(Mike Hunter's report continued)- Dr. Frank Conrad ran 8XK, the forerunner of KDKA in his garage. His antenna was mounted on a pole about the size of a typical 2 way radio installation. WWJ began broadcasting on Aug. 20, 1920, and was operated by the Detroit News. At about the same time, WHA was started at the U. of Wisc. This was the first station to broadcast educational programs. WEAJ, now WNBC, ran its first program on Aug. 16, 1922. 12 days later, it ran the first commercially sponsored program. On Jan. 4, 1923 the first simultaneous broadcasting by two telephone connected stations was performed by WEAJ and WJAC Boston. The first commercial network was established between WEAJ & WJAR, Providence. Note that WJAR is still a NBC affiliate. In 1947 there were 1298 stations in the U.S. Of these, 167 were NBC affiliates. The NBC net was (by states) Washington: KOMO & KHQ. Oregon KGW & KMED. Calif. KCRA, KNBC, KMJ, KERO, KIST, KFI, KFSD. Hawaii KGU. Manila KZRN. Nev. KOH. Idaho KIDO, KTFI, KSEI. N.M. KOB. Colo. KOA. Neb. KODY & WOW. Kansas KWEW, KANS & KOAM. Okla. KVOO & WKY. Texas KGNC, WFAA-WBAP, KTSM, KPBC, WOAI, KRIS & KRGV. Iowa WHO & WOC. Mo. WDAF, KSD & KGBX. Ark. KARK. Ala. WBRC, WALA & WSFA. Ky WAVE. Ohio WSPD, WTAM, WLOK, WHIZ & WLV. Fla. WIOD, WFLA, WIAK, WODZ, WJAX & WCOA. Pa. WORK, WGAL, WKBO, WJAC, KYW, WRAP, WFBG, KDKA, WMRF, WBSN, WAZL, WEST, WBRB & WRAK. Mass. WBZ & WBZA. (This is not the complete list, but only that of states of possible interest to members). I found it interesting to note that CBL, CBE & CBF were NBC affiliates. Many of these stations are still NBC stations. The first audience of KDKA was approximately 500 persons. This was for a regular schedule program (the Harding-Cox returns). Hows that for coverage? Many stations were, and still are for that matter, operated by colleges. Such famous stations as WHA (U. of Wisc.), KOAC (Ore. State), WOBU (Ohio State), WILL (U. of Ill.), WOI (Iowa State), WSUI (U. of Iowa) & WKAR (Mich. State). A lot of collegex stations were carrier current stations, or stations that used a wire rather than an antenna in order to restrict the signal to the campus. Other were run by religious organizations such as WMBI, Chicago. A few stations were run by city school systems and by the city itself. WNYC is such a station. As a last note, on the subject of stations that share time, I read that WIS & WENR shared time. When did this arrangement end? I hope that some of these bits of information prove interesting to someone, and that Steve will forgive me for the blisters he will probably get typing this mess. Source of information for this were Behind Your Radio Dial, published by NBC & Foundations in Broadcasting by Edgar E. Willis. In Richard Cooper's DXF report I notice that he was talking about the poor reports sent to radio stations. I think that it would be a good idea to furnish some of the large stations that give mem-com names to us with those sheets that say how to send a good reception report. I know that when I sent my first few reports that I didn't have the slightest idea about what I was doing. By these stations sending these back to the DXer (ahem) who sent it, it might improve both the DXer himself, and help a good DXer get a verie that he might not get if the station gets sick of crummy reports. 73. Re Howie Modell's "Open Letter to the Members" on page 7 of the 12/4 issue, my Proposal 2.1-36("Individual members of the Board may not be criticised for their manner of voting") was intended to protect the individual directors from unethical criticism, however it seems that I didn't state the proposal clearly enough, so its defeat would be a wise move on the part of the BoD. In March, 1941, most stations in the US, Canada, Mexico and Cuba changed their frequencies to comply with the new NARBA treaty recently signed in Habana. Before that eventful day in radio history, a somewhat different system of allocations existed. The BCB then consisted of 96 channels, from 550 to 1500 kc/s, of which 46 were clear, 6 local, 4 high-powered regional, and 40 regional. Of the clear channels, 40 were American and 6, Canadian. The United States was divided into five Zones with 8 clear channels assigned to each:

The "graveyard" frequencies were 1200, 1210, 1310, 1370, 1420, and 1500 kcs. Maximum power was 250 watts day and 100 watts night. Regional frequencies were 550-630, 780, 880-900, 920-950, 1010, 1120, 1220-1300, 1320-1360, 1380-1410, 1430-1450 kcs. Maximum power was 5 kw. day and 1 kw. night. Stations on 1010 kcs. were moved to clear channels in 1941. Four experimental stations operated beyond 1500 kcs.:

And that's how radio was back in the 30's, almost every city having a station sharing time with another. Brooklyn had 6 stations of its own, of which 5 shared time on 2 frequencies, 4 on one of them! Present FCC policy seems to be to have all stations operate on the same frequency at the same time, hi.

- 650 KORL Honolulu, HAWAII was noted here 12/5 at 0200. Still too weak for a report however. (LM)
- YVQO Puerto la Cruz, VENEZUELA had an excellent signal 12/17 from 2149-2150 with an ID as Ondas Portenas. (LBG)
- 670 JOBK Osaka, JAPAN was noted 12/10 with an excellent signal. Reported to NHK HQ in Tokyo in lieu of Osaka, as previously JOIB-750 forwarded a postcard and no verie. (LM)
- 690 ???? An unknown SS was noted u/ CBF on 12/12. (RAV) (Probably CMBC - ed)
- 720 KUAI Eleele, HAWAII was on the air by at least 0929 on 12/18; perhaps s/on is 0900. The Radio Peking outlet is usually on top through 1015 fade out. (LBG) Barely made it here on 12/4 at 0300. (LM) (I believe this call and location are correct, Len - ed)
- CM.. Colon, CUBA fights it out with WGN every night here. (RAV)
- 750 ???? An UnID SS was heard on this frequency or 745 at 2250 on 12/10. (RAV)
- 760 ???? MM 12/13 at 1517 an SS IDed as Radio Reloj but gave the time as EST + 1 hour. Did Cuba change time zones? (LBG)
- ???? An UnID SS was logged u/ WJR on 12/10. Very weak however. (RAV)
- 773 .... San Sebastian, SPAIN was the location given for this RNE outlet on 12/20 at 0200 to substantiate reports by NRC listeners. They seem to also have increased power as they are now very strong. (ELK)
- 775 TIW San Jose, COSTA RICA was probably the strong SS here 12/17 at 2316. I heard several commercials but no ID. (LBG)
- 780 ???? I have been hearing a station here I suspect is the Philippines from 1003 (when JOIU s/off) until 1035 daily. On 12/13 at 1008 and on 12/17 at 1013 I heard a commercial for a featherweight championship fight to take place on 12/18, giving the fighters' names etc. I checked with local newspaper offices for news of this fight, but none was available; however I did learn that frequently there are fights in the Philippines on Saturday nights (12/18 was a Saturday). Following the fight commercial I heard one in SS for transistor radios with prices given in a monetary unit that sounded like "kapatinka"; the unit in the Philippines is the peso, but the SS-EE combination highly suggests the Philippines. Finally 12/18 at 1015 a man gave what sounded like a call, DXQY or D-Zed-QY; the only D's listed are DXCC, DZAB and DZBT. (L)
- ???? I noted SS music u/ WBBM at 2235 on 12/10; is this CMHB? (RAV)
- 782 CSB9 Miramar, PORTUGAL was likely the station with time pips 12/17 at 0200. The signal was quite weak. (LBG)
- 800 PJB Bonaire, NETH, ANTILLES is "killing" CKLW lately around 2200. (RAV)
- 810 ???? I noted an UnID SS u/ WGY; possibly WKVM. Are there any Cubans on this frequency? (RAV) (Yes, but WKVM is a good possibility. - ed)
- 830 3GI Sale, AUSTRALIA was logged back on 9/27 at 0600 with ABC News. (RH)
- ???? I note an UnID SS u/ WCCO, but they are terribly weak. (RAV)
- 840 4RK Rockhampton, AUSTRALIA was the only Aussie audible 12/18 but it was quite strong. At s/off at 0906 the calls frequencies and locations of all regional stations were given, followed by GSQ. (LBG)
- HJBI Santa Marta, COLOMBIA concluded a weekly program entitled "Discoteca Panamericana" 12/13 at 0603, followed by an ID as Ondas del Caribe. It was completely atop WHAS 12/17 at 2154. (LBG)
- 2XB Masterson, NEW ZEALAND was logged 9/18 from 0418-0425. R&R music. (RH)
- Sent an NZBC QSL card and letter signed by R. B. Sabiston, Senior Technician, for my tentative report of 10/4. Apparently the station had received only 2 previous reports from the US. 2 kws.. (LBG)
- 850 JOTK Matsue, JAPAN was logged 10/5 at 0633 with US popular music. (RH)
- .... Pyongyang, NORTH KOREA is heard every AM around 0800 with S9 signals or better. (RH)
- 870 HCN22 Guayaquil, ECUADOR was noted 12/19 at 0216 with a Radio Cristal ID. They were on top of the jammer with their best signal this season, but unneeded here. (ELK)

- 870 ???? I note an UnID SS here; is this the Puerto Rican, WWL, or the Cuban? (RAV) (Depending on the time, I'd strongly suspect WWL - ed)
- 875 TISS San Jose, COSTA RICA was logged 10/25 at 2101 with an ID. (RH)
- 880 .... Radio Peking, CHINA is heard every AM from 0700-0900. (RH)
- JOPK Shizuoka, JAPAN was logged 12/5 from 0405-0430. S9 signal. (RH)
- 881 .... Washford, WALES became a new country verified thanks to a personal letter from H. D. P. Bambridge for my tentative report of 10/21. He enclosed a handy plastic card-list of BBC stations, and returned my tape. Though I sent the report to Wales, the verie came from the London office. (LBG)
- 890 HLKB Pusan, SOUTH KOREA was logged 10/3 at 0330 with time pips. Was IDed as such by a JJ friend who helps me ID most TPs. (RH)
- 910 4QB Maryborough, AUSTRALIA was logged 9/27 with ABC News at 0600. IDed. (RH)
- JO?? (?) , JAPAN was logged 10/5. Was definite per my friend, but I couldn't catch any IDs. (RH) (JOCB, Nagoya the only one listed here - ed)

- 950 KIBH Seward, ALASKA is heard every PM from 0700 on to s/off at 0300. Operatin sked is 1700-0300. (RH)
- 2UE Sydney, AUSTRALIA was logged 9/27 from 0513-0516 and can be heard occasionally on MM only. (RH)
- JOKR Tokyo, JAPAN was first logged 9/20 from 0343-0355. Can be heard every MM after 0400 with little or no QRM. (RH)
- 960 .... Kodiak, ALASKA can be heard every AM from 0600-1200 and later (PST). Best signal around 0900 PST. QRM from CFAC and KALE. (RH)
- 962 ???? An UnID station, presumably TA, was noted here 12/19 from 0201-0215 with classical music. Quite high at times, but no language heard. Probably Tunis, but I'd like Turku. (ELK)
- 970 HLCA Seoul, SOUTH KOREA was first logged in October and can be heard every AM from about 0400-0900. QRM from KREM. (RH)
- KPUA Hilo, HAWAII was first noted with this new call 12/5 and can be heard most AMs at s/off at 0500. (RH)
- 1004 XECL Mexicali, MEXICO was noted drifting here 12/16 at 0855; from 990. The ID as Radio Mexicali was repeated after every record. (LBG)
- 1010 JONR Osaka, JAPAN was logged 9/22 at 0432 and can be heard every Friday AM with CBR off. (RH)
- 4IP Ipswich, AUSTRALIA was logged 11/1 at 0333 with horse races. (RH)
- 1020 2KY Sydney, AUSTRALIA was logged 9/18 from 0400-0403 with Rugby results, then a phone number was given. (RH)
- YVQB Cumana, VENEZUELA was probably the Venezuelan here 12/18 at 0845 atop KDKA IDing as Radio Rumbos network. Does this coincide with the info you have, Ed? (LBG) (Perfectly, Larry - ed)
- .... Radio Peking, CHINA was logged 12/13 at 0515. (RH)
- 1030 3DB Melbourne, AUSTRALIA was logged 9/18 from 0430-0433. Weather forecast then R&R music. Has been heard upon occasion since then at about the same time. Verified with an oversized QSL. (RH)
- 1034 CSB2 Parede, PORTUGAL was probably the station giving 6 pips (seemed identical to ABC pips) at 2300 on 12/16. The signal was quite good through 0030 or so. (LBG)
- 1040 4ZB Dunedin, NEW ZEALAND was logged on 9/18 from 0630-0643. News, then Top 40 music. Heard occasionally at this time. (RH)
- 1043 .... Dresden, EAST GERMANY was likely the strong TA here 12/16 from 2300-0000. The voice was rather poor, and I can't tell if the language on my

- 1090 JOHB Sendai, JAPAN was logged 9/20 at 0335 // to 1320, 1360, 1370, 1510. (RH)
- 1100 3ZB Christchurch, NEW ZEALAND was logged 9/18 from 0355-0430. It is heard almost every AM at this time and later. (RH)
- 1110 2UW Sydney, AUSTRALIA was logged 9/18 from 0351-0352. Commercial the R&R music. It is heard almost every AM. (RH)
- 119½ .... Radio Peking, CHINA was atop KMOX at 0150 on 12/15, which was only 1350 in China. What an "upsetting" time to hear this one! (LBG)
- 1120 WVUV Pago Pago, AMERICAN SAMOA was logged 9/18 from 0343-0356. Anyone else have this baby? I bet I logged it before anyone else. (RH)
- .... Radio Peking, CHINA is in every AM after 0600 and is in until at least 0900. (RH) (See also 1119½ - ed)
- 1140 JOBR Kyoto, JAPAN was logged 12/6 at 0410 with plenty of QRM from the Cuban jammer. (RH)
- 1160V .... Radio Americas, SWAN ISLAND comes in softly adjacent to local WCOP. (RAV)
- 1178 .... Okinawa, RYUKYU IS. (US TRUST.) IDs simply "This is the Voice of America. The following broadcast is in Korean." No CGO was played and the location was not given. Every AM at 0915 the station plays 3 tones and at 0930 the full ID is given followed by a near complete fade out. (C)
- 1180 ???? A USSR station was logged 11/6 at 0630 with Kremlin bells then a theme song. Could it be the VOA; but then what would they be playing the Kremlin bells for? No listing in WRTVH. (RH) (Nor in the Summer Supplement FBIS-1965 or the latest EBU listings - ed)
- 1190 JOCB Niigata, JAPAN is in every Sunday AM after KEX s/off at 0500. Usually with an S5-9 signal. (RH)
- 1214 .... The Light Program was fairly strong 12/17 at 0130 when I heard a weatherforecast for England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Still no verie yet. (LBG)
- 1220 XEB Mexico City, MEXICO puts up a good battle with WCAR here. (RAV)
- 1235 ZBML Hamilton, BERMUDA was logged with a beautiful signal at 0159 on 11/29. Report sent. (RAV)
- 1250 2DU Dubbo, AUSTRALIA was logged 9/20 at 0420 with a spot for a restaurant. Really fighting it out with the USSR station. (RH)
- 1260 JOIR Sendai, JAPAN was logged on 9/20 at 0354. It has been heard on MMs occasionally since then. (RH)
- 3SR Shepparton, AUSTRALIA was logged 9/27 at 0740 with a soap opera. (RH)
- 1270 KBYR Anchorage, ALASKA is heard every AM from 0300 to s/off at 0500. They play C&W music. (RH)
- 2SM Sydney, AUSTRALIA was logged 10/25 from 0518-0520 with R&R music. A QSL was received along with SCs enclosed. (RH)
- 1280 JOHW Sapporo, JAPAN was logged 9/20 from 0328-0330. It was // to JOHR-1290 for obvious reasons. (RH) (Rich, FBIS and PAL show this one as being in Obihiro. Both are owned by Hokkaido Hoso, however - ed)
- 1285 YNRPS Granada, NICARAGUA was noted 12/20 at 2255 with a positive ID as Radio Granada. Good signal; US popular music. (ELK)
- 1290 JOHR Sapporo, JAPAN was logged back on 9/20 from 0328-0330 in // with JOHW. It is heard nearly every AM but it is best on MM when KHSL is off. (RH)
- 1300 JO?? (?), JAPAN-No listing on this in WRTVH, but it was in // with JOKD. It was logged 12/6 from 0359-0400 during the CJME DX test. (RH) (Rich, FBIS lists 7 stations here; JOHP-Takamatsu strongest with 5 kws. - ed)
- 1310 JOLF Tokyo, JAPAN was logged back on 11/29 from 0400-0430. It is heard every MM with S7 signals or better. (RH)
- 1320 JOAZ Nayoro, JAPAN was logged back on 9/20 at 0335 in // with JOKD. (RH)
- 1330 JOSEF Nagoya, JAPAN was logged back on 9/20 at 0418. (RH)
- 1360 JO?? (?), JAPAN was logged back on 9/20 at 0335 in // with JOKD, JOAZ and JOZB. This frequency appears to be one of Japan's graveyard channels, so what did I hear? (RH)
- 1380 KPOI Honolulu, HAWAII is heard every AM after 0300 way under KRKO. It was first logged on 11/6. (RH)

- 1390 JOJB Kanazawa, JAPAN was logged 9/20 at 0335 in // with JOKD etc.. No listing in WRTVH, so who is it? (RH) (Rich, WRTVH-65 and FBIS both list this one as being the only JJ here - ed)
- 1400 .... Noumea, NEW CALEDONIA was logged back on 10/24 from 0230-0240. ID in FF, then a discussion program of some sort. Drool everybody. Bet I'm the first to hear this baby, right? (RH)
- 2PK Parkes, AUSTRALIA was logged back on 11/6 at 0608 with horse races. Again I say drool. Only 2 kws.! (RH)
- 1410 2KO Newcastle, AUSTRALIA was logged back on 9/27 from 0557-0600. Top 40 music with many spots. Report sent, but still unanswered. (RH)
- 1420 3XY Melbourne, AUSTRALIA was logged back on 9/20 at 0416 with a soap opera. (RH)
- 1440 1XA Kaitaia, NEW ZEALAND was logged back on 10/25 from 0528-0530. (RH)
- 1450 2MG Mudgee, AUSTRALIA was logged back on 10/29 at 0310, and that's early for DUs; it's only 1810 AEST. (RH)
- KLAM Cordova, ALASKA was logged 11/14 at 0306 s/off. Bet I'm the only one who's heard this one. About 500 miles NW of here. (RH)
- JOKF Takamatsu, JAPAN was logged back on 9/20 at 0400 with an ID. It is heard at times on MMs about this time. (RH)
- 1460 JOUO Saga, JAPAN was logged back on 9/20 at 0408 with US R&R music. (RH) (Rich, both FBIS and PAL indicate this location; not Nagasaki - ed)

- 1510 JOZB Matsuyama, JAPAN was logged back on 9/20 at 0335 in // with JOKD etc.. (RH)
- 1530 2VM Moree, AUSTRALIA was logged back on 9/27 from 0550-0552. It has been heard occasionally since then. Best time is on MM at 0630 or so. (RH)
- 1560 2RE Taree, AUSTRALIA was logged back on 9/27 from 0530-0533 with the end of a soap opera, a couple of spots, the weather, and an ID. A report was sent. It is heard nearly every AM now around 0600. (RH)
- 1580 2WN Wollongong, AUSTRALIA was logged 9/18 from 0411-0412 with a report on rugby matches. A verie was finally received around the middle of November. They said mine was the furthest report in the station's history. I'm only 8000 miles away, hi!
