STORM-BATTERED TIRI WINS OUT ... THE PIRATES FACE A NIGHT OF TERROR

The Radio Pirates, who have laughed in the face of authority, joked as they faced the thought of death this week. Death became a reality as high seas, lashed by gale-force winds, pounded the 101 ft Tiri. Fear of the unknown was worst. ... Would Tiri break up? Would her mooring anchor pull her bows off? Or would she roll too far, turn turtle, and sink?

Tiri stayed happily afloat, lurching around like a cork perhaps, but weathering the storm easily enough. The boys now have every confidence in their boat. ...

We slept a lot. Succumbed to lethargy, never to seasickness. Press reports about this annoyed the boys. Read books and MAD magazines Dave Gapes brought along, evidently thinking it appropriate. ... Apart from two days when seas were too rough to deliver a vital part, Doc spends most of his time with his beloved transmitter. "High seas won't affect Hauraki once we're on the air," he says. "The danger lies when we are testing. One slip and you could short circuit the lot."

CALM at last! Pirate radio ship Tiri is safely anchored in position, the morning after the first terrible night. She was completely undamaged - and absolutely seaworthy.

2 NZ Truth - Tuesday, November 22. CREDIT TO NO ONE IN HAURAKI FIASCO

The Public of New Zealand must be wondering just what is going to happen next in the Radio Hauraki affair (I ain't; I read the next clipping! kgs) following the Prime Minister, Mr. Holyoake's lauding of the pirates last week. His "I like pirates" statements in Auckland seemed like a crazy climax to a row in which the leading figures have emerged with very little credit. (Near bankruptcy for some - kgs). Mr. Holyoake, in fact, made a mockery of the Government's handling of the Radio Hauraki problem. After watching the row explode day after day for several months Mr. Holyoake blandly told an election meeting in Auckland that he admired the pirates for their imagination and initiative and he hoped it would be rewarded. His statements must have come as a shock to everyone - specially the Minister of Marine and Broadcasting, Mr. Scott. ... Mr. Scott's handling of the matter left a lot to be desired - and he ended up being roundly criticised by Auckland magistrate, Mr. L. G. H. Sinclair. Mr. Scott lost "face" over the court case - which cost the Crown 52 pounds 10 shillings costs - and there was even a suggestion that he might resign.

Radio Hauraki managing-director Mr. David Gapes could have won few friends with his emotional outbursts against the Marine Department and the Post Office. Before the pirate ship set sail for Colville Channel, Mr. Gapes accused the Marine Dept. inspectors of "persistent obstruction." ....

In the ensuing court case magistrate Mr. Sinclair said that the detention order issued by Mr. Scott was not in the interests of safety, as was claimed, but served the dominant purpose of preventing the Tiri from going to sea as a pirate radio ship.

## Corporation Conditions Criticised

## N.Z.B.C.'S SAY ON PROGRAMMES

## TWO FIRMS SEEK RADIO TIME

Radio Hauraki and Radio International will tender for time on the YD stations. A spokesman for Radio International yesterday criticised the conditions on which the NZBC will allow private enterprise to use the stations. The corporation will remain the sole judge of what goes on the air. Private enterprise may tender for air time between 10 p.m. and 9 a.m. six days a week.

It will be allowed to broadcast only music programmes.

Contractors will be able to sell advertising time provided they pay the corporation a fee and cover all the costs of their programme. Organisations not running commercial programmes will have to make time available for the advertising arranged and obtained by the NZBC. The spokesman for Radio International described the conditions as a "weird operation." He said Radio International had wanted to broadcast news and documentary programmes as well as music. Conditions of contracts were given yesterday. Tenders close with the NZBC on January 31.

The chairman of the NZBC, Mr. C. A. McFarlane, said yesterday: "After weighing up all considerations, it was decided that the corporation was not empowered to lease station time on the NZBC stations under section 14 of the Act, but it was prepared to extend further the YD hours and invite tenders from private contractors for programme supply between 10 pm and 9 am."

Under the conditions of tender, the contractor will have to ensure that no programme includes anything which offends against good taste or decency or is likely to incite to crime or lead to disorder or to be offensive to public feeling. ... The minimum tender period will be two hours a week. The hours available to private broadcasters are:-

- \* 10 pm to midnight on Saturdays
- \* Midnight to 9 am on Mondays
- \* 10 pm to 9 am Monday to Saturday.

No private broadcasting will be allowed on Sundays, Christmas Day, Anzac Day or Good Friday. In the all-night programmes the contractors will be able to broadcast 16 minutes of advertising each hour. But in return they will have to:-

- \*Pay the NZBC a fee;
- \*Supply their own announcers, records, tapes and materials;
- \*Take out a 20,000 pound insurance policy in the name of the NZBC to protect the corporation against any defamation by the contractor.

The NZBC will make its studios available for the private broadcaster.

All advertising has to be in line with NZBC policy - that is, no cigarette, liquor, political or religious commercials.

The Manager of Radio International .. said last night that his organisation would tender for the whole of the midnight to 9 am broadcasting time... Radio International still wanted to operate its own radio station. It had hoped to use the YDs to show how it would use a private station. ... Radio Hauraki .. said last night (they) would tender for time, but it was "not overcome with joy at the proposal."

**TIRI BACK LOUD AND CLEAR** Radio Hauraki was back on the air yesterday. Reception in Auckland was excellent. Full transmitting hours - 6 am to midnight - would begin as soon as technicians were satisfied the equipment was working correctly.

4 N. Z. Press Association - December 3. GALE RIPS OFF TIRI'S 100 ft. RADIO MAST

Gale force winds snapped off the 100 ft. antenna of the radio ship Tiri at deck level this afternoon as the crew fought to manoeuvre the coaster back to its broadcasting position in the Hauraki Gulf. The mishap occurred when the Tiri dragged its anchor and started to drift toward the rocky coast. ... In the teeth of the storm the ship's engineer, Mr. W. Owen, climbed out on an outrigger spar, extending 12 ft. over the side of the Tiri, and used a gas torch to cut the stays of the fallen antenna, which then sank in 25 fathoms off Great Barrier Island. ... In the meantime Radio Hauraki staff will be busy erecting the 50 feet of the antenna that they still have in reserve. "We're not out of the game yet. We'll be on the air testing by next weekend."

PIRATES: Gray Scrimgeour sends us this item, clipped from the Times, London, 12/13/66: "Radio 390 Appeal Begins": Court began hearing the appeal of Radio 390 against its recent conviction, for operating a transmitter unlawfully, in London on December 12. Radio 390 would like to have the convictions quashed (fine of 100 pounds levied, but no confiscation of equipment). Their argument is the appeal is based on determining whether or not Red Sands Fort is in English Territorial Waters or in International Waters. Red Sands Fort is on "Middle Sands", 7 miles off the Kent coast normally, but at low tides because of long tidal recession the distance to shore is only 4.9 miles. This 4.9 miles is still outside the 3-mile territorial limit, but at the original trial it was claimed by the prosecutor that Middle Sands was a "low-tide elevation" (ie, that at extreme low tide, portions of Middle Sands were above water). Red Sands is marked on a government hydrographic chart as being a low-tide elevation and so at the time of the first trial was ruled by the court to be part of the English territory. Radio 390 now have some Kent fishermen to testify that they never have seen land at the location of Red Sands, and never heard of their being any! But the government countered with a Navy witness who says that if the chart says it's land, then it must be. Next step may be for Radio 390 to broadcast again, so that their fresh testimony can be made at an entirely new trial.

And broadcast, they did; Bill Nittler sends the following from the 1/1/67 Denver Post, dateline London: "Pirate Radio Station 390 was back on the air Sunday despite an early court ruling it was operating inside British territorial waters..."

At last report, Radio Hauraki in the Hauraki Gulf off Auckland, New Zealand was still broadcasting on 1400 kHz, with 2 kw. During its first days, the frequency varied up to 1484. Prospects for more New Zealand pirates look favorable. See Gray's column in this issue for more information.
