Who doesn't need Maine? Most DX listeners will agree that Maine is the toughest state to receive in the Continental US for a couple of reasons: 1) Because it is farther north, the radio waves are affected by the ionosphere close to the auroral zone. Northern lights, or auroras, are very common in this zone and adversely affect radio transmissions passing through the zone or close to it. During periods when the ionosphere is disturbed, the auroral zone moves south and signals that are normally stable are weakened. 2) There are no 50kw. or cinch stations; however, there are many 5kw.; and WABI-910kc., Bangor, and WCSH-970kc., Portland, are good bets. Other good catches worth mentioning are: WLBZ-620, Bangor, NBC; WFST-600, Caribou, directional, Tone test on second Sat. of the month at 0030EST; WLAM-1470, Lewiston, might be a bad frequency in some places, ABC; WGAN-560, Portland, tough frequency except in parts of the Midwest, NSP; WAGM-950, Presque Isle, MBS. Maine stations are at best 2 or 3 hours before sunrise at great distances and 1 to 2 hours at shorter distances. The cool Northern air will keep signals steady if the aurora doesn't have a fit, because of the ionospheric particles contracting together to form a better reflecting barrier. This winter, with the sunspot count relatively low, will be good for Maine, although not quite as good as last year. Watch out next summer, though. The sooner you receive Maine, the better!! Skip reception will be best in the Eastern Great Lakes region and south to maybe as far as North Carolina. However, this will vary somewhat as the temperature changes.

As you have noticed, I am the new State of the Month editor. Gray did a fine job as editor and I hope that my efforts can produce a monthly column as helpful to the listener as it formerly was. Please bear with me these first few tries as I am bound to make errors. This is my first try at typing stencils and, as my typewriter is light, the letters might be blurred at first, but I will soon remedy that.

I have tried to not be too radical this time as some opposition might occur, but expect many changes later on. I will have fewer individual tips on stations and more general tips for receiving the state as this is easier for the beginner to do. Technical information is due, and a small amount is included this time.

New Hampshire and Vermont will be combined next month. Larry Godwin has requested that I not do this, but I find it necessary as these two small states have much in common as to propogational characteristics and neither have a large number of stations. If you have any tips for either of these states, I would appreciate them.

"H.G. Walker, VP and general manager of the CBC-English language network, has been named to co-ordinate a major study project that will result in the establishment of a Commonwealth Caribbean-Canada radio network in the West Indies. The network will serve as a regional broadcasting voice for 13 Caribbean countries and as an outlet for Canadian information material. Under the scheme Canada would establish, in co-operation with the Caribbean governments, a radio broadcasting network with all necessary production and transmission facilities. The CBC has already begun to investigate the availability of desirable broadcast frequencies, both BCB and SW, which could be used in the Caribbean area. Coverage is envisaged for the following territories: Antigua, Bahamas, Barbados, British Honduras, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, Jamaica, Montserrat, St. Kitts-Nevis-Anguilla, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and Trinidad and Tobago."
