There were a great many interesting topics in the May Association of North American Radio Clubs newsletter. But I'd like to speak about one in detail, though, and that is the report of the Ethics Study committee of ANARC. John Callarman, the chairman, has submitted a draft of a code of ethics for DX'ers, and even though this may not be its final form, I'm reprinting it here. It's a fine document, and reflects a great deal of thought and work. John has steered clear of specific examples on purpose, and has come up with a code that allows both freedom for the individual, and yet defines the responsibilities of all parties involved in DX'ing and verifying.

A CODE OF ETHICS FOR DX'ERS

I. Definitions

- A. A DX'er is one who listens to stations in the radio and television spectrum for the purpose of hearing the station without regard to content.
- B. A "listener" is one who listens to stations in the radio and television spectrum for program or message content.
- C. A DX'er can be a listener, but the average listener is NOT a DX'er.

II. Scope of responsibility of a DX'er

- A. The DX'er is responsible to the station he hears
 - 1. Contact slanted toward the station's interest.
 - 2. Contact to reflect the standards of the hobby overall.
- B. The DX'er is responsible to his fellow DX'er
 - 1. Exchange of information.
 - 2. Maintenance of Reputation of the Hobby.
 - 3. Maintenance of Personal Honesty and Integrity ... in all relationships.
- C. The DX'er is responsible to the club he joins
 - 1. Utilization of the club as a medium of exchange.
 - 2. Cooperation with the club in its projects.
 - 3. Adherence to Club Rules.

III. Scope of responsibility of the club

- A. The club is responsible to its members
 - 1. To provide information of value in pursuit of the hobby.
 - 2. To engender a friendly spirit among all DX'ers.
 - 3. To insure upholding of standards throughout the hobby.
- B. The club is responsible to other clubs
 - 1. To exchange information provided by the respective members.
 - 2. To work cooperatively in areas of mutual interest.
 - 3. To avoid antagonism in areas of disagreement.
 - 4. To assist in policing violations of ethics.

IV. Scope of responsibility of the station

- A. The station is responsible to its listeners
 - 1. Providing the programming.
 - 2. Maintenance of good public relations.
- B. The station has no responsibility to the DX'er
 - 1. Unless the DX'er also is a listener.
 - 2. Unless the station requests the DX'er's cooperation.

V. Summation

- A. The hobby of DX'ing is basically a personalized, one-man thing.
- B. The club should try to prevent individual actions harmful to other hobbyists.

Comments on this would be interesting, I think. It would do all of us good to remember this code in our DX'ing and reporting (both to stations and to the bulletin). But above all, the code only points out what we should all know - that is, we should show our maturity and common sense and good manners in DX'ing, as in everything else.

Hi gang, DX here has been great since it turned cold again, hi! But I have been studying too much for exams. I did manage to send reports out to KAAV (Ark. #1) and KRLD in Dallas. Those 1 kw stations are now coming in at 30 db, since I wound a new coil (about 1500 winds of #20 CU around a pencil) for my antenna tuner. Now I have 2 filter coils and 2 tuning coils. My rx is nothing without the tuner. CHARLES BARNES: chances are that your new rx needs a new alignment job. From what you say about the 10 tube job it will be a little harder to line (lighn??? lrs) up than mine was so take it to the local repair shop and have them do it. It will cost a couple of bucks but it is well worth it. Another thing that may be wrong is that one of your coils has been re-wound (repair shops do a lot of this and so do I when I have the time and wire) with the wrong kind of wire or the coil may have one or two turns. I know with my rx. The band tunes only from 550 to 1550 and then a new band. I have lined up the rx to 540 and the frequencies are off about 20 kc, but it doesn't affect the performance at all. Gray why can't you erect an outdoor antenna? Drop me a line and I am willing to bet you that you can put one up. Since every one is having new members in their families I will be waiting for my cigars like Larry, hi. Mike Shannon: A telephone makes a great ground, although you may find that it causes some static on some frequencies though. 73.
