Whether or not I attend, I'd like to extend my Best Wishes for a successful convention. Lots of Good Luck! I just returned from a two week, 6,000 mile tour of the West and South. Of course I brought my 8 trans. RCA Portable RX along to DX with enroute. We spent a week visiting the fabulous Rocky Mts. in Colo. Bill Nittler gave us a fine tour of Denver while we stopped over in the City for a day. Good to see you, Bill! I did some daytime DX'ing in the two western Colo. towns of Durango and Phippsburg. Durango is appx. 280 air miles S.W. of Denver. The following stns were hrd at that locale: 580-KUEC weak; 610-KGGM, fair; 730-KVOD, fair; 740-KVFC, strong; 770-KOB, strong; 930-KIUP, local; 960-KWVK, strong; 1240-KEGO, local; 1280-KRZE (Crazy Radio), strong and 1390-KENN, fair. KOB-770 is clearly audible daytime throughout all of Southern Colo. They seem to have alot better ground coverage than WABC despite the mountainous terraine in N.M. In Phippsburg, about 170 air miles N.W. of Denver, only three stns were hrd in the early afternoon: 550-KRAI in nearby Craig was strong; 85C-KOA also strong and 1260-KSNO a bit weaker than KOA but still very clear. I found that Regional and even Graveyard Freqs, were not as jammed nights in the West as they are in the N.E. From Colo. we rode back to Chicago and then southward to Nashville. While in the "Music City" I visited WLAC. (Bob Ziel's rpt continued on next page--

(Bob Ziel's rpt con't)- One of their engineers was surprised that their signal reaches N.Y. regularly. From Tenn., we headed Northward to Cincinnati and spent the weekend of June 25-26 with Fred Prechtl and his family. We had a grand time touring Cincinnati and DX'ing. "CBS RADIO SIGNS MEXICO CITY AFFILIATE"

CBS Radio last week reported it had signed XEVIP Mexico City for limited network service, starting, Auguts 1, 1966 under a licensing arrangement. This type of CBS service is also extended to 12 other stations outside the continental U.S. The network does not number these stations as part of its affiliated network. CBSX Radio also reported last week that KLAJ will affiliate with the network on Dec. 31, bringing thte total nomuber of affiliates to 242. KLAJ was a former CBS affiliate four and a half years ago under the call, KLAS. The XEVIP agreement is the first for CBS Radio in Latin America, XEVIP is operated by Radio Programas de Mexico, S.A. on 1560 kc. with 500 watts. The station's format is English-language broadcast on a 24 hour basis. Last April, its call letters were changed from XERMK. Station director and general manager is Clemente Sarna Alvear, and station manager is D. Keith Larkin."

WMOZ Mobile, Alabama is to leave the air by July 31 under FCC orders. This action was taken due to WMOZ's falsifying of logs sent to the commission with renewal of license application. (also from BROADCASTING)

Many letters have been received by DX'ers in New Zealand asking why we can hear so many stations, and why N.Z. is labelled the DX'ers Paradise. The reason for this is - N.Z. is a small country, bigger than Cuba in size but not as large as New Guinea; very few parts of the South Island (better look at the map) are more than 80 miles from the sea. The North Island is wider in parts, but all New Zealanders know the sea and spend holidays at the seaside as it is so handy to any part.

Also, New Zealand has less than 3 million people and most own their own homes and each home has a reasonable garden which allows at least a 100 foot outside aerial up. DX'ers in New Zealand have, I think, the world's most amazing aeriels, anything from 100 foot wires to 4 mile wire (used by Dick Pollard in Nelson - an old telephone wire left up by the N.Z. Post Office when phones to a Forestry Station were taken out), and the longer the wire the better on m.w. Best of all is a small number of NZBC radio stations in the country, 33 at last count. The NZBC is an independent body, but Government controlled, and has both commercial and non-commercial stations. Private enterprise has missed out so far (except for 4XD-1430 operated by the Dunedin Radio Club: N.Z.'s only independent, till we get our pirate).

Then you can see that if your frequencies are not cluttered up (only one 24-hour station, 2YA-570), signals cannot help but get through. In fact, it becomes impossible at times, but remember, when you in the USA are enjoying Summer, we are in Winter, and vice versa, we are 19 hours ahead of you in time due to the International Dateline.

Well, with the above advantages, let's look at reception. Take a day like today, was raining, I got home from work early 0400 GMT.....turned set on....just faintly in background is HJKC on 850 kcs, in Bogota...then it fades about 0430 GMT....quite a bit of QRN....then KYOS on 1480 is heard, then along the dial KFBI on 1530, drowned out further down by KOMA on 1520, on up the top XERF is Wolfmaning it on all 250,000 watts, time is about now 0800 GMT....then on 910 kcs JOB2 is starting to come through, and by 0930 GMT it's 5 & 9 on "S" meter, well now things get interesting; Swan Island comes through on 1.55 or it moves to 1160 to avoid that Cuban jammer we hear down this way, then Marathon, Florida is back on 1180 mixed with 4ZB, also Fiji is on 730 and 930, not to mention 4KQ, 2RE, 3UE and the hundreds of Australians. Bed time at 1030 GMT, does one sleep, one gets accustomed to it, even though WGY is coming through and all those Asians, not to forget the Europeans which are there at 1600 GMT just when the alarm clock is thinking about waking up so it's ready to wake me at 1800 GMT.....

Well then, that's one of the many reasons New Zealand is a good QTH, but sunspots and storms do play a great part also, and don't forget the South Pole and its Aurora etc. These do cause a trouble in trying to hear African stations on m.w.; in fact, it's nearly impossible to hear any lower than Congo, unless it's a freak reception.

So that's the reason for all these good catches. This I hope will answer all the letters I've received from IRCA members, which I'll never be able to answer.

Article X of the IRCA By-laws shall be amended by deleting the words "and date" and adding the sentence, "The date of the annual convention shall be determined as early as possible by its hosts."
