What we especially are looking for is the type of programming at a specific time, the s/on and s/off times and WITH WHAT. Also if a NA, is it vocal or music. This can help us all. Also we like note what other stations are interfering. What I am not too interested in is "KGAY, Salem on RS 1400 10/21." This is a local condition only, and is really no help to anyone in logging this station. One idea I have had however is a "Station of the Week", which I can type up in my column, space permitting. One of your locals might be someone elses most desired station and any tips might result in its being logged. I'll put in an example. If you like this idea lets do it for Wash., Ore., and Calif. only. Lets have your comments on this in the round-up or Forum.

OREGON station of the WEEK- KGAY, Salem Oregon. 1430 kc with 5000 watts. A real powerhouse and is noted way atop on car radiotill Yreka Cal. when KALI/KOL take over in early afternoons. All cw. programming. Announces as "Radio Wonderful Willamotteland" and after has a singing ID. S/off in Nov. is 447 PM PST with a few bars of "Listen to the Mockingbird". Has 5AM PST s/on.

Application was made last week for the operator of radio station KCKC in San Bernardino to acquire controlling interest in KGOL in Palm Desert. The joint announcement was made by Del Davitt, the current owner of KGOL and Henry Trenner of Bermuda Dunes who is president of the new corporation that will own KGOL. KSEE was coming in over KWIZ/KYOS at 6:53 until they went off the air. Today is 11/20. KLIV-1590 in S-9 until 7:00 power lowering. Favorite station at night is KDON-1460 Salinas, ususally in from S-7 to S-9 all night with KENO under them. I can get KIST and KUDU all day now on the Hammarlund out in the garage; 16 tuber job from WW2. Now, a little info on the local outlaws: KPNT has been KENK since around August and have been operating with 10 watts. The owner told me that they now have 100 watts and beam into Central Los Angeles; BUT, I couldn't hear them with their supposedly 100 watt output; all I got on 1610 was a strange KFWB-KRLA image. REPORT ON ANARC ACTIVITIES

There are several items of interest for IRCA members in the most recent ANARC (Association of North American Radio Clubs) newsletter. One is the offer of PJB - Trans World Radio in Bonair - to send sheets describing how to write good reception reports to those reporters whose reports are verifiable but may not be of the best quality. ANARC will supply TWR with the sheets, which will also include information about ANARC and will state that information on North American radio clubs can be obtained from ANARC headquarters. I personally think that this is a fine gesture by PJB and a good chance to help some beginners to write better and more useful reception reports.

The second interesting news is the proposed ANARC countries list criteria. A vote will soon be taken amongst the ANARC reps of the various clubs, and if the proposed criteria are passed the country list will be made up using the accepted criteria. The ANARC list does not cater to any particular band, but is fairly general. IRCA's country list is quite specific (for example, it includes only those countries known to have operating BCB stations). Here are the proposed ANARC criteria :

1. Any self governing nation shall count as a DXing radio country area. For the purposes of this list, a radio country shall be defined as "a group of people who have something in common, such as language, religion, etc., and are banded together under a central government for their mutual benefit, operating within certain defined boundaries." (Note - this will take care of Angola, etc. in a general rule).
2. Colonized territory (possessions) or lands in free association shall be counted separately from the mother country.
3. Each colony or possession administered separately from all other colonies of the same nationality shall be considered a separate radio country.
4. Any territory or land mass under joint control of, or shared in claims by, two or more self-governing nations, under UN control or UN Trusteeship, shall count as a separate radio country.
 - (a) Any permanently leased territory shall count as a separate radio country.
 - (b) Antarctica, presently shared in claims, shall count as one radio country until colonial boundaries are established.
 - (c) For the purposes of this list, the locally-administered city of Hong Kong, as well as Singapore, will be counted as separate radio countries.
 - (d) For purposes of this list, Vatican City will count as a separate radio country.
5. For the purpose of this criterion, the following provisions are made for the logging of International Waters transmitters, outer space emissions, and air space loggings:
 - (a) Int. Waters loggings shall count as one country only, regardless of the number of loggings. (Note - mainly intended for utilities DXers, so 100 ship-to-shore QSL's wouldn't be 100 countries).
 - (b) Outer space (50 or more miles above the earth) shall count as one radio country, regardless of the number of loggings.
 - (c) Air space, not exceeding 50 miles above the earth, and the portable transmitters within, shall count as one country logged for each country flown above, with "country" status to conform with this criterion's general regulations.
6. Any territory, not covered under another regulation of this criterion, and separated by all other territory of the same nationality by 50 miles of land mass or Int. Waters, shall count as a separate radio country.
7. This list recognizes as separate radio countries the varied Soviet Socialist Republics.
8. Provision is hereby made to this criterion for additions to, and amendments of, the resulting Country List, said power to rest with the Executive Secretary of ANARC.

It seems to me that a relatively short set of criteria that takes care of all cases fairly is a hard task. There possibly will be some examples that will be noticed that won't fit with the above criteria, so perhaps some specific notations will have to be added to the criteria. If you'd like to compare these criteria to those of IRCA's Country List Committee, look back to the March 12, 1966 Monitor (page 2). The last time the IRCA list was published was 13 November 1965. kgs.

LOTS OF RARE DX FROM OUR OWN NORTH AMERICA

There's lots of DX for all of us just from our own continent! There are 36 or 37 countries in North America, and so there are many chances to increase our totals right here at home. Lots of the countries are relatively easy to log, too. For example, Barbados (even though it has moved to 780 kc.) has a strong signal even to the west coast. Belize, British Honduras on 834 kc., Radio Americas on Swan Island (1157 kc.), and Point Galina, Jamaica on 750 kc. are heard throughout the continent. Also 4VIEF - 1035 kc, from Cape Haitien, Haiti. ZBM1-1235 in Hamilton, Bermuda is also possible on MMs, depending on your local conditions on the adjacent frequencies. Cuba, of course, has many loud outlets, so that the listening part is easy - it's getting the verie that is the snag with Cuba. Mexico (eg. XEG-1050, XELO-800, etc.) is a cinch to hear and verify, but there are lots of stations that are real challenges. One of interest will be XEVIP-1560, the new English-language CBS outlet in Mexico City. The six Spanish speaking countries of Central America - Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, and Panama - have lots of stations to try for, so we'll spend more time on them in a separate article.

We've all heard Canada, but there's some rare stuff there when you look past the powerhouses like the CBC Trans Canada network, CKWX, CKLW, CFRB, and so on. CBI-1140 (Sydney, N. S.) made it to the west several times on MMs last fall, and CFPR-860 (Prince Rupert, B. C.) has been logged in the east at its s/off time of about 0315 EST. More difficult are CHAK (also 860) in Inuvik, N. W. T. and CFWH-570 in Whitehorse, Yukon. And then there are all those low-powered (20 and 40 watt) relays of the CBC, and the peanut stations on some of the military bases. Newfoundland has lots of good catches, too, like VOAR-1230, CJOX-710, and the Labrador stations CBG-1450 and CFGB-1340.

Don't forget the nearby St. Pierre et Miquelon outlet of Radiodiffusion Television Francaise on 1375 kc., a few miles off the south coast of Newfoundland. At 4 kw., there are many DXers who'd like to claim this one.

Alaska, because of its separation from the lower 48 states, counts as a separate country as well as a state. Most commonly heard stations are KFQD-750 in Anchorage, KICY-850 in Nome, KFAR-660 in Fairbanks, and KINY-800 in Juneau. Weaker commercial stations to watch for include KBYR-1270, KSEW-1400, KIBH-950, and KTKN-930. The AFRTS has weak stations in Alaska on quite a few frequencies; 890-Adak has been heard this year, at 250 watts. Some AFRTS stations are as low as 10 watts.

Speaking of the AFRTS, on good TA nights look for the Armed Forces station in Thule, Greenland on 1425 kc.

Moving to a little warmer region - the Caribbean, there are a great many countries to bag. A few of the easier ones are noted above. Tough ones include the stations of the Windward Islands. These are on split frequencies, though, and are freer of QRM. There's St. Georges, Grenada (535 kc.), Castries, St. Lucia (685 kc.), Roseau, Dominica (695 kc.), and Kingston, St. Vincent (705 kc.). Radio Caribbean at Castries, on 840 kc. with 10 kw., is perhaps an easier way to log a Windward Islands country. Guadeloupe in the French West Indies is possible on both 640 and 1420 kc. Easiest American Virgin Islands station is WBNE-1000 (watch at its MM s/on time of about 0500. You can also try for WIVI-970 and WSTA-1340. PJD2-1295 in St. Maarten, Netherlands West Indies, has raised its power recently and should be logged even more readily now. Montserrat has several stations operating now: Radio Montserrat on 885 is only 250 watts, but its only QRM is from YNKW (Radio Libertad). The new Radio Antilles station is not up to its proposed power of 200 kw, and is operating on an even frequency (930) rather than the proposed split (926). Martinique has a station on 1310 kc., another ORTF outlet. ZNS1 on 1540 (Nassau, Bahamas) has been heard quite often this year during Auroral conditions; there's also ZNS2 on 1240 kc. to try for. The Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico are heard fairly easily in the eastern part of the country, and there are lots of stations to choose from.

My nominations for the toughest (and therefore the most exotic DX) from the C.Am.-Caribbean are: the Canal Zone stations on 790 and 1420 kc. (both supposedly NSF), the AFRTS station at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba on 1340 kc., ZBVI-780 at Tortola, British Virgin Islands, Radio Ziz-570 kc. which is assigned to St. Kitts; Antigua - variable frequency (620 to 644), and as a real gem - HJHU-1260 on San Andres Island, a Colombian territory. Even if you don't have any of these rare stations, why not fill in your best catches on the map of North America? Remember, the distance to the North American stations is not too great, and keep trying for them in the next few years of higher sunspot activity.

- 640 ???? A mystery broke through CMQ with classical music, quite clearly, at 0500, then faded. Seemed like an ET or maybe s/on. (LBG)
- 647 -BBC- England, Daventry was noted in EE at 0058 on 11/16. Nice signal. (ELK)
- 656 ???? UNID TA was spotted here at 0120 on 11/16. I suspect Italy. (ELK)
- 665 Portugal, Lisbon was noted at s/on, 0100, on 11/16. Superlative signal. (ELK)
- 670 YVLL Venezuela, Caracas, "Radio Rumbos" heard well with "R. Rumbos" news and chimes after each item. 11/21 at 0516-0520. (RJS) UNID SS mentioned "Caracas" and gave chimes as in ID, but couldn't catch it. Perhaps a YV. (LBG) (Agreed, maybe your 640 is too-RJS)
- 674 France, Marseille slugged it out with "Radio Union", and came in quite well on 11/16 from 0116-0120. (ELK)
- 680 WAPA Puerto Rico, San Juan is, I am 90% sure, the one with "Lord's Prayer" at 0410 most MM's. Heard just prior to s/on with SS 11/21. No CP34 noted at all this AM. (LBG) S/on heard 11/21 at 0409 with "Lord's Prayer" until after s/on announcement following SS at 0415. No sign of CP34. Had 2 SS at 0500, and an EE too. (RJS)
- 725 -SRS- Surinam, Paramaribo, finally logged with s/on in Dutch (presumed) and EE at 0430 MM 11/21. Showed consistent strength for several minutes. Reported. (LBG) Ditto (RJS)
- 735 HJCU Colombia, Bogota "Radio Tricolor" was, I feel certain, the LA noted here on 11/14 with a good signal, but with severe co-channel QRM. Monitored from 2202-2215. (ELK)
- 750 HJDK Colombia, Medellin heard w/USB and JBC on 10/18 at 2245. Weak (RV)
- 755 CSA2 Portugal, Lisbon heard on 10/6 at 1900½. Very strong signal. (RV) Had an absolutely fantastic signal at 1908-1912 on 11/14. (ELK)
- 770 YVQQ Venezuela, Puerto La Cruz, heard "Radio Puerto la Cruz" over-powering WABC on 10/5 at 2121. (RV)
- 773 -RNE- Spain, San Sebastian heard real strong on 11/11 w/"Radio Nacional de Espana" ID at 1800. Followed by chimes and whistles on hour. (RV)
- 782 CSB9 Portugal, Miramar, was possibly the UNID PP or SS (couldn't tell language) here on 11/14 from 0105-0235. Had mucho music (all types, even US R&R), male and female announcers, three pips at 0200. Signal was very weak, severe QSB, no QRM. 0235 is kind of late for a TA, isn't it? (BER) (Not at all, Bill, East Coasters often here w. Europe stations after 0400, BBC-1214 was in until 0430 in Texas and 0415 in San Diego two years ago-RJS)
- 812 HJBW Colombia, Bucaramanga, "Emisora Atalaya" is probably the SS heard 11/21 at 0540-0550, dominating 810 at times. (RJS)
- 818 Andorra, Andorra was noted with a good signal at 0137 on 11/16. Was in French at this time. (ELK)
- 820 HJED Colombia, Bogota "La Voz de Rio Cauca" heard on 11/21, rare for me; 0220-0240 with much fading, S-6 peaks. (KGS) (It's Cali, my boe boe, not Gray's--RJS)

- 827 ???? A weak TA was noted here at 0133 on 11/16. Possibly EAJ1 in Barcelona as I thought the language was SS. (ELK)
- 840 ???? UnID SS noted with non-stop records, many of them SS vocals, 0000-0130 11/15. Then I heard SS announcements at 0100 and 0125 11/18. Any ideas what this might be? HJBI off by 0000. (LBG)
- 850 H3KC Colombia, Bogota, "Emisora Nueva Mundo" has been heard quite often in the past, but rarely at the level heard 11/21 at 0522 and on. (RS)
- 855 ???? A real puzzler, with Hawaiian music of all things at 0532 11/21. Perhaps PJC2? This is probably the same one I heard 11/14, reported as 856 kc. (LBG)
- 870 JOLB Japan, Fukuoka heard 11/20 at 0430 //830. (KGS)
- 870 ???? The strong SS AN SM's with WWL off remains unID here. I thought I caught a "La Voz de Cuba" ID at 0304 11/20, but not at all sure. At 0410 it had a newscast with details from Venezuela and the Dominican Republic, and was not anti-US. (LBG)
- 872 EAJ101 Spain, Zaragoza, "Radio Zaragoza" was possibly the TA here from 1855-1902. Fair signal, but severe WWL QRM. This on 11/14. Still trying for a report on this one. (ELK)
- 881 -88C- Wales, Washford, has the credit for being my first IDed TA. Was heard on 11/14 giving weather for Wales at 0155, but faded very quickly. Not enuf for a report, darn. Signal was very weak, caused a hot WWL QRM. (BER)
- 890 Fiji, Lautoka is still here. (LBG, from NZDXT)
- 890 ???? UnID, heard fast talk at 0243 and on, 11/21. Music at 0251, but couldn't ID language. Single long time tone at 0300, the Jap faded in later. UnID looped SA. (KGS) (Possibly HJCE-RJS)

- 965 YNLU Nicaragua, Managua, "Radio Managua" was heard at 2035 on 11/13 with a very good signal, slight QRM, moderate QSB. (BER) Heard 11/21 at 0601 with music, apparently right after s/on. No ID. (RJS)

- 1043 East Germany, Dresden was noted with a powerhouse signal at 2245-2250 on 11/14. Program of good music. (ELK)
- 1043 ???? UnID SS with very good signal at times, but only voice heard at 0400 when a TC for EST was heard. Anyone catch an ID? 08X40 was noted on 1048 kc recently, so I wonder what this one was. (LBG) (Was HQJ2 on 1045 then, Larry?-RJS)
- 1090 Communist China, Peking outlet heard in Mandarin on 11/21 at 0528 and on. XERB is now off MM's from 0500-0600, which is greatly appreciated. Also had a CBC Maritime ID at 0504 here, but it's domestic so I won't say anymore about it. Must be an LPRT or CHRS. Any ideas? (RJS)
- 1098.6 YSRF El Salvador, San Salvador, "Radio Femenina", 1 kw, is shown on IIOO in govt. list, but here according to DFG. (NRC/Krcjny)

- 1188.5 HJCT Colombia, Barranquilla, "La Voz de la Costa" detailed world news till 2358 10/31. (NRC/Indiana)
- 1190 ???? UNID SS heard evenings u/WOWO; gave ID at 1930 on 11/15. (BER)
- 1277 France, Strasbourg was probably the TA logged here at around 0045. Medicore signal, and no logging altho still needed. This on 11/16.
- 1295 -BBC- England, Crowborough was noted with a nice signal on 11/16 even with WERE blasting away. Program in FF at 0041. (ELK-last-2)
- 1322 East Germany, Leipzig must have been the TA here in German from 0005-0035. First time noted here. Fine signal but occasionally severe QRM. This on 11/16. Reported via tape. This is my 100th European logged. (ELK)
