Announcing the 1967 World Radio Handbook

The 1967 edition of the World Radio TV Handbook will be off the presses in mid-December, and the IRCA has been granted a substantial discount on multiple orders. Those of us that have the 1966 edition know that the WRTH is an invaluable source of DX information for MW, SW, FM and TV stations of the world. For the BCE DXer, the WRTH lists all stations by frequency under each country, and gives the address for sending reception reports. Other interesting information includes whether the station verifies by letter or QSL card, whether tape recordings are accepted, and prospective power increases. It contains a world time conversion chart and maps of each continent. The operating schedules are listed for most stations. Although no data on U.S. MW stations is included, this publication is a must for foreign-DX listeners.

Greetings from the land of DX and homework (in reverse order.) In the tradition set forth by my SDSC associate, dan Sheedy, here's a roundup of my rx'es: U.S. Army Signal Corps BC-344-D and BC-342-N. The former has an IF of 92.5 kc/s, rs'es 150-1500 kc/s; and the latter an IF of 470 kc/s, rx'es 1500-18,000 kc/s. Both have antenna trimmers, 2 RF amplifiers, 2 IF amps, 1 mixer, 1 BFO, 2 audio amps, and weigh 50 lbs. The BC-342-N has a crystal filter, also, and was built in July of 1950. The BC-344-D was built in March of 1952. They both cost \$36 (each) at a local surplus store. The BC-344 is in very good shape, except for a recurring microphonic in the 1st<sup>a</sup> audio amp stage. The BC-342, conversely, is in awful shape, especially since the previous owner didn't believe in anchoring or soldering-in replacement parts. You might say I really get a shock out of the BC-342, hi. On the selectivity score, the BC-344-D's 10 cps divisions range from 3/8 to 1/8 inches on BCB, while the BC 342-N's 10 cps BCB divisions are about 1/16 inch apart. Generally, the lower the frequency, the larger the divisions (e.g., about 1 inch at 150 kc/s = 10 cps; (Cont'd next page)

(Lance Muller's report, cont'd)

Sometimes, for instance, the BC-344 acts like a poor quality radio, but then sometimes perks up like an HQ-180. Likewise, the BC-342 ~~sometimes~~ (if I'm lucky) lets some good ones through. On another note, I'd like to say that the bulletin is really hitting the top in quality and quantity (sic). Keep up the good work editors. Can anybody give me the QTH & QRA of ODGE-516, AL-525, AP-530 NUJ-533, the tones on 521 & 534, and the teletype on 517 and 670 kc/s? 73's and Good DXn. See yawl in a few moons.

by two tones and very short hymn. Freq. approximate. (BER) (Poss-  
ibly Dakar-764 above??-They have 1901 s/off.-RJS)

- 765 ???? UnID station here many AM's, in fairly well 11/2 at 0928. There is a 10 kw new one in Malaysia here and is a good possibility. (LBG) (May the bird of paradise remove KFMB from the airwaves!!-RJS)
- 770 YVQQ Venezuela, Puerto La Cruz, "Radio Puerto la Cruz" was all alone here at times during 11/3 evening. Fine signal. (ELK)
- 780 Barbados, Black Rock, "Radio Barbados" was heard for the first time on MM 10/31 from 0104-0108 s/off w/"God Save the Queen". Announcer said that s/on would be at 5:30 AM (Barbados time). Heard again same day at 0432. (BER) Heard Barbados IS 11/7 at 0418. (GS) Good signal 11/7 at 0422 with IS, then s/on at 0430. In (I presume) with religion at 0502. (RJS)
- CMJN Cuba, Camaguey, may have been the SS briefly atop WBBM 11/3 at 0033. (LBG) Noted fair to weak signals 0515 through 0600. (JC)
- JOIU Japan, Muroran, was probably the NHK station that s/off 1000 11/5. (LBG) Heard NHK pips 11/7 at 0600. (RJS)
- 790 CMCH Cuba, Havana, "Cadena Habana" was almost all alone here when checked on 11/3 from 1835-1840. (ELK)
- 805 HCFV1 Ecuador, Quito, "Canal Tropical" logged and reported 0404-0428 1/2 PJB s/on 11/7. SS music, fair signals, but subject to deep fading. (JC) Was perhaps the SS in weakly at 0507 (MM 11/7. I'll keep trying this one! (LBG) Weak SS 11/6 at 0450. (RJS)
- 825 TIOS Costa Rica, San Jose, "Radio Titania" seems back up to this reading. Heard 11/6 at 1904-1907. (JAC)
- 834 -BHBS- British Honduras, Belize puts in a fair to good signal a few days each week. Heard as early as 1900. (BER)
- 840 ???? UnID, a very, very weak LA was noted here 10/31 at 0235. Suspect PRH9, but no evidence to support it. (ELK) UnID-SS here 11/6 at 0459 s/on, too weak to get ID. Cuban? (RJS)
- 850 XEZF Mexico, Mexicali, BCN, "La Rancherita Contenta" had tremendous signals 11/5 at 1006. (LBG)
- YNAV Nicaragua, Managua, "Radio Continental", noted with usual programming 11/7 at 0228-0232, mainly to get an ID on tape. (JAC)
- 854 ???? Rats! (Who-RJS??) I got a rare MM when WJW is off and conditions have to be poor! A very weak signal was noted here on 10/31 at 0115 I suspect Peru over Murcia as the TA's were all but nonexistent. (ELK)
- 860 TGX Guatemala, Guatemala, "Radio Ciro's" was almost certainly the LA logged here on 10/31 from 0132-0140. Only a fair signal, however. (ELK) (Ed, note NRC report of TGKL-840 move to 860-RJS)
- 875 YNW1 Nicaragua, Leon, "Radio Mundial" noted with special program for forthcoming elections 11/5 2328-0003 s/off. Gave complete list of polling places, interspersed with march music. Not very sparkling listening! Evening of 11/6 and 11/7, though, found no Nicaragua election returns. (JAC)
- 880 YVMP Venezuela, Barquisimeto, "Radio Lara" was logged with a weak to fair signal from 0506-0516 1/2 on 10/31. WCBS OC ended the game. Reported. (ELK)
- ???? UnID, Oriental seemed // to 840 JOQK, but very weak at 0355 11/7. The 878 North Korean was giving a strong hut. (KGS) UnID, heard 11/7 at 0445-0500 with classical/popular music, woman IDing, no language IDed. (GS)
- 890 HJCE Colombia, Bogota, heard 10/31 at 0110. (BAP)
- 890 -AFRS- Alaska, Adak, as recently as 1965 this station was 24 hours a day, and was operated by assigned Navy personnel. (MR)
- 970 HLCR South Korea, Seoul, has been conspicuous by its absence. Heard it lately. (RJS) (LBG) (Nope, KCHV is very effective!!-RJS)
- 1000 ???? UnID SS s/on at 0500 on MM's. Fair signal, but heavy QSB. (BER)
- (Bill, I heard YVOB-San Cristobal at 0500 s/on last year-RJS)
- 1000 WBNB Virgin Islands, Charlotte Amalie, noted at 0500 s/on 10/31. Used SSB. UnID LA mixed with them, suspect a YV. (ELK)

- 1015 HJAI Colombia, Barranquilla, "Radio Kalamary" was in with a fine signal on 11/3 from 1957-2022, had severe QSB. Definite ID's. Rpted.(ELK)
- 1020 ..... China, "Kum Yow", Program in Cantonese (I think) at 0445 on 11/6 over KDKA. IDcd as "Kum Yow Jun-min Kuan-to Tien-tai" at 0455.(KGS)
- 1035 4VEF Haiti, Cap Haitien is often heard evenings at 1900 w/good signals. Especially strong on 10/31 at 1900-1930 w/EE lessons. Good time for a report. (BER)
- 1040 TGXA Guatemala, Guatemala, "Radio Centro" heard 10/31 at 0030. (BAP)  
YVLB Venezuela, Valencia, "La Voz de Carabobo" was logged for a report on 11/6 from 0453-0510. Had apparently just s/on. NRC reports 0400 s/on, but I wonder if Sunday's s/on is later. Had a program called "Los Exitos Musicales del Domingo". (ELK)
- 1060 CMBQ Cuba, Havana, "Radio Enciclopedia Popular" is station with US standards noted around 0340, fair to good. Can't work up much enthusiasm for reporting to Cubans. (JAC)
- 1070 HJCG Colombia, Bogota, "Radio Santa Fe" logged 0305-0332 with music, different nationalities, time checks, complete ID's (minus call letters) for BCB and SW each 15 minutes. They couldn't have a blander format unless they segued selections. (JAC)
- 1080 HJZD Colombia, Medellin, "Radio Reloj" just readable under WTIC on 10/27 at 2020. (BAP)
- 1160 ????? UnID oriental, fairly strong, had no IS at 0700 MM 11/7. (LBG)
- 1180 XEFR Mexico, Mexico, DF. "Radio Felicidad" was in with a fine signal on 11/6 at around 0345. (ELK) Was fair on 11/7 at 0345.(KGS) Didn't realize they were on this late. Logged 0335 on 11/7.(JAC)
- 1250 -FES- Asiatic USSR, Khabarovsk, great signal on 11/6 at 0430. No QRM at all with the loop. (KGS)
- 1295 PJD2 Sint Maarten, Philipsburg, heard 11/7 at 0428, fair signal.(RJS)
- 1325 PJA10 Netherlands Antilles, Aruba, was noted with a fairly nice signal on 11/3 from 2037-2045. Anyone ever verify this one?(ELK)
- 1394 ..... Albania, Tirana, heard testing 10/29 at 1545 and 10/30 at 1130. Drowns out Austria, AFN, and Sweden here.(NRC/W.Germany)
- 1424 ????? UnID, detected a carrier here 0135 11/4, but could read nothing(JC)
- 1428 ????? UnID, carrier noted here 0115, on 11/4, but too much 1430 splatter to detect any audio. Good night for West Africa.(JC)
- 1435 ????? Neth. Antilles, apparently the OC, no audio, noted 11/4 0120.(JC)
- 1460 3YW New Zealand, Westport, came in on top of the JJ station at 0401 on 11/7 with weather; news then at 0403. 3YW played music from Japan after about 0415 (Jap had US standards). Reported at last(KGS)
- 1520 2QN Australia, Dinelquin, NSW, must have been the one with accented speech on SE Asia MM 11/7 at 0517 very readable and //4QD-1550, but not //-2N.-1510. Don't know why it would be // on ABC station since it is commercial. (LBG) (Special news-wire of some sort-RJS)
- 1535 HJ.. Colombia, Barrancabermeja, "La Voz del Pueblo" now moved here from 1542. (NRC/Jamaica)
- 1538 ..... Senegal, Dakar, also noted 11/4 with some audio. Not as strong as 764, naturally. (JC)
- 1550 4QD Australia, Emerald, Qsld. boomed in at times on 11/6. Historical drama about Queen Victoria 'til 0600, then local and network ID and news. (KGS)
- 1554 -RTF- France, Nice, the only European in on 11/4. (JC)
- 1560 2RE Australia, Taree, NSW, probably the accented EE with fair signals at 0519 MM 11/7. (LBG)
