Anybody who can help me, it would be appreciated. Same day, at 1941 WTAD-930 logged w/a rpt, KIRA-1010 o/WINS f/1955-2010 w/a rpt. 10/22, WFBC-1330 hrd o/KFH (by the way does KFV verify??) ((They have for some people, but not for me in 3 tries Steve-pb)). w/an ID, and then dissolved itself into the QRM, not to be hrd from since. I need it for my first S.C. 10/24, XEG-1050 w/ the Ft. Worth address at 0229. 10/28 an UnID stn on 630 w/CBC program (news, editorial, and a commentary) f/2110-2125, then lost...IDed, but not hrd, my guess is CFCY. I also had a short, but enjoyable visit with B. Nittler. I found DX to be almost the same in the west, as here in the east, except of course on regional channels. Out eastern 50kw clear channel stns can be hrd almost as well throughtout the west, as here in the east. There are a few exceptions though, such as KNEB, KOB, KFAB, KVOO, KSTP & KOMA. These stns are quite hard to get here in the east, but they really blanket the western U.S. I indulged in some serious daytime DX at Grand Canyon, Ariz. and White Sands Nat'l Mou., N.M. CHARACTERISTICS OF RECEPTION OF TPs.

Here's the last section of my letter from Gordon Nelson. It deals with seasonal variation of TP reception, and again calls on the data made available by Hank Tyndall.

"Regarding the statement (ed. note, Season Openings) that perhaps one good DU opening may be noted during September: I am very interested in the amount of symmetry in reception patterns during equinoctial periods. In the small, conditions should be "equalized" in each hemisphere during these periods; in the large, one might expect some longterm residual effects in each hemisphere. In order to investigate this question I again have turned to the data of HTT. Find enclosed a histogram (reproduced in a slightly changed fashion below) showing the distribution of South Pacific DX catches as by month. T= Tasmania, N=N.Z., A=Australia, and P=South Pacific. I am well aware that the number of stations involved is small, only 30. They are however randomly selected in a very real sense; they represent those South Pacific stations for which I have date, time, and frequency information. So they are a rather unbiased sample, I believe. Note that the total number of stations is quite symmetrically distributed between equinoxes: 14 to 16. It sort of looks as if Aussies come through during the Vernal and South Pacifics during the Autumnal doesn't it? The statistics certainly aren't conclusive, but they're the best we've got.

Also find enclosed a similar histogram for North Pacific and Far Eastern stations (Hawaii excepted). J=Japan, P=North Pacific, F=Far Asian. Note the enrichment of J and F receptions on the autumnal side of the new year. My subjective impression is that this represents a very real trend; the exact mechanism is certainly not clear, though; any suggestions? Again, these HTT loggings are randomly selected on the basis of the criteria listed above for South Pacific stations."

 Thanks very much for all this information, Gordon, and for your permission to use it in the DXM. Yes, I have some comments to make using my log book for the 1964-65 DX season. Naturally, since we are closer to the TP stations, reception is quite a bit easier, and more frequent. BUT, the same trends seem to hold! I did not do any DXing during the summer months for DUs or TPs from Asia, but the data for the other months is listed below. The approach is a little different, though. These data are of stations logged (ie., on which there was positive identification) but not necessarily verified. No single station is counted more than once in each one-month period, but some occur in more than one place in the charts (eg., for Japan, JOBB and JOIB were heard during each month from Sept. to Mar., so there is a minimum of 2 during the season in each month). The numbers may be lower than real for Dec. and Jan., due to no DX from Dec. 23 to Jan. 15. I did not list the South Pacific stations in the DU chart; just Aussies and Zedders. Only Japan listed for Asia - my listening times usually coincided more with favorable reception from Japan.

STATE OF THE MONTH - NORTH DAKOTA.

- North Dakota is one of the states that's not too well represented in most QSL collections. KSJB, 600 seems to be the ubiquitous first catch from North Dakota, but KFYR, 550 also shows up often. Outside of the neighbouring states and provinces, few of the other stations are heard on regular schedule. However, most North Dakotans have regular frequency checks, so try them then through whatever interference you may have. The latest available f/c times are listed below; some may now be different.
- 550 KFYR, Bismarck. Gets to the midwest once in a while, and both the f/c and s/on as far as Calif. 0115 s/off; 0545 s/on. f/c on 2nd Thurs., 0320-0335.

- 790 KXGO, Fargo. S/on MM is 0628 EST; AN rest of the week. f/c is the 1st Tuesday from 0315-0330. Regular in Colorado; often at sunrise in Wisconsin.
- 900 KFNW, Fargo. Has a f/c on 4th Sunday at 0115-0130.
- 910 KCJB, Minot. 0600 s/on heard in Wyoming; later in morning in midwest. f/c is 0200-0220 on the 4th Thursday.
- 970 WDAY, Fargo. Most regular in Colorado and Wisconsin (late evenings in latter). S/on 0645; 0800 on SM; s/off is 0200.
- 1220 KEYD, Oakes. Has a f/c first Tuesday - 0230-0300.
- 1270 KBOM, Mandan. Its f/c gets out! eg., San Diego and Troy. 4th MM, 0200-0230.
- 1310 KNOX, Grand Forks. QSL. Same 2 places as KBOM have heard the f/c; 1st MM from 0115-0130.
- 1340 KGPC, Grafton. Various times listed and rptd for this station's f/c. Watch DTI, and check Larry's latest list.

Chris Hederstrom of the Arctic Radio Club (Sweden) is staying with us this week, as he is touring this country after being aboard ship for several years. It's incredible the DX the Swedes hear, and I'm debating whether we will move to Sweden or New Zealand upon retirement, hi. I am now plagued by another local station, "Radio Cal," on the University campus, which broadcasts on about 849.5 kc with 10 watts. I don't have to explain the interference it causes. I just received a fast reply to my letter to John Wallis and hope he receives more letters from our members. He says he has quite a bit of spare time and enjoys corresponding about everything. I regret that I forgot an acknowledgement in the f/c list, to thank Byron Barnum for writing some 18 letters to radio stations inquiring about their r/c's. A couple of notes of interest from Chris: Every time his ship passes near Swan Island, he hears "R. Americas" very loud; he has taken bearings on the station from the Gulf of Mexico and the Pacific, also. He points out that the station might be on the northeastern Honduras coast, however. COMMENTS

AFRICA has the following changes: Nyasaland to Malawi; Southern Rhodesia to Rhodesia; Tanganyika and Zanzibar to Tanzania; and Northern Rhodesia to Zambia.

Somalia is off the list because the BBC-701 station was moved to Perim Island, which is a dependency of Aden.

Congo (Leopoldville) has finally made the list with several sources reporting reception of Radio Congo-1131, located in Leopoldville. The Radio College station in Elizabethville on 1500, listed in the WRTVH-65, apparently does not exist.

WMWG-65 shows Maseru-895 in Basutoland, but considering how inaccurate this log can be, and considering that this station has never been mentioned anywhere else, there is doubt that this station exists also.

The Spanish territory of Fernando Po is planning a BCB station.

In ASIA North Borneo has become Sabah, and Aden will soon become the Federation of South Arabia.

French Guiana in SOUTH AMERICA and the British Virgin Islands in NORTH AMERICA are both planning BCB stations.

In OCEANIA the 1111 station in Djakarta, Indonesia is not now on the air, if it ever was, but the RRI is reported to be planning a BCB service for Djakarta soon.

Pitcairn Island is planning a broadcasting service, but it will most likely be short-wave.

- 530 ???? An UnID station was heard here, but with too much QRM to even ID the language. (LA)
???? A weak station was noted here. My log lists only 6DL in Australia, but it didn't sound like EE. Maybe Peking. Any ideas? (RC) (FBIS also lists DZXQ, Manila and a Russian station - ed)
- 540 XEWA San Luis Potosi, MEXICO was noted u/ CBK here on 10/22 from 2304. (SO) Was monitored on 9/22 at 2323. V/c received from J. Gonzalez Cordova at Cadena Radiodifusora Mexicana, Radiodifusora XEWA, Apdo. Postal No. 418, San Luis Potosi. (LA)
???? I heard two stations here SM 10/31 at 0900; one was an UnID NHK First Network station with the standard IS, and the other appeared to be Australian, with 6 pips, 1 second apart. Both signals were poor, though the Japanese was stronger around 0917 when I observed that it was // to 570, 590, 610, 660, 780, and 840. (LBG)
- 548 Bechar, ALGERIA was heard with chanting one past evening before 2000. Sure loud for 20 kws. (RFS)
.... Vladivostok, ASIATIC SFSR was noted with a good signal on 11/1. (RC)
- 550 CMAN Pinar del Rio, CUBA was logged here on 9/21 at 0040. Report sent. (LA)
- 575 ???? An UnID oriental was noted here 11/8 at 0528. Sounds like North Korea; may be // to 635. (RJS) There is an oriental here. Heard weakly at 0750 on 10/31. (LBG)
- 595 ???? There was a very weak signal here 10/31 at 0750. I note that the USSR is a possibility according to FBIS, but no power listed. (LBG)
- 600 YSNK San Salvador, EL SALVADOR, R. Exito was logged on a friend's set 10/31 at 0100. Mentions slogan frequently. (RFS)
.... Radio Peking, CHINA was probably the station I heard 10/18 at 0643, as a Korean friend says that the language appears to be Chinese. I thought it might have been the 100 kw. South Korean outlet. (LBG)
- 620 Radio Peking, CHINA had the 6 pip IS, the last higher, 11/7 at 0600. (RJS)
CMHQ Santa Clara, CUBA was logged here on 10/25 at 0137. A report was sent. (LA) (Sure of frequency? Listed as 630 here - ed)
- 629 Khabarovsk, ASIATIC SFSR had an excellent signal 10/31 with a program in EE from 0645-0700. Accent was American not British. (LBG)
- 630 CMHQ Santa Clara, CUBA is noted consistently here o/ WIAP and KXOK from 2200 on. (SO) (Believe this is the correct location, Steve - ed)
- 638 ???? Is this TGW? Noted on 11/8 at 0605. (RJS) (Sounds likely - ed)
- 644 Ottos, ANTIGUA has 5 kws. projected for this frequency according to FBIS. Watch for it. (RFS) (NRC recently carried an item which would tend to indicate that this station is now on 620. Power? - ed)
- 653 Hue, SOUTH VIETNAM has been noted on this frequency. (LAR) (FBIS lists this one on 650 with 20/50 kws. - ed)
- 654 ???? Only a het was noted here. First noticed 11/8 at 0621. Hue, South Vietnam? (RJS) (Note the above, Randy - ed)
- 655 Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA surged up to good level briefly 11/8 from 0359-0403 with what was apparently an ID by a woman, rapid pips exactly on the hour, and children's chorus tune to open next show, which featured music. (JAC)
- 660 ???? An oriental was noted here 10/25 at 0620. Who? Suspect Peking or Japan. (RC)
.... Kabul, AFGHANISTAN has been noted here, but possibly it's too far westerly for you? (LAR)
- 670 TGRT Guatemala City, GUATEMALA, R. Fabulosa was heard with a bullfight 10/24 at 2253. (RJS) (Sure of frequency, Randy? - ed)
- 675 YND Managua, NICARAGUA was monitored on 10/20 at 2250. Report sent. (LA)
- 680 CM.. (?), CUBA was logged here with a good signal on 9/23 at 0019. Report sent. (LA) (CMBC is on 690, Lawson. Three others are listed here: CMAF, CMHN, and CMDB - ed)
- 683 Sevilla, SPAIN was logged 10/25 at 2305. V/1 in SS received. (LA)

- 700 Radio Peking, CHINA was heard weakly 11/8 at 0620. (RJS)
- 720 CM.. Colon, CUBA was sent a report for a logging on 9/21 at 2259. (IA)
- 730 JOCK Nagoya, JAPAN was noted with classical music, // to JOCK-840 but weaker, at 0345 on 10/25. (KGS) Was noted // to 670 on 11/8 at 0510. (RJS) Was probably the station heard with standard NHK pips at 0600 on 11/1. Radio Peking was also audible with its IS at this same time. (LBG)
- ???? An UnID oriental was heard here u/ XEX's OC and with a "W" s/on. Possibly Peking, but the tape is untranscribed as yet. (RJS)
- 750 KFQD Anchorage, ALASKA is weaker than it was on 730, thanks mainly to JOIB. Noted on 11/8 at 0435. (RJS) Was first heard at this new spot well down under JOIB at 0330 on 10/25. Above WSB late evenings now too. (KGS)
- 760 ???? An UnID station was noted in FF with oriental music on 10/24 at 0150. (IA) (Sure it wasn't Dakar on 764? - ed)
- 770 ???? An UnID SS station carried what sounded like a newscast from 0507-0526 on 10/30, with chimes between each item, similar to what RJS heard on 810. Any ideas? (LBG) (Are YVQQ and YVLP in same network? - ed)
- 773 Radio 390, INTERNATIONAL WATERS after tests on 774, 776, and 782 has now settled here, synchronized with Stockholm to avoid heterodynes. These have disappeared, but Radio 390 can be heard under Stockholm. Announces address at London W.C.2 during daytime programs ("EVE"), but W.C.1 at nighttime. According to the letterhead of the station, it is operated by Estuary Radio Ltd., 14 Bouverie Square, Folkestone, Kent. Sales organization is at 35a Bessborough Place, London, S.W.1. Contrary to the other "pirates" this station broadcasts mostly "good music". Sked is 0200-1900. Daytime program, until 1300, is called "EVE, the Woman's Magazine of the Air". 1300-1400 is the "Raven Show" of US R&R, and 1400-1900 is "Evening Serenade" with "beautiful" and semi-classical music. (LAR)
- 775 TIV San José, COSTA RICA, R. City was probably the LA noted here on 11/7 at 2349. (RJS)
- 780 CMJN Camaguey, CUBA, R. Rebelde, is here from 960. Delete CMHB in Sancti Spiritus. (The FBIS list is atrocious!) (RFS) Was logged on 9/27 at 0407. Report sent. (IA) (Listed this one here, Lawson, although maybe it was still CMHB when you heard it. - ed)
- 785 Black Rock, BARBADOS was logged with a very good signal 10/27 at 2000. Report sent. (IA) Was heard on 10/30 at 1908 with a fair signal. Report sent. (RBC)
- 795 ???? This oriental, probably China, faded in about 0450 on 11/3. Audio was getting fair at 0500. (Time pips-couldn't hear them all-at 0500) At 0545 Chinese flute music, man talking in Mandarin, then choir singing with drum accompaniments to 0630. Perhaps Peking-790 moved? Will try for an ID. (KGS) This oriental gave an odd IS at 0600 on 10/31, consisting of 6 pips, 1 second apart, the 6th. being higher in pitch than the others. It would fit Radio Peking except that the timing is off; Chinese IS spaces the pips 2 seconds apart. (LBG) Is tentatively Shanghai per FBIS. Logged on 11/2 at 0352. Maybe // to 720 on 11/7 at 0602. (RJS)
- 799 ???? This station, still a mystery, but tentatively Pyongyang, was good on 11/2 at 0650. XELO's OC at 0655 kills any chance for pips. (RJS)
- 800 PJB Bonaire, NETHERLANDS ANTILLES was finally noted over CKLW's usually strong signal from 2158-2233 with religious music on the "Music and You" show. News in EE at 2230. (SO)
- 808 ???? An UnID SS station was noted; is this HJBW drifting? On 11/8 at 0535. (R)
- 809 EAJ7 Madrid, SPAIN possibly was the TA noted here 11/9 briefly at 1854. Faded before even the language could be IDed. (ELK)
- 810 ???? A faint signal was readable SM 10/31 at 0846. The program sounded like a play in an oriental language. CHQR didn't help, but there was no other interference. Through KGO s/on of carrier at 0855. (LBG)

- 810 WKVM San Juan, PUERTO RICO was noted with a good signal 11/9 from 1900-1909. ID at 1900. Believe WGY off during recent power troubles. (ELK)
- 820 HJED Cali, COLOMBIA was in here with a very good signal 10/27 at 0435. Report sent. (LA)
- 830 JOBB Osaka, JAPAN began FF lessons at 0920 on 11/2, // to 780 (NHK-2). On 11/3 at 1000 I heard the call in EE, then an anthem; this might have been a s/off. (LBG)
- KIKI Honolulu, HAWAII s/on at 0900 11/2 with SSB. First Hawaiian ever heard with s/on; the time announced was 0400, Hawaiian Time. (LBG)
- 834 Belize, BRITISH HONDURAS was heard on 10/31 at 1921 with a strong signal. Report sent. (RBC)
- 835 Radio Peking, CHINA was good after 0500. Possibly in Darien? Noted on 834.93. (RJS) (Huh? - ed) Was just fading in at 0500 on 11/3. Woman speaking in Mandarin gave program schedule at 0503 (Local news at 2220, rebroadcast of National news at 2300 - no zone given, so assume Peking time). "Chiang-Shi Yung-ming quang-bo diang-tai" heard in a sentence, but I don't think it was an ID. (Translation= "Kiangsi People's Broadcasting Station" words in same order). Chinese opera after announcements. Wailing noises are crying, as depicted in the opera. Talking and singing alternate. These operas, usually sung in Mandarin, are beloved by the older generations especially. For export to Formosa? (KGS) (Same province so close to 843? - ed)
- 840 LV4 (?) San Rafael, ARGENTINA, R. San Rafael - Taped the ID of a SS station fighting PRH9 on 11/8 which seemed to say "Esta es Radio San Rafael". Had infrequent but lengthy announcements with instrumental music, paso dobles, and others similar to that I used to hear on LRA, shortwave. PRH9 was dominant, though both were weak, and thunderstorms in the area didn't help any. Frequent mention was made of Argentina, la republica, etc., and seemed not to have commercials. May have been AN for the Chilean border clash, but at one point said "diariamente desde la Navidad", so perhaps will be on special. Not heard after 0230, when it seemed that PRH9 had things all to itself. Tentative sent. (JAC)
- ????
843 ???? A SS station was logged u/ WHAS at 2230 on 11/1. Who? (RC)
- 843 ???? The oriental here had no IS at 0900 on 10/29 though the signal was strong. The best time to get this one is at 0800 when the chimes are given. I still think it's Thailand! (LBG) (Larry, Lars Ryden has written that a Thai station is noted on 841 in Sweden - ed)
- 850 CMKC Santiago, CUBA was very high 11/8 at 0335 To complicate matters on this fairly good channel, which found KICY in Nome in on 10/11 with religious programming to 0400 ID and newscast. YNAV, CX28, WABA, and HJJC are among the "goodies" loggable here MMs. (JAC)
- 856 ???? There was a weak station here 10/31 at 0915; I think an oriental. (LBG)
- 860 ???? A weak EE station, looping east-west, was noted at 0320 on 11/2. orchestral music. Time check at 0345 sounded like "5:45 AM", but CBH wouldn't be on ADST still. Aussie or 1YZ? News at 0400 sounded DU. Interference from Japan. (KGS)
- 870 KAIM Honolulu, HAWAII may have been the UnID oriental I had atop KIEV SM 10/31 at 0940. (Not JOLB) I heard KAIM s/on 11/2 at 0930, and I think the first program was in an oriental language. (LBG)
- 880 TGJ Guatemala City, GUATEMALA, R. Nuevo Mundo, was logged here with an excellent signal at 0050 on 10/25. S/off at 0109. Report sent. (LA)
- 1YC Auckland, NEW ZEALAND was noted with WCBS on 10/28 from 0225 for a 1/2 hour. ID heard then a discussion program. (KGS)
- 890 HJCE Bogota, COLOMBIA, La Voz de Bogota, surged atop the noise 11/8 from 0252-0258 with typical music and, somewhat rare for Colombia, a call letter ID at 0258. (JAC)
- ???? An oriental was noted here 11/1 at 0700. Japan? (RC)
- 940 HJGB Cali, COLOMBIA was logged on 9/24 at 0139. Tape sent. (LA)

- 940 Radio Peking, CHINA was noted here on 9/25. (RC) Is very strong here; one of the best Asian signals. (LAR)
- 950 XEGM Tijuana, MEXICO was logged on 10/19 at 0246 while WJR (sic) was off the air. Report sent. (LA)
- JOKR Tokyo, JAPAN had a beautiful signal on 11/8 from 0405-0500. (RJS) Had a clear signal on 11/1 from 0425-0520. Two low pips, 1 high tone at 0500. Reported; lots of music and talk. (KGS) Is assumed to be the JJ heard virtually all AM 11/8, from 0346 (with KIMN still on) past 0430 with KIMN OC and KRSI test with organ music. About even with KRSI under the OC. (JAC)
- 955 ???? I actually had brief traces of modulation here around 0433 on 11/8, but could not bring anything up to readability, particularly through the severe thunder static which, by 0630, was coming from directly overhead. This channel certainly bears close watching. (JAC)
- 970 HLCA Seoul, SOUTH KOREA was noted with pips much like NHK and North Korea at 0500 on 11/8. (RJS)
- 1007 ???? An UnID oriental was only a het here on 11/2 at 0645. Haven't had any audio as yet. (RJS)
- 1020 Radio Peking, CHINA was heard weakly on 10/31 with pips at 0400. I doubt that this is the same outlet heard so well last season. (LBG)
- YVQB Cumana, VENEZUELA was heard on 10/24 at 2250 with "Rumbos" news. Do all YVs have "Royal" ads? (RJS)
- 1025 TIAC San Jose, COSTA RICA, Radio Fides, is a regular here. Noted on 10/24 at 2215 and on 10/31 at 2158. (RJS)
- 1035 4VEF Cap Haitien, HAITI was heard on 11/1 at 2020 with a very weak signal. Good catch, with local WBZ-1030 on with an S9+45 signal. (RBC)
- 1110 YVNN Punto Fijo, VENEZUELA, Radio Punto Fijo, is assumed to be the YV here with "Rumbos" news and "Royal" ads at 0516 on 11/8. (RJS) (Yes, Randy. They're a "Rumbos" affiliate, and a good verifier. - ed)
- 1120 JO?? Arctic Radio Club member Chris Hederstrom says the oriental I heard 9/19 was broadcasting in JJ, so there go my hopes for Samoa. There are several JJ stations listed here. (LBG)
- 1147 ???? There was a weak signal here 10/31 at 0718; it might have been an oriental. (LBG)
- 1150 XEJP Mexico City, MEXICO was logged on 9/27 at 2305 with an excellent signal. Report sent. (LA)
- ???? An UnID SS was noted on 9/27 at 2340 playing SS and R&R music. ID sounded like Radio Nacional; who? (LA) (Possibly TIGPH3, Radio Monumental in San Jose, Lawson? - ed)
- 1160 Radio Americas, SWAN ISLAND was heard on 9/26, and verified on 10/9. (RBC) Sent a v/c for my report of 9/21 at 0203. (LA)
- 1178 Okinawa, RYUKYU ISLANDS (US Trust.) had a TT with various pitched tones 10/31 from 0445-0500. I couldn't hear the actual s/on, but I don't believe an anthem was played. There was a program of EE lessons at 0522. (LBG)
- 1195 TICA Puntarenas, COSTA RICA, Radio Columbia, was good 11/2 at 2300, and on 11/7 at 2400. (RJS)
- 1200 BED50 Taipei, TAIWAN was heard during the 1964-65 DX season in Sweden, so probably it was on the air at the time of Gray Scrimgeour's reception of his mystery "Voice of the West" station. Power listed is 100 kws.. (L)
- ???? At least two weak orientals (Japan probably) were noted 11/1 from 0215. Singing on the dominant one. (KGS)
- 1220 XEB Mexico City, MEXICO was logged on 9/25 at 0018. Report sent. (LA)
- 1235 ZBMI Hamilton, BERMUDA sent a nice card for my report of 10/27 at 0120. ID is "Bermuda Call". (LA) Was heard on 10/28 and verified on 11/5. (V/c signed by John Forber). (RBC)
- 1240 (?), CHINA is heard here in Sweden. (LAR)
- 1352.7 Radio Essex, INTERNATIONAL WATERS was noted for the first time 10/27. Still testing. Frequency has been steadily this one so far. Noted as

- 1352.7 (cont.) early as 1200 EST, signing off at 1900 (Midnight GMT). Transmitter is said to be built by an amateur, who is the owner/operator of the station. Modulation still not perfect, microphone announcements very little modulated, Announcing as "Radio Essex, Britain's First Local Commercial Broadcasting Station" on "222 meters medium wave". No location or address given, but presumed to operate from Fort Shivering Sands, previously used by Radio City. (LAR)
- 1370 NHK synch. JOKD in Kitami, and JORB in Kochi, JAPAN hit S8 at 0317 on 11/8 with classical piano, announcement in JJ by female at 0321. This is consistently the best JJ here in the Panhandle. Call letters are now given only at s/off, Roy Millar says, but three years ago the JOKD call was heard here. (JAC)
- 1375 ST. PIERRE & MIQUELON was probably the weak station noted here 11/9 at 1921. Sure wish I could get a log on this one; still needed. (ELK)
- 1420 ???? An oriental was noted here 11/1 at 0730. Very weak. Any ideas? (RC)
- 1466 3AM2 Monte Carlo, MONACO was logged here with a good signal on 10/21 at 0639 (sic) in EE and FF. What is the address please? (LA) (Radio Monte Carlo, 16 Boulevard Princesse Charlotte, Monte Carlo, Monaco. Is there a mistake in this time? - ed)
- 1480 JORF Yokahama, JAPAN was the loudest on this channel 11/1 after the 0303 KWIZ s/off. (KGS) Was probably the UnID oriental here on 11/8 at 0421. (RJS)
- 1520 2QN Deniliquin, AUSTRALIA was logged from 0410-0445 on 10/25. Old US tunes, time checks, and a local contest. Fair signal. (Weaker than 2NA on 1510). (KGS)
- 1570 XERF Ciudad Acuna, MEXICO was heard on 10/30 using this call exclusively, on the "Wolfman" show with R&B music. (SO)
- 1580 XEDM Hermosillo, MEXICO was logged here on 9/24 at 0210. Tape sent. (LA)
- "PIRATES" Radio Scotland plan to start tests in October on 1133, the frequency of Radio London. (WRB)
Radio Invicta was taken over some time ago by King Radio. (WRB)
Radio Yorkshire is expected to be on the air soon according to Press reports. There is also much discussion going on in England about a possible merger between Radio Caroline North and Manx Radio. (WRB)
- ALBANIA French can be heard on Tirana from 1130-1200, 1230-1300, and 1530-1600 on 1088. (SCDX)
- BASUTOLAND Lesotho Broadcasting Corp. in Maseru will, contrary to its previous statement, have 10 kws. on MW and 5 kws. on SW. (WRB)
- MALI Radiodiffusion National du Mali in Bamako will have a 200 kw. transmitter (probably MW), later increased to 360 kws., within two years. China will build this station. (WRB)
- SWAZILAND Swaziland Broadcasting Service at M'babane will be on the air in December using 10 kws. on MW. (WRB)
