Ap-530 is at Active Pass B.C.--Half-way between Victoria and Vancouver. Active Pass is the channel between Galiano and Mayne Is. Al-525 is at Alert Bay, B.C., wherever that is. All teletypes heard on BCB are images as far as I know. CMS: It is not necessary for eye of hurricane to pass over an area to cause wind damage; storm may also set up tidal wave many miles from it. Also, RA may have stopped SW transmission on their own. Lastly, MW antennas are often longer than SW and more likely to be damaged by wind. In short, the storm doesn't prove a thing about R. A short hop is taken from Maine to New Hampshire and Vermont this month. Conditions, atmospheric, that is, are similar to Maine, but station reception is different. Signals are strong on the first skip, but weaken considerably on the second to fourth; Maine's are more easily heard on the second. Reception will be easiest on the Eastern coast. Anyplace else that they may be heard at long distance will be due to freak conditions.

Surprisingly, Vermont, with far fewer "power stations" (5,000 watts or more), is easier to log; this due to the frequencies! At times, New York, Vermont, and New Hampshire stations fight it out on their fringes. Frequencies are the same for many stations in this area.

SOME NOTES ON THE NEW EDITORIAL POLICY

Our Board of Directors has voted to approve the Editorial Policy that is enclosed with this issue of our bulletin and to rescind the present official Editorial Policy. The Policy is fairly self-explanatory; however, to answer some questions that may arise, I shall comment on a few portions of the Policy.

Basically, what this new Editorial Policy does is to legalize the present format of our bulletins, under which we have been temporarily operating for the past few weeks. As our older members may recall, the former Editorial Policy made no provision for the "DX Roundup" columns that are now in use, but with this exception, we have attempted to maintain the general context of the former Policy.

Regarding the line and column limitations, the Publication Format Committee felt that since most of the space that was taken up in the "DX Forum" concerning DX information would for the most part now be included into the "DX Roundups," we believe the 15-line limit for "DX Forum" reports is not too restrictive. Of course, reports over 15 lines containing pertinent DX information would still appear. The column sizes mentioned are to serve only as guides and may vary from the sizes specified if necessary.

Although our club may not necessarily condone the appearance of non-DX information in "DX Forum" reports such as personal notices and remarks, etc., the PFC believe that Proposal 2.1-78, which allows such information to appear, should be introduced into the Policy, thus the reason for Section III, E.

Section III, H, was written to preclude any possible editorial rephrasing to the effect that a member's report may appear to say one thing while in reality he may have said something different. The method to indicated such rephrasing is up to the editor, however, a simple "(Report rephrased)" is sufficient.

Our club's policy on "pirate" stations, as stated in Section III, I, may need to be clarified. This Section does not pertain to stations operating in International Waters since such stations cannot be categorized as being under the jurisdiction of any specific national radio regulatory agency. Therefore, publicity on such stations may still appear as well as DX information on them.

Should you have any questions about our new Editorial Policy, please feel free to drop me a card or letter or mention it in your "DX Forum" reports. I shall be happy to help you out as best I can.

IRCA EDITORIAL POLICY

I. **PURPOSE:** The purpose of this Policy is to outline the duties and authorities of the IRCA Editorial Staff.

II. **CONTENTS:** The IRCA bulletin, called DX Monitor, shall comprise the following sections:

A. Administrative and General Feature Section

1. The IRCA President's reports, when necessary.
2. Results of voting by the Board of Directors (BoD), to be reported by the president.
3. Club membership and financial reports. The financial report will be written by the IRCA Secretary-Treasurer, and published only after its approval by the BoD.
4. Cover page, compiled by the Publishing Committee, to include announcements of club interest such as DX programs, etc.
5. Additional feature columns as approved by the BoD.

B. DX Sections

1. Domestic DX sections, to include all reports from members in the United States and Canada of stations located in and/or licensed by these two nations.

a. Each member will report to the editor(s) representing his own section of the continent, as follows:

1. Atlantic and Eastern Time Zone areas
2. Central and Mountain Time Zone areas
3. Pacific westward to and including Bering Time Zone areas

b. There will be two columns for each reporting area, a "DX Forum" ("DXF"), and a "DX Roundup" ("DXR").

c. All times reported will be in Eastern Standard Time.

d. "DX Forum"

1. The "DXF" columns will contain reports from individual members with information or comment about their DX activity and equipment, the IRCA and its policies, and any other relevant and allowable discussion that cannot be fitted into another column.

2. "DX Forum" editors shall have the authority to limit reports to fifteen lines in the interest of conserving space for other reports or of eliminating non-pertinent information.

3. "DX Forum" editors may omit from reports any statements made in a language other than English which are, in the editors' judgment, meaningless or excessively long.

4. If members submit more than one report per issue to the "DXF" without instructions to destroy those previously submitted, the editor may disregard the earlier report(s), unless that have already been stencilled; in that case, the editor may either defer or disregard the later report(s).

e. "DX Roundup"

1. Each "DXR" column will contain reports of domestic DX loggings and tips such as sign-on and sign-off times, frequency checks, and any other useful station schedule information.

2. Reports will be listed by frequency and should include the call letters, location, date and time of reception, type of programming and any other concise and useful comments, e.g., signal strength, interference encountered, and whether a regular or uncommon catch.

f. Preferably the "DXF" editor will also compile the "DXR" for the same area; however, if necessary, one editor may be appointed for each column from that specific area.

2. Foreign DX section, called "DX World Wide" ("DXWW"), to include all reports of stations located and/or licensed from outside the United States and Canada, and, separately, all reports of domestic stations hoard by foreign members.

- II., B., 2., a. "DX World Wide" will contain reports of loggings, schedules, addresses, and verification information concerning foreign stations.
- b. Reports should be listed by frequency, and should include call letters (if any), location, date and time of reception, type of programming, and any other concise and useful comments, e.g., signal strength, interference encountered, and whether a regular or uncommon catch.
- c. "DX World Wide" will also contain 'DX Records' (listing of members' verification achievements, compiled by a separate editor), standings in IRCA Foreign DX Contest, and any other information deemed helpful for foreign DXing by the editor.
- d. There will only be one editor for "DX.WI."

G. Size of DX Monitor

1. DX Monitor will be twenty pages (10 sheets) per issue, if possible, but may be larger at the discretion of the Publishing Committee Chairman or the individual column editors. Individual sections shall attempt to follow these approximate lengths:
- a. Each "DXF" column, two pages
- b. Each "DXR" column, one page
- c. "DX World Wide" column, six pages
2. Remainder of DX Monitor will include the administrative section and any normal excesses of DX columns.

III. EDITORIAL AUTHORITY

- A. Editors may omit portions of reports to comply with size regulations, provided that omission does not remove pertinent DX information or detract from effectiveness of included portions.
- B. Editors may add to columns or reports only if such additions do not violate size regulations and if comments are both pertinent and in accord with this Policy.
- C. Editors may determine individual formats of their particular columns, and methods by which reports are to be submitted, beyond the formats specified in this Policy.
- D. Editors may omit any report or portion thereof that they deem would
1. Violate any applicable portion of this Policy
 2. Be detrimental to the IRCA, its individual members, or its policies
 3. Be interpreted as profane or otherwise improper language
- E. It is a privilege of members to have in their published reports any reasonable and prudent mention of non-DX information, provided such information does not violate the format of the particular column and that such mention does not jeopardize the particular column's size.
- F. Editors will have authority over "filler" material used at the end of their columns, provided such material follows this Policy.
- G. Editors may disregard illegible reports.
- H. Editors may rephrase any report or portion thereof if they deem such rephrasing to be in the best interest of their column(s), this Policy, or the IRCA. Any such rephrasing must, however, be indicated as such by the editor, with the knowledge that the reporting member assumes no responsibility for the rephrased text.
- I. No advance publicity will be given to any station broadcasting in violation of the rules of its specific nation's radio regulatory agency. However, reports concerning reception of such stations may appear in applicable DX columns.
- J. Editors will have authority to omit any reports submitted by other than IRCA members-in-good-standing; however, interesting reports from non-members may be included if they comply with this Policy.

IV. RESPONSIBILITY

- A. The BoD will have sole authority for passage and amending of this Policy
- B. Any violations of this Policy will be dealt with by the BoD in accordance with the IRCA By-laws.

From the San Diego Union, 11/26/66: "Kent magistrates court yesterday convicted a pirate radio station management of broadcasting without a license on British territory from an abandoned fort in the Thames Estuary. The company was fined 100 pounds (\$280). It was the first of several pirate radio cases to be tried. The station, known as Radio 390 for the wavelength it used (773 kHz) announced it would cease operations at once."

Prime DX Possibilities : Winter Solstice, 1966

On or near the date of the winter solstice, December 21, the TA DX'er will have his best chance to log a number of very rare stations and countries. As the solstice date approaches, local sunsets come earlier, sunrises come later, and the total amount of signal attenuation due to ionizing solar radiation reaches a minimum. Since the polar regions are essentially in total darkness during this period, signal paths through high latitude ("polar") regions are greatly favored.

While a flat map conveys the impression that the distance to India is very great, the relevant high latitude great circle signal path from Lucknow to New York is actually shorter than the path from New Zealand to New York. Signal paths from the following stations to the East Coast are all possible during the solstitial period; best bets for logging this year have been starred. Try for these stations from about December 1 to January 15; barring unpredictable ionospheric disturbances, reception from these stations (whatever there may be) should peak on December 21.

IRAN ** Teheran-895 is listed as 50 kw; the all night Radio Iran broadcast in Persian may be audible from sign-on 1630. This one gets to England but has not been reported from the US for many years. Beware of mistaking native Andean music from OBX4X if they're still on 895. Kermanshah-985 is listed as a full 100 kw but the schedule is highly unfavorable for US reception: sign-off at 1330. This one is impossible unless on late.

INDIA ** Lucknow-760 is 50 kw and is on until 2115, which makes it a prime pre-sunset possibility. There's a good chance that this one can be snagged an hour or so before sunset while WJR and WCPS are still down. Often heard in England. Cuttack-965 is about the only other possibility for India although its comparatively low power (20 kw) and eastern location make it even more difficult than Lucknow-760. Schedule on this one is uncertain.

KAZAKHSTAN Tselinograd-746, 20 kw, provides two possible time periods for reception in North America: before sign-off at 1603 and after they sign back on at 1900. Lopic, Aleppo, and Cottbus will likely dominate the channel during the earlier period but should be off by 1900 most nights.

KIRGHIZ ** Frunze-611, 25 kw, is possible for a few minutes after their 1900 sign-on. The channel should be clear (except possibly for East Germany) after AFN and Morocco complete their sign-off formats.

CHINA The Sinkiang station on 1525 which was heard by several DX'ers in North America during the week of solstice last year has reportedly changed frequency. In the event that they reappear, this station is a good bet around 1600.

ETHIOPIA Harrar-840 and Addis Ababa-870, both 100 kw, are well received in Europe but will be rough here. While the Domestic QRM is minimal several hours before sunset, the 1500 sign-off time is a bit early for likely propagation. Very near solstice is the best time for these two stations. If they're on late, they may well break through the domestics.

GREENLAND ** Thule-1425 is regularly heard around solstice throughout the country; best times are 2200-0200.

ICELAND ** Keflavik AFRTS-1484, 1 kw, is a good bet after 2000 when the Common Wave jumble begins to clear up; their AN AFRTS programming should cut through the remaining carriers for those DX'ers with sufficient patience. Hoefn-665, 1 kw, is possible to sign-off at 2000 but Lisboa I will be very difficult to get past without a good loop; all-Icelandic programming won't help either.

GIBRALTAR ** Wellington Front-1484, 1 kw, is possible from November 25 to February 24 according to the E20 calculations made last year; this one should peak about January 11 on which date fade-out should be about 0225. This one should be in only for a few minutes after 0155 sign-on at best.
