Hoping that all DXers may log the station, the special will be broadcast on October 31, November 28, and December 26. Air time will be from 3 to 3:00 a.m.

This bit of advice is also given. No verification will be issued, unless the listener gives the exact wording of the station's identification."

TOTAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN

"There will be a total eclipse of the sun on November 12, over South America. Dr. David Meisel, Leander McCormick Observatory, University of Virginia, Charlottesville, Virginia, is very anxious to receive reports on possible ionospheric effects, either Medium Wave or Short Wave. DXers should listen Nov. 11, 12, and 13 (all three dates are needed for comparative purposes) at 0700-1000 EST, (0800-0915 is the time of max. eclipse). The eclipse will be maximum over Peru, Bolivia, Paraguay and the southern tip of Brazil. PLEASE support this project! Here is a chance to put DX Listening (as distinguished from Amateur radio) on the map." Above from CMStanburv.

Moscow - Radio listeners in Kaluga, 100 miles southwest of Moscow, were enjoying an unusually lively program of jazz when suddenly a grave voice, speaking "for all the radio stations of the Soviet Union," interrupted to warn that U. S. rockets armed with nuclear warheads were hurtling downward on Soviet cities. A funeral dirge followed the announcement.

The reaction of Kaluga residents was somewhat less than good-humored when they learned that the alarm was the prank of an 18 year-old radio amateur.

The incident was reported in Nedolya, a Sunday supplement of Izvestia, the Soviet Government newspaper. Nedolya complained that a rash of pirate stations throughout the Soviet Union was angering the authorities and, occasionally, listeners with broadcasts of jazz interspersed with cuss words and critical commentaries on aspects of Soviet life.

The illegal stations, according to Nedolya, usually are operated by young men, who sometimes are inspired to go on the air after too much vodka. They often give their stations romantic names such as Gay Follows, The Angels, Daisy, and inexplicably, Cowboy's Pistol Shots.

The Soviet Supreme Court recently ordered that operators of illegal radio stations be tried under Article 70 of the Criminal Code, which stipulates prison terms of up to seven years for first offenders convicted of "anti-Soviet agitation and propaganda." However, Nedolya complained that in most cases the authorities have been too lenient with such persons.

For example, the punishment of the Kaluga youngster who frightened listeners with the warning of a "rocket attack" was limited to the confiscation of his transmitter and a pledge that he would abandon amateur broadcasting.

Groups of radio specialists have been organized in many parts of the Soviet Union to locate the illegal broadcasters. Unauthorized broadcasting by some of the more than 1,000,000 amateurs in the Soviet Union has been a cause of concern and close attention in recent years.

Nedolya reported that an illegal station in Karaganda, a coal mining town in Kazakhstan, had jeopardized an airliner attempting to land in bad weather by radio guidance. The only frequency linking that plane and the ground control center was taken over by the unauthorized transmitter. Nedolya did not report the fate of the aircraft but said the illegal broadcasting had been severely punished.

The journal complained that the pirate radio stations reflected a "senseless temptation to play dirty tricks."

Nedolya described in detail a search for an illegal radio station in a farm village west of Kaluga. The search was organized after the station had begun broadcasting popular music on request. A typical transmission of the illegal station concluded, Nedolya said, with an apology by the operator: "We would like to continue our broadcast of music, but first we must take time out and chip in for a bottle of vodka ..."

 Greetings! Long time (like 6 mo.) since last report, but then DX has been a little slow lately. Very little DX of much interest from around home (Solon, O.) over the summer--in fact the only logging worth mentioning was that of KCN @ 2:30 PM on 8/27. What's that you say? You never heard of KCN? Cheer up, neither has the FCC. They are daytime only (no licence for nights, hi.) on 1040 kc w/8w. QTH is on the SW side of Cleveland (on the border w/Parma). When I called the stn and asked for the chief engineer (who also doubles as DJ, M, NxD, etc.) and told him he was getting into Solon (abt 17 mi. away) he wouldn't believe me thinking he was just covering a few blocks. But after reading of a list of all the records he had played over the last hour he was convinced. Apparently there are several other outlaw stns. around Cleveland, w/ 1040 being the most popular freq. (I've caught two others there besides KCN); also some on 1000 kc. In keeping w/the trend started by dan Sheedy, here goes a rundown on my RX, a Hammarlund HQ-100C. It is a 9-tube superhet (used to be 10 tubes until I got tired of the 5Y3 burning up 10w of filament pwr. and so replaced it w/Si diodes --xfrmr runs cooler now). It tunes from below 540kc to 30mc. (If anybody knows the freq. of the beacon stns NB and/or FZ please let me know as these represent the lower tuning limit of it). Its Q-mult. is OK for seperating stns 4kc apart (and some closer) but I will soon be installing a Lafayette mechanical filter for more selectivity. The HQ-100C has one stage of rf, a pentagrid mxr (seperate osc.), two stages of if. Electronic bandsread allows for tuning to within .1kc near the low end and within .5kc on the high end. It also has a built in clock timer and noise limiter that is some help at times. With this I use a 42" square loop. Incidentally the price on the HQ is \$200. (new). Question for our midwest members: On 10/17 @ 1815 heard SSB on 1020kc u/KDKA--apparently either WCIL or WPEO s/off, which one? Please let me know, tnx. 73.

- 1370 JOHD Japan, Kitami strong with pips 10/24 at 0500. (GS)
- 1460 JO.. Japan, UnID Jap strong at 0353 10/24, faded by the hour. (LBG) Still can't ID this one, heard by 0248 10/24, faded on hour as usual (KGS)
- 1470 JO.. Japan, NHK-II relay logged for 2nd straight week under XESM on 10/24 at 0310. Reported to Tokyo. (KGS)
