Greetings from the city of dust. There hasn't been much DX lately on the BCB. The main reason is because I have been down on the Ham bands. The only BCB DX was 5/7 at 2100 EST KGLC-910 Miami, Okla., 5/8 at 2115 EST KWKH-1130 Shreveport, La., and 5/10 at 0815 EST KDAV-580 Lubbock, Texas. KBIM-910 here in Roswell is planning to go on night time commercial broadcasting sometime in the near future. They started giving nite time tests May 5, 1965 sometime after 2200 EST. Someone told me that they hrd them testing at 0100 EST. Hope some of you pick them up. Good DXing. (additional from Jesse--DEE). Time and frequency of night-time testing is rather erratic. Night-time transmissions will use about 500 watts. They hope to begin commercial night-time broadcasting before the 15th of Spet. 1965. They will not verify any reports received more than 7 days after they are claimed; this came about because of their discovering of a trooper who came through town in a car, logged KBIM, and claimed 2000 mile daytime reception. The letter from KBIM was signed by James L. Torne, Engineering Dept. 73. (Thanks for the report and the info on KBIM--DEE)

Hi gang, only DX since last rpt is WISN-1130 @ 1955 5/28 and WERK-990 @ 1335 5/31. Veries in since then are, WNOE-v/q, WPRT, WIMA and WCSI-v/1's, the later two after f/u's. This brings my total to 358/185. Crosley Broadcasting Corp. (WLW) announced last week, that they are contemplating the purchase of WQAI and WQAI-TV for \$12 million, in addition to WWDC, that I mentioned in my last rpt. How about that? While on the subject of WLW, I want to add some more of their history to Mike Shannon's 4/27 rpt. First of all, I want to express my sincerest thanks to WLW's CE for furnishing me this info. WLW first went on the air in 1921 with the calls 8XAA, with 5 watts of power, shortly thereafter, boosted power to 50 watts. In 1922 changed calls to 8CR, and moved studios and XR to the Crosley Corp. factory bldg. and boosted power to 100 watts. After 3 months boosted power to 500 watts and changed calls to the present WLW. In 1925 they moved the XR to Harrison, Ohio, and boosted power again, to 5000 watts. Then in 1928 they moved their XR to the present site near Mason, Ohio, 21 miles N.E. of downtown Cincinnati and beamed out 50,000 watts over their new 708 ft. hightower. On New Years day, 1934, they went on the air with the fantastic power of 500,000 watts. At that time, probably the world's most powerful radio stn. WLW operated at 500,000 watts full time until 1939. From 1939 to 1941, they operated at 50,000 watts until midnight, and went to 500,000 after midnight with the call letter W8XO. In 1941 the midnight power boost was dropped, and they were 50,000 watts full time, ever since. Rumors that were prevalent at the time of WLW's high power were that the farmers in the vicinity of the XR complained that their cows weren't giving milk, that music emanated from their wire fences, and that when near the XR, your ears would ring. I suppose all the inhabitants of Mason, had a perpetual ringing in their ears. It is also rumored that WLW could be heard on the entire BCB from 540 to 1600 here in Cincinnati. and could even be hrd under the other local stns. That would really make miserable DX conditions, wouldn't it? Thank goodness, they are only 50 kw now. WLW wasn't the only stn to operate in excess of 50 kw. WGY was 100 kw, and KDKA was 200 kw. at one time, according to WLW's CE. Since there weren't enough active members in the Cincinnati area to make a successful convention, I boost New York in '66. How about it? 73 and gut DX.

SUMMARY OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS ACTION

Proposals submitted to board April 19, 1965: Prop. 1, BOD 5-0 in favor of Gray Scrimgeour's new section. Prop. 2...5-0 in establishing a countries list committee. Prop. 3...BOD authorizes Mike Shannon to prepare an IRCA Gov't. list 5-0. Prop. 4...BOD voted 3-2 to request Mike Shannon to stop selling report forms using IRCA emblem. Prop. 5...BoD voted 5-0 not to ban all censorship of DX Forum. Prop. 7...to establish a reporting contest to DX FORUM...rejected. Prop. 8...authorizes the Board Chairman to establish a list of "dedicated areas" for future DXM's. Hereis the list of dedicated areas:

Vol 3, #1, Wisconsin. Vol. 3 #2, Brit. Columbia. Vol 3 #3 New York. Vol. 3 #4 Colorado. Vol. 3 #5 Illinois. Vol. 3 #6 Washington. Vol. 3 #7 Connecticut. #8 New Mexico, #9 The Southern States. #10 Oregon. Volume #3 begins with the first issue in September.

Action on May 4 proposals: Prop. 1 Board voted 3-1 with one abstaining not to include International Waters as a country classification. Prop 2 BoD voted 5-0 against including a list of birthdays monthly in DX Monitor. Prop. 3 vote 3-2 against setting up an awards program for certain verie standards reached, at this time. Prop. 4 BoD voted for this statement of policy: "While members' reports concerning illegal radio stations have in the past been printed in DX MONITOR as they constituted DX, the IRCA wishes to make it clear that it does not condone the operation of any station not observing the rules of the FCC or specific country's governing agency. In the future it will therefore not give advance publicity to the operations of these stations although members' reports concerning reception will continue to be published".

The DX MONITOR mastheads and club stationery have not been re-ordered pending relocation of club HQ in another city. Some stationery is still on hand but is going fast. The July and August issues will undoubtedly carry a temporary masthead.

Notes and announcements: 1) Because there were no volunteers to take the job of WC DXF editor, DXF will be done by Don Erickson until further notice. Park Barton and Don Erickson have set up certain standards for their sections. Both are now the same and are as follows: No acknowledgements of letters, tapes, or WPE cards will be printed nor will voluminous discourse on SCs, card swapping, and other subjects not directly related to DX and IRCA be allowed. This is not so much to save the editors time but to keep DX Forum full of DX which is the prime reason many people joined IRCA, to get DX info. Also, space is at a premium. IRCA dues of \$4 will not cover all that we might like. In answer to Mike Shannon's request for a break down of the cost of putting out the IRCA bulletin, the following is given: Income from 300 members: \$1200.00. That sounds like a terrific sum of money but watch it go: Postage per issue (third class only, 1st and air mail extra is paid by the member) is \$12.00 or MORE. Never less. That is a yearly cost of \$408 not including the many times the bulletin requires 6¢ or 8¢ postage. Stencils for 20 pages per issue are required in the quantity of 680 at a cost of at least \$68. The average bulletin is over 20 pages so there is additional expense there and stencils cost more than 10¢ each here on WC. 21,000 sheets of paper would cost a minimum of \$250. Envelopes run over \$100 per year. Ink runs \$100 or so per year. Cost of printing masthead is over \$75. Additional expenses include the Post Office Box, membership cards, electronic stencils, etc. The total obvious is over \$1000. It doesn't take many overweight bulletins to bring that over the \$1200 income. The club must hold down the size of the bulletin or dues would have to be increased, and sentiment is strongly anti- any dues increase. That is one of the best reasons for limiting chatter, second only to the fact that DXM is indeed a DX club publication. Also, in the future, no further attacks on fellow members will be allowed in DXF. Unfortunately, there have been a couple in the past. Park has agreed to follow the same editorial policy on the EC that is being followed at present on the WC.

In consequence of some bitter editorialism by prospective Convention hosts, the Chairman of the BoD has banned all further mention of the merits of the respective cities in DXF in individual reports. The 3 bidding cities (those presently in the running) are requested to send to the BoD, c/o Don Erickson, 30 lines on their proposed city. They will be printed in a special section in the July bulletin. Any city may do so but they must be sent to the Board for approval. They should be factual and no reference made in any manner to any other bidding city.

Ken Kramer of Pasadena, Calif. (1070 Atchison Street) informs all IRCAers that KWKW-1300 in Pasadena is planning on running a DX program for IRCA sometime in June or July. For further details, contact Ken at the above address with a self-addressed post-card and he will send you details in advance of the program, or read through the rest of DXF for further mention of the program.

He aquí los detalles de mi recepción de Radio Nacional en la frecuencia de 870 kcs. onda media, incluidos en mi informe original: Capté sus señales el día 11 de agosto de 1964 desde la(s) 4:15 hasta la(s) 4:50 A.M., hora argentina. (Incluyo una cinta magnética, grabada a la velocidad de 7-1/2 pulgadas por segundo, que contiene la programación de su emisora a esa hora.)

Le envío una estampilla de su país para la esperada carta de comprobación.

Le agradezco la oportunidad de comunicarme con su gran emisora, y espero que sea muy provechosa para las fraternales relaciones de los pueblos (del continente americano; del mundo).

Con mis mejores deseos, y los del International Radio Club of America, expreso a usted la seguridad de la más distinguida consideración.

TRANSLATION

Dear Sir:

Some time ago I wrote you concerning my reception of your station Radio Nacional. The letter, dated August 12, 1964, was a report of the conditions under which I heard your station.

I have waited for your reply, but it has not yet come, perhaps because it was lost in the mail. I collect letters of verification of reception of the stations that I have succeeded in hearing, and I would be very grateful to receive such a confirmation from yours.

Here are the details of my reception of Radio Nacional on the frequency of 870 kcs. medium wave, included in my original report: I heard your station on August 11, 1964, from 4:15 to 4:50 A.M., Argentine time. (I am enclosing a tape, recorded at 7 1/2 IPS, that contains the program of your station at that time.)

I am enclosing a stamp of your country for your reply.

Thank you for this opportunity to communicate with your great station, and I hope it will serve to further the good relations among the nations (of the Americas; of the world).

In closing, I wish to convey my best wishes and those of the I.R.C.A.

Note! The IRCA Regular SS Report Form should be used with this f/up form; copies are available at HQ. When writing the time in Spanish, you should use the article "las" except between 0100 and 0159 (eg. "las 0415", "la 0130").

- 530 6 DL Dalwalinu, AUSTRALIA should be possible. This ABC outlet is scheduled from 1400-0807. (RJS)
- 570 HCRM 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Musical" is now on the air 24 hrs. a day, 7 days a week using the slogan "Canal Tropical" from 2400-0500. The AN show will occasionally be put on 565 kcs., and next fall 575 kcs., on MMs, so look for it. The AN program may also soon go into network operation with 7 other stations, so look for an AN craze in Ecuador. (DFG)
- 620 -RNE- Tenerife, CANARY ISLANDS is now scheduled from 0300-1900 with a power of 100 kws.. (SCDX)
- 640 CMQ Havana, CUBA, usually very good MMs, was weak on 5/17, but very loud on 5/31 and 6/7. (RJS)
- 652 HIFA San Isidro, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC, "Radio San Isidro", the official loyalist station, is now here from 645 kcs.. (RFS)
- 660 XERPM Mexico City, MEXICO, "Radio 660" is very good evenings and AMs until 0300. This frequency is now clear since KFMB moved from 540 kcs.. (Had a very good image here.) (RJS)
- 670 2 CO Albury, AUSTRALIA sent a standard ABC card to verify my reception of 7/29/64 from Colorado. Aussie QSL # 17 from Amarillo-Boulder. (LBG)
- 690 CMBC Havana, CUBA verified my reception of 7/13/64 from Boulder for country # 49; thanks to a tip from Bill Nittler. V/s is Antonio Hernandez, Director; address is Apartado No. 132, La Habana. Verie is on "Radio Progreso" stationary. (LBG) Whenever XETRA is off (not too often now) this station blasts through. (RJS)
- 700 2 NR Grafton, AUSTRALIA had a beautiful signal on 5/17 at 0620, the last time heard. (RJS)
- 730 5 CL Adelaide, AUSTRALIA was probably the one with Australian newscast at 0707 on MM 5/31; tentative report sent. Also I noted a play here at 0541 on 6/7 that might have been 5 CL. (LBG)
- 740 2 BL Sydney, AUSTRALIA was heard on 5/18 at 0435 with a Senate speech. Very strong signal. (MR)
- 750 YSKLA Santa Ana and YSKL? in Usulutlan, EL SALVADOR, "Radio Cadena YSKL" relays were logged well on 5/31 at 0100 s/off. Besides these two stations this network consists of: San Salvador on 760 kcs., and San Miguel and Sonsonate on 770 kcs.. (RFS)
- 770 3 LO Melbourne, AUSTRALIA was noted at 1457 on 5/17 with an ID. Very weak signal. (MR)
- 780 4 YA Dunedin, NEW ZEALAND was heard at 0620 on 5/17 with a good signal. (RJS)
???? Which station was playing EE records here from 0717-0721 on 5/31 ? Too late for WBBM. (LBG)(The above ? - ed)
- 785 HCAA 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Noticia" currently signs off at 2300, and plays tropical music. (DFG)
- 800 ???? An UnID SS station was noted here after 0600 on 5/17. YSAX ? Still after them. (RJS)
- 812 HCFV 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Pacifico" signs off at 2400, and plays Rock - all in SS. (DFG)
- 820 4 ZA Invercargill, NEW ZEALAND verified my report of reception on 4/3 by sea mail. Fifth verie from New Zealand in five reports this season. V/s is J. Robertson, Manager. (KGS)
- 825 HCGB 2 Guayaquil, ECUADOR, "Radio Nacional Espejo" is now extinct, so the only ANers now on in Ecuador are: HCRM 1-570 kcs.; HCGB 1-1310 kcs.; and HCUA 2-1270 kcs.; with "Radio 1020" on temporarily. (DFG)
- 835 HCCD 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Luz de America" signs off at 2400, and plays "good" music. (DFG)
- 840 CB 84 Vina del Mar, CHILE, "Radio Recreo" sent a friendly letter to verify my reception of 6/17 and 6/20/64 from Colorado. The Director-Gerente, Ivan Gonzalez S., specifies that the power is 1 kw.. My 10th. verie from Chile. Address is Casilla 596. (LBG)
- HJBI Santa Marta, COLOMBIA, "Ondas del Caribe" signed on at 0502 on 6/7 with a good signal. (LBG)

- 850 HJKC Bogota, COLOMBIA, "Emisora Nuevo Mundo" has a beautiful signal on MMs. Usually best, with peaks of S 7, at around 0500. (RJS)
- KICY Nome, ALASKA continues to blast in despite so little darkness in that part of the world. Heard with excellent signal on 6/7 at 0416. (LBG)
- XEZF Mexicali, MEXICO was heard on 5/17 at 0713, and is often heard beside XEMO in the daytime. (RJS)
- ???? My 850 mystery was possibly heard again on 6/7 at 0259. The NRC heard CX 16, "Radio Carve" (Is that "Car-bay" or "Car-way" ?) around 0359 back in April right around when I heard them first. (RJS)
- 854 OAX 4 A Lima, PERU, "Radio Nacional" was heard with a definite ID at 0610 on 6/1 after their 0600 s/on. (LBG)
- 860 2 YZ Napier, NEW ZEALAND must have been the NZBC station // to 4 YA-780 kcs. on MM 5/31 from 0331-0618. Signals were quite strong, considering the listed power of 5 kws.. Tentative report sent. (LBG)
- 870 YVKU Caracas, VENEZUELA, "Radio Libertador" is here now from 880 kcs.. (RFS)
- 880 3 UL Warragul, AUSTRALIA sent a verie for my tentative reception of 7/29/64 from Colorado, stating that this was their first report from the USA. Unfortunately, I had already received a verie for this same reception from 4 WK for an identical tentative report. 4 WK specified that I was tuned to the "Back to the Bible" program, which matches the religious program I heard, while 3 UL was vague. I have sent an inquiry to 3 UL in hopes of clearing up this mystery. (LBG)
- 1 YC Auckland, NEW ZEALAND is presumed to be the station with an opera type program heard on 5/17 at 0451. (RJS)
- 890 5 AN Adelaide, AUSTRALIA must have been the station with ABC pips at 0500 on 6/7. The signal was quite weak. (LBG)
- 955 ???? An UnID station, with American EE, was heard past 0100 on 5/31 very weakly. Loop pointed to Greenland. Who ? (RFS)
- 960 4 AY Townsville, AUSTRALIA is heard every night with RR. V/1 from the manager requests a 2 to 3 months check on their signal. Power is 2 kws., and address is PO Box 880 in Townsville. (MR) (Listed as Ayr, Mike. - ed)
- 990 YVRT Caracas, VENEZUELA, "Radio Tropical" is now here from 1050 kcs.. (RFS)
- 1005 HCGH 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Tarqui" signs off at 2400, later on SM (as late as 0200), and broadcasts national music and comedy programs. Uses 1 kw.. Has a "novela" at 2100, then tropical music and talk programs until s/off. (DFG)
- 1020 KSAB Naha, Okinawa, RYUKYU ISLANDS was noted on 3/19 at 0400. V/1 from Tom Nash, Program Director. Power is 1000 watts. (MR)
- ZCO Nuku' alofa, TONGA ISLANDS is believed to be the station heard occasionally atop KDKA on 6/6 from 0219-0301 and on 6/7 from 0320-0505. The program on 6/7 seemed to be in a Polynesian tongue, with both Hawaiian type and US popular music. I heard what must have been the s/off with an anthem that ended at 0505. (LBG) Haven't heard this one yet, but noted KGBS off on 6/7 at 0400, and KDKA very weak, s/off at 0400. Wish I had a loop ! (RJS)
- FIJI ISLANDS was heard on 5/21 at 0325-0435. RR and popular music with EE and FF IDs. IDs GRBL all times. (MR) (Mike, could this be Tonga above ? Also, are you sure of the FF IDs ? - ed)
- 2 KY Melbourne, AUSTRALIA was noted on 5/21 at 0341 with an ID and a horse race. (MR) (Believe this should be Sydney, Mike. - ed)
- HCLV 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Mil Veinte" is now operating from 2100-0900 on this frequency; in other words, they're AN. Uses about 400 watts; terrible distortion, but they might make it to the US. (DFG)
- 1029 ???? An UnID LA station is noted here evenings. Probably Colombian. (RFS)
- 1040 Peking, CHINA suddenly popped in at 0700 on 6/8 after what must have been an antenna shift or a power change. Stayed in through 0725 when they faded out. (LBG)
- 1049 TIRH San Jose, COSTA RICA, "Radio El Mundo" was logged here in the evening recently with a fair signal. (RFS)

1070 1 ZB Auckland, NEW ZEALAND was heard with a definite ID at 0430 on MM 5/31 and at 0442 on 6/7. Report sent. (LBG)

1100 HJAT Barranquilla, COLOMBIA, "Radio Reloj" is presumably the outlet heard very briefly on 6/7 at 0259. Surprised me. (RJS)

1110 2 UM Sydney, AUSTRALIA was noted on 5/18 at 0525 with RR music and IDs. Medium strength. (MR) (This location, Mike/ - ad)

1118 HCEG 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Exito" signs off at 0100, and plays popular, tropical and national music. (DFG)

1125 HRRO Comayaguela, HONDURAS, "Radio Universal" is here from 1145 kcs.. Signs off at 0100. (RFS)

1140 ???? A mystery SS station was heard here MM 6/7 from 0515-0526. Since CB 118 was heard a bit later, perhaps this was CB 114 in Santiago. (LBG)

1145 HCRG 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Nuevo Mundo" signs off at 2330 or 2400, and plays national and tropical music. (DFG)

1160 ???? A mystery station, in EE, was heard quite weakly MM 6/7 at 0414. Perhaps 3 XC. (LBG)

1175 HCLR 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Emisora Central" is here from 1180 kcs.. They sign off at 2400, and play "good" music. (DFG)

1178 -VCA- Okinawa, RYUKYU ISLANDS apparently shifts antennas at 0630, as it was inaudible before then, and again at 0700. The station was quite strong through the "Columbia the Gem of the Ocean" IS at 0700 on 6/7 when it suddenly faded before the ID was aired. (LBG)

1180 CB 118 Santiago, CHILE, was heard with definite IDs as "Radio Portales" at 0600 on 6/7 and at the same time on 6/8. The station was noted as early as 0545 and stayed in through 0630 when VOA-1178 faded in. Already verified from Colorado, but worth noting ! (LBG)

1220 XEB Mexico City, MEXICO seems to sign off at around 0300; good signal when on. (RJS)

1235 HJFG Armenia, COLOMBIA, "La Voz del Comercio" is my mystery HJ station of last Christmas. From 1240 kcs.. (RFS)

1245 HCFA 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio Metropolitana" signs off at 2330 and plays a variety of music; mostly soft. (DFG)

1270 XEHN Nogales, MEXICO was heard with EE spots on 6/7 at 0215. (KGS)

1292 HJEB Cienaga, COLOMBIA, "La Voz de Cienaga" is only drifting here from 1270 kcs., which it announces ! Is with RCN. (RFS)

1306 ???? An UnID HJ, HO or HC is heard here weakly evenings. Loop points to the South. (RFS)

1320 XEAI Mexico City, MEXICO often has a decent signal on MMs until 0400. (RJS)

135J KJQR Saipan, MARIANA ISLANDS was relogged with this correct frequency and call sign. Their transmitter is located at Micro Beach, and their power is 1000 watts. Connie Opah gave the s/off, but she and the other announcers are still having trouble with their EE. Some RR, but mostly native music is played. S/off is at 0530. (MR)

XEQK Mexico City, MEXICO was probably logged on 5/24 until 0500. I'd hate to DX in Mexico City ! (RJS)

1370 XEH? Either XEHG or XEHF signed on at 0651 on 5/17. (RJS)

1380 KPOI Honolulu, HAWAII had a weak and fading signal u/ KRKO on 5/31 from 0215-0245. (KGS)

1400 -AFKN- Unchon-ni, SOUTH KOREA was heard on 5/17 at 1410 with RR. Station goes by the name "Radio Gypsy". (MR)

1410 2 KO Sydney, AUSTRALIA was heard on 5/17 at 1324. RR music on "Night Life" to 1400, then "Star Time" to 1426 when ended monitoring. Played all US "Top 50" as most Aussie RR stations do. (MR) (Listed as Newcastle, Mike. - ed)

1413 ???? An UnID LA station is noted here with poor modulation. Who ? (RFS)

1430 XELL Veracruz, MEXICO was logged on 5/31 in the AM announcing as // to XEHV. (RFS)

1460 WFBA San Sebastian, PUERTO RICO, "Radio Pepino" is now on the air with 500 watts. (NNRC)

1540 ZNS Nassau, BAHAMA ISLANDS has a clear, local, signal in Miami, even on car radios. "Top 40 Show" with DJ Howard Carter (1500-1700 weekdays) is a favorite with Miami teens. (RFS)

1545 HCDJ 1 Quito, ECUADOR, "Radio ABC" signs off at 2400 or 2300, according to the day, and plays band and jazz music. (DFG)

"PIRATES!" "KING Radio" expects to extend its schedule into the night soon. (SCDX)
"Radio London" (1129 kcs.) is going to introduce a new v/c in the near future. (SCDX)
"Radio Pamela" began test broadcasts on 5/19 from a boat off the Essex coast. Regular broadcasting was scheduled to begin on 5/23 with an intended coverage area of about 60 miles. (SCDX) (No frequency listed, or power. - ed)

CAROLINE IS. The address of WSCZ is: Kasper Peter, Station Manager, WSCZ, Truk District, E. C. I. 96942. (MR)

ECUADOR A new radio law prohibits, after two years, split frequency stations, so look for frequency changes in the future. (DFG)

EL SALVADOR "Radiocadena 1050" stations are: YSABC-560 in San Miguel; YSW-930 in Santa Ana; and YSU-1050 in San Salvador. (RFS)

GUATEMALA SW station TGWB has been re-activated. (WRTVH) (Although not specifically mentioned, this may mean that TGW on 640 kcs. may also be re-activated. Watch for it. - ed)

ISLE OF MAN "Manx Radio" on 1539 kcs. (New frequency ? - ed) has been granted permission to play pop records for half their total broadcasting time, instead of one fifth as at present. The time is increased by 3 hours to 12 hours daily. (SCDX)

JAPAN The address for the FEN is: HQ FEN, APO San Francisco, California 96267. (MR)

LATIN AMERICA Music such as XEB and HJED play is what is known as "musica tropical". What XEJP plays is "musica popular". That is, cha-cha-cha, merengue, cumbia, tango, porro, ganta, pachanga etc. are all part of "tropical music". Rock and ballads are "popular music". Every country has, usually, "national music" such as CPR plays after 0400, and "Ondas del Pacifico" plays on SM. There is the "ranchero" in Mexico; the song with the heavy guitar backing in Colombia. To a latin there is no such thing as "Latin American music", and "Spanish music" is music from Spain, pasodobles, flamenco and so on. "National music" is "musica nacional" in SS, of course. (DFG)

This issue of the DX MONITOR is going out a week late due to several things. First, stencils arrived a day late in two out of three editor's cases. Secondly, The disastrous flood that hit Denver Wednesday night resulted in the Nittler household being without power for more than two days...thus no mimeograph power. Anyway, the flood missed me by about a 1/4 mile. Can see the river from my patio but live up on a hill. A regional shopping center down the hill was completely destroyed as well as more than a million dollars damage to the Centennial Race Track. KDAB-1550 lost their tower and transmitter and may not return to the air again as it cost them about 50,000 dollars. KDKO-1510 lost towers but returned after 3 days off the air. Most were off at one time or other.

SHEDDING SOME LIGHT ON THE SUN

In this year of minimum sunspot activity, we've all heard about the importance of sunspots to radio wave propagation. The phenomenal BCB DX that has been possible this season can't be expected to continue much longer, although next year should still be better than average. At this point, it might be interesting to find out a few things about sunspots and how they affect our hobby.

The amount of ultraviolet energy given off by the sun is proportional to the sunspot activity. Ionization of the gases in the ionospheric layers of the Earth's atmosphere by the ultraviolet rays from the sun causes refraction or skipping of radio waves. The more ionized the ionosphere is (i. e., the greater the electron density), the higher the frequency that can be used for transmission of radio waves (or transmission of atmospheric noise). Static, mainly from thunderstorms or from precipitation, is transmitted by the same mechanism as all radio waves; highest noise levels are at the lowest frequencies. The noise at BCB frequencies is lowest during minimal sunspot activity, and we've been able to hear stations that normally would be lost in the background noise.

A sunspot is a dark patch on the sun. It is characteristic of a center of activity (CA) - or area of strong magnetic field near the sun's surface. Although their origin is unknown, they can be seen to appear quickly (in a few days), but decay slowly (up to 3 months for a large sunspot group). Records of sunspot numbers have been kept for over 200 years. From these records, it was recognized that there was a cycle of increase and then decrease of sunspot count. The cycle has an average time of 11 years between points of lowest solar activity. However, the average duration of each series of CA's is about 14 years, so there is considerable overlapping of old cycle CA's and new cycle CA's. Old and new cycle sunspots can be distinguished from each other in several ways, the easiest being their position on the sun (the old CA's are nearest the equator).

When the IQSY (International Year of the Quiet Sun - counterpart of the IGY scientific studies carried out in the 1957-58 solar maximum) began in January 1964, old cycle (cycle 19) sunspots were still present, and several rather vigorous groups of new cycle (cycle 20) activity had been observed in 1963 (the first was seen on Aug. 28). Astronomers suggested that residual activity would not be as low as hoped for, and the IQSY might not be too quiet. The exact date of the minimum won't be known for about a year because all sunspot counts are averaged over long time periods, but it probably occurred in mid-1964.

What are the possibilities for the solar activity magnitude later in cycle 20? In general, probably bad for BCB again, but excellent for high frequency DX. New cycle CA's tend to appear quite rapidly. Approaching a solar activity maximum, there not only are more sunspots but the CA's associated with them are also more intense. Zurich sunspot numbers now of 4 - 10 will probably be about 40 by next "BCB" winter. The 1958 maximum was the highest in 200 years. Although it's next to impossible to predict sunspot activity, cycle 20 doesn't appear to be coming in like a lamb.

One phenomenon we can all watch for is the 27-day cycle of disturbed radio propagation. These storms, lasting as long as 5 days each, should still be noticeable for about another year. They can usually be observed for 3 years before a sunspot minimum and for 1 year after. One region of the sun's surface (called the M region) is responsible for these magnetic disturbances. The Earth is only affected by the storms when the sun is aiming the M region at us; that is, only once in each rotation of the sun (27 days). The 27-day cycle of magnetic storms may be active when there are more sunspots, but it can't be noticed for 2 reasons: (1) it is weak in comparison to other solar disturbances, and (2) CA's near the M region quench the 27-day phenomenon. Typically, a cycle of storms begins with a weak disturbance, followed every rotation of the sun by storms of increasing ferocity, then

these gradually weaken and end the series (there are 5 to 20 storms per series). The storms cause a blacking-out of radio communication, much like ionospheric storms caused by large solar flares, only less severe. These are from a gusty increase in the solar wind; they are not electromagnetic rays, but streams of ionized gases (weak cosmic rays) ejected from the sun. However, note the following letter I just received from WWV (CRPL, Boulder): "This sunspot cycle minimum has been quite unusual in that no well-defined recurrent geomagnetic disturbance patterns occurred. For example, during the past 6 solar rotations, there was only one brief magnetic disturbance (March 5-6, 1965). The probability that a recurrence pattern will develop within the next few months is nil." So, despite the relatively high sunspot level at this minimum, it was counter-acted for us by lack of storms.

Don't despair just because the average number of sunspots is increasing. There will still be days every month without much sunspot activity. And even when the sunspot number goes up, there's the chance of hearing stations because of decreasing cochannel interference.

STATE OF THE MONTH -- IDAHO.

Here is the first of the detailed reports on each state or province. All will be based on actual loggings by several DXers across the country. Although there are about 40 stations in Idaho, there are not yet any clear channel or cinch stations for DX. Many of the Idaho stations can be logged easily in the west at s/off, and once in a while these same s/off's make it farther east. Examples are KTFI, KOZE, and KLIX. If KBOI moves to 670 kc. as IIA, it should make this state easier for the Eastern seaboard listeners. Some DX specials would help, too. Here's the rundown:

- 580 KFXD, Nampa. Quite strong. 0200 s/off for the west; SSS for farther east. Try MM s/on in Calif. at 0730. KMJ is the worst interference.
- 590 KID, Idaho Falls. Listen in the evening thru the QRM. 0300 s/off audible in Colo. Sometimes at SSS. S/on is 0700 or 0730 EST on MM. Veries with a QSL card.
- 630 KIDO, Boise. Loud most evenings on the west coast, but CHED interferes in north. A loop helps on this one. Also heard at 0700 s/on with KHOW. QSL.
- 790 KEST, Boise. Tough one. 0700 s/on has been heard in Calif.
- 930 KSEI, Pocatello. Another to watch at 0300 s/off; try in the east. Often heard through KHJ in Calif. and CJCA in Seattle. Has v/q. 0700 s/on.
- 950 KBOI, Boise. Watch during DaylightTime for 0210 s/off. Makes it to the east.
- 1010 KATN, Boise. Try early s/on during summer. SSS gives good signal in Colo.
- 1140 KGEM, Boise. With 10 kw., Idaho's strongest. Nightly in the west. AN except MM. Good s/on at 0700 MM. NRC DX a few years ago was quite successful.
- 1230 KBAR, Burley. One of 3 graveyarders on 1230. Heard once in a while testing.
- 1240 KFLI, Mountain Home. Heard in Calif. thru KROY. Also at 0730 s/on.
KVNI, Coeur D'alene. Has 0105 s/off with National Anthem and Lord's Prayer.
- KWIK, Pocatello. S/off at 0100, and s/on at 0800 - heard in Colorado.
- 1260 KTEE, Idaho Falls. Quite strong at 0600 MM s/on. Sends a nice CM card, but not a verification.
- 1270 KTFI, Twin Falls. 0208 s/off heard well, even to the midwest. 0712 s/on. QSL.
- 1290 KSNM, Pocatello. 0600 EST s/on is regular in Calif. on MM's.
- 1300 KOZE, Lewiston. Try their s/off on MM - usually mixed in with KOL, but KOZE often sets their XR for daytime pattern and blasts out for a few minutes.
- 1310 KLIX, Twin Falls. MM s/on in the west (0730). S/off is 0200 or 0230. Try sunset and after in the east.
- 1350 KRLC, Lewiston. Regular in NW until 0300 s/off. Heard in summer on SM to 0230.
- 1400 KRPL, Moscow. Much QRM, but watch for 0300 MM s/off.
- 1450 KEEP, Twin Falls. Loud in the NW, weaker farther south. Just keep trying.
- 1490 KCID, Caldwell. Easiest 250 w. in the west! Often AN. How far east?

That's it on Idaho. Fall is a good time for this state from the east. Good luck.
