Stations heard here in the daytime by states are: Kansas-32, Okla.-30, Texas-27, Colo.-5 (KLZ, KCSJ, KHOW, KOA, KLMR), Neb.-5 (WOW, KMMJ, KFAB, KRVN, KBRL), Mo.-4 (KWTO, WDAF, KFEG, KCMO), Ia.-2 (KWMT, WMT), SD-1 (WNAX), NM-1 (KICA). Hi! This Forumula is dedicated to a review of my RBM-3, BCB set..so that a stock of opinions may be built up on various XR's, won't YOU send in a short evaluation of YOUR set with your next Forumula? The RBM-3 has proved to be an exceptionally good DX machine for BCB/LWBC DXing..the noise limiter distorts some, but it virtually stops ALL noise from lousing up reception..viz..WYDE r/c is buried under buzz..a flip of the switch & WYDE is a 80%, 10mv. signal. The calibration on the set is excellent..every 5kHz on bands 1-3 (200-1140kHz), & every 10kHz on band 4 (1140-2000kHz). Selectivity is in 2 stages, 5&2.5kHz, as far as I can tell..& sen. is such that I can (& have) use a window screen as an antenna & pull in 90% of the stations I hear on the 12-AVS vertical. On the selectivity again..I hear R.Americas-MM(hi)-1157kHz-consistently from about 5pm PDT, & mostly readable 80% with slight splashing from KSL-1160 ..HJLQ-1517-can be heard most MMs..sometimes crowding KOMA a bit with their music. BHBS-834 is, of course, an easy separation..in the winter around 5pm PST. It is a Navy surplus set, though, & does require an AC power supply for operation on household current..dealers normally supply them, so it's no problem. The price-\$60. DX: 8/29-KWG-1230 ID 0035, one of my more-wanted, CBM-940 0421 w/CBC AN music, & KARM-1430 scotching ZAP go..8/31-KRBC-1470 with ET 0113 & on..pretty decent u/XERBC, KTOK-1000 0654, surprising me as I never hear anything on 1000, except KOMO, unn. Back to the blue pages after an 8 mos. absence. More time to DX since July 1st. New communications receiver bought in Frankfurt July 4th. It's a BRAUN T 1000 with 13 wave bands including FM. The BCB is covered in two overlapping bands of 0.470 kHz to .920 and .900 to 1.600 kHz. It also has fly wheel tuning, BFO, sharp & broad selection 3.0/0.9 kHz selection, tuning meter 0-10 (0-4.5 equal S9), bandspread. Tuning accuracy is less than 1% on all bands. Cost to military personell is 237.00 and civilians 600.00 export price. It has 3 RF stages for the AM section, & 4 RF stages for FM section. For more information, it is advertised in WRTVHB page 77, in the 1966 edition. This receiver is equal to or surpasses the HQ-180 A or is second best to an HRO-500. Down to DX now. For a beginning DXer, the reference by domestic DXers to "f/c" (or "frequency-check") may be a little confusing. But, as he'll soon learn, this type of test program will give him a chance to log - and often verify - many new stations. Some months ago, I asked John Tucker, our industry adviser, if he could describe the procedure and results of a f/c, and perhaps give a few tips about what might be useful or verifiable material to send to a station in a report of a frequency-check. Here's his reply:

"It is required by FCC rules that these checks be made at regular intervals (the station's engineer decides how often needed within the maximum allowable interval set forth by the rules). In the USA, a station is allowed to drift only +20 to -20 cycles from its assigned frequency. Most stations attain +5 to -5 cycles stability, while many run even closer. Seldom will a station be more than 10 cps off frequency. This is, of course, done by the use of precision cut crystals in either temperature controlled ovens or vacuum containers. The latter is becoming the more frequent in new equipment as crystal production methods are constantly being improved. The tone (usually 1000 cps more-or-less) is merely for the convenience of determining the testing station's carrier among the many on the frequency. However, the type of modulation or even the complete absence of modulation, is of no importance whatsoever in making the test. Certain types of transmitters do not react well to continuous tone modulation (some overheat the final stages and some draw too heavily on the power supplies) and so music may well be substituted for tone. Modulation does not change the carrier frequency of an AM station, so anything or nothing may be used on a frequency check!

Monitoring stations may be any distance from the monitored broadcast station, limited only by the ability of the monitoring company to hear the station. Odd transmission quirks sometimes cause odd arrangements to be necessary. For example, a certain station in Grand Junction, Colorado (on the Colorado-Utah border) cannot be monitored in Denver because of the intervening Rocky Mountains and interference from a Denver NSP station. However, still further east near Kansas City is a company that can monitor the station well enough to check frequency because of the first-skip characteristics.

When reporting F/C's to a station, you are pretty well up a creek. Some stations are checked during their regular broadcast periods so no special check is necessary. Those using tone modulation may often do as we have done -- a tape has been made up complete with tone and ID's and is played by whoever is unfortunate enough to be called in for the special test period. In reporting this type of test, about all taken down should be reported...the exact time of tune-in, the exact time of ID's heard, the exact time of the end of the test. On our tests the operator is required to insert the following phrase at least three times during the 15 minute period (the usual duration of such a test): 'The DX verification number for this test broadcast is (a three digit number).' Perhaps IRCA should undertake to get each station to use this system if the station indicates an interest in DXers."

John's comment that usually a 1000 cps tone is used often causes some problems for monitors, if more than one station happen to be testing at once on the same frequency. Peterkin Radio Laboratories of Detroit, in fact, have asked stations testing with them to use tones between 200 and 500 cycles rather than 1000 cycles just to avoid this possible confusion. They also point out in an instruction sheet for testing that voice announcement identification is often unreliable. They request that stations rapidly swing the modulating tone up and down in frequency for about ten seconds and then return to the steady tone. This special ID is used by Peterkin not as a substitute for the FCC-required station identifications, but as an additional aid for monitoring.

Of course, the most useful aid to "f/c DXing" is the IRCA Frequency-Check List, which Larry Godwin has compiled from tips from club members and from information from some of the monitoring companies. This annual list contains the times of over one thousand frequency checks!! Keep it near your receiver, especially when DXing in the early morning hours (since tone tests will be after midnight in the station's local time). The list gives information on the type of modulation that a station will usually use for its f/c. But, as with all other loggings, be sure to identify the station you hear. Don't send tentative reports to stations just because you hear a tone on their frequency! Be sure before you write. And don't be surprised if you wake up on Monday with a ringing in your ears.

Guidelines for Submitting Proposals

- I. The IRCA government has jurisdiction over the following matters, to which proposals may refer:
- A. Initiation of additions, changes or deletions to the IRCA Constitution and Bylaws.
 - B. The IRCA Editorial Policy.
 - C. The IRCA bulletin, DX Monitor.
 - D. Club policies.
 - E. Club activities.
 - F. Charges of irregularities.
 - G. Actions performed by a member that involve the club, or reflect upon the club name, other than those reasonably expected in the normal activities of membership.
 - H. Appointments or removals by the President.
 - I. Creation or dissolution of committees.
- II. Requirements of proposals submitted to the President:
- A. Name of the member submitting the proposal.
 - B. Date of submission of the proposal to the President.
 - C. A proposal must not violate procedures established by the IRCA Constitution and Bylaws.
 - D. A proposal may be accompanied by comments of explanation or justification.
- III. Procedure for submitting proposals:
- A. Eight copies of each proposal should be submitted in written form to the President. (Only seven copies are necessary when Board members submit proposals.)
 - B. Upon receipt of the proposals, the President will send one copy to each Board member as soon as feasible, with his own comments and recommendations if he wishes. Board members will communicate their decisions to the President as soon as possible.
 - C. (Exception to the above.) Proposals concerning certain special areas for which committees exist will be sent by the President to the appropriate committee chairman for recommendations. Then the proposal, together with the committee's recommendations, will be sent by the President to the Board for action.
 - D. After the Board's decision is obtained, the President will have the results published in the club bulletin as soon as possible. If the member who submitted the proposal desires to know the outcome immediately, he may send the President a self-addressed stamped envelope.
 - E. A proposal that is passed by the Board becomes effective immediately, unless otherwise specified in the body of the proposal. Exception: proposals dealing with additions, changes or deletions to the IRCA Bylaws, which must be approved by the club membership as well as by the Board. (Note: Proposals amending the Constitution are not sent to the Board of Directors.)
 - F. A proposal that is defeated by the Board may not be resubmitted in identical form for a period of one year from the date of announcement of the Board's decision.

These guidelines have been approved by the Board of Directors, and should be followed in all instances. Naturally, all proposals submitted are welcome and will be considered carefully by the Board of Directors. You may wish to discuss the wording of a proposal with your representative on the Board, or with the President, before it is submitted. President's Report

There are several important matters that should be dealt with right away. First, Regions #1 and #6 do not have representatives on the Board, and the offices should be filled as soon as possible. The one requirement for being a Board member is one year of continuous membership in the IRCA. If you would like to volunteer in this capacity, or nominate someone else in your region, please write me before Saturday, October 8; the names of all nominees will be given to the chairman of the Election Committee on the following day. The directors elected will serve until the date of the 1967 IRCA Convention. Here are the boundaries of the two regions: Region #1: New England states, New York, New Jersey, Europe, Africa, Quebec and further east Canadian provinces. Region #6: British Columbia, Washington, Oregon, Alaska, and Northern California (defined as all Calif. counties except San Diego, Imperial, Riverside, Los Angeles, San Luis Obispo, Kerr, Santa Barbara, Ventura, Orange and San Bernadino).

Also, we need another ANARC representative. The IRCA falls within the 151-350 members range and is entitled to 2 representatives, who are responsible for acting on proposals submitted by the ANARC Executive Secretary, and communicate among themselves via a monthly newsletter. At least 1500 active members in 11 affiliated clubs are represented by ANARC which is, of course, the Association of North American Radio Clubs. If you are interested, please contact me at once, and if you have questions, get in touch with our existing ANARC rep., Gray Springleur.

The members present at Milwaukee voted to hold the 1967 Convention in Denver. The official dates will be announced very soon.

A one-page advertisement for the IRCA will appear in the 1967 issue of "How To Listen To the World." Publication should be in November, and circulation is expected to be 12,000. The nominal charge of \$15.00 has been approved by a majority of Board members.

Soon there will be a new printing of the Constitution and Bylaws, to reflect the many amendments approved during the past year.

The rules and details concerning this season's DX contests will appear in the bulletin very soon. The contests (both foreign and domestic) are sure to be retro-active, so start sending reception reports as soon as you wish.

It has been suggested that the IRCA adopt a signature melody, or official club anthem, to be used on DX programs, etc. Some possibilities are Sousa marches ("Hands Across the Sea" has been suggested) and the national anthem of another country (such as Colombia's). If you have any ideas along these lines, let your director or me know

KBOI 670kc/s?

While taking a trip through the West this summer, I passed through Boise, Idaho. This presented an opportunity to call KBOI and inquire about their proposed frequency and power change. Finding, when I called, that the chief engineer was on vacation, I was referred to another engineer to get the information. When asked about the change, he stated that WMAQ was persistently fighting the change to the FCC on the grounds that it would put serious limitations on their coverage area. If the move goes, the station's patterns would be designed to protect WMAQ's clear channel status. They would use a daytime power of 50,000 watts with a slight suck-in toward Chicago, and a night power of 25,000 watts with a "V" cutout toward Chicago and a slight suck-in to protect KNBR. He emphasized the fact, however, that WMAQ was strongly opposed to the move. For this reason, KBOI has not even begun to construct the facilities or buy the equipment necessary. When asked when the station could be on the air if the move was immediately approved (August 22), he was unsure. He stated that the owner's target date of May, 1967 might still be reached if work was started soon. In any event, KBOI's proposed change from a 5,000 watt station on 950 to a 50,000 watt station on 670 is dependent on FCC approval after overcoming WMAQ's opposition.
