Hi'ya from the jolly old (?) DX hearer. Like usual, I forgot to intro myself for the new members in the anniversary issue. So here goes: I am 17 in the senior year in high school; hope to go to San Diego State College next year. Prob will get a BS degree; and hope to move on towards a PhD in Electronic Engineering. I have been an active DXer since about 3/1/65, then having about 130 stations heard. I now have 523 heard, with about 135 varied, with only 18 countries heard, and 10 varied. Newest stations varied are KJAN-1220, Atlantic, Iowa 250 Watts; KEPS-1270 in Eagle Pass, Texas, 1KW; KVLB-1410, Cleveland, Texas, 500 Watts; KOLS-1570, Pryor, OK, 1,000 Watts, WAKR-1590 Akron, Ohio, 5 KW; XMMW-1270, San Luis, Mexico, 1 KW; and KHER-1600, Santa Maria, CA, 500 Watts. All are pp's, exc. WAKR. I have lately begun using the Frequency Check List, which has brought in 11 new stations in the last 2 weeks for me. Larry says that he might not type it next year, so I think we should all give him a vote of confidence for the F/C List. It would be truly a sad idea to let it fall to the wayside. Thank you to everybody who told me about WCKY's transmitter. Also, thanks to Charles Barnes, and Jack Paton for the long lists of verie signers. It's too bad that the Bd rejected it, though. On the matter of KiloHertz, I do not accept them. As far as I can tell, the re-naming is purely arbitrary, with no rhyme nor reason on why we should change. Perhaps Europe (you know, the defunct "center" of the world) does use Hz, but is that any reason why we should? Because the Chinese use a different alphabet and language, and are the largest population, should we follow them? The idea is not to play follow-the-leader, but instead to search for REASONABLE larger horizons of knowledge. I cannot see any possible use of switching to Hertzian, rather than cycles-per-second. - 940 YVQT VENEZUELA, Carúpano was noted again atop the frequency on 3/30 at 1922. Fine signal, and only slight CBM QRM. (Krejny)
- XEQ MEXICO, México, D.F., was entirely atop CBM 3/15 at 2200, perfectly readable. (Walsh, Ont.)
- 960 ZFB1 BERNUDA, Pembroke is the VOA outlet without a doubt. Gordon Nelson's tapes and bearings are very definitive, to say the least. (Seaver, S. Diego) / (Vatalaro)
- 990 YVLR VENEZUELA, Maracay heard on 3/25 at 2354:30 with SS pgm. XET MEXICO, Monterrey, N.L., probably the SS dominating here with U.S. r&r 2/24 at 0025. (Jarvis, B.C.)
- 1010 HJCC COLOMBIA, Bogotá, "Emisora Mil Veinte", unID, on top of KBUY in and out on 3/29 between 0215-0235. Verified several years ago. (Nittler, Colo.)

- 1025 HJER<sup>V</sup> COLOMBIA, Cali verified my report of 2/15 with QSL, pennant and a great tape of Colombian music in return for my tape. (Seaver, S. Diego) Cali was noted with a good signal on 3/26 up to its 0058 s/off. (Krejny, Ohio)
- 1030 XEQR MEXICO, México, D.F., smothered WBZ 3/14 2230. (Walsh, Ont)
- 1035 4VEF HAITI, Cap-Haitien was heard quite well on 3/17 from 2015 to 2030 s/off; (Walsh, Ont,) Correction - s/off is 2230 (Ed)
- 1100 HOS21 PANAMA, Panama, "Radio Unión" was logged for the first time 3/25 from 2118-2133. Reported. Wonder if I'll be as lucky as Larry? (Krejny, Ohio)
- 1045 HOJ2 PANAMA, Las Tablas was in with a very fine signal on 3/26 at 2230. Positive ID. (Krejny, Ohio)
- 1055<sup>a</sup> YNLL NICARAGUA, Masaya, "Radio Masaya" is definitely my unID here Heard again on 3/25 from 2032-2110 with a very nice signal. One of their programs was "Informativo Dos la L", so apparently this call is correct. Wonder if their still only 250 watts? Reported, naturally! (Krejny, Ohio) Ed, are you sure the program isn't: "Informativo de las dos eles"? More grammatically correct. ("DXWV" Editor)
- 1080 YVQJ VENEZUELA, Barcelona shocked me 3/16 with a QRM-free signal. Very strong and clear from 2015 to 2035, no WTIC at all! ID is "Radio Barcelona". My first Venezuelan. What is their power? (Walsh, Ont.) 10 kw. (Editor)
- 1100 HJAT COLOMBIA, Barranquilla, "Radio Reloj" was heard with ID at 0230 on 3/14. Another one that is heard regularly. (Colton)
- 1102 HJCH COLOMBIA, Bogotá, was definitely ID'ed here on 3/28 at 0057. Fairly good signal, but don't confuse this one with HJAT, Barranquilla, on 1100. (Krejny, Ohio)
- 1120 YVMF VENEZUELA, Maracaibo, "Ondas del Lago" was another YV noted riding on top their frequency on 3/25. Noted 2028-2030 with a fine signal. (Krejny, Ohio)
- ?SS? UNID/SS, heard here with ID at 1930 completely on top of KNOX on 3/30. ID was something like "... musicales por Radio Deportivo"? The underlined has syllables sounding lik like "deportivo". Any help? Had real strong signals at this time and played typical SS music. (Colton, Mich.) Larry, your mystery is probably YVMF above, but not sure. Also, there is no such animal as "typical SS mx." (Editor) From 2000-2015 on 3/16 an unid. SS was heard here. Mentioned Caracas, so maybe another Ven. Any possibilities? (Walsh)
- ?TP? UNID/TP, Oriental, which I at first took to be "Radio Peking, gave a 3-letter EE ID at 0759 4/1; sounded like "DKF". At 0800 there was no IS, and the station seemed to fade out or leave the air. Probably one of the Japs. (Godwin, Calif)
- 1135 ?LA? UNID/LA with LA music and man talking u/WABC NH 2/21 0445? Who? (Shannon, Wis.) Almost definitely YVQQ. (Editor)
- 1150 XEJP MEXICO, México, D.F., "Radio Variedades" heard on top of 1150 on 3/14 at 0300. (Colton, Mich.)
- 1157 .... SWAN ISLAND, "Radio Americas" heard on 3/28 at 0052 with Cuban jammer missing 'em, hi. (Vatalaro, Mass.)
- 1260 CHCI CUBA, Habana, "Reloj Nacional" was heard with excellent signal 3/14 0244. Was one of many Castros to appear. (Colton)
- 1270 CHJG CUBA, Camagüey, "Reloj Nacional" was heard with weaker signals than 1260 but still readable 3/14 0244. (Colton, mich)
- 1340 ZBM2<sup>V</sup> BERNUDA, Hamilton verified my tape report with a pretty QSL card, which thankfully specified ZBM2. V/s is Keith Parris Hart, Asst. PD. My first foreign graveyarder verified!
- 1395 XEUV MEXICO, Chiapas de Corzo, Chis., is my long-sought mystery here. Heard 3/13 at s/off w/call, 3/27 at 2256, out at 22-58. While at Gordon's, only had SAH from HCVE4, XEUV off
