CONCERNING EDITORIAL POLICY OF THE EAST COAST DX FORUM

Due to the present condition of the editorial policy of the ECDXF, I feel that I should set up standards for the ECDXF, per the "IRCA Editorial Policy as Approved by the Board of Directors." After reviewing letters from co-editor Don Erickson, the above mentioned Editorial Policy, and the consorship that has been carried on in the past few months, I feel there is a strong need for a change that will conform to the policios set up by the Board of Directors in the Editorial Policy they voted on and approved.

As you probably noticed last month, there was a policy put forth concerning the DXF in general. That was OUR policy as set up by Don Erickson. This is MY policy and concernsonly members sending their DXF reports to me. This policy will continue to be effective unless I revoke it or the BOARD of Directors revokes it. Also, I shall continue to act as ECDXF Editor until I decide to resign or until I am asked to resign by the BOARD of Directors. Any censorship performed in the ECDXF will conform to the Editorial Policy approved by the Board of Directors.

This is not a temporary policy, established during our present "state of omorgency", but the permanent policy to be followed as long as I and the BOARD of Directors see fit.

I will not try to list the rules here, but I suggest that any member who plans to send a report to me for the DX FORUM first check with the above stated policy and make sure that his report conforms to it in every way, or it is very possible that your name will be missing from the next issue of DX Monitor. The sections of the Policy that concern OUR section of the DXM are: Section I, Part C & D; Section III, Part B & C; and Section III. It would probably be best if you would copy these excerpts on a sepa.te sheet of paper and keep them handy.

I realize that these rules are not "uniform" with the past policies of the DXF, but they are the ones set up by our presently governing body, and they shall be followed by me until I am instructed to change by the Board of Directors, and not the Chairman of the Board of Directors.

I want to apologize for taking up so much space here, but I felt that this was something that needed to be done for the good of all concerned. I know that this will not be to the pleasing of everyone, but I think it will be for the majority. And, anyway, WHEN has everybody been pleased at anything? I might add that the policies followed in this issue were those set up by Don Erickson last month, slightly revised! E N U F....

- HJKC Bogota, COLOMBIA is believed to be the station heard here after 0500 in SS. Seemed at times to be two separate stations; CMKC probably the other. (DR)
- YNAV Managua, NICARAGUA, "Radio Continental" was probably heard on 7/3 at 0300 s/off. Heard a NA which I didn't recognize. (RJS)
- 2 CY Canberra, AUSTRALIA (Best bet for the Capital Territory) was heard well with an ABC ID SM 6/27 at 0645. KOA signs on late Sundays only so that's the best day to try for 2 CY. (LBG)
- KIMO Hilo, HAWAII signs off at 0300. Heard on 6/23. (RJS)
- KICY Nome, ALASKA finally sent a verie for my 5/2 report. V/s is Dave Olson, Acting Engineer and the address is PO Box 303. (LBG)

- 855 ???? A station was heard here with the loop pointed SE on 7/1 from 0500-0530, and on 7/7 at about 0530. PJC 2 s/on is listed as 0600. Could they be an hour earlier w/ DST ? (DR) (Doubt it, but they may simply have changed skeds. - ed)
- 860 XENL Monterrey, MEXICO is heard here on Tuesday AM in the clear w/ KONO off. Frequent IDs as "Radio Recuerdo". (DR)
- 1 YZ Rotorua, NEW ZEALAND was the station I heard on 5/31, not 2 YZ as listed in the 6/15 DXWW. A frequency substitution was affected on 5/24; 1 YZ is here (es-800) and 2 YZ in Napier is now on 630. Verie letter, signed by M. G. Adams, Station Manager, and NZBC QSL card already received. This was the strongest NZ station heard on MM 7/12 with a fantastic signal from 0500-0515. (LBG) Is here from 800. Heard on 7/7 from 0406-0425. (RH)
- 870 2 GB Sydney, AUSTRALIA might have been the EE station heard here on SM 6/20 at 0530 after KAIM s/off. Very weak signal. (LBG)
- 880 PRI 3 Belo Horizonte, BRAZIL, "Radio Inconfidencia" is now NSP. Easily heard past 0100 u/ WCBS, and loud and clear MMs. Much louder than ZYU 33. (RFS)
- TGJ Guatemala City, GUATEMALA was relogged here for a report w/ good signals on the evening of 7/1. Had "Noticias Nacional" at 2145. (DR)
- 3 UL Warragul, AUSTRALIA sent a letter of clarification regarding my tentative report of 7/29/64, stating that it (like 4 WK in Warwick) was carrying the "Back to the Bible" program. Since apparently both stations carried the same program at the same time, and both verified, I decided not to count either. 3 UL is now on 530, so I should have a clear shot at 4 WK one of these days. (LBG)
- 1 YC Auckland, NEW ZEALAND really surprised me MM 7/12 at 0453 broadcasting in French ! Never heard this language on a NZ station before. (LBG)
- O.. 4 Lima, PERU, "Radio Union" seems to s/on at 0600 daily with 4 chimes repeated for several minutes. On SM 6/27 and 7/11 I heard definite IDs as "Domingos musicales en Radio Union" at 0615. This is a new station. I met the owner in Lima last winter and he advised me that the power is 10 kws.. Report sent. (LBG) Was heard on 6/27 from 0610-0620. Larry Godwin phoned me about this one. Country # 22. (RH)
- 950 XEGM Tijuana, MEXICO signs off at 2400. (LCM)
- 960 XEIQ Ciudad Obregon, MEXICO was logged here for a report from 0230-0300 s/off. Only ID heard was "Radio I-Q". This on 7/7. (DR)
- 1020 ZCO Nuku'alofa, TONGA IDed in the clear on 6/25 at 0230. Steady signal. First time heard without KDKA QRM. Mixed with KDKA on 6/27 at the same time. (KGS) Was heard on 6/28 with s/off at 0500. No sign of KDKA. Country # 23. (RH) Was finally IDed on 6/30 at 0300 with talk and chimes. A long battle ! (RJS) Was heard strong MM 6/28 at 0340 playing US R & R records and announcing in EE and some unidentified language. I believe their normal s/off is 0500, but SM is 0400. ID is "Call of the Friendly Islands". (LBG)
- CP 4 La Paz, BOLIVIA was finally heard after three years of trying on MM 6/28 from 0541-0550, thanks to a tip from Rich Heald. It ended the program "Cantares de Bolivia" at 0541 (which, incidentally, was aired at 0600 when I was in La Paz) and then IDed as "Emisora del Estado". I believe their new s/on must be 0530, a change from 0600 in February. By the way, the 1965 WRTVH doesn't have the QTH for this station listed; I believe it is: Av. E. Camacho Edificio Krsul. Report sent ! (LBG)
- Was heard on 6/28 from 0540-0555. Still no sign of KDKA. Country # 25. (R)
- 2 KY Sydney, AUSTRALIA was probably the station I heard on 6/14 at 0600 with 6 pips and the news. Had a program called "Report from London" at 0605. (LBG)
- YVQB Cumana, VENEZUELA, "Radio Sucre" burst through on 6/21 at 0510 with news and chimes. (RJS)
- YVMX Maracaibo, VENEZUELA, "Radio Calendario" is here from 1030. Clear ID Heard on 7/11 at 0522. ID on tape. (RH) Was heard here thanks to a tip from RFS. Heard definite ID at 0517 on 7/11. (LBG)

- 1020 ???? An UNID station was heard here at what seemed to be s/on at 0456 on 7/5. Thought I recognized the YV NA from ELK's tape, no mention of "Radio Rumbos", so YVMX, "Radio Calendario" ? (RJS)
- 1030 KEQR Mexico City, MEXICO was relogged here with good signals for a report on 7/5 at 0230. (DR)
- 1035 4 VEF Cap Haitien, HAITI came in with a beautiful signal on 7/11 from 1756 to 2015, with FF religious programming. (HMM)
- 1040 PRG 2 Sao Paulo, BRAZIL was heard on 7/11 from 0427-0430; clear ID on tape. Country # 26. (RH) Faded in briefly through a strong KHVH at 0300 on 6/27. (KGS) Was in well on SM 7/11 atop KHVH at 0425. IDed as "Radio Tupi" several times. I don't believe I've ever heard a Brazilian in the summer before. (LBG)
- Peking, CHINA in answer to my reception report of 3/21 sent a program sked, 3 issues of "Peking Review", and a letter thanking me for the report, but failing to specify frequency or mention verification. Got f/up off, but in the meantime I'm counting it. Asia # 1, Country # 9, and Continent # 3 verified. (DR) Is especially strong daily just after 0700. (LBG)
- KHVH Honolulu, HAWAII is definitely not AN; heard with ET-OC on 7/5 at 0619. Apparently s/off at 0600. (LBG)
- 1050 XEG Monterrey, MEXICO virtually drowned out my 50 kw. local, WHN, on 7/12 from 0333-0339 with "Smoky Robbin's Caravan of Country Hits". Address is Ft. Worth 11, Texas. (HMM)
- 1060 CB 106 Santiago, CHILE was possibly the station heard in SS here MM 6/28 from 0600-0620. Other Chileans were strong, and this one is listed as 100 kws.. (LBG)
- 1070 HJCG Bogota, COLOMBIA, "Radio Santa Fe" really booms in here on MMs. (RJS)
1. ZB Auckland, NEW ZEALAND sent a letter and a QSL card to verify my report of 5/31. V/s is S, Williamson, Programme Organiser. (LBG) Was mixed in with HJCG here on 6/4, although both were easily separated with the loop. HJCG was only slightly stronger. (KGS) Was heard briefly on 7/12 from 0528-0532. (RH)
- 1090 XERB Rosarito, MEXICO s/off MM at 0202; s/on at 0500. (DB)
- 1150 KLEI Honolulu, HAWAII was hopefully the station heard here 6/22 during a CKWX fade at 0305. (RJS)
- 1140 -VOA- Poro, PHILIPPINE ISLANDS supposedly signs on at 0630 according to WRTVH. It might make it through on a MM when the frequency is relatively clear. Power is 1000 kws.. (LBG)
- CB 114 Santiago, CHILE was very strong MM 6/28 from 0517-0620. I believe it is still AN. (LBG) Was heard on 6/28 from 0515-0550. Peaked at S 7 ! So strong that I was able to hear it on a Sony 11 transistor, and a 6 tube AM-FM Arvin. Country # 24. (RH)
- 1150 KEJP Mexico City, MEXICO, "Radio Variedades" was heard for the first time on 7/5 at 0250. (RJS)

- ALGERIA According to a schedule for May-October, "Radio Algiers" now has FF from 0130-0330, 0700-0930, and 1200-1700; Saturday 0130-0330 and 0700-1700; Sunday 0200-1700. EE from 1700-1730 and SS from 1730-1800 on 890. (SCDX)

- FRANCE A recent ORTF program sked lists: GG, every day but Sunday, from 1345-1400 with FF language lessons, and 1300-1400 daily except Sunday, and 1340-1430 on Sunday. All on 1277 (Strasbourg). Also SS from 1700-1800 daily on 944 (Toulouse). (ELK)
- INDIA New 1000 kw, medium wave transmitters will be installed near Bombay and Calcutta. (SCDX)
- ISLE OF MAN "Manx Radio" (PO Box 20, Douglas, Isle of Man) now transmits on 1295 instead of 1594, and has never used 1539. During the winter a combination of 1295 and 1594 will be used as the BBC will be on 1295 also. At the end of June the power was supposed to be increased to 200 watts. (SCDX)

Colombian Call and Frequency Allocations

Ronald F. Schatz

This is the first in a series of articles dealing with the "FCC's" and "NARBA's" of our neighbors to the south. Scientifically-minded DX'ers should find these interesting and useful.

The large number of Colombian frequency changes that have occurred over the past two years are no coincidence, but are in compliance with the government's new system of frequency allocations, arranged as follows:

The frequencies between and including 540 and 1010 kc/s are called "international channels". Only one station can operate on each channel, and stations in the same locality are separated by 40 kc/s. This allocates 4 sets of international frequencies for 4 large regions of the country as follows:

540, 570, 610 - (every 40 kc/s) - 1010	for Bogota
550, 590, 630 - (every 40 kc/s) - 990	for Medellin, Manizales, Ibague, Pereira, and Bello

560, 600, 640 - (every 40 kc/s) - 1000 for Barranquilla, Cartagena, Santa Marta, Bucaramanga, and Tunja
 580, 620, 660 - (every 40 kc/s) - 980 for Cali, Pasto and Buga

Note the irregular 540 for Bogota instead of Cali.

The frequencies between and including 1020 and 1600 kc/s are called "regional channels". Several stations can operate on each channel with a maximum power of 10 kw. Stations are separated by 30 kc/s in the same locality. This allocates 3 sets of regional frequencies, one of which, in general, is exclusively used by one of the 16 departments of Colombia as follows:

1020 - (every 30 kc/s) - 1590 for Medellin, Cali, Palmira, etc., and surrounding areas
 1030 - (every 30 kc/s) - 1600 for Bucaramanga, Barrancabermeja, Manizales, Pereira, Armenia, etc., and surrounding areas
 1040 - (every 30 kc/s) - 1580 for Bogota, Barranquilla, Cartagena, Pasto, Popayan, etc., and surrounding areas

The call system in Colombia is now a disorganized mess. Note the existence of two HJCT's, HJCP's, HJLK's, and HJZH's !

The old call allocation system is no longer used, but it still applies to most stations. In this system the 3rd. letter of the call indicates the department where the station is located, as follows:

HJA- for Bolivar, Atlantico, and Cordoba
 HJB- for Magdalena, and Norte de Santander
 HJC- for Cundinamarca
 HJD- for Medellin, and Choco
 HJE- for Valle del Cauca, and Cauca
 HJF- for Caldas, Tolima, and Huila
 HJG- for Santander, and Boyaca
 HJH- for Narino
 HJI- for Caqueta
 HJJ- for Cundinamarca
 HJK- for Cundinamarca
 HJL- for Tolima, etc.

HJN-, HJT-, and HJZ- not allocated

COUNTRY OF THE MONTH - MEXICO.

The Mexican stations that can be DX'd in the United States fall into several categories: the clear channel stations broadcasting in English, the Spanish clear channels, the SS border stations, the SS regional stations, and the rarer catches.

The FE clear channel stations are: XETRA-690 kc., all news, "X-TRA News Over Los Angeles," 50 kw+, going NSF; XEJO-300 in Juarez, 150 kw (harder now with PJR); XEMO-860, Tijuana, 5 kw., but gets out well; XEG-1050, 150 kw. from Monterrey, gives Fort Worth, Texas addresses; XERB-1090, 50 kw+, Rosarito, has daily schedule of 0600-0300 EST; XERP-1570, Ciudad Acuna, 250 kw listed (but usually a little lower). Most of these are heard easily nationwide, despite semi-local interference - XEG and XERP probably most easily.

The SS clear channels are: XETRA-540 kc., 150 kw, San Luis Potosi; XEX-730, 500 kw listed, Mexico City; XEW-900, 250 kw, Mexico City; XER-1220, 100 kw, Mexico City; XEDM-1580, 50 kw, Hermosillo. These are all heard across North America during the evening, except where there is Canadian interference.

The SS border stations can be broken down (a pun, KGS) into geographic areas: In Baja California: XESU-790, XEAO-910, XECL-990, XED-1050, are Mexican stations heard over fairly large areas. In Tijuana, XEGM-950 s/off @ 0100, XEC-1340 stays on until after 0400 weekdays, XEXX-1420, XEAU-1470, and XERG-1550 which stays on late weekdays, are heard. In Sonora, XEIQ-960 "Radio Ee-Koo" (EI) is heard regularly, as is XEOX-1430. XEY-630, XEAL-1250, XEKE-980, XEHT-1470, XEY-1270, XEY-1290 also are heard. In California, XFAB-1400 and XECB-1400 are occasionally heard around 0200. From Chihuahua, XEDU-620, XEFI-530 (s/off 0055), XEI-910, and XEP-1300 are heard. XEAE-1600, XENR-980, XERPG-1420 "R. Ranchita" are Chihuahua stations frequently DX'd.

The Spanish regional stations are plentiful: XEFB-630; XERP-660 "R. Seis Senta"; XEAO-700 "Radio ABC," s/on around 0700; XENL-860 runs AN, and is often heard Tuesday morning when KOHO is off; XEOY-1000 "R. Mil" is best when U.S. stations are off; XEHL-1010, s/on around 0700; XEQR-1030 "R. Centro" gets out well, even considering WEZ; XEMR-1140; XEJP-1150 "R. Variedades"; XFWK-1190 (0016 s/off); XFAI-1320 after 0300 MM "Radio Ah-Ee"; XEQK-1350; XEBS-1410 "R. Bay-Esse"; XEIZ-1440 (after 0300 in the East); XESM-1470 is very good on a clear channel MM's; XERH-1500 makes it to the southern states; XENU-1550 s/on 0700.

Some of the rarer catches during the last season were: XEJB-630 (0800 EST on MM), XESB-820 (0745), XEAW-1280, XEDG-1370, XEL-1260 (0020), XELK-1280 (2230).

Most Mexican stations broadcasting in Spanish identify on the hour and on the half hour with their call letters. The SS alphabet was published several issues ago (April 6, 1965 - p. 10, ed.). If you're going to DX Mexico and the rest of Latin America, the alphabet should be memorized for quick recognition.

The times given above are EST for winter reception. For example, XEGM-950 will s/off at 0100 in November, but during DST they s/off at 2400 PST. Some Mexicans retain standard time, however, especially those farther south. (Like other aspects, often unpredictable).

Many Mexican stations verify reports. If you are just starting, try the EE and SS clear channels, and the SS regionals; most verify readily. XERP is an exception. If possible, write the SS stations in Spanish, using the IRCA SS report form. Watch the DXW pages for those that do verify, and start your own list of verie signers.

Dave Gleason's forthcoming SACCA log will list all Mexican stations and will be indispensable for the LA DXer. It is complete with call, slogan, power and location. The Mexican list incorporated in the Vane Jones log is also fairly accurate. The NARBA listings occasionally given in DXW are often misleading, and White's Radio Log is nearly worthless. SACCA is the best.

Since last month, Dodson et al. (Science, Vol. 148, p. 1328) have published a scientific paper describing the Solar Activity during the first 14 months of the IQSY. July, 1964 was indeed the quietest month, marking the beginning of higher

sunspot numbers after that time. Actually, the "statistical minimum" occurred in June, 1964 (an average of 10 spots). The minimum between cycles 19 and 20 was one without long intervals of solar quiet and with relatively few days without visible spots. Only 19 spotless days occurred in July, and by the end of the year the number of spotless days had dropped markedly (Dec.=5, Jan.=2, and Feb.=4). Residual sunspot activity - although well above the immediately previous (1954) minimum - was below the average for cycles 8 to 18 (some consolation). One oddity of the solar minimum was the exceedingly high number of days of "quiet earth," i.e. days with low levels of geomagnetism. The minimum was much quieter than 1954 in this respect! Another strange circumstance was the appearance of new cycle spots only in the northern hemisphere of the sun, for the first 16 months of cycle 20. In any case, the minimum is past, cycle 20 is well underway, and cycle 19 still is forming sunspots.

EVOLUTION OF BROADCASTING

Perhaps some of you wonder how our hobby came into being. This article will, I hope, tell you a little of how radio broadcasting started. The possibility of radio was foreseen in the 1860's when James Clerk-Maxwell predicted mathematically that radio waves did exist. Later, experiments by Heinrich Hertz demonstrated that rapid variations of electric current could be projected into space in the form of waves similar to heat and light waves. Marconi transmitted radio signals a short distance in 1896 and successfully completed a Trans-Atlantic test after the turn of the century. Marconi's rather simple spark gap-type transmitters were used exclusively until about 1914.

Radio was first applied practically for ship-to-ship and ship-to-shore telegraphic code communication. The speed and effectiveness of radio was proven and was a great help in saving lives and property during marine disasters.

There is a great debate as to when the first voice broadcast was made. Some say that it first took place in 1892 at Murray, Kentucky at a demonstration by Stubblefield, while others argue that it was in 1906 at Brant Rock, Massachusetts when some nearby ships picked up a program. Lee DeForest, who greatly improved the newly invented vacuum tube, broadcast music by Enrico Caruso in 1910.

There were other tests including the Trans-Atlantic voice tests made by the U.S. Navy at Arlington, Virginia in 1915, but regular broadcasting did not begin until after World War I. The identity of the first broadcasting station is also debatable. Among the first was KDKA, Pittsburgh, which furnished experimental programs before it received its regular broadcasting license on November 7, 1921. However, WBZ, Springfield, Mass. got its license on September 15, 1921.

There were experiments of network operation over telephone lines as early as 1922. In 1922, WJZ, New York and WGY combined to broadcast the world series, and in 1923 WEAJ (New York) and WNAC (Boston) picked up a football game from Chicago. Later that year, KDKA and KYW, Chicago hooked up with WEAJ and WGY to broadcast talks at a dinner in New York. Six stations carried President Coolidge's message to Congress in 1923. The National Broadcasting Company started the first regular network in 1926 with 24 stations. In 1927 the Columbia Broadcasting System was organized. The first round-the-world broadcast was made from Schenectady, New York in 1930. Today it is possible to send the same program over many stations at the same time, thanks to telephone wires, microwave, and other relay facilities.
