P S T / H 3 T D X F O R U M

That birthday issue of DXM was great--let's have more like it! QSLs have been rather slow, but they keep coming. Need one more country to break the 30 mark, but it seems slow in getting here. Was down in Oakland last week to look at the Drake SW-4A, which is a SW receiver w/LW & MW as well. It is described on page 203 of the 1967 WRTH The calibration of the receiver is excellent--you can read frequencies to the nearest 1 kc. The set seems to operate well on SW, HOWEVER IT IS WORTHLESS FOR BCB. If you want a BCB DX receiver, steer clear of the Drake. It has double conversion with IF stages at 5645 kc and 455 kc. That works fine for all frequencies above 5645, but for below 5645, the oscillator ADDS to the station's frequency to get the 5645 IF. The effect of taking the sum instead of the difference of the two frequencies is that you hear harmonics. For example, KFRC-610 has 5035 kc added to get 5645; KIBE-1220 has 4425 added to get 5645. The second harmonic of KFRC occurs at 1220 as well which also

 (Art Peterson cont'd) produces 5645. I found local KFRC-1220 only 2 S-units weaker than KFRC-610! (What, that weak, Art? mbn) So you see that every strong local will set up harmonics right up the dial. And you think you have image problems now!?? Thus, the Drake SW-4A is fine on SW, but a flop for LW & BCB. I guess I'm over the limit, but I felt it was important to pass on this information to save someone a headache. Until next time, 73. (Tnx for the info, Art. I know several of us were interested, mbn)

MIDWEST DOMESTIC DX TIPS

The midwesterner must operate under a set of conditions that make domestic DXing rewarding on one hand, but difficult on another. Nearly every frequency except the clear ones has several stations that can be heard quite often, so it is easy to hear a great many stations. This situation also makes it a challenge to hear more than about twenty-five states. Here are some tips for the mid-America DXer.

ALASKA: To join the exclusive group of midwestern DXers who have heard this state, listen for KFQD-750 on MMs when WSB is off. Tough to verify.

ARIZONA: Also a difficult state to hear. Try for KFIF-1550 and KTKT-990 on SSS; KRDS-1190 has been heard on EC before 0158 MM s/off.

DELAWARE: WAMS-1380 might make it atv0500 MM s/on. WDEL-1150 has a good signal but interference makes it quite difficult.

FLORIDA: WSUN-620 is a good MM target. WAPE-690 often sifts through the channel on SRS.

HAWAII: An easy state for WCers, but those of us who live inland will have to sit down some MM, tune to 650, and wait for KORL to come in.

IDAHO: This is one of the rarest. Keep trying for the MM 0205 SSB s/off of KBOI-950.

KANSAS: An easy one is KXXX-790 on SRS. 1330 is a crowded channel, but KFH often tops the others after 2200 or so. Both can be difficult to verify.

MAINE: WGAN-560 has been heard MMs, and WLOB came in on a DX. Try around midnite. Both will verify good reports.

MONTANA: KGH-790 can often be picked out of the jumble on that frequency. Past about 0000 they are often on top. KFLN-960 comes in at their LSS s/off, but have not verified.

NEVADA: Very rare on RS, but KEND-1460 f/c has been heard 1st MM, 0330. Their MM s/off is 0250 and might make it past KSD, WBNS, & Co.

NEW JERSEY: WBEN can make things difficult, but try for WPAT-930 early AMs.

NEW MEXICO: Big KOB-770 is the best bet. Try after LSS, and on MMs.

OREGON: KYMN-1520 has been heard MMs after KOMA s/off at 0300.

RHODE ISLAND: Not easy. Try for WPRO-630 on SSS and later in the evening.

SOUTH CAROLINA: WSPA-950 can be heard evenings, but not often. Sunrise is the time to try for WQOK-1440 (especially MM before the 0500 s/ons) and WESC-660.

VERMONT: Two MM s/ons have put this state into many logs. WVMT-620 SSB s/on w/SSB at 0459 might be in for a few minutes sometime. WHWB-1000 is the other one. Try for them MM SSB s/on at 0554.

WASHINGTON: KING-1090 and KOMO-1000 are two 50kwers that can sometimes be heard at night and MMs. On a good night, KVI-570 is a definite possibility during the evening. They are off SM but AN MM.

WYOMING: That well-known KWYO-1410 test is the way to hear Wyoming. It's the 3rd MM from 0205-0220.

ALBERTA: CBX-1010 can be separated from CFRB on the hour and half-hour when the CBC stations ID. CFAC-960 can often be heard early AMs.

BRITISH COLUMBIA: CKLG-730 is a good bet for early AMs, especially MMs. CBU-690 is one to try at SRS if you're not too close to CBF.

NEW BRUNSWICK: CBA-1070 occasionally breaks through AMs. CBC music.

NEWFOUNDLAND: Try for CBN-640 after 0000. Also CBC, with :00 and :30 IDs.

NOVA SCOTIA: CKBW-1000 has been heard MMs around 0530.

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND: CFCY-630 is the only chance. Try around 0300 and after on MMs. Very friendly verifiers.

QUEBEC: Not too difficult, especially if you can get CBJ-1580 in FF after about 2000. Another FF is CJBR-900, w/0600 s/on.

It's not easy to get a 50/50 and 10/10 record for states and provinces, but keep trying on these tips. Frequency checks and DX Specials can help quite a bit. Whenever you hear a rare state, be sure to report to the bulletin!
