WHERE are our Calif. regular reporters. IF YOU DON'T SUPPORT THIS COLUMN THEN THE PRIME OBJECTIVE OF THE IRCA FAILS---DX. Had a chuckle at DKK's unid 1500 in Ark. How the ears can play tricks. About a year ago I took a 10 minute tape on a loud TT with 4 IDs on 1490. That was before I had a Vane Jones Book. ID as KPES in Lovelock Nevada. not just once but 4 times. Only there is no such station. HI. I like JKK idea of a sunrise-sunset table but to save alot of work on Jeff's part for 10 cents ( or that was price in 1948) you can send to US Government Printing Office in Washington DC and ask for "Section 26 of the Standards of Good Engineering Practice Concerning Standard BC Stations". Cover 550 to 1600 kc and contains tables of Average Sunrise and Sunset Based on Local Standard time in Specified Cities and Localities in the US. Should this bulletin be no longer available, I could send my 1948 copy to Jeff for someone to thermofax and send out. Even though it is 1948, it should and does still hold good, at least in the past.

I have another thought for the western area which could pick up interest. All of us have badly needed unknowns in different states. How about compiling a list of 10 or so in each nearby state and forwarding them to me. I would like to see if we can't set up a "Most Desired Station- HELP " Column. I'd gladly handle this on the WC. Drop me a card with your most desired DXs for Ida, Ore, Wash, BC, Mont and No. Cal. this time and lets see what we can do with it.

Another thought is to make a freq. of a week.. Lets all take 1300 for example on a MI between 0300-0560 just for an example. If this freq. is really monitored in the NW and SW for example, some interesting tests or RS could be picked up. On 1/30 when KYNO was off, I surely wished someone would monitor 1300 with me. Sensitivity was good, but there was a lot of line noise. To me it seems doubtful there was any connection between deletion of the R.Americas SW XMTR and the "controversy" over the location. Why wouldn't the BCB outlet have been deleted for the same reason? Good DX.

I now have inescapable evidence to prove Radio Snafus, the pirate station operating on 1157 kiloHertz, is indeed located in the Snafu Islands, one hundred miles off the coast of Upper Mysore (located above Lower Mysore.) The proof is in the form of a high resolution map of Greater Evil, the smaller island in the two-island group. 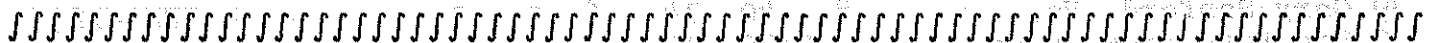

- 950 UnID SS heard 2/6 at 0415, o/u WPET on RS. Any ideas? (Hoogerheide, Ore.)
- 960 Mexico, Cd. Obregon, XEIQ on late with program promoting the Baja Grande motel in Obregon. Half the announcements were in English inviting Americans to come down to visit their city that is "untouched by tourism". S/off at 0300. ID is "Radio I-Q". (Nittler, Colorado)
- 990 Colombia, Medellin, HJDB surely the one with RCN ID and "La Voz de ..." at 0550 2/13, atop CBW. (L. Godwin, N. Calif)
- 1000 Nicaragua, Managua, YNT heard AN w/ERs on 2/6. Good signal, best of all YN's noted that AM, except YNKW, who was really pounding in. (Raczko, Ohio)
- 1001 UnID SS, perhaps HCEW2 per DFG's tip, noted 0612 MM 2/13. Weak. (Godwin, Cal)
- 1010 Mexico, Esperanza, Sonora, XEEB was in strong w/GBR during music pauses 0303 2/12. (Peterson, N. Calif)
- 1015 UnID SS heard 2/13 at 0509. HJAI2 (Seaver, S. Calif)
- 1020 Argentina, Santa Fe, LT10, "Radio Universidad del Litoral" broke thru WDKA for a few minutes at 2050 1/20. Weak signal and faded quickly after a fast ID on the hour. (Weber, England)
- 1040 Honduras, Tegucigalpa, HRVH, Radio Mil, heard w/SS R&R at 0147 on SM 2/5. WHO testing, so no report. Anyone ever get a verie from this one? (Raczko, Ohio) HRVH made interesting listening on 2/12 at around 0130 as it was mixed in nicely with Radio Tupi. Both had good signals. (Krejny, Ohio) (Bill, last v/s I have is: Alfonso Lastra Pinzon, Director, Apartado 1000, or 4a Ave, No. 015. Sends a v/l. May I take this opportunity to remind you all that I have a rather extensive card file of verie signers from the last 2 years, mainly of LA stations. Proceed with caution on these names, however. RJS)
- 1000 Venezuela, Barcelona, YVQJ in the clear with Notirumbos with KRLD off at times on 2/13 between 0500 and 0600. (Seaver, S. Calif)
- 1140 UnID, but JOBR was most likely the weak signal at 0400, 2/6. (Peterson, Cal)
- 1145 Panama, Panama, HOB 49 was logged here on 2/6 with a signal that was at times S9. Listened from 0132-0211 s/off. Definite ID and Panamanian NA noted. Very weak LA was left on the channel after their s/off. Who? Still there at 0315. (Krejny, Ohio)
- 1160 Peru, ERRATA: My reception on 1/23 was on 0600 s/on, not 0500. (Seaver)

Sweden Calling DXers had a story about German programs from Radio London which has been deuced by the station itself. They also have a story about "Radio Free America" to be anchored off the Californian coast and broadcast 10 hours per day!?

Either that, or some wild speculation has cropped up following the plans several months ago to found the country of Abalonio on Cortez Bank, off the coast of Southern Calif. The purpose of this island, which was to be artificial, dirt piled onto a sunken ship on the shallow bank, was for a fishery and light-house, but the U.S. government reportedly nixed it as a "hazard to navigation".

Gray also said that John Wallis, recently of the Coast Guard, stationed in San Clemente, is heading back to Philadelphia (his home) within a week. Haiti - Radio station 4VEH, The Evangelistic Voice of the West Indies, Cap Haitien, started on 1/0/67 operating a dual broadcast as follows: I-4VEF-1035 kHz, 10 kw, II-4VE- on 095 with 2.5 kw, which is now temporarily on 1090 kHz.

Swaziland Radio Swaziland-001 kHz, broadcasts in EE and Siswati; is also commercial, several South African made commercials noted, gong notes in between. IS is the "Cilongo", a Swazi trumpet.

Guinea - Radio Nationale appears to have raised the power of the 1403 kHz outlet from 4 kw. Has 1900 EST's/off, with NA.

From the New Zealand DX Times-

Cocos (Keeling) Island: VKW-1400 kHz, 100 watts is on the air 2230-1030 with programmes for airport personnel. Station is operated by volunteers and has an extensive tape and disc library. Has been heard in Malaysia, and is operated by Australian Civil Air Dept.
