DOMESTIC CONTEST RULES

- Contest begins 9/1/64 at 12:01 A.M. local time and ends 7/15/66 at 11:59 P.M. local time. Stations must be logged in these dates and must be verified by 8/15/66 to count in the contest.
 - A. 2 stations from each of the 50 states, D.C. and each Canadian Province is eligible. The first station counts 1 point; the 2nd from each state or province counts 3 points. (total of 4 for each area)
 - B. All members are eligible. Entry fee is 25¢ and must be sent to Larry Lehmer, 420 N. 28 St., Council Bluffs, Ia. by 11/1/65.
 - C. Any domestic special Test or DX for the IRCA will count additional 3 points. This station may count as 1st or 2nd station in an area.
- Final standings will be announced at the annual IRCA convention in '66.
- No station may be re-verified unless it is a special DX for IRCA.
- Contest will issue regular standings. Manager also has right to reject any station a member might enter in error. Contest manager's decisions are final. Any questions of the manager must be accompanied with return postage if contestant requires an answer.
- List of entries must include, Call letters, frequency, location, dates heard and verified. Each person should report additions as often as possible and not less than 2 months apart.
- Prizes will be awarded to the winners, # of places awarded determined by entry fees. A bonus prize may be worked out by manager for various mystery stations.
- All stations entered must be logged within a 10 mile radius of DX den.
- The person in First place in this contest at end may not take first in Contest #2 Letterama. If so, he will become 2nd place winner in the latter one.

Send in your entry fees today. The #2 contest will be explained next time. It is basically the same as last season with possibly a change of letters. We will be having a contest with the NRC based on the #1 contest so let's get busy and put IRCA on top. (Also explained next time)

Greeting! After almost an entire season of inactivity, I decided to reofrm and DX..you know the story, I'd rather fight than stop. First, a station employee and myself converted an unused closet into a DX den, with racks for the radio and tape recorder, shelves for logs, tapes and vital information as well as a (what DX er can be without one) food box! Then, I built a support outside of the window for a loop, installed a half mile long wire, read through last seasons Monitors, and am now ready for the season. I started by looking for changed IA conditions, which are reported in detail in Ed's DXWW. Static after midnight has been bad, but several US stations have been audible. Notable are WLCY, KAAV, WCBS, WIOD, KTRH, WGBS, & WOAK. Now that 1210 is clear, WCAU is making nightly appearances. WFLA-970 makes it into Quito at around 2200 nightly, for one of the first US stns to show. First European suspect is on 1538, where two were fighting it out on 8/29. The loop proves to be invaluable, as I can get within 5 kcs of many locals by nulling the interfering stn with the loop and then tuning to side freqs. Some stns can be mullled so well that other stns can be brought out of the freq. My US totals are 19 states, 31 verios. Well, according to the latest survey, R. Musical has over 50% of the Quito audience.. not bad for a 34 stn market. #1 here is the US song "Satisfaction". No personal comments. DX DX DX HCRM-1 will DX for the IRCA the entire AM of MM, Soptomer 27 on 565 kcs. Will be the regular programming of our Canal Tropical, hence no R. Musical IDs will be heard. Ads will be transmitted, and a few EE IDs will be included. As last year, please report is SS, however an EEcover letter can be included. Also, avoid going "blah-blah-blah" in paragraphs or lists of technical or program details in your reports. Personnel generally have little time for reading letters, so your details and your specific request for a verio should stand out in plain sight; small talk only gets in the way, and should be kept in paragraphs of its own. Insight, anyone? Hi. DX here is limited to a Jap AM-FM portable. It doesn't pull in much, but the LA's are still strong, especially PJB and XEW. In the absence of DX, I plan to contribute technical info. from the library of the College of Engineering here at the Univ, which should prove interesting to everyone in the club. Since May, my DX for veries activity has been nonexistent due to a continuing series of address changes. This will be the case until sometime next spring when I hope to settle somewhere near San Francisco. I assure you all, however, that my interest in BCB activities has not diminished. A major portion of my spare time this summer has been spent recompiling past DX logs and editing the "1965 Issue" of my own BCB listings. The latter covers the 13 western States, western Canada, western Mexico, and specializes in such info as former call letters, do sun's TV-FM affiliations, directional antennas, and FCC freq. chng. I collect primary coverage maps, so while attempting to acquire more of these I've visited several stn's. One of these was KCAY 1520 rr Port Hueneme, Cal. I talked to dj-engineer Lee Richards whom I had met about 3 years ago when KACY was a 250 watter being from a small shack in the middle of an orchard. This stn is still in the orchard, but now operates with a power of 10KW days/LKW nights from one of the nicest studios that I've yet to see. Utilizing seperate patterns day and night from its 4 tower array, KACY is highly directional to the WNW. This puts the growing cities of Oxnard, Ventura, and Santa Barbara in its primary coverage area, but a larage null to the east (to protect KOMA) prohibits decent reception in Los Angeles. A recent modification of KACY's pattern, Richard's told me, enables slightly better reception in the area between the xmtr and LA (35 miles) as well as some improvement in the direction of San Diega. Future plans call for a day power boost within a year to 50KW and an eventual night power of 5KW (both directional). Any Dxer lucky enough to receive KCAY's hard-to-get signals might as well forget about them because this stn will not verify. Richards defended this policy by stating that KACY was in business to serve its primary coverage area, and reception outside this area was of no importance to him. To me this is a little harsh toward sincere DXers, but he was rightfully critical of the so-called DXer who asks for a verie from a stn which is just a few miles away. This is ridiculous becuase DX means LONG DISTANCE radio reception and not an indiscriminate request for a verie from a local or semi-local stn. - 1420 2 AP Apia, WESTERN SAMOA was country # 42 logged. Heard on 9/6 from 0258-0430 with signal ranging up to S 7. Best before s/off at 0430 following a drama produced for the BBC, then the IS, and ID. (RJS) I finally got enough detail to send a f/up report on 9/6 from 0230-0330. (I can lay off of them now.) (KGS)
- Fort Davis, CANAL ZONE was noted on 8/26 at 2230 with US hits. They are now AN. (DFG)
- 1423 HJ?? An unidentified Colombian was noted on 8/26 at 2045. The only clue was a Gillette Sports Cavalcade ID. (DFG)
- 1425 ???? An UnID station here, could barely pull out any audio. Probably SS. Any ideas ? Heard on 8/30 at 0535. TICJ ? (RJS)
- 1435 HJAP Cartagena, COLOMBIA, "Radio Bahia" is believed to be the CARACOL station on this frequency. Heard on 8/26 and 8/27 after 2200; on 8/26 with football at 2320. (DFG)
- 1445 HJGM Sogamoso, COLOMBIA, "Radio Sogamoso" was noted at 20 Db over S 9 on 8/27 at 2300 with an RCN ID. Many ads. S/off at 2315 with NA. (DFG)
- 1450 HJNL Villamaria, COLOMBIA, "Radio Sintonia" was noted at 2030 with popular and tropical music. Moderate strength. (DFG)
- 1455 HOD 42 Almirante, PANAMA was heard at 1950 with a program on national history and anti-communism. It was about 10 Db over S 9 and clear. Slogan is "La Voz de Almirante". Signed off at 2005 with the NA. Announces as 146C. (DFG)
- 1460 3 YW Greymouth, NEW ZEALAND was apparently the station with the "National Programme" and an IS with 6 pips at 0600 on MM 9/6. Power is 2 kw.. Veried from Colorado. (LBG)
- ???? An unknown LA, very faint, is noted MMs with 0230 s/off. Deep SA, but who ? (RFS)
- 1462 HJZU Pasto, COLOMBIA, "La Voz de la Amistad" is here from 1310. Heard from 2030 on past 2100. News on the hour. Tropical music. Bad het off 1460. Licensed power is 1 kw.. Think they had a poetry program at 2110. (DFG)
- 1480 ???? A SS station loud and on top at 0704 on 8/14; "The Voice of the Andes", sounded like "OAXI" ("I" not "1"). Was this real or just KYOS ? (WV)
- 1484 St. Louis, SENEGAL, "Radio Senegal" was tentatively logged for reception of 0130 on 8/9. (RFS)
- 1510 JO.. An NHK Second Network station (// to 1370) was weak at 0445 on 9/6, and outdone by 2 NA, Newcastle, AUSTRALIA a few minutes later - until WLA's s/on during the ABC ID. 2 NA was reported, of course. (KGS)
- ???? An Oriental was noted here at 0732 on 9/3 with a male speaker, group singing after 0740. Not // to Peking-1040 or JJ-835. NHK ? (WV) (Sounds likely, Bill, off Gray's report above - ed)
- 1525 OAX 4 D Lima, PERU, "Radio Reloj" is entering another season on this frequency. Power is 1 kw., lots of ads. Music is basically tropical. Has been heard in New Zealand and Sweden. (DFG)

- 1530 XEUR ? Mexico City, MEXICO, "Radio Honda" is a new station on the air. They belong to the "Radio Mil" group. (DFG)
- 1538 ???? An UnID station, in what seemed to be GG or some other European tongue, (Not FF, SS or II) was heard on 8/29 at 2340. WHO ? Man and woman announcers. Light music. Another station in rare language behind them with a YL announcer. (DFG) (Dave, "Deutschlandfunk" - Mainflingen is here with 300 kws.; possibly they ? - ed)
- 1560 2 RE Taree, AUSTRALIA was possibly the station, heard weakly but clearly, on 9/6 from 0410-0435 and u/ WQXR from 0515-0530. Radio drama both times. I'm checking the tapes and will listen again on 9/13. (Anything in the East at around 0400 regularly, Ed ?) (KGS) (Haven't listened for quite some time unfortunately, Gray - ed)
- 1565 ???? There is something here, probably Peruvian, with a woman announcer. Poor signal. Tried for an hour, but couldn't get an ID. This was on 8/29 at 2330. (DFG)
- 1575 TI?? Palmares, COSTA RICA, "Radio Columbia-Canal 6" was heard between 2345 and 0001 s/off on 9/7-8. Not sure about the frequency, but believe it was closer to 1573 or 1574 than 1575. Had vocals and instrumental music with frequent "Radio Columbia" IDs. (PB) Was heard on 8/29 at 2300 with an excellent signal. Mixture of all types of music (middle of the road), and frequent IDs. (DFG)
- 1578 ???? A mystery station here, too weak to ID the language, presumably in Asia, at 0345 on 9/7. Any suggestions ? (LBG)
- 1590 XEVOZ Mexico City, MEXICO now uses the slogan "La Voz de la Personalidad". (DFG)
- 1595 HJZT Armenia, COLOMBIA, "Radio Ciudad Milagro" was noted at 2250 on 8/29 with La Hora de la Amistad with romantic and tropical music. Did not note any ads. Was 20 Db over S 9. Hetted with someone on 1593.5, but even the slot filter would not dig the other out. (DFG)
- "PIRATES"
A new station, called "Radio Falcon" is expected to begin operations beginning 10/31 from off the coast of Scotland. Frequency and power not known as yet. (SCDX)
"Radio Scotland" will be on the air from a 500 ton converted trawler, anchored either on the Firth of Forth or the Clyde river mouths. This will be in December of this year. (SCDX)
"Radio City" has left 1615, and is now putting out 13 kws. on 1033 daily from 0000-1300, but it has been noted to s/off at 1800 on a Saturday. The fort where the station is located is to be pulled down before the end of the year, so the owner of the station has bought a 162 foot schooner, on which the station will be installed in about 5 weeks time. The ship will be anchored off the Devon coast, broadcasting to Wales and the West Country. (SCDX)
- ANGOLA "Emissora Oficial de Angola" plans to install four 100 kw. SW transmitters two of which will be able to operate on MW also. The station will also soon change the MW frequencies of 872 and 1295 to 1124 and 1412. (SCDX)
- ETHIOPIA A new station is testing with pops, tone, and EE announcements on 940 up to 1600. Kaduna (NIGERIA) which is also on 940 will move to 593. (KB)
- ISLE OF MAN "Manx Radio" is now on the air from 0200-1400 on 1295 during daylight and on 1594 during darkness. (SCDX)
- MEXICO The following Mexico City area stations are now AN-7 days: XERC-790; XEABC-760; XEQK-1350; and XEQR-1030. (DFG)
- NORTH KOREA The following frequencies have been deleted: 585-660-850-860-935-1000-1045-1120-1150-1275-1285-1355. Added have been: 605-635-735-820. JJ programming is scheduled on 635 from 1600-1700 and 0400-1000. (WRTVH)
- PORTUGAL An EE DX program is broadcast at 1800 on 755 and 1061 on Fridays. (SCDX)
- SURINAM "Stichting Radiocomroep Suriname", a new government station, officially opened on 8/14 with 1 kw. on BCB, with 50 kws. scheduled before the end of the year. No frequency noted. (SCDX)

EAST GERMANY "Freedom Radio 904" and "Deutscher Soldatessender" both operate from a small town near Magdeburg in the Soviet Zone. "Freedom Radio 904" is currently on 908 kc. with 500,00 watts power, which provides considerable interference to the broadcasts from London on the same channel. The station transmits daily daily at 1300-1400, 1500-1640, and 2230-0000, announcing as "the single broadcasting service in the Federal Republic of Germany which is not controlled by the government of Western Germany." An excellent musical format makes it popular among teen-agers, but the station also features propaganda talks and messages for undercover agents.
 "Deutscher Soldatessender" operates on 935 kc., the channel used by the American Armed Forces Network in Berlin. Broadcasts are at 0015-0115, 1200-1245, 1415-1445, and 1730-2030, with western dance music and propaganda talks beamed primarily to armed forces in Western Germany. DX'ers with sharp broadcast-band receivers should try for either or both of these stations during their late evening transmissions. (The foregoing is a verbatim copy of an article featured in the September 1965 issue of POPULAR ELECTRONICS.)

Argentine Frequency and Call Allocations

by Ronald F. Schatz

The following international frequencies are allocated to Argentina by treaty: 710, 750, 790, 830, 870, 910, 950, 990, 1070, 1150, 1190, 1230, and 1310 kcs.. All other frequencies are regional.

Most stations in Argentina are owned and operated by the government, which, domestically fails to distinguish between international and regional frequencies, with similar stations operating on each.

Argentine calls generally indicate the age of the station: The LR's are oldest, followed by LS, LT, LU, LV, and, lastly, LW. Numerals from 1 to 99 follow these prefixes in chronological order, station LR 1 being older than LV 8, for example.

Radio Nacional stations have calls reading LRA followed by a numeral.

OFFICIAL 1965-1966 IRCA FOREIGN CONTEST RULES

1. This contest is open to all members in good standing of the IRCA. Entrants will be automatically disqualified if they cease to be members.
2. The entry fee is 25¢. Entries should be sent to the Contest Manager, and entries will be accepted until November 31, 1965. No entries will be accepted after that date for any reason.
3. Contest dates will be: 0000 (local time) on September 1, 1965 to 2400 (local time) on June 30, 1966.
4. Stations may be submitted for counting until August 14, 1966.

5. Station entries should consist of the following items:
 - (a) Station call and slogan, if any.
 - (b) Frequency.
 - (c) Dates heard and verified.
6. The Contest Manager reserves the right to request for inspection the actual verie or a reproduction of it from any of the stations submitted, although it will not not be normal for either to be submitted.
7. The Contest Manager will have the final word on all scoring, and whether or not stations entries will be accepted.
8. The contest will consist of one league encompassing the entire United States and all of Canada.
9. One distance point will be awarded for every 1000 miles the station is from the contestant's location, or fraction thereof. (e.g. 2300 miles = 3 points)
10. Standings will be in order of the most distance points scored.
11. The winner will be awarded a free one year membership in the IRCA; the second place winner will be given a 7" reel of magnetic tape; and the third place winner will be awarded 25 U. S. (5¢) postage stamps. An award will also be given to the entrant who verifies the most countries. (The Official IRCA Countries List will be used.) This prize will be determined by the number of entries, and will be announced at a later date.
2. The winners will be announced at the 1966 IRCA Convention, and the results will be published in the issue of the DX MONITOR following the Convention.
13. No station may be re-verified for the purpose of this contest.

Please note that it is anticipated that the 1966-1967 Contest may begin on July 1, 1966, so DXers should stay at their dials right through the summer !

The Contest Manager this season will again be Ed Krejny, so get your entries in as soon as possible.

THE TRUTH ABOUT RADIO AMERICAS - PART OF IT ANYWAY.

Probably the greatest hoax ever perpetrated upon the World's DXers is R. Americas and its predecesor R. Swan. Not that R. Americas doesn't exist - it certainly does as almost every SWL can attest. But it does not "exist" on Swan Island as its operators would have us believe and as many Dxers/SWLs do believe. Of course your editor has saidthis basing his arguments on EI's FRAUD FINDER.

However due to some recent events within the DX world, we have decided to release further and more dramatic evidence from our classified file (classified - that's pro writer's terminology for "don't publish unless you get paid for it"). Now once before in these pages we mentioned a series of letters written by a R. Americas staff member to a Massachusetts DXer. The letters were written to convincehim, and subsequently SWLs in general, that his station was in fact on Swan Island. Just why this particular SWL was selected is a good question.

That staff member is Robert (Bob) Houston, K 2 SRT. Some of you may have R. Americas QSLs signed by him. The DXer - Walter Giordano, Houston, in order to explain why he was not operating as a ham from Swan, stated that no Amateur operations were permitted on the island. About the time he was making that statement, K 9 ULF of Chicago was working W 3 ZQ/KS 4 on the controversial isle. W 3 ZQ/KS 4 confirmed the contact and your editor personally inspected this QSL.
