On Mike Northam's suggestion comments are sent in the report (Monitor, Sept. 10, 1966) about John (actually it is James) Morris in England and his report to KDOV - a 5kw daytimes. A West Coast daytimer is a theoretical impossibility in England. It appears from what Mike says in a letter to me that the report was of the type "I heard your station X hours GMT on 1300 kc/s - Please verify". Further information on this DXer, using the term loosely, comes from my experienced DXer friend Richard Wood, now in the USA, who visited KVI & CHAT and saw two very dubious reports from Mr. Morris both lacking in program details, convincing reception details on anything else to make them credible. KVI may have verified being so delighted in hearing from so far away - its not the first time in the U.K. that we have hrd of this kind of thing, nor the first in Sweden and I know you have had similar cases in the USA in the past. The only solution to the problem is to try to educate these people in the correct and honest way of reporting. (Welcome to the IRCA, Ken, and I'll be looking for more rpts from you in the future-SRR). 73 & bestD

Region 6 is: British Columbia, Washington, Oregon, Alaska, and North California. (all Calif. counties above San Luis Obispo, Kern and San Bernardino).

BY LAWS AMENDMENT INFORMATION

In accordance with Article XV of the IRCA By-Laws, we publish the text of the By-Laws amendment proposals that have had full consideration and approval by the IRCA Board of Directors so that the IRCA membership may vote to approve or reject their enactment as amendments to the IRCA By-Laws. Due to delayed returns from Board member(s), only three proposed By-Law amendments may be put before the membership at this time. They are:

Proposal 2.1-95: Amendment to Article V, Sec.2, Part 3, f, addition to read:

"The Chairman of the Election Committee shall ballot the Board of Directors soon after each election to determine the Chairman of the Board, who will be the spokesman for the Board and will be responsible for assuming the President's office in case it is vacated during the current term; a tie in the balloting will be broken by the President. In the case where the Chairman of the Board becomes club President, he shall be required to resign as Chairman of the Board and a new Director from his region must be selected to fill the position vacated by his succession, in accordance with Article V, Section 4; should the Chairman of the Board resign from the Board of Directors with such resignation not subsequent to succession to the Presidency by him, or when the Chairman of the Board succeeds to the Presidency due to a vacancy of the office of the President, he must immediately hand down the Chairmanship of the Board to the remaining Director who has been a member of the IRCA for the greatest length of time, this to be determined by the official records maintained by the IRCA Secretary-Treasurer."

Proposal 2.1-100. By-Laws amendment to Article V, Sec. 2, Part 3, addition of sub-part "i", to read:

"All members of the Board shall submit to the President their votes on all proposals no later than 30 days after the mailing of the proposals to them by the President. All votes not received within the 30-day period will be considered abstentions from voting by the Board member(s) in question."

Proposal 2.1-101. By-Laws amendment to Article XI, addition to read:

"A proposal that receives more 'yes' votes than 'no' votes will be considered passed." (NOTE: Refers to Board of Directors' balloting)

Plans are laid to print a revised version of the IRCA Constitution and By-Laws updated to October, 1966. This should appear prior to January 1, 1967. Please send the enclosed ballot BEFORE NOVEMBER 26, 1966.

President's Report

In the last DX Monitor a ballot was circulated for several proposed amendments to the IRCA Bylaws. If you haven't mailed your ballot to Randy Seaver yet, I hope you will - today. The turnout on the last balloting was extremely poor; of the more than 200 members in the club, only 30 returned their ballots. It really makes one wonder how important a democratic government is to a radio organization like ours. Perhaps many of you are not aware of the fact that the IRCA was created primarily so that voting such as this could be accomplished by the membership at large. Ours is one of the very few radio clubs set up to permit such democratic procedures; some of the NRC members attempted to set up a constitution for their club recently, but it was voted down at the convention last month. How important is a democratic club government to you?

Several suggested signature melodies have been submitted. If you have an ideal club melody in mind, why not let the rest of the club know about it? Mention it in your Forum report, or send the title to me.

I hope the new bulletin format isn't proving to be too confusing. Basically, the Forum stays as it has been except that all mention of DX tips and loggings go to the Roundup editors. So instead of listing your DX by dates in the Forum, why not arrange all your catches by frequency and send the list into your Roundup? It will be more helpful to you to scan the Roundup for wanted stations than to sift out the needed information from Forum reports. Remember, even if it's a routine regular-schedule logging, it should go into the Roundup.

The 1967 IRCA Convention will be in Denver, probably the fourth weekend in August. The exact dates will be published in the DX Monitor very soon. And what about the 1968 Convention? It is customary for the Convention to be held east of the Mississippi River one year, and west the next. If you live to the east and are interested in the possibility of hosting the 1968 get-together, mention it in/Forum.

Other club news: Tom Stoltmann has been appointed ANARC Representative; Mike Bratcher has been appointed State of the Month Editor; and Bruce Collier has been appointed Stand-By Editor. These appointments are subject to Board approval.

Notes on the 1967 IRCA F/C List

The list is a bit shorter this year than last, but hopefully it is more accurate. Considerable duplication was eliminated thanks to Don Erickson's computerized list. There is a continuing trend to replace early-AM f/c's with daytime checks made with mobile monitors. Also, Roy Beer, monitor from Denver and IRCA member, recently passed away and his many checks are no longer active. IRCA support for the list was good. Some duplication is unavoidable; for instance KVIO was heard per list the 1st Monday in October '65 and January '66, but per list the 2nd Monday in Nov. and Dec. '65 and February '66. Each check was considered individually before it went into the list.

The times for some checks were pieced together and may not be entirely accurate. When reporting checks you hear, please give the full time of the test, if possible. And be sure to distinguish between frequency checks and equipment tests; ET's are generally not regular and do not go into our list. And if you don't hear a check as listed one month, keep trying as it may be made quarterly.

Radio Barbados Frequencies

Mr. G. S. Shaw, Chief Engineer of Radio Barbados, writes: "To put you in the picture as to the reason for our frequency change, I will try to outline some of the difficulties in this area on the medium wave band. Radio Barbados started broadcasting in December 1963 on a frequency of 795 kcs. 10 KW. Unfortunately, Transworld Radio Bonaire were allocated a frequency of 800 Kcs. by Geneva the same day that Radio Barbados was allocated 795 Kcs. This resulted in a hetrodyne between ours and Bonaire even in Barbados. We therefore moved from 795 to 785 but found the stations in Caracas and Tortola were experiencing a hetrodyne in fringe areas. At the request of the British post office we are now in co-channel with these two stations."

Apparently Radio Barbados intends to remain on 780 kcs. despite the short distance to Tortola. If you hear Mr. Shaw's station, be sure to report to P. O. Box 785, Bridgetown, Barbados. It broadcasts a musical program from 2200-0100 EST.

Unique within the ranks of our club's membership we have an IRCA member whom several consider to be one of today's unsung heroes. Like many of us, he is a DXer, a family man, and a great friend of many people. What sets him apart from others is that he lives in Havana, Cuba.

One a thriving import-export business owner with servants, rentals, and several acres of farm land, Oscar Reyes is now struggling to make ends meet because he adamantly refuses to bow to his communist oppressors. Faced with hardships practically none of us can conceive of, Oscar bravely lives day to day with only his sincere faith in Christ Jesus as his Savior to comfort him.

So strong is his dislike for communism that for years rather than support Castro ("Mr. Dirty Beard") by working in government-owned business and industry, he refused to go to work, and he still refuses to let his daughter attend the state-controlled schools, preferring to educate her himself. His wife, once a teacher in a Catholic school until it was closed for teaching "against the revolution," now suffers with a disease of the blood in a land where drugs are impossible to get. His sister's entire family is now serving a 10-year prison sentence for trying to escape from Cuba. Another one of his relatives was captured during the Bay of Pigs fiasco in 1961.

Due to restrictions on parcels to Cuba, they will have to be purchased and/or sent via Canada so if one or a group of you members living in Canada would like to volunteer to serve as a "middleman" in this effort, please let me know. However, all of you can help Oscar by sending in contributions to me so these tires can be purchased. Or better yet, if any one of you would be willing to donate some 8.00 x 15 tires, drop me a line. But most of all, please join in and do whatever you can to help for Oscar will certainly appreciate it from the bottom of his heart. For you life may seem bright and wonderful but not everyone is as fortunate as we are to live in a land where we are free. - Malaysia: Stations in Kuala Trengganu-960 and Kuantan-810 are now 10 kw. NEW outlets in Kuala Trengganu-765 and Kuantan-1140 are ON THE AIR with 10 kw. Further stations are planned for Kuala Lipis, Mentaka b and Mersing. (NZDXRL)
