WHAT IS DX? An Editorial Comment or Two. kgs

The Constitution of our club says that we are "interested in the hobby of broadcast band DXing." But just what is DX? Yes, DX is distant reception - the reception of distant and weak radio stations. Let's examine that phrase, though. KDKA is distant for us on the west coast, but KDKA is not DX here. Similarly, CKOK is only 500 watts at night but I don't consider it DX for myself - simply because I can hear it at least 300 nights a year, if I try. Therefore, we've got to add regularity of reception to the definition. DXers mature as they learn their hobby; what was DX for your first season often is old hat for your second, and so on. I got a thrill the first time I heard Japan in September, 1964. A little over one year and 30 JJ stations later, I'm still impressed to hear TPs - even if they are only the same ones. It's the unusual that really gets your heart beating, whether it's from another continent, a domestic DX special you didn't expect to hear, an equipment test on a new station close by, or a nighttime regular heard by freak conditions at midday. So let's add the unusual flavor to our definition. But there are also many things that are not DX, and really don't concern a club like ours. It would be a stretch of anyone's definition to include nighttime reception of a local 5000 watt station, a semi-local 50 kw. outlet, or even your hometown graveyarder as DX. That doesn't mean the club isn't interested in news of your local stations (f/c times, strange s/on times, verification policies, etc.), but a report of hearing a local station during the daytime rarely helps any other club members. So if one or the other editor omits XETRA, or WLS, or WABC, or one of your local stations from your Forum report, don't be discouraged. Listen to these stations, verify them, and keep moving on to tougher stations. Ones that really deserve the name of DX. Granted, most of the club members who have been DXing for several years have communications receivers, but don't think that they just hear DX (by our definition) only because of their big radios: they've learned where and when to listen, and to recognize stations that are out of the ordinary. They've also gone through the same process of hearing the easy logs first, and finding out just what DX is all about. So if you are interested IN DXING, don't get in a rut of just listening to those stations that come in S9 - go after those stations in foreign languages, pay attention to the tips in the Monitor (all sections), try the stations you hear weakly under your regulars. It's the only way you'll get the most out of a great hobby!!!

A few random thoughts this time. I hope 1 or 2 of them draw comments from other members. First, I am not listing my current DX for a good reason. It seems to me that this part of the DXM is of little, if any, value. I don't think a list of a DXers catches can help anyone outside of his general area; to others (to me, anyway) it is about as interesting as a Hong Kong phone book. What I really like to see is articles such as on pages 5,6 and 8 of 10/30 DXM. I hope we have many more of them. Second, I think we should put together a pamphlet listing as completely as possible the good receivers and including such things as: cost, number of tubes, special features helpful for BCB, provision for external antenna, and a good-fair-poor rating by members who have used it. Case in point -- I recently bought a Hallicrafters S-11B by mail order (the only way I could), and found out when it arrived that it is so built that an external antenna only has an effect on the SW bands. Third, I think getting veries (valid, of course) is the best part of DXing. What's so great about hearing a new station if you don't have anything to show for it? And when I get a verie, it's always valid. The kind of report I try to send is indicated by a sentence on a v/1 from KGAY-1430: "I didn't have to check the log, as you seem to know it about as well as we do." Enough said. 73. (Good comments, Gordon. Typing lists of DX is even more boring than reading them, usually. That's why we're experimenting with new formats, pleas for only good DX, articles, etc. Hope someone has a suggestion or 2 for hooking an external antenna to the 11B for BCB. HELP GORDON!! kgs).

Hi. Here are some tips: If you have trouble finely tuning the IRCA loop antenna, just turn on your BFO (CW osc.) and adjust for the highest pitch. While the BFO is on, be sure to tune your antenna trimmer again, to repeak the signal. If you don't have an antenna trimmer, see 6/64 issue of PE; if you don't have a BFO, see 11/64 issue of EI. If you don't have a good enough ear to fine tune the BFO and loop, then use your S-meter. If you want to build an S-meter, see 4/64 PE. The recording level meter on a tape recorder can be used by hooking the output of the receiver to the input of the tape recorder. Place the recorder on "record." The only difference is that the recording meter method is variable with the volume; while the S-meter method is not, but proportional only to signal strength. I've built the RF amp. in 2/63 PE, and it doesn't work. Has anyone had it working? And the speech filter in the 5/64 issue of PE? XETRA-690 now announce their strength as "5 times the previous strength." They mention they now have 5 towers. S/on info says still 50 kw. (Lance: the effective radiated power towards Los Angeles is now 5 times the previous, from the new array;kgs). I just read an article on an outlaw that operated for 23 years - WUMS or We're Unknown Mysterious Station; operated from a boat on the Ohio River from 1925 to 1948. Even had WUMS license plates for his car! Finally in '48, some friends from the NRC tipped off the FCC to another DX test. (See 5/63 issue of EI). KXR, KYR, and KABS (SD outlaws) had 35 watts, but WUMS only 10. New v/q-WSM & KGEM. v/1- KTWO. KPUB sent typed memo (187 days). KTWO say they have an application in for 1030 kcs. 73

One of my projects the last month has been to compile and correlate data on Down Under reception in North America. The information was gathered from NRC ('62-'65) and IRCA ('64-'65) bulletine. The results obtained agree, on the whole, with HTT's verification info presented by Gordon Nelson. I have split the figures into 3 categories - North American (all loggings), reception east of the Mississippi, and my own data for 1964 and 1965. The numbers represent the number of stations heard during the month in question.

Randy Seaver (cont'd) for reception in Western NA are Feb., June or July, and October. For ENA, the best month appears to be February, especially the middle 2 weeks. All South Pacific loggings in ECNA were of ZCO-1020, usually through KGBS on MM. The 4 Zedders heard ECNA in Feb are 2YC-660, 4YA-780, 1YC-880, and 1ZD-1000. The only Aussies reported there were 4QN-630, 2BL-740, 3GI-830, 4RK-840, 2UE-950. In my own case, I haven't heard a DU in October, the month with the most stations and most instances heard. The vernal equinox period peak is rounded quite possibly due to excellent conditions in both hemispheres. It is also possible that the summer low is due in the main to DXer's inactivity. (Certainly so for WC, but not the East, Randy;kgs). The October peak might be attributed to the good conditions in NA and the late summer (late Jan-March) experienced in the Australian area (EC of Austr. has weather similar to Southern Calif.). The summer conditions in the S. Pacific then take over from Nov-Jan. For those in the east, these channels are partially clear MMs: 660, 780, 840, 880, 1000, 1020. Lastly, I have a request to make: To get meaningful results, I need data from a number of DXers in different areas. At the present time, I have only my own and Gray's loggings at hand, plus those I gleaned from the bulletin. So, if you're sitting at the receiver some Tuesday night looking for Caroline Island on 1570, and need something to do while waiting for an ID, how about writing up a list of DUs you heard and the days you heard them. I'd sure appreciate it. 73. (It'd also be nice to get some general information on patterns of reception of NA stations from our New Zealand members;kgs)

Hi, DXers. A lot has happened here in the way of DXing since I last wrote to the Forum last spring. I have moved to a new address which is somewhat closer to the District than old one. This means more interference from D.C. stns, but actually I can now get all the even-frequencies, which was impossible in the old house because of interference from a close local. I set up a 90' long wire and built a 15' loop antenna. The loop has great selectivity, but at times its sensitivity needed a boost. I found I got the best results when I hitched the loop and the long wire together simultaneously. This eliminated most of the null of the loop but the increase in sensitivity was fantastic! I first tried out the system during the daytime around noon, and in came CBF, WSM, WMAQ, WLW, WGN, WJR, WOSU, WHAS, WLS, CBM, AND WBZ with up to strong signals! Using the longwire alone produced images and tuning instability on most of these frequencies, so I consider the loop a tremendous addition to my equipment. Now getting down to DX. I have hrd so many new stns that I cannot list them all here. Miami, 24 hrs(off 2400 MM). WMIE-1140 Miami, 24 hrs (off 0100 MM). ϕ WKWF-1600 Key West, 2400-0600. All but WFAB above are being jammed by Cuba. OK, let's see what else I have in the files - yes, a survey of daytime rx in Miami. Several members have shown theirs in past issues, and mine should be all the more fascinating. - 610 XEGS Guasave, MEXICO was heard well on RS 11/16 at 0755 and also on other mornings. (DE)
- 615 ???? An UnID station was logged here at 2000 on 11/18. IDed as La Voz de Progreso and Radio Nacional in Nicaragua. Who is this please? (IA) (YNM in Managua with 10 kws. - ed)
- 620 Enugu, NIGERIA is where Continental Electronics is currently installing a 500 kw. transmitter for the Eastern Nigeria Bcstg. Svc. to be used on this frequency. It should be ready to go on the air before the end of the year according to Continental. (GK)
- 625 TIRICA San Jose, COSTA RICA was coming in strong 11/18 at 1928. IDed as La Voz de la Victor. Report sent. (IA) Was very high (S7 as opposed to TGJ's usual S6) 11/22 from 2330-0003 s/off. Now 50 kws.? (RJS)
- 630 CMHQ Santa Clara, CUBA was heard poorly SM 11/21 with KHOW off u/ and o/ KXOK. (DE)
- 654 ???? An UnID SS s/off at 2324 11/15 with an unfamiliar NA. I heard one ID, which sounded like "Radio Mil ...", which doesn't make sense. Does Radio Universal in the Dominican Republic s/off about this time, Ed? (LBG) (S/off on 11/23 was at 2325 with the Dominican NA, Larry. They also used a jingle with frequent references to "cinco mil watos"; your ID? I note that the NRC is still reporting La Voz de San Isidro around this frequency although Radio Universal and Santo Domingo were definitely mentioned on this date. Two separate stations? - ed)
- ???? The oriental here had a fair signal 11/20 at 0803. Pyongyang on 655 is always stronger. (LBG)
- 655 YSS San Salvador, EL SALVADOR was logged with a good signal 11/9 at 2055. Tape sent. (IA)
- 665 Bodensee, WEST GERMANY is almost certainly the TA noted here 11/23 with a good carrier level but only a little audio. Believe it had the piano IS from 2340-2345. Not enough for a report. One of these days! (ELK)
- 705 ???? The oriental here had a good signal at 0753 on 11/20 but it wasn't audible at ID time. (LBG)
- 710 ???? An UnID LA was heard 11/22 at 0515 with KMPC off. Cuba or a YV? (RJS)
- 720 Colon, CUBA was heard 11/10 at 1925 u/ WGN. (RBC)
- 737 Barcelona, SPAIN was in well at 0130 on 11/20. A man and a woman were talking; news maybe. (RB)
- 750 KFQD Anchorage, ALASKA was noted here on 11/17 at 0600 o/u WSB. (JO)
- Port Maria, JAMAICA was logged 11/22 from 0442-0456 for my annual try for a verie; will try a tape this time. Seemed to repeat the s/cn programs twice with incorrect time signals each time! (ELK) Was logged 11/17 o/u WSB at 0600 briefly. (JO)
- 755 Lisbon, PORTUGAL had a positively fantastic signal 11/23 from 1828-1830 with the "Voice of the West" program. (ELK)
- 764 Sottens, SWITZERLAND had an S9+10 db signal around 0130 on 11/20. It had almost uninterrupted western style music. There was a deep fade at 0140, but it came back nicely at 0145. (RB)
- 773 ???? A station was heard testing around this frequency. One night I caught it going off at 2159 so it can't be Cairo. Best bet would be the "pirate Radio 390, and a query letter has been sent. (CMS)
- 782 CSB9 Miramar, PORTUGAL was noted very loud in PP on 11/15 from 0218-0232. (R)
- 799 Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA was heard // to 635 on 11/22 at 0350. (RJS)
- 810 WKVM San Juan, PUERTO RICO was logged 11/9 at 1918 during the big blackout. WGY was virtually nonexistent. (LA)

- 810 ???? I heard two stations along with CHQR 11/21 that may have been the AFRS outlets in Japan and Alaska. One of them played R&R music and the other had a recorded program that gave a plug for Changing Times at 0845. Reception of both was best at 0840-0855 when KGO s/on its carrier. I doubt that KCMO would be in at this time. (LBG)
- 818 Batra, EGYPT/UAR was noted 11/19 at 1845 with S9 signals. It had typical Arabic programming. I also heard a very weak signal behind them; probably Andorra. (RB) Noted with a good signal 11/23 at 2303. (ELK)
- 830 JOBB Osaka, JAPAN was in very well at s/on 1000 on 11/16. The call was given just prior to the time pips and the NA immediately followed. (LBG)
- 834 Belize, BRITISH HONDURAS was very strong 11/8 at 1900. Reported. (LA)
- 850 Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA was taped with a loud KCBC time signal 11/14 at 0600. On replay I heard the usual North Korean pips, but also 5 pips and 1 tone underneath. Not tape print-through! China here too! (KGS)
- KICY Nome, ALASKA was logged on 10/15 at 0530. (JO)
- ???? An oriental was noted here SM 11/21 around 0500. Poor signal. Is this Pycngyang? (DE) (Sound likely - ed)
- 860 XEÐU Durango, MEXICO was heard very well SM 11/21 at 0741 and other mornings also. In the clear and the signal was terrific from about 0700. What's the power; surely not 1 kw.? (DE) (As far as I know it's 1 kw. - ed)
- ???? Possibly a Japanese station here. Taped at 0457-0502 on 11/14. Single pip then fanfare on the hour. (KGS)
- 880 JOPK Shizuoka, JAPAN was heard // to 840 on 11/15 from 0402-0413. (KGS)
- 908 Brookmans Park, ENGLAND had a stock report around 0140 on 11/20. Strong S9+25 db signal with good audio. Home Service. (RB)
- 935 Agadir, MOROCCO was noted around 0150 on 11/20. Fair strength but poor audio because of CBM. (RB)
- 950 JOKR Tokyo, JAPAN sent an unsigned an undated, but nice, QSL. Tokyo Bcstg. System, Akasaka, Tokyo. (KGS)
- 965A ???? On 10/15 at 0735 I heard a woman speaking in Cantonese overriding WDAY on 970. Not Radio Peking. (JO)
- 965 ???? Possibly Nicaragua was heard here 11/16 at 0605. Presumably it had just signed on. (RJS)
- 973 Yuzhno-Sakhalinsk, ASIATIC SFSR was heard in Russian and seemed to be in // to SW outlets on 4996 and 5015 on 11/15 from 0413-0425. It faded a lot. (KGS)
- 1008 Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA is the one here, I am 99% sure. At 0800 on 11/21 I heard the 3 pip and note IS (which is distinctly different than the NHK and KBS IS's which are 3 pips followed by a melodic tone), and the program at 0810 seemed to be // to 876. (LBG)
- 1025 TIAC San Jose, COSTA RICA IDed as Radio Ides at 0618 on 11/15 with a good signal. (LBG) Had a beautiful signal 11/16 at 0558-0603 s/on. (RJS)
- ???? On 11/16 from 0022-0044 I had a station here that I suspect was a TA. The language didn't sound like SS and I think Radio Fides signed off earlier. (LBG)
- 1034 Tallinn, ESTONIAN SSR had a beautiful signal 11/16 from 0000-0130! A little CSB2 QRM. Can't get much detail translated but a tape of the news at 0000 was sent. CSB2 was loud on 11/15 - Tallinn was almost alone the next two nights! (KGS)
- CSB2 Pareded, PORTUGAL was logged in EE and FF with news at 2000 on 11/8. (L)
- ???? This frequency really opened up 11/15 from 2300-0115 on 11/16. I have many tapes of the program but I can't tell if the language is PP or perhaps Russian. I might have had two stations as after 0032 the signal was quite weak and then picked up at 0101-0104. On the evening of 11/16 as early as 2300 the signal was fairly strong and at 2309 a woman said something that sounded like "aqui estamos ..." which would point to SS or perhaps PP. The signal was also good 11/18 at 2303 but it faded early. (LBG)
- 1040 Radio Peking, CHINA is fairly regular again. Noted 10/15 at 0810. (JO)

- 1040 KHVE Honolulu, HAWAII was ruined three MMs in a row by Radio Peking at their 0430 s/on with anthem. Still need a good ID for my tape. (DE)
- 1043 ???? Another TA signal was strong here 11/15 from 2303 to past 0135 on 11/16. Most of the program was music; when the announcer spoke the signal always seemed to fade, It was also fairly strong the evening of 11/17 but it was gone by 0030. (LBG)
- 1048 ???? Another oriental mystery is here. Heard fairly well 11/21 at 0801. (LBG)
- 1060 HLKX Inchon, SOUTH KOREA was very strong MM 11/15 from 0500-0532. The program was religious and in EE, featuring Bible verses, hymns etc.. At 0530 a man spoke in a language I presume was Korean and spoke the call letters "H-L-K-X" in EE. Incidentally, there was slight interference from another Radio Peking outlet - heard with IS at 0500. (LBG)
- 1088 Droitwich, ENGLAND was noted with news at 0200 on 11/20. Home Svc.. (RB)
- 1100 HJAT Barranquilla, COLOMBIA was presumably the one heard with WKYC-like signal at 0338 and all through the morning of 11/8. Believe it IDs as Radio Rel Power? (JPN) (ID is correct, and power is 1 kw. - ed)
- 1123 ???? The mystery oriental was in well SM 11/21 and seemed to be // to 843 at 0804 but not at 0818. At least I would say the announcer's voice was the same on both frequencies. (LBG)
- 1124 EAJ15 Barcelona, SPAIN was logged for a report 11/22 from 0100 $\frac{1}{2}$ (apparent s/on) -0123. Nice signal and two positive IDs. (ELK)
- 1125 ???? Another oriental is here; easily separable from 1123. No ID yet although it had a fair signal 11/21 at 0812. (LBG)
- 1133 Radio London, INTERNATIONAL WATERS was logged for a taped report 11/22 from 0227-0242. Positive ID noted at 0230 before the news report. (ELK)
- 1140 ???? An UnID oriental was heard here on 11/22 at 0308 and at 0502. JOBR? Larry, do you have jamming noise here? (RJS) (Randy, I presume that you know that there's a Cuban jammer for WMIE here? - ed)
- 1156 Radio Americas - While I'm not saying that this one is necessarily aboard ship, if it were a weather ship complete with helium balloons, 1000' cables and the whole bit, it would be the ideal cover. A weather ship would operate from a more or less fixed position. (CMS)
- 1178 Okinawa, RYUKYU ISLANDS (US TRUST.) was noted on 10/15 with an S5 signal at 0700; then with an S2 signal later. Antenna change? (JO)
- 1196 Munich, WEST GERMANY was heard 11/16 at 1711 with news in special EE. (RB)
- 1200 YVOZ Caracas, VENEZUELA is probably the station with the time check heard here in SS. CMDE is too weak at 250 watts. What's YVOZ's power? The station was noted with very good signals on 11/8 at 0335. (JPN) (YVOZ runs 10 kws., John, but I don't recall them running AN or signing on this early. I suspect you may have had the Cuban - ed)
- 1205 Bordeaux, FRANCE was heard 11/15 at 0025 and 0048 with FF broadcasts. Very weak signal. (RBC) Was logged here on 11/10 at 2011 with a fair signal. Report sent. (IA) (Is this time correct, Lawson? - ed)
- 1210 KZOO Honolulu, HAWAII was in briefly on 10/15 at 0430. So apparently the s/off is not 0300 as was stated. (JO)
- 1214 The Light Program - Audio was in until past 0304 and the carrier to 0338 on 11/15. News at 0130. Nice. (KGS) Surely this was the station I heard 11/16 from 0030-0101. At 0034 I heard the announcer's name given and also the name of the program, so I am again sending a tentative report to the BBC. I received a reply to my tentative of 10/22 in the form of one of their cards; on the back of which a check mark was placed by "You probably heard one of our transmissions but the information you give does not entirely confirm this". - 1220 XEB Mexico City, MEXICO was heard on 11/15 at 0032 with WGAR off. Strong signal. (RBC) Was heard with SS musica tropical on 11/14 (A Sunday morning not a MM) at 0149 only briefly. Power? (JPN) (50 kws. - ed)

- 1235 ZBML Hamilton, BERMUDA was logged on 10/19 at 0600 and on 10/18 at 0500 with hurricane reports. (JO)
- 1250 Vladivostok, ASIATIC SFSR was noted for the first time this year (first time I've tried, hi!) on 11/21 at 0440. (RJS)
- 1285 Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA is, I believe, the oriental here as it seemed to be // to 785 on 11/15 at 0553 and at 0620. (LBG) Was presumably the UnID oriental heard 11/22 at 0450. Music at that time. Thanks to a tip from Larry Godwin. (RJS)
- 1290 JOHR Sapporo, JAPAN was probably the UnID oriental I had traces of on 11/22 from 0455-0500. (RJS)
- 1307 Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA is the location of this one, I think, as it was // to 785 at 0553 on 11/15 although it was not // at 0620. (LBG)
- 1439 Marnach, LUXEMBOURG was very strong on 11/16 at 1832 with EE and R&R music. Report sent. (LA)
- 1460 (?), JAPAN - I taped the Japanese station noted here at 0426-0431 on 11/15 but I can't get an ID. It was 50% readable to past 0500. (KGS)
- 1466 ???? A TA was noted here on 11/15 at 0200 with a man talking. It was very weak so the language was not IDed. Monaco hopefully. (KGS)
- 1470 (?), JAPAN - NHK2 - This is the first time I've logged this batch. They were // to 1370 with lessons on 11/15 from 0430-0446. (KGS)
- 1578A HJAY Galapa, COLOMBIA probably was the good SS here which seemed to ID as La Voz de la Cordialidad at 0345 on 11/22. Frequency? (RJS) (Listed to 1580, Randy, but drifting here - ed)

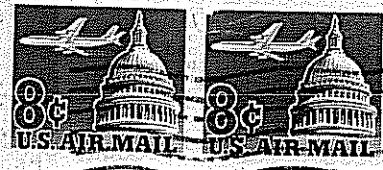
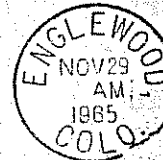
