Yukon and N.W.T. will just list the stations, but if you have any tips, I'll be glad to have them. (So will I, for that matter! mbn) Alta., Sask., & Mani. will include LPRTs, and I'll take tips for them anytime. Hey, why not send them now while you're thinking about it? The CBC sent me a big envelope of stuff recently. It included: a full list of Canadian stations (including CBC affiliations), mailing addresses, operating power, directional antennas, and date commenced operation, which took up twenty pages; a full list of Canada's LPRTs, including location, frequency, and power. Canadians can get this simply by writing to: Miss Patricia Dalziel, Information Services, Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, P.O. Box 478, Terminal 'A', Ottawa, Ontario, and asking for a "list of Radio Stations in Canada," "Part VIII - Licensed Low Power Relay Transmitters." I recommend Americans include 25¢ return postage. Hi. Not a very exciting week, DX-wise. There was a good opening to North America on 4/1 but it faded out completely by the next day; nothing at all from South America. New loggings are CKCV-1280, WCMC-1230, ECS5-836, EAJ58-1520, EFJ46-1133. Present North American totals are: stations 91/53, states 20/19, provinces 6/6. Playing through some tapes this weekend I came across one of my old mystery loggings; it was very much a hard rock type of format with a jingle ID that sounded like "WHEP Group W" on 1390. Anybody got any ideas? Reports are out to WCMC and WTAE, no veries from NA since January. Don't know when I'll be able to report again as school starts tomorrow, anyway, 73 for the time being and here are my NA loggings of this week:

- 1230 WCMC Wildwood, New Jersey, weak 3/31 2058-2105, had news on the hour followed by pops, 4 IDs heard before the news.
- 1250 WTAE Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, heard at 2110 3/31, strong signal with middle of the road type music.
- 1280 CKCV Quebec City, Quebec, heard at 2030 3/31, fair on peaks but kept fading quite a lot.

Albania-Radio Tirana moved to the new channel of 647 kHz on 2/1/67, which is the channel of the BBC 3rd program. Since this caused quite a bit of interference, one of these stations had to give in, so Tirana moved to 557 where they began to destroy the weaker signals (50 kw) of R. Monte Ceneri. Tirana uses between 400-500 kw here. (Radio New York Worldwide Listeners Club Bulletin, April, '67, from Bruce Portzer)

Taiwan-The government of Taiwan will shortly acquire a 1000 kw transmitter which will probably be used for MW. (RNYWLCB, 3/67)

International Waters (Pacific) April issue of NZDXT states: "Australia's first full-time off-shore broadcaster, Radio Surfer's Paradise, scheduled to go on the air on April 13, will be jammed by the Postmaster-General's Department Radio Engineers. R. Surfer's Paradise started as a protest against the granting of the Gold Coast commercial radio licence to a company with very little Gold Coast residential representation. It plans to retaliate by broadcasting on a frequency as close as possible to that used by the commercial and national stations already serving the Gold Coast and "if they jam us, they will also jam these stations" says Squadron Leader J.K. McCarthy, R. Surfer's Paradise Organiser. Nearer at home, Radio Ventura is to anchor in the Hauraki Gulf and to broadcast 24 hours a day from May 1, states Antonio Fernandez, Managing Director. Power 7½ kw, no frequency given in newspaper reports yet. "Further info in this issue: "Press releases bring news of another pirate radio station to operate in the Hauraki Gulf from 1/5/67. The item stated the ship was 2 weeks out from Auckland and would operate from a position adjacent to the Tiri from which Radio Hauraki operates." And a Times reporter notes: "Christchurch pirate Radio Pegasus heard recently on 1020 and is again local to Christchurch" (NZDXT)
