The above is my NEW ADDRESS eff. imm'y. I note that KTW is AN again. They are AN-7 but NOT NSP! Share-time agreement w/KWSC says that both KWSC and KTW can not be on the air nights at the same time. Daytime, both OK. KWSC is on 0930 (EST, natch) to 0215 weekdays. So KTW is on Pullman sunrise (now 0945) to Seattle sunset (now 2030), and 0215 to 0930. Exception Sunday morning, KWSC not on until 1100 and KTW on straight through. Recommended reading: FCC rules & regs in back of BROADCASTING YEARBOOK (excerpts, mbn). For instance, did you know that many stations can operate with daytime facilities before sunrise, at 4 a.m. local standard time? This includes virtually all regional-channel stations. Exceptions include clear channels not assigned to the U.S.; operations that would interfere with a Class-I station unless an agreement is worked out; and share-time stations. Local-channel graveyarders cannot operate with more than 250 watts before sunrise. This allows many daytimers to sign on at 5 or 6 a.m. Changes in Yearbook: Wash., Pullman, KOFE is now KPUL. Ore., Eugene, switch KEED and KORE. Idaho, Payette, 2 stations listed on 1450. Which is the one? KEOK or KYET? Bill Raczko, a list on N.W. rr stns will be on the way shortly. Last semester GPA was 1.88, so DX down to a minimum until June. If I owe you a letter, be patient. 73.

President's Report

For the first time in IRCA history our dues are being increased. Effective March 1, IRCA dues will be changed as follows:

3rd class bulletins from \$4.00 to \$4.40 per year
 1st class bulletins from \$6.00 to \$6.60 per year
 Airmail bulletins from \$8.00 to \$8.80 per year

The new dues structure has been approved by the Board of Directors, upon the recommendation of the Secretary-Treasurer Bill Nittler, Publisher Bill Lipis, and President. The reason for the necessary increase is higher costs experienced in California than Colorado, due to paper and other mimeographing supplies being more expensive. Also, our membership total has dropped to just over 200, and the fixed costs of the club must be spread over a narrower base.

A complete financial statement, prepared by Bill Nittler, will appear in the bulletin soon. On February 1, 1967, we had \$216.96 in the bank.

Briefly, here is how we determined the average cost of one IRCA membership. First we divided all costs into two classes: fixed and variable. The fixed costs are those that would be incurred regardless of the number of members we had. For example, we would subscribe to Broadcasting magazine whether we had 100 members or 500. Other fixed costs are ANARC dues, advertisements (in "How to Listen to the World", etc.), mimeograph machine maintenance, electronic stencils, depreciation of the mimeograph machine, sample bulletins, etc. The total of these fixed costs over a 1-year period is \$339.50. Dividing by 209 members (as of Feb. 1), the cost per member is \$1.62.

The variable costs are those that depend upon the number of members we have. For example, if we had 500 members, we would spend 5 times as much on envelopes as if we had 100 members. Other variable costs are mimeo paper, mastheads and postage. The annual variable costs for 3rd-class members is \$2.71.

Adding the fixed and variable costs per 3rd-class postage member, plus 12¢ for extra postage on heavy issues, we get \$4.45. So by charging \$4.40, we are still "losing money." However, we anticipate the membership will rise significantly in the next year, with our hard-working Membership Committee, and the fixed costs per member will be reduced.

The costs of a 1st-class postage membership is \$2.20 more than one for 3rd-class because of the extra postage expense: 34 issues times 6¢ plus 30¢ for heavy issues.

The new dues structure makes no allowance for a possible U.S. postage increase. According to the San Francisco P.O., Congress has taken no action on such an increase yet. If rates are raised, it is possible another dues increase may be necessary.

Current dues for members outside North America may be obtained by writing Bill Nittler.

Other IRCA news: Jon Pearkins of Burnaby, B.C., has been appointed to edit a new column in the DX Monitor, entitled "Province of the Month" to appear every two months. Mike Northam will type Jon's stencils, and his first column will appear soon.

The Chairman of the Membership Committee is Don Erickson, and if you are interested in serving on it, please write Don at 24360 Myers St., Sunnymead, Calif. 92388. The object of the committee is to contact DXers who do not belong to a BCB club in hopes of interesting them in the IRCA. We obtain the names of prospective members from several 50 kw. stations in the U.S.

Comment on the suggested IRCA DX booklet has been very favorable. We need a chairman to head this important project; his duties would be to receive suggestions for topics to be covered in the booklet, to solicit volunteers to write articles, and to coordinate all information into booklet form. If you are interested in this job, please contact me as soon as possible.

Don't forget to support the IRCA Anniversary Issue (March 18). The club will be 3 years old this year, so how about writing in to every column to wish it a Happy Birthday? It's an IRCA tradition!

Finally, don't forget the final deadline for ordering radio publications at IRCA discounts is March 18. Full details are included in the Feb. 18 bulletin.

And don't forget the BIG convention that will be held in Denver the 4th weekend in August! Denver hosts have been planning the festivities for the greatest get-together ever, and Dan D. Receiver informs me that the IRCC will be represented.

This is being written primarily in response to the points raised by Bill Nittler, IRCA's Executive Secretary in the February 4 DX Monitor. I believe these points raised by Bill are both intelligent and deserving of a full reply.

1. The eye witness quoted in the January 1967 EI is Victor C. Clark, W4KFC. He and two other Amateurs were on Swan Island for 8 days from February 15 through 22, 1960 - right in the middle of R. Swan's construction period. Immediately upon his return from Swan he wrote an article for "CQ" titled "Journey to Swan Island" which appeared in the May 1960 issue. This article both confirms and expands on the statement quoted in EI. He breaks down the number of Americans on Swan more exactly - 6, 4 USWB and 2 FAA. The article reveals that he not only made careful observations but asked questions as well. Some illustrative quotes are "as the two low lying islands emerged above the horizon, we could see coconut palm trees and the antenna masts of the weather station and homing facility," "Although the weather station has been completely reconstructed since 1955, evidence of the storm's ferocity still remains in the many acres of four or five foot coconut stumps and the twisted wreckage of radio range towers, now overgrown with brush," and he even goes so far as to note "Evidence of even earlier activity on the island remains in the form of concrete footings for four large radio towers erected by the United Fruit Company back in 1911. The station was discontinued some years later and the towers were taken down in 1932." W4KFC is certainly a most thorough observer.
2. Bill Nittler now suggests that R. Swan (which subsequently became R. Americas) originally operated from a ship "anchored at Swan Island" (all this according to an article published in "BROADCASTING" prior to R. Swan's going on the air) but that the station has now been moved onto Swan itself. I acknowledge that Bill's solution is technically possible, at least as it applies to the Medium Wave XMTR. Certainly if R. Swan began its career aboard ship, the station would have been built at a site far removed from Swan Island. This would explain why there were no extra American personnel on Swan half way through the construction period, why an observer as thorough as W4KFC saw no sign of the station or heard nothing about its pending arrival from the USWB/FAA personnel who under the situation suggested by Bill would not necessarily have heard anything about it themselves at that date. On the other hand, while I cannot actually prove that the MW XMTR was not moved onto the island at a later date, I do know that the SW XMTR was not. This based on consistent patterns shown by my antennas at 6 MC which clearly indicate that RA's 6000 kc signal was not coming from Swan. Further, and of particular importance to IRCAnS, if R. Swan did operate from a ship, it in all probability did not remain anchored at Swan constantly but for obvious reasons would have often transmitted from a location much closer to Cuba. During the Bay of Pigs especially when R. Swan served as a military command facility, such mobility would have been especially useful. IF as Bill suggests there was a changeover from ship to Island, a reasonable assumption is that it occurred when R. Swan became R. Americas. Thus if the changeover theory is correct, QSLs from R. Swan should count as International waters, and only those from R. Americas (BCB) as Swan Island.
3. Bill's suggestion that RA's SW XMTR was not "profitable" and therefore a "Liability" is clearly not valid. Everyone who has carefully investigated these stations - Wise and Ross (authors of "The Invisible Government"), Jensen, myself etc. - all agree that they are creatures of the Central Intelligence Agency which of course is not in business to make money. Further, once built, the SW facility would cost very little to operate // the MW station. And at night, 6 MC XMSNs are somewhat harder to jam than their MW counterparts due to skipping of nearby jamming signals and reduced ground wave coverage at 6 MC. Thus RA's SW XMTR must have added something to the CIA's coverage and the facility would not be allowed to sit idle (if it is in fact idle) except for some very definite reason. And the only apparent reason is that controversy over its location. On the other side of the coin, the fact that ONLY the SW XMTR was deleted at the height of the controversy suggests that ONLY the 6 MC station was vulnerable and this clearly tends to support Bill Nittler's changeover theory as it applies to the BCB XMTR. It should be added that if the SW and BCB facilities were operating from different locations, then for a variety of technical reasons the SW XMTR almost had to be airborne and similar to that of the

facility which tested in 1965 calling itself Blue Eagle.

4. None of the other major pieces of evidence, specifically the NRC's DF study and pictures released by R. Americas itself, contradict the above points. CMS II
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ANARC Activities. Association of North American Radio Clubs. February Newsletter.

N.B. A complaint has been turned in to the Manufacturers Liaison Committee from a reliable DXer who purchased a Drake SW-4 receiver. The DXer in question says that the receiver lacks selectivity when a weak signal is within 5 kc. of a strong one and does not match up to other communications receivers in this regard. C. M. Stanbury who is chairman of the committee requests information from any other purchasers about the ir results with the SW-4. Has anyone tried it, or the BCB-covering model SW-4A?

Countries list : Committeemen are compiling segments of the list, and should have it done by March. The list will be stenciled and distributed to the clubs, and then about 1000 copies will be printed.

Still no news of a possible site for the ANARC convention for 1967. It is possible that IRCA will offer to host the convention jointly for ANARC and IRCA in Denver. Tom Stoltmann and I have been contacting the responsible club members to see what their feelings are about this, and so far the president and convention hosts feel that it would be a nice gesture. I think that ANARC would prefer a mid-west site, but I think that any IRCA offer would be considered. More later on this. kgs

The following proposed amendments to the IRCA By-Laws have been approved by the Board of Directors, and are hereby presented to the membership for its approval:

Proposal 2.2-14: Addition of sub-part m to Article V, Section 2, Part 1, to read "(The President) shall be responsible for the inclusion of the complete IRCA Constitution and By-Laws, as amended during the previous year, in one of the summer issues of the 'DX Monitor' each year."

Proposal 2.2-18: addition to Article XII, Section 2, the full text to read: In case of irregularities, the IRCA President must with the approval of the Board issue a letter of reprimand, to be sent by registered mail, to any officer or member of the IRCA, clearly stating the nature of the offense and the proper means of rectifying said offense."

Proposal 2.2-19: addition to Article XII, Section 3, to read:

"...that dismissal proceedings are being undertaken, The afore-mentioned letter(s) are to be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. A sufficient amount of time..."

Proposal 2.2-20: Addition of sub-part n to Article V, Section 2, Part 1, to read

"(The President) shall be responsible for reporting the results of voting by the Board of Directors in the 'DX Monitor'; such reports must be made by the time a ballot is circulated among the membership dealing with matters that were presented to the Board for decision."

Proposal 2.2-21: Deletion of portion of Article III, Section 3, Part 2e, full text to read (with proposed deletion struck-out):

"Eligibility: no member shall be eligible to election to any office without having held one year's membership in the IRCA; no member shall be eligible for more than one elective office concurrently. ~~In the case of 1965 elections, the first requirement shall be changed to three months.~~"

IRCA ELECTIONS

As you know, 1967 is an IRCA election year. Nine offices are to be filled, the Presidency, Secretary-Treasurer, and the seven positions on the Board of Directors. The following is a summary of the requirements for office, and the nominating/election procedures:

Requirements: all nominees for any office must have been an IRCA member on September 15, 1966.

Nominations: All nominations must be sent to the Chairman of the Election Committee no earlier than April 1, and no later than the deadline of the June issue of DX Monitor.

- 1) President: may be nominated by any member regardless of location
- 2) Secretary-Treasurer: may be nominated by any member regardless of location
- 3) Director: may be nominated only by a member or members residing in the appropriate region

Restrictions:

- 1) A member may make only one nomination per office
- 2) A member may run for only one office. In the event he is nominated for more than one office, he shall indicate his preference to the Election Committee.

The 7 Regions of the world have been re-apportioned by the Election Committee, and are summarized below:

- Region 1) New England States, New York, Quebec and further east Canadian provinces, Europe and Africa
- Region 2) Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Michigan, Ontario
- Region 3) Minnesota, Wisconsin, Illinois, Iowa
- Region 4) Virginia, W. Virginia, North and South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Kentucky, Louisiana, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Texas, Central and South America, Caribbean
- Region 5) Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, Utah, Nevada, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, North and South Dakota, Nebraska, British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Northern Canadian Provinces, Alaska
- Region 6) Regon, Washington, Northern California (see below for Calif. counti in Region 7, all others in Region 6)
- Region 7) Pacific (New Zealand, Guam, etc.), Asia, Southern California (counties in Region 7: San Diego, Imperial, Orange, Riverside, Los Angeles, San Bernardino, Ventura, Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo, Kern)

Please note that several changes have been made in the geographical areas of each region. The shift in the membership makes these changes necessary. All regions have more than 10% and less than 20% of the total membership, as specified in the IRCA By-Laws.

- 1210 Cuba, Cruces, CMHK, Reloj Nacional heard on 1/30 at 0326 with news, time checks every minute. (Vatalaro, Mass.)
- 1220 Colombia, HJKR heard 2/20 with Radio Juventud ID at 0439. (Seaver, Calif.)
- 1270 Cuba, Camaguey, CMJC IDed as Reloj Nacional with news and time given every minute on 2/20 at 0110. (Hartman, Wis.)
- 1439 Luxembourg, Radio Luxembourg heard in unID language on 2/5 at 0203. First time in a long while I had to use selectivity. (Vatalaro, Mass.)
