner so I could receive CKY at 40 db over S-9. I finally succeeded this week when I tuned every coil in my rx. One of the if coils was just a bit off. Performance was greatly improved on all frequencies up to 1000 kc/s. With the rf amplifier (I don't need my antenna tuner when I use the amplifier) any stn that can be heard without very much trouble can be brought up to 40 db over S-9. Now I'll get down to the bad points about the tuner. By careful tuning and gain adjustment I can tune the amplifier up to 730 kc/s. After that, the oscillations are too bad. Even on the lower frequencies I have to adjust the rf amplifier very carefully or it will oscillate. I've tried everything but I still get oscillations. However, I'm not going to try anything else until I get the 6SJ7 tubes I ordered. They might make a difference. For all who have been patient enough to read this far, here is a reward: To fasten QSL cards to the wall, plastic holders can be purchased from Tepabco, Dept. T-12, Box 198, Gallatin, Tenn. 37066. 3 packets for \$1; 10 for \$3. They also sell a "Worked All States" set for \$1. The regular packet holds 20 cards in two vertical columns. For larger cards, fiberboard is suggested. For letters, save the envelope and cut the return address off and past them onto a large sheet of cardboard. That way you will know that you have verifications from those stations. If the letters are then stored in a safe place they will be in much better shape in a few years from now. 73 for now from the "Gateway to Saskatchewan's Oilfields".

- 655 YSS San Salvador, EL SALVADOR, "Radio Nacional" operates with 10kws. from 1200-2400. The v/s is Sr. Alfredo Pareda H., Director. He is very interested in reports, and personally conducts a DX program every Monday from 2000-2015 featuring the latest reports received. The address is Altos Teatro Nacional. (LBG)

- 770 3 LO Melbourne, AUSTRALIA was fading in and out over WABC at 0448 on 4/5. (RJ)
- 800 YSAX San Salvador, EL SALVADOR, "La Voz Panamericana" - reports should be sent to P. Pbro. Mateo Quijada, Director-Gerente. (LBG)
- 820 4 ZA Invercargill, NEW ZEALAND was heard weakly on 4/3 from 0353, then on 4/4 from 0315 with a good signal. (KGS)
- YSDR Santa Ana, EL SALVADOR, "La Voz de Latinoamerica" is a repeater of YSEB on 580 kcs., and operates from 0700-0100 with 1 kw.. (LBG)

- 980 XEKE Navojoa, MEXICO, "La Grande Emisora KE" was logged on 4/3 at 0117 and on, over, under and around KMBC. They play all sorts of music, from honkey tonk style to Strauss waltzes. Nice signal. (JLK)
- 1000 CP 19 La Paz, BOLIVIA, "Radio Aspiázu" - I tried on 4/5, but an unknown OC covered the frequency. There was also a very high QRN level. Listened from 0300-0340, but I only heard traces of another SS signal under the OC. (JLK) Thought I heard a man in EE mention "Bolivia" at 0259 on 4/5, but maybe I was deluding myself. After that it was all KOMO and static. Too bad ! (ELK)
- 1015 1 ZD Tauranga, NEW ZEALAND was quite consistent on 4/4 at 0325. (KGS)
- 1015 YSC San Salvador, EL SALVADOR, "Radio Internacional" (ex-"Radio Mil Veinticinco" is now using this slogan after changing its frequency from 1025 kcs.. Their sked is 0600-2400 with 10 kws.. The Gerente-Proprietario, Sr. Felipe Ochoa Valenzuela, says that the station will have eleven repeaters in various parts of the country in operation within a year. Their address is Apartado 150. (LBG)
- 1040 4 ZB Dunedin, NEW ZEALAND could be heard under KHVH on 4/4 while WHO was off, and before Peking came on. I will try for them again for a report. (KGS)
- 1070 JOPC Kushiro, JAPAN was in very weak, but clear, at 0444 on 3/29. What is their power ? I thought I had WFLI at first, but it was the wrong language ! (JTA) (10 kws., John - ed)
- 1080 YSDM San Miguel, EL SALVADOR, "La Voz de Latinoamerica" is a repeater of YSEB on 580 kcs.. Their sked is 0700-0100 with 1 kw.. (LBG)
- 1100 3 ZB Christchurch, NEW ZEALAND was in for the third consecutive MM on 4/5. I finally got enough detail for a reppt from 0400-0430. No HJAT interference this time. (KGS) Is very regular Sundays and Mondays. Beautiful signal on 4/5 at 0415. (RJS)
- HJAT Barranquilla, COLOMBIA, "Radio Reloj" was heard on their AN sked with music etc. at 0448 on 3/29. What power do they run ? I haven't any reference here. (JTA) (Only 1 kw., John - ed)

- 1160 ..... "Radio Americas", SWAN ISLAND was heard at 0457 on 3/29 with their IS prior to their 0500 s/on. It was definitely announced as 1160 kcs. in // with 6000 kcs., not 1165 kcs.. There was heavy jamming on the sidebands, but nothing on top ! (JTA)
- 1175 YSCB Sonsonate, EL SALVADOR, "La Voz del Pacifico" operates with 1 kw., and is the head station of the "Cadena de Emisoras Departamentales" which also includes YSCG on 1210 kcs., and YSCD on 880 kcs.. Their address is 3 A, C. O. Co. 19, and they also have an office in San Salyador located at Edificio Ruben Dario No. 309. (LBG)
- 1180 PRE 3 Rio de Janeiro, BRAZIL, "Radio Globo" was heard on 3/28 in the clear at 0350, but they were broken up by an OC at 0355. (JLK)
- 1195 TICA Puntarenas, COSTA RICA, "Radio Columbia-Canal 2" sent a v/1 for this outlet along with one for the 725 kcs. station. Thanks to Larry Godwin for this one also ! The letterhead lists this one as 1175 kcs., but the verie specifically notes 1195 kcs., which is where they were when I logged them. (ELK)
- 1200 ???? A very weak signal was noted here on 4/5 at 0420. A woman was heard in an UnIDed language which sounded oriental. (RJS)
- 1210 YSCG Zacatecoluca, EL SALVADOR, "Radio La Paz" broadcasts with a power of 1000 watts, and is affiliated with station YSCB on 1175 kcs. (which see). (LBG)

- 1220 JQJC Morioka, JAPAN was the first TP of the morning on 3/29. I thought the openings would be over by now ! It was heard at 0329, but they along with JOHC were "smeared" by KKAR and their puny 250 watts ! (JTA)

Logged for Country # 24, but there was not enough for a report. Still only 1 kw. ? (JTA) (Apparently, John, although they have plans for higher power. - ed) This one is still unidentified. I pulled some music up on 4/5 at 0438, but little else. (RJS)
- 1410 ???? By far the most interesting UnID of the morning. At 0500 on 4/5, when I tuned here, I heard 3 pips similar to the ABC's and little else. 2 KO is a commercial station here. I wonder if they pip off the hour ? (RJS)
- 1420 XEXK Tijuana, MEXICO was heard at 0805 on 4/6. Very strong. (LPA)
- 1445 YSHF Cojutepeque, EL SALVADOR, "Radio Caribe" was noted on 4/1 at their 2301 sign-off. Good level. Listed on 1430 kcs.. (JLK)
- 1460 XEYC Ciudad Juarez, MEXICO was heard weakly in the background under XELX at 2140 on 4/6 with an ID. (LPA)
- XELX Zitacuaro, MEXICO was heard dominating KDON and KENO at 2135 after KTYM's s/off. This on 4/6. (LPA)
