ANARC CONVENTION.

The first annual national convention of the Association of North American Radio Clubs (ANARC) was held at the Hotel Muchlebach, in Kansas City, Mo. from Friday, July 29 to Sunday, July 31. This first DX radio convention to be organized at a supra-club level was attended by members from 6 independent ANARC-affiliated clubs.

Convention chairman was Don Jensen, executive secretary of ANARC. James J. Howard, editor and publisher of SWL News, organized much of the event.

At Friday evening's meeting, Richard Wood presented a talk on the activities of the ANARC's Frequency Recommendation Committee. On Saturday morning, "What is ANARC," an introduction to the association, was presented by Jensen. Discussion followed and numerous suggestions were made for future ANARC projects. It was proposed that a joint convention be held with one of the other clubs, perhaps on a rotating basis with a different club acting as host each year. If a separate convention is to be held, it was suggested that another time of year be chosen to prevent crowding the summer schedule. The formal meeting Saturday night was highlighted by the presentation by Richard Wood of an instructional talk on the identification and verification of Latin American stations. Don Jensen showed photos of some LA stations. Sunday morning's meeting began with the formation of a private group, known as the DX Foundation, whose sole purpose is to make awards to members of the DX hobby. This foundation was established on a private basis, with no direct connection with ANARC. Selected as trustee for a 3 year period was Jim Howard, who will appoint a committee to determine awards during the next 3 year period. The foundation is not a club nor will it accept members or seek funds. The foundation expects to present a 'man of the year' award annually at the ANARC convention or other suitable place and time. Howard awarded an engraved plaque to Jensen for "service to the hobby," during his tenure as ANARC executive secretary. Speaking on Sunday morning were Glenn Hauser on television DX, Jensen on the history of clandestine radio, 1915-1945, and Jon Gentry on ham band subjects. A general discussion followed, with one topic being round-robin type newsletter groups. One result of the conversation was that plans were made to start a Missouri DX organization, consisting of members residing in that state. It is to begin operation soon with a round-robin format; no regular bulletin will be issued and membership will be limited to Missourians. A number of people took photographs of the convention activities, some of which will appear in SWL News. A closing banquet luncheon was held Sunday noon (steak in burgundy with mushrooms!). Sounds like a fine time. How come no IRCA members were there?

Report on ANARC Activities.

Other than the report on the Convention above, the main topic of this month's ANARC Newsletter is the upcoming election of a new executive secretary. As you know, Don Jensen's term in office expires October 20, and Don does not wish to continue in the post. Thus far, NO nominations have been submitted. August 31 had been set as the deadline for nominations, with ballots to go out in September. If there are no nominations, then the position (and probably ANARC) will become dormant in October.

Don Jensen will be at the IRCA Convention in Milwaukee, and will be explaining the workings of ANARC then.

Country list committee chairman Doug Benson is forming his new committee, and also is seeking views and ideas about the approach to the list criteria. Doug says, "I have no intention of copying anyone's list, just as I have no intention of not taking some of the good points of all of them. What I'm fishing for is a building block, a premise, a solid foundation for amassing such a list ... and are we going to make up our list by countries (geographically), by countries (politically), by subdividing into provinces, or subdivisions into zones, by languages, or what? ... What I need ... are more ideas. How about yours?" For those who'd like to help (maybe some from IRCA's Countries List Committee?), Doug Benson's address is 49 Washington St., Lakeport, N. The paper discusses the empirically derived sky wave propagation curves that are used to determine the service and field strengths of medium wave stations in the US and in Europe. Howdy after a long absence. It took about six months, but I finally managed to move to Northern California. My wife and I live in Menlo Park but all mail goes to Box 471 in Palo Alto. Hope to meet fellow IRCAers in the area soon, if I haven't done so by the time this is printed. I ended DXing activities in Goleta, my previous city(?) of residence, with the following grand total: 175/135, or 77% veried. No DX from May thru September since starting in 1961, nor were any stations DXED within 200 miles of receiver unless of very low power. I never received veries from 40 of the stations DXed from Goleta, so for the benefit of those who want to know why, I'll elaborate. KWIL, KLAS, KOPA, KCUB, KORK---lousy report; GFPR---no return postate; HRN, KFRB, KIMN, KGHV, ZGO, Peking, KMAK, KQMS, KLO, KLOU, XEDM---heard them, but never sent a report out; KLUB, CKY, CMQ, KSVN, KTHH, XEW, KECK, KRAM, KERP, KIOA, KNOS, XEQR, KHVH, KPAY, KSCO, KWJJ, WCAU, KROY, KNDI, KROP, WLCY, KPOI, KVON---no reason for not verifying (good report with return postage). Best five veries are from CJGX, KIBS, HJBI, JOBK, and SWAN. Completely new DX will begin in October, and in the meantime, I hope to build the IRCA loop. Does anyone collect coverage maps?--if so, send a list of those you want to trade. Bob Goomler: I have some more duplicates since our last correspondence; if you're interested, please send me a list of all your maps along with your address. Question: Is KFBK-1530 really quite easy to hear in the midwest and east?(like a local at times in Colorado, BN) Judging from the number of veries, it is, but I'm surprised. I have a copy of KFBK's coverage map, and most of its signal is beamed to the NNW and SSE. Although KFBK is 50 kw, full time with the same pattern day and night, the major null is to the ENE (or virtually East), with the primary contour (.5 mv measurement) in this direction being only 40 miles from the xmtr at Pleasant Grove. This is evident as one drives toward Sacramento on US 40 from Reno; KFBK is virtually inaudible, both day and night, until the Sierras are crossed. Comments on this subject appreciated 73.

I have just received the official announcement that I will be the CPC Chairman for next year. This year we are going to stress EFFORT and HARD WORK. We must have these if we are going to have a successful CPC. We are also going to do things a little different this year. There are 4 main points to this program: 1. The U.S. and Canada will be divided into 17 sections (listed later) with a fulltime CPC member working one section. These sections are determined by the number of stations in the area, and not by the equal land area. Each prospective CPC member may choose the section he wishes to work, however please list 2 or 3 choices in case one has already been assigned. In addition to full-time CPC members there will be a number of "free agents," These are members who do not have enough time to take on a section; they will have no set areas. Anyone may contact foreign stations, SS forms available. 2. Each CPC member must, when volunteering for CPC work, submit a copy of the form that he is going to use to contact stations. For those who are not sure what should be included in a letter, please contact me and I'll help you out as much as possible. 3. Every 2 months, each CPC member must submit a "progress sheet" containing info on each station contacted, what replies were received, if any, and any other info from the station. This info will be transferred to permanent CPC files. The first "progress sheet" is due on November 1, 1966. 4. After a member has arranged a test, he must notify the publisher and myself at once. It is very important to get the info published as soon as possible. I must have all the info to put on permanent CPC files, and also I will need and send all the info to the NNRC and NRC to advise them of our test. 1. Ont. Que. N.B. N.S. P.E.I. Newfoundland. 2. Man. "DXWV" Tip of the Month

MEXICO is the most frequently heard Latin-American country in the United States and Canada, and since a large number of Mexican stations broadcast our way in EE from super-powered transmitters, there is no excuse for any DX'er's not having this country in the logbook. Easiest to hear are the "border stations" with their n'th-class EE programming, such as XERF-1570, XEG-1050, and XELO-800, also XETRA-690, XEMO-860, and XERB-1090 on the West Coast. Other giants include SS-speaking XEW-900 and // XEWA-540. \$ Most Mexican stations, however, cater to a Mexican clientele, so broadcast in SS. They are easily identified, tho, by the type of music they play and their callsign ID's. Typical Mexican music includes the "son ranchero" with its guitars and wailing singing, and the "son huasteca", played with an orchestra of violins, etc. The "nueva ola" is their version of our rock-'n'-roll, and stations carrying such a format can be as wild as our own teeners. Tropical and classical (like XEDA-1290) music is also popular, as well as the internationally-appreciated "continental" music of Europe and America. \$ Most Mexican stations identify with the last two letters of their callsigns; i.e., "Radio LZ", "Radio AI", "Radio ABC", "La RH de México", etc. In order to catch these ID's you should know the SS pronunciation of the alphabet, which I list below phonetically:
