Hello from the land of domestic DX. We can't all have everything! e.i. TA, TP! Conditions in the past month are the best I've ever heard, I have more than 100 new loggings since 12/1/65. I've also DXed a bit below 680 kcs. My good RX works from 680 to 1610 but my RCA works 540-680! It doesn't have a loop, which I am used to, so it seems rather poor. I am building an IRCA Loop, and have put up 3 new l.w. antennas. I found (by research; not experimentation, hi) that a short (around 50') l.w. when end-fed, is directional to the end it is fed from. I now have fixed antennas with best reception East, NW, SE, N, and N-S. Also a loop! Anyone who doesn't have a loop: you don't know what you're missing! Regional channels seem more like clear-channels with one, since you can separate stations completely at times. Someone mentioned that National NC-121's were on sale at B-A. I have one, and don't recommend them to anyone. The only good thing is its high selectivity, which is no substitute for image rejection and sensitivity. Above 15 mc, the only signals are images from WIBW-TV, our TV's oscillator(s), and a few local hams and CB'ers. It can't get WWV on 15 or 20 mc. at any time. I better get down to DX now, hi. States and Provinces

For those of you needing to build up states and provinces totals, here's a list of stations that may help. One or two stations are given for each state; these stations are those which usually are heard at the greater distances. Of course, your local interference may make some of these impossible, or there may be easier logs if you live close to the state or province needed. I haven't always chosen the strongest station from the state (eg. KFI, 640 would get out best from California, probably, but CHQ makes it tough in the east; KRDS may surprise you, but they're one of the most often heard Arizonans to the east). The underlined stations are easy ones, ones every member should have heard, so that's 20 to start with. Some of the western states will be easier when the new class II-A stations commence operation (KSWS-1020 is on now). But, unless you are close, there are a lot of tough ones in the list (like CHAK and CFWH and WKVM). By the way, don't confuse CHAK with CFWH, Prince Rupert - both are on 860 kcs. and are CBC. I've also tried to pick stations that verify (hence, KICY is included for Alaska; KFQD is easier, but rarely QSL's). Good luck!

- 540 HJKA Bogota, COLOMBIA, Radio Horizonte, was taped on 12/30 at 0355. Wonderful reception. My first time although I've tried often when CBK has been off. (KGS)
- 670 TGRT Guatemala City, GUATEMALA, Radio Fabulosa, was my previous mystery chime-ID. They were excellent 12/30 from 0030; news at 0046. (KGS)
- 770 ???? An UnID SS station was weak here 1/3 at 0533. I thought he mentioned "Bogota ... cadena", so it might have been HJJX. (LBG)
- 780 YVOD San Cristobal, VENEZUELA was loud and clear at s/on 1/3 at 0458 atop the Cuban. The slogan is Ecos del Torbes. (LBG)
- ???? My mystery Pacific station was in weakly on 1/6 with what sounded like commercials in SS at 1004. No word has yet been received from the Philippines stations I wrote. (LBG)
- 810 WKVM San Juan, PUERTO RICO - I listened many times to my 1/3 tape, from 0435, and I finally deciphered a "transmitan WKVM" ID. Music was good u/ WGY and CHQR (probably). Country #38 heard. (KGS) Is surely RJS's mystery. The slogan seems to be Radio Reporter, and on 1/3 from 0502-0527 I heard a newscast that mentioned items from San Juan and Aguadilla several times. I sent them a tentative report. (LBG)
- 830 XE?? An UnID Mexican station signed off at 2007 on 1/5; probably XENP. (LBG)
- 835 .... (?), CHINA - The winter sunset skip has caught up with the s/on here. The carrier was on at 0358 or 0359, the anthem at 0400. (Poor reception, but I'll try for a good s/on tape.) (KGS)
- 840 4RK Rockhampton, AUSTRALIA was the strongest ever heard on 12/27 at their 0905 s/off. (LBG)
- 843 .... Khon Kaen, THAILAND sent a New Year's card in answer to my tentative report, with no mention of my reception. I sent a f/up this week to Radio Thailand in Bangkok; tentative, of course. (LBG)
- 850 HJKC Bogota, COLOMBIA, Emisora Nuevo Mundo gave a great ID at 0515 on 1/3. Made a fascinating tape. (KGS) Was a powerhouse 1/3 at 0516 when it played the NA (though the s/on was at 0500, I believe) followed by a complete list of all Caracol stations (24 of them). (LBG)
- 879 XETZ Tequilla, MEXICO is tentatively my mystery s/on 12/29 at 0802. The station is listed on 1430 in the Jones Log, but it doesn't appear at all in the FBIS or WRTVH. On replaying my tape I found the announcer said "... transmite desde la bella y alegre ciudad de ???", and the location did sound like Tequilla. Can anyone confirm this? (LBG)
- 885 .... Plymouth, MONTSEERRAT might have been the weak station here 1/3 at 0521, but I couldn't even tell if the language in use was EE. (LBG)
- 890 HJCE Bogota, COLOMBIA was, I think, the station AN 1/3 with an ID at 0418 that sounded like La Voz de Bogota. (LBG)
- YVLW Valencia, VENEZUELA, Radio America, came right through WLS's carrier with an ID at 0515 on 1/3. (LBG)
- 995 HCEW2 Guayaquil, ECUADOR was likely the SS station here 1/3 from 0605-0618, but I couldn't get an ID. I think their s/on was at 0600. (LBG)
- 1000 YNY Managua, NICARAGUA came through KOMO's OC 1/3 at 0558 with two IDs as Radio Mil. The announcer gave the power as 5 kws.. At first I thought it was XEOY (also Radio Mil), but the announcer gave the location as being Managua. (LBG)
- 1030 XEQR Mexico City, MEXICO is in every night. They have an excellent signal, with no trace of WBZ. (LCM)
- 1040 ???? Country & Western music is heard u/ WHO from about 0000-0300 each night, barely audible and intelligible. KHVH? I'm not sure. (LCM)
- 1045 HOJ2 Las Tablas, PANAMA, Ondas del Canajagua, was in well 1/3 at 0447 with an ID. This station is NSP and the best bet for Panama. (LBG) Three or four clear IDs were heard on 12/30 around 0130. (KGS)
- 1088 .... Tirana, ALBANIA verified by QSL card my December 1964 report. A f/up was sent along with my report on their 1358 outlet. (ELK)

- 1160 ??? I had an UnID SS station on 1/3 from 0625-0634, and to me the music sounded Bolivian. It was too late in the morning for reception from Bolivia, however. (LBG) An UnID SS station (probably Guatemala or Mexico, from the loop) was heard with music until KSL's test. This was on 1/3 at 0630. (KGS)
- 1196 .... Munich, WEST GERMANY QSLed in less than 2 weeks. Is this a VOA record? Five card were received for my 5 receptions. Country #22. (KGS)
- 1358 .... Tirana, ALBANIA verified my 11/27-11/28 reception with a fine looking QSL card and a nice letter from the Foreign Language Department of Radio Tirana. They apparently appreciated my tape as they sent along many gorgeous mint stamps. Country #66 verified. (ELK)
- 1420 XE?? A Mexican station to my east was logged on 1/1 from 0340-0415 tune-out. One ID only; "X-E-Double ???" (XEII or an XEW- ?) (KGS)
- 1525 TIEEAW Turrialba, COSTA RICA, Radio Turrialba, was in strong by 0507 MM 1/3, so they might be AN. (LBG) Their music was great, but they faded for most of the IDs on 1/3 from 0530-0615. (KGS)
- 1550 XEBG Tiguana, MEXICO was off all of New Year's Day leaving CBE, KKHI clear at night, and KFIF and KWIC during the day. (LCM)
- 1580 YNE Managua, NICARAGUA might be the SS station I had giving a time check as CST on 1/3 at 0539 and mentioning Managua along with its frequency. (LBG)
- "PIRATES" Radio Scotland opened on 1/1, on 1241 kcs., and is scheduled from 0100-1235 (Sundays 0300) and 1530-2100. They operate from the ex-light-ship "Comet" 3½ miles off the East Schottisch Coast. Reports are requested, and they promise to reply by card and technical data. Their address is: Technical Controller, Radio Scotland, 38 Bath Street, Glasgow, C 2, Scotland. They also have a London sales office at Royalty House, Dean Street, W 1, but reports are requested to the former address. They operate with 10-20 kws., but intend to go to 50 kws.. (This will probably never become a reality. Like all other "pirate" stations, they have a 50 kw. transmitter onboard, but the power supply is too small to obtain enough power to operate with 50 kws..) (LAR)
- ADEN The 400 kw. BBC African Relay that was forced out of Somalia a few years ago and re-installed on Perim Island is not in operation at present, as it was sabotaged by Egyptians. The BBC relay on 701 is temporarily done with a 10 kw. transmitter from Aden. Meanwhile it is assumed that it was the Perim Island equipment that was flown into Bechuanaland. (LAR)
- BECHUANALAND A letter from a South African DXer to Sweden Calling DXers confirms that the BBC Central African relay at Francistown is now on the air, but they opened on 12/30 only. They are on SW plus 908, and presently only from 0045-0115, 0515-0630, 1045-1515. They suffer severe QRM from the SABC on 908 and Mozambique on 917, in South Africa, that is. (LAR)
- CHINA The Russian Service for Europe from Radio Peking is relayed at 0700-1600 on 1525. The location of this transmitter is in the western-most part of China according to Deutsche Welle. Another transmitter, also located in China, is relaying the Russian Service from 1000-1200 on 1313. (LAR)
- According to a schedule from Radio Peking, 1190 and 1340 are the main frequencies for the Southeast Asian Service of Radio Peking. The English Service is until 0900. (LAR)
- NETHERLANDS The Third Program was introduced last fall on FM, and since 1/1 also on Hilversum (or rather Lopik) III on 1250, with 5 or 10 kws.. They are scheduled from 0300-1100 or 1200 with light music and news. This is the Dutch national radio's answer to Radio Veronica. Due to the fact that 1250 is NOT assigned to Holland this station is to be called a "pirate" (By whom, Lars? - ed), but Dutch requests were made to the other countries using this frequency, and they got a positive reply.

NETHERLANDS (cont.) However, in order not to interfere with Hungary, the Lopik station operates daytime only: Oct-Febr 0300-0930, March 0300-1100, April 0100-1100, May-July 0100-1300, Aug-Sept 0100-1100. (LAR)

YUGOSLAVIA A new 400 kw. BCB transmitter was recently inaugurated near Belgrade. The frequency is not yet known. (LAR)

From Lars Ryden we have received the following list of the new Spanish frequency plan. It was due to be put into operation last November. According to this plan the REM, CAR, and CES networks share frequencies. The REM and CAR are in fact only one network, as they share staff and technical equipment, but they have different programs as a rule (but also many in common). In the new plan some changes of location and network took place, e.g. EFJ51, Radio Juventud de Ayamonte, went to Huelva, and is now Radio Juventud de Huelva. EFJ1, Radio Juventud de Espana, Madrid, changed to the CES network, etc. In the list all stations heard and identified during the past few months on their new frequencies are marked with an asterisk. In case they do not operate on their assigned frequency, the actual frequency as noted after the change would have taken place is written following the station's name. Note that the old RNE transmitter in Huelva on 836 has been taken over by Radio Juventud de Huelva. This was probably done after the inauguration of the Centro Emisor for that part of Spain. Note also that the local RNE Barcelona station operates on 1178 instead of the planned 854.
