Howdy folks! Veries: v/1 KRLA CJAT (+ promo disc). DX equipment is finally all working. Latest casualty was my tape recorder which ceased functioning at the DX get-together. It's now working perfectly after replacing a capacitor and rectifier tube. In case anyone is wondering how to fix an older tape recorder with not enough AF gain, try this: open up your t/r so you can easily get at the heads; get a small stick with cotton on it (e.g., Q-Tips), some alcohol (no mbn, not that kind) and a de-magnetizer (the type jewelers use); dampen the cotton with the alcohol and rub the cotton on the stick across the heads (incl. erase head) until all the oxide and dirt is removed; then use some dry cotton and dry the heads; now get the de-magnetizer and make the electrodes almost touch (not touching!) and place them near the heads; (where the tape would go), but not touching, for a count of ten and remove it slowly. The demagnetizing should be done once a month or more often if the tape recorder is used very often. The cleaning need only be done every four months or so. DST took effect in all Canadian provinces at 2400 (local time) on 4/29 except Alta. and Sask. Remember REPORT and BC in '69! 73. Good DX and join the CPC in September. (Volunteer now for CPC Chairman. mbn)

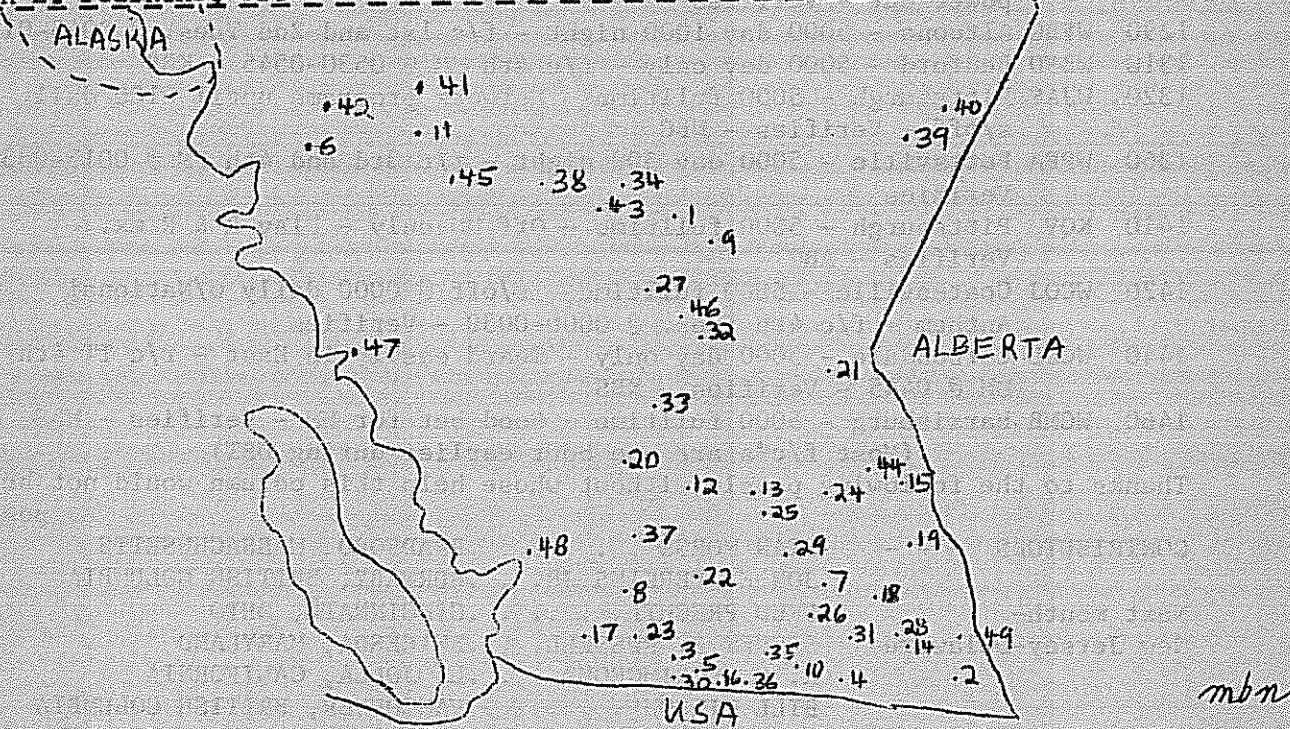

- #5 Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, Utah, Nevada, Idaho, Montana, Wyoming, North & South Dakota, Nebraska, British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Northern Canadian provinces, Alaska.
- #6 Oregon, Washington, N. California (all counties not listed in Region #7).
- #7 Pacific (New Zealand, Guam, etc.), Asia, S. California (San Diego, Imperial, Orange, Riverside, Los Angeles, San Bernadino, Ventura, Santa Barbara, San Luis Obispo and Kern counties).

Regarding Proposal 2.2-38, advertising may appear in the DX Monitor provided it deals with radio, reception reporting or other club activities. Members are allowed 2 lines per issue free, and non-members are to be charged at the rate of \$1.50 per line. This because I sincerely believe Chicago is our best bet.

I am happy to say that Warren Nordgren, 2129 Linden Avenue, Waukegan, Illinois 60085 has agreed to take charge of arrangements. Deep South American Reception

Reception usually depends on an early fade-out of U.S. clear channel stations (on 660, 780, 840, 880 kcs., etc.), and continued darkness in the Southern Hemisphere during its winter. Dene Lynneberg - 8 John Street - Titahi Bay, New Zealand

A big hi to all in IRCA. This is my first report to the DX Forum, however not the last, I hope. A little about myself. I am 19 years old on 9th July of this year and at present I am working as a technical trainee with the New Zealand Broadcasting Corporation. My present location of work is at my home town of X Titahi Bay (Not Titari Bay as printed in DX Monitor) where I work at the transmitting site of stations 2YA, 2YC, 2YB, 2ZB and Radio New Zealand. Equipment in use here is a Japanese TRIO No. 9R - 59 (9 tubes) connected to a 120 foot long single dipole antenna. Direction being roughly east-west. A medium wave 4 foot loop in construction. Sony TC-464 Tape recorder also used, 4 track. At present my Yank DX is confined to holiday periods when I can move to a better DX locality as at my home town I do not hear any Yanks due to interference from locals. However, I do have a few Yank veries. I have been DXing since 1960 and have a total of 370 QSLs. (814 QSLs on SW) both of these as of Jan'67. Recent veries include JORF-1480 which sent 4 QSL cards.
