The way I figure it this is a better method because it reduces the chance of splitting the board, the nails would have no more of an effect on the antenna than passing it through the holes and it takes almost no time to wind the antenna. 1. From the Feb. 3 Newsletter comes the word that ANARC could not rouse sufficient support for a convention for 1966, despite our club's offer to share facilities and planning in Milwaukee in August. 2. There has been a suggestion by a BCB DXer that a small network of DXers scattered over the US and Canada be set up whose purpose it would be to receive letters from DXers who have heard a certain station that hasn't answered their reception reports or follow-ups. These volunteers could call the station and find out why it hasn't answered. A listing of volunteers would be printed and sent to those wanting it. The person with the problem would look in the list, pick out the name of the DXer closest to his station and send him a letter, with perhaps money to make the call. Don has asked for comments on this. One comment that I will make is that poor-verifiers will say "Yes, we'll send a QSL right away," and then still do nothing. But with other stations, personal follow-ups are helpful. A BOOK REVIEW!

World Publications, publishers of the WRTVH, etc. have sent several of their latest publications to IRCA for review and for possible sale to the IRCA at 40% discount rates. I believe Larry Godwin will tell us more about the details of the sales. One of the books was the 1966 edition of World Medium Wave Guide, a 68-page listing of BCB stations. Many of us bought the first edition last year; I found it handy for foreign DX, because of the quick reference listing of foreign stations by frequency. This new edition is decidedly improved (eg., the Colombian stations are included this year, and many new stations are listed). The second half of the book has all Canadian and USA stations listed by frequency, city, and frequency. The WMWG does not have the station addresses, etc. that WRTVH has, nor is it as useful to domestic-only DXers, but is still quite worthwhile. Perhaps, as last year, the US BCB clubs can send corrections to WMWG to World Publications, and continue to make it better each year.

Frank Kennedy of Saratoga, California has sent me a 3 page list of exact antenna locations for many Pacific coastal stations. It might be useful for those needing direction finding bearings, Frank suggests. Rather than type the list, I'll make copies for those wanting it (please send me a SASE). Thanks, Frank.

Don Jensen also sent me letter in reference to the Voice of America station heard on 960 kc. in the east. "Rather than a 'freak image' of a SW outlet, I would suggest a new mw relay, using one of the VOA's portable air-transportable transmitters, possibly the one formerly in the Keys. As to location; no idea but would like to see one or more of the fellows do something with DF on this one!" It's a tough frequency for DF, but who can try? What is the schedule? Any announced target area? Does it just say "VOA, Greenville"? Does the transmission time correspond to a SW VOA program? Bill Woodfield recently said he had heard ZFB1 at the same time, eliminating the Bermuda station as a relay of the VOA. VOA has said nothing about it, according to NRC reports to Washington. What gives??

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Encompassed in our club's Constitution and By-laws is the first truly workable foundation of a democratic-style DX club administration of international auspices. When its predecessor was drafted at Denver in 1963 and the final draft made in 1965, its framers developed a document which was to exceed all others in its rights of members, checks and balances, and in general retaining final power in the hands of the individual. Naturally, nothing manmade is flawless, even the finest set of laws have been changed or modified through the years. It is with this in mind that I want to propose to you the most significant change in our Constitution and By-laws.

In the first administration our government suffered from an obvious oversight in these documents--for almost eight months we were without a president. During this period we were for the most part without a binding set of laws, although through informal arrangements we were to abide by the Articles of the proposed Constitution and By-laws adopted at Denver in 1963--however in both there was a provision for both the office of president and a method to deal with vacancies of this office--in these provisions, both the proposed and final drafts were worded exactly the same. The reluctance of the first administration to deal with this matter caused much unnecessary power plays from various administrators; criticism, both warranted and unwarranted, lashed back and forth--unity was more a dream than a reality. All this could have been avoided quite easily.

Now, I am not going to deceive anyone. Being in the armed forces I have no security of being assured the same schedule I now have--so far I have been fortunate to have a schedule quite compatible with any civilian job: Eight hours a day, five days a week. However, with the situation as it is, I cannot even predict what I might be doing one month from now. My primary responsibility lies not with our club but to the service, and I live in constant awareness that at any time I may have to resign from office due to military actions. I do not wish this administration to end in chaos should I be forced to resign--I want continuity in our club, whether I will play a part in it or not.

For this reason, I am asking you the members of our club to support, endorse and work for the passage and adoption of a modification to our Constitution and By-laws calling for the creation of the office of vice president, whose primary purpose will be to succeed the president in his office should the presidency become vacant.

My proposal calls for all candidates for president to name their choice for vice president in time so both names will appear on the ballot for the general elections, with a vote for the presidential candidate being a vote also for his choice for vice president. In my case, should this amendment be adopted, I will choose my vice president at a time soon after the amendment goes into effect.

What complicates this is that to create the office of vice president will require an amendment to the Constitution, which can only be initiated at our annual business meeting. However, I do not believe it to be too early to begin a movement to support the Vice Presidential Amendment. The passage and adoption of the Vice Presidential Amendment is one of the best ways to insure that our club shall always be with a president. May I count on you to support the Vice Presidential Amendment?

(The following is an editorial that appeared in the North American Shortwave Assn.'s bulletin by its Executive Editor, Bill Eddings, entitled "Integrity, You, the Clubs and Hobby." It is reprinted here for its timely message, which I sincerely hope each member will keep in mind and practice throughout our hobby.)

No matter an OM be a serious DXer or a "once-in-awhile" reporter, or just a humble cardswapper, his integrity plays a most important role in the clubs and hobby in which we are connected. On his good name and that of his clubs as well as the hobby

itself greatly depend, regardless he be the eldest oldtimer or the youngest newcomer. Perhaps in no other hobby does it play so very an important part as it does in this with which we are concerned.

Time and again there have been individuals questioned as to their integrity. Others have been doubted justifiably in various instances, not merely in one club, but in many clubs around the world. The integrity of one individual reflects on every club in all of the hobby. Far too few realize all are given equal opportunity to prove themselves in more ways than from mere "head."

In the reports submitted to any section of the bulletin, in those sent to any radio station, the integrity of the reporter is always involved. In the efforts of bulletin staffs, committeemen, BoD members, integrity is the foremost important factor.

We have grown at a fast pace and have many ways become recognized. Integrity has been THE asset which has helped us most. Though we have not been always worldly through the years, we have every way been respected and accepted, again because of our integrity. We have been far more fortunate than others. Even so, we do not claim to be perfect. The size of any club depends not so much on the number of its members, but moreso on the bigness of the heart of each individual member in the way of integrity.

Proposal 2.1-53. Amendment to the IRCA By-laws, to be submitted to the membership for ratification: Article V, Section 2, Part 3, f, to be completely deleted, as it is in direct conflict with Article V, Section 2, Part 3, c, which does not delegate to the Board of Directors the power to appoint chairmen of committees. This action is delegated to the President, and the Election Committee should be no exception."

SPECIAL NOTICE: By-laws amendment proposal 2.1-12 that appeared in the February 5 DX Monitor is in error in its text. The corrected text is as follows:

Proposal 2.1-12. Amendment to the IRCA By-laws, to be submitted to the membership for ratification: Article V, Section 2, Part 3, f, with addition to read: "...In case of a deadlock, the President shall cast the deciding vote."

As you can see, should 2.1-53 be adopted, Article V, Section 2, Part 3, f, will be entirely deleting, thus nullifying any vote all votes for the approval of 2.1-12. "Radio Television Kaduna", in Kaduna, still uses 940 kc. and NOT 593 kc. as mentioned in WRTH '66. (WRB) "Nigerian Broadcasting Corp." has some power changes: (Nat'l programming) 1088 kc has 10 kw; (East) 1320 kc has 250 watts; (North) 1376 has 1 kw, 1397 has 250 watts. (WRB)
