It is a waste of an IRC to enclose one with a report to these countries. Use mint stamps which are available from DX Stamp Service, 466 Weaver Rd, Webster, NY 14581. President's Report

As was announced in the May 6 DX Monitor, John Hoogerheide is resigning as PST/HST DX Roundup editor, since he is being transferred to Chile. Although most of the country is on Daylight Time, the IRCA Editorial Policy states that Eastern Standard Time will be used in the bulletin. So far no one has proposed that we amend the E.P. for Daylight Time, so EST will continue to be standard.

The Summer Supplement to the World Radio-TV Handbook will be available in late June from New York, and IRCA members may order at the special price of \$2.15 (regular price is \$2.50). Also, anyone else wishing to order the 1967 WRTH itself can send along \$3.65. The deadline for orders will be Wednesday, June 14; please send your check or money order (no stamps, please) to me in Berkeley by that date.

The IRCA Special Features Editor is John Kalpus of Milwaukee. He is Chief Editor of his highschool newspaper, and will begin doing the IRCA column right away. If you have any material for the features section, send it to John at 5638 N. 95th St., Milwaukee.

As you know, there is quite a bit of concern in BCB circles over the quality of reception reports. It is really surprising to check through the files of reports received by any large station and see that the majority of them are either on post cards, or contain no program details whatsoever. Gerry Dexter, Executive Secretary of ANARC, has suggested that all the BCB clubs adopt a plan proposed by the NRC to help improve the quality of reception reports. Here is a quote from his letter:

"Suppose each club which covers BCB DX'ing were to appoint a member to take charge of a committee on poor reception reports for that club. Members of the club could be asked to volunteer to contact stations in their immediate area, ask them to set aside poor reports to be sent to or collected by that member say once per month. The member in charge of a given area would then send information to the authors of these poor reports (no doubt a mimeographed explanation sheet and information about the club) to the offender.

"As more than one club would be involved, there would have to be a chairman's chairman to co-ordinate the thing, maintain a list of what people are covering what cities in order to prevent duplication of effort."

This sounds like a worthwhile project that could encourage DXers who aren't members of BCB clubs to send acceptable reports, and to join one of the ANARC clubs. Our new DX Booklet, which should be off the press this month, will contain a comprehensive article on writing reception reports. Hopefully members of the IRCA won't be among the "guilty parties" who are sending poor reports. The ANARC project is aimed at DXers who are not affiliated, and could benefit from the knowledge of more experienced listeners. It could improve the verie return for all of us.

If you would like to be the IRCA chairman for this committee, please let me know.

Foreign Reception Reports

All foreign DXers (that is, DXers for foreign stations) should be aware of the new postal increases, effective May 1. The rates to all foreign countries (except Canada and Mexico) by surface mail are 13¢ for the first oz. and 8¢ each additional oz. or fraction. Airmail letters to Central America now cost 15¢/half-oz., instead of 13¢. Airmail letters to Europe are now 20¢/half-oz. instead of 15¢. Air rates to South America have not changed and are 15¢/half-oz. You can obtain a complete list of rates for all countries at the Post Office free; ask for POD Publication 51.

Registry of letters now costs 75¢ and is probably a good idea for Latin American stations, especially those for which the WRTH lists no address. However, for South Korea it's another matter, it seems. I've sent tapes registered on 2 occasions in the past 2 years that did not arrive, per letters from the stations. For Europe and the South Pacific, and Asia generally, registry doesn't seem worth the money. lbg

BRITISH COLUMBIA

There are 40 stations in BC, but unluckily most of them are hard to log, especially east of the Rockies. Best bet on the East Coast is CKLG on MM before s/off and after XEX and CKDM s/off. Other EC possibilities are CKDA and CFUN. CKWX, CKNW, CBU, and CFPR also get out well and make it to the Midwest. The time zone here is Pacific except for CJDC, CKEK, and CKNL which, because of their proximity to Alberta, are on Mountain Time. All stations (except for the above three) observe DST in the summer. Therefore, add one hour to all the times mentioned below for summer months (except for CJDC, CKEK, and CKNL). There are no f/c's. Most BC stations verify well. -----

MIAMI, FLA.--Cuba is putting together one of the world's most powerful radio systems, and intensifying her international propaganda broadcasts. A 50,000 watt stn has taken to the air in eastern Cuba, not far from a 150,00 watt facility opened in February. The two transmitters are the first of six imported from Czechoslovakia. There has been no report on what is being done with the other four. -A US government source said the FCC has asked the state department to determine whether the new Cuban stns are violating an international frequency agreement to which Cuba is a signatory. The 150,000watt stn operates on 600kc. It is near Holguin in Oriente province. The other is 15 miles away, at Cocucum. -Observes of the Cuban scene link intensification of communist propaganda with the "solidarity conference of the Latin American peoples," opening in Havana July 28th. -The station comes on the air(the SW outlet-ed.)with the "26th of July March," Fidel Castro's revolution song. Mostly in spanish, but also in languages such as Quenchua, spoken by Peruvian Indians.

From AP(10):

NEW YORK--Gordon McLendon, owner of a group of radio stations around the country, said Sunday night he hopes the National Association of Broadcasters will support his policy of banning Top-40 records with questionable lyrics. -In a radio interview in New York City(over WNEW), McLendon said the FCC "could have revoked about 50 per cent of the station licenses" in America on the basis of dirty lyrics. He said he requires an advance copy of lyric sheets for all records played on his stations. -McLendon claimed that the audience for radio stations playing Top-40 records has been "markedly down in the last couple of years." He said he would be "shocked if the position of the NAB were not one of at least tacit enthusiasm." -McLendon also predicted the day when there will be --in his words--"Maybe a station specializing in all sports news, and specializing in all financial news, and still a third one in all society news." He added that a classical music station might be able to command six or seven per cent of the audience.

From Broadcasting 4/24 comes this info on daylight savings time:

Broadcasters' recurrent problem of keeping network and local programs on a regular schedule when various states, counties and even communities did or didn't go on daylight saving time, or went on at different dates, seemed considerably closer to a solution when Congress passed the uniform time act last year. -It provided for national uniform daylight saving time to start the last Sunday of April. The states could exempt themselves, if they did it on a statewide basis. -The main opponents were farmers, operators of drive-in movie theaters and dedicated states-righters. -last year only 19 states observed daylight time statewide, another 17 by local and county consent. -This year, as the result of campaigns to educate legislators and citizens on the issue, and some discrete lobbying, all but Missouri(which was at last report considered a "probable"), Michigan, Kentucky and Florida, will be on the uniform time standard. -A petition for a plebiscite next year is currently being circulated in Michigan, whose problem involves the division of the state into upper and lower peninsulas. Kentucky and Florida legislatures have simply been unable as yet to meet on the question. -Broadcasters were key figures in many of the state campaigns. -Owen Saddler, executive vice president and general manager of KMTV(TV) Omaha, cut informational spots on the exemption bill in the state legislature, and distributed them free to other stations in Nebraska. He argued that it would be impossible for a stn to tape 15 hours a day of network programming, even if it wanted to, and that if people desired their programs at the time they were used to them, they ought to write their legislators. -Many other broadcasters were actively involved in the achievement of uniform time standards in 46 states.

Neither of these states has many stations, hence my including them together. If one counts transmitter location rather than studio location, New Jersey should be one of the easiest states in the country to get. There are NINE 50,000 watt stations with their transmitters in New Jersey. Many of the graveyard stations get out excellently in the west and north.

GUIDELINES FOR SUBMITTING FOREIGN DX RECORDS

There have been numerous contributors to FOREIGN DX RECORDS recently that have supplied insufficient information for the column. I ask you now to please read the following guidelines and remember them when you update your FOREIGN DX RECORDS.

1. Column A. This category is to include the number of countries that you have verified on the standard broadcast band, from 535 to 1605 kilocycles. As a rule, beacon stations do not count. The U.S.A. and Canada should be included in this total.
2. Column B. This category is to be a total of all of your verifications, domestic and foreign, on the standard broadcast band. Again, is it not customary to count beacon stations.
3. Column C. This category should include all foreign verifications. Alaskan and Hawaiian verifications should be counted in this group, but U.S. and Canadian veries should not be.
4. North American Veries. Count all verifications from all north American countries in this group. Remember that north America includes central America, most of the Caribbean area, and Alaska.
5. South American Veries. Count all verifications from south America, and the Caribbean countries of Trinidad and the Netherlands Antilles, off the northern coast of south America.
6. European Veries. Count all verifications from Europe and the British Pirates in this group.
7. Asian Veries. Count all verifications from Asia.
8. African Veries. Count all verifications from Africa.
9. Oceania Veries. Count all verifications from the Pacific Ocean countries and Hawaii.
10. Best Verie In Each Continent. This is your best verification from each continent that you have verified. Don't forget to include this when sending in totals; many members do not.
11. If possible, send in your latest totals every month. If this is not possible, please bring up your totals at least every six months; failure to do so will result in your name being dropped from the column.

I hope this guide is a help to all of the contributors; and after reading it over, how about some of you newer members joining in? Thank you, and good luck!

And, in a reprint from the ASWLC "SWL", submitted by CM Stanbury II, of Crystal Beach, Ontario.

HOAX DEPARTMENT--I have before me World Radio Bulletin #862 dated 4/19/67 which contains various "items" from a certain DXer (?) in Miami, Fla. Among other little gems, he tells us that WINB has purchased AM/FM station WXUR (which is untrue). The Miamian moves into high gear with this one: "SWAN ISLAND" "As a result of certain legal problems! R. Americas (formerly R. Swan) doesn't use anymore its frequency of 6000 kcs since Sept. 20." Since when did the CIA have legal problems? But the Miamian really reaches his peak with this one: 'Very soon there will be a 50 KW MW and a 20 KW shortwave station on Navassa Island'. But we do trust that WRB will do their best to straighten out this mess for its subscribers.

Members should note that this article does not represent the editorial opinion of the editor, radio club, or even R. Americas. If I may be allowed a small editorial, it's my opinion that R. Americas is transmitting from Swan Island. I think this has been fairly well documented and proved; Mr. Stanbury's argument against this has been thoroughly disproved, in my opinion.
