Where prices are indicated by "NA" either they have no set asking price or I couldn't remember it. Perhaps this list will help some of you as a comparative price list when you are looking for a used RX. Incidentally, the best RX in this lineup other than the HRO-500 appears to be the Collins 51J4, the 51J3 and 51J2 being earlier models of the same thing. All three have mech. bandsread and are calibrated every one kc, the 51J2 however is not quite as good as the other two due to a later redesigning of the filter circuits. The best buy for the dollar is probably o one of the Collins', the NC-400, or one of the HQ-180's. For the record, the Indianapolis Motor Speedway Network claims the world's largest radio network. They have 900 stations in the US, plus 130 CBC stations and their affiliated LPRT's plus the AFTRS on both SW and MW. They claim the world's largest radio audience, also, 100,000,000 people. As far as I know, the station that has been with the network the longest in this area is KEEN. They have been with the network since it began. Oh yes, one more thing, those receivers listed are those available at various dealers and do not include those for sale by private individuals. Remember--"radio Free Cuba--Free Cuba from radio" 73's and see you in Denver August 25-27, I hope.

I finally got my loop antenna built but being the great carpenter that I am, each side was of different length. It worked though. The monster (averaging about 42" on a side) was too big to rotate in my shack (inside dimensions 4'5½" wide 5'3½" long and 7'1" high), so I built a 15" box loop on a couple pieces of cardboard. I got it to resonate, just barely, from 530-1600 by using 2 less turns than called for. Now all I have to do is to figure how to remotely tune a loop and I can put a 5' loop on the roof. Any suggestions? Any one besides me hear a VOA on a GB transceiver? And why izit that on a warm day the static is terrible while on a cool (like 80°) day it can hardly be heard? I am of the understanding that a lot of you guys have trouble logging CBX-740. Guess I must be a better DXer because I had absolutely no trouble at all, hi, hi. But to solve your problem, a recent talk with the CE revealed that CBX is omni-directional daytime and directional nite with severe nulls towards KCBS and CBL (so severe that at nite they have a barely readable signal in Camrose and Lloydminster). He suggests that you try for a freak skip during last part of month in Fall or Spring when they actually should be going directional due to darkness but haven't. My veries this month include v/q CBUS, CKOK, 4QD, WCFL, CJVR, KBLI, CBF, WCSC, WFBL; v/1 KGBX, KLOO, KBGO, WREF, KSWS, KDKO, KCMO, KOWL, KPRL, KAGO, KSEN, KTRI; v/pp KOJM, KARR, CKDA, CFCP. Who has veries from (what kind and how long) GJDV, CKKR, CKRD, CKXL, KRUX, KTNT, KVLV and WRR? 73.

TIP: If you live on the EC the best bet for some of these are when the EC teams are playing on the WC. This means that many of the stations that usually s/off at midnight or 0100 will stay on until around 0130. This is the easiest way to log many of the stations on the local channels. A loop antenna will help a great deal on the local channels. Caution: I have found that many stations are cautious to verify reception rpts on BB broadcasts due to the fact that they are too easy to fake! Start listening at around 0100 EDT to hear the ID on the hour and then if you do hear an ID keep listening until the s/off (try to get the exact wording) or the station has local ads after the game. 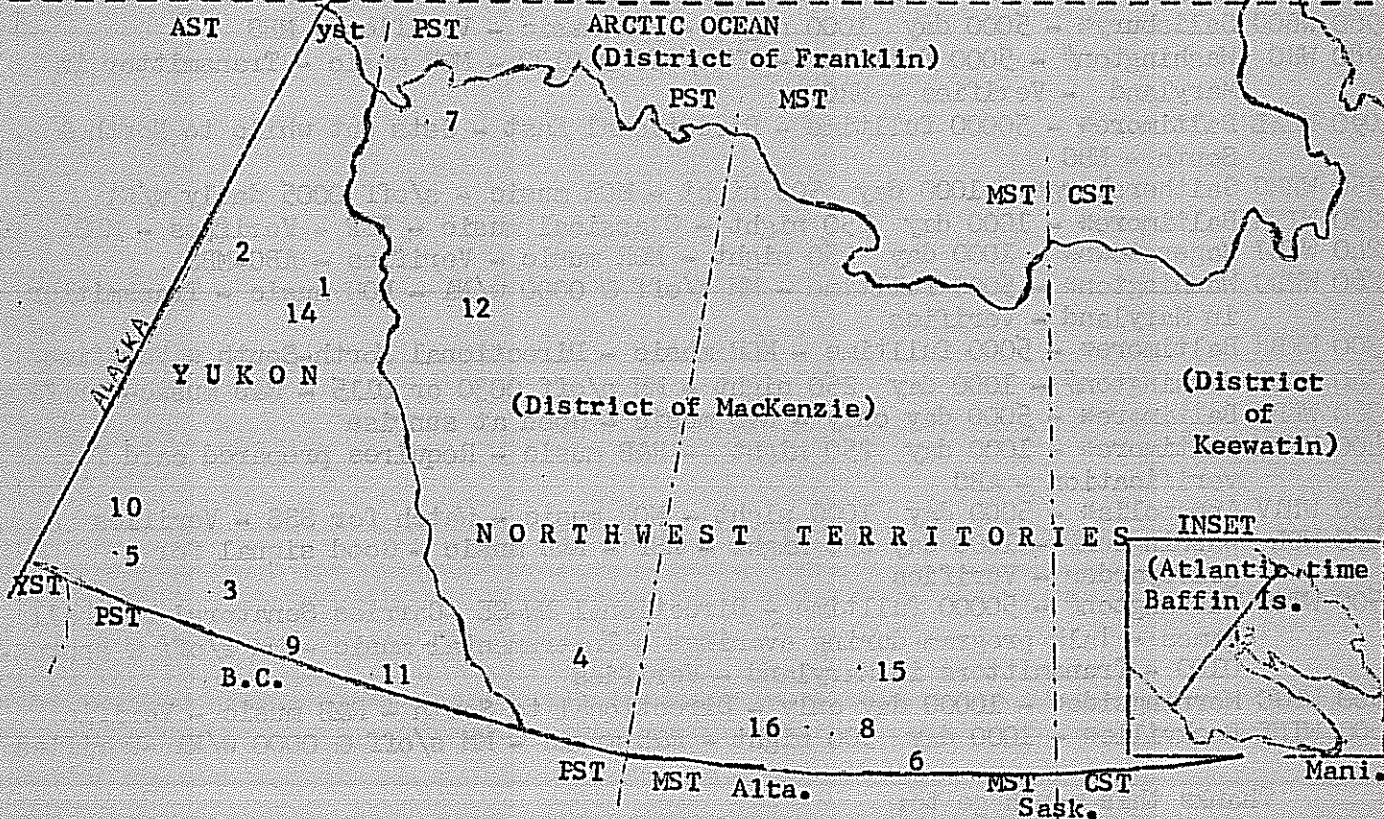

## DX WORLDWIDE FORUM

Dear Sir: As you know, I am a member from IRCA and doing by now, TV DXing. Some member from IRCA wrote me about getting QSLs from Radio Habana Cuba, Internacional. They said they don't get QSL. If someone needs a QSL from R. Habana Cuba, please send report and IRC enclosed to help on postage. I should enclose the report and a Spanish letter to R. Habana to see that everyone receives a QSL. I shall try to help everybody who sends an IRC to help me sending letters. Greetings to all members from IRCA. May God Bless.

C.M. Stanbury II Reports: THE VOICE OF AMERICA SCENE

During the past few months a series of rapid fire and surprising revelations have been made concerning the VOA. Not all of these events are necessarily connected but most probably fit into some sort of overall pattern. Items are listed here roughly in the order in which they were made public.

1. The VOA's 760 kc Vietnam station again appeared in their official frequency list, but according to both press and SWL (NASWA) sources, this outlet had not been silent and in fact had broadcast every day since it first went on the air in the fall of 1964. For some reason, the official list does not show this station's power.
  - 2) The Voice of America announced that it would no longer QSL reports from the United States.
  - 3) As detailed in the July ELECTRONICS ILLUSTRATED, the VOA has secretly removed its portable 50 kw BCB station from Marathon, Florida, probably for use in Botswana by the British against Rhodesia. In a letter to EI, partially quoted in "The Listener" column, they freely detailed the movement of all their portable equipment, except the high-powered BCB unit (which includes incidentally two portable towers of normal BCB transmitting height). They freely admitted moving in the fall of 1965 the portable studio from Liberia to Vietnam. Thus it seems that whatever secrecy surrounds the Vietnam operation does not involve portable equipment, unless VOA Vietnam is much more of a clandestine operation than anyone realizes.
  - 4) Also as detailed in the July EI, the 10 kw SWBC XMTR relaying the BBC in Botswana may be the original Sw Blue Eagle (previously described by several US govt. sources as airborne). One of the frequencies used by BBC Botswana is 7295 on which ASWLC Publisher Stewart H. MacKenzie is hearing an unlisted VOA station, apparently in Africa. The VOA, of course leases BBC facilities at Woolferton, England.
  - 5) Robert Chancellor has resigned as heard of VOA. He has been replaced by well-known TV personality John Charles Daly.
- It is difficult to draw any hard and fast conclusions regarding these events except that the secret withdrawal of the portable equipment from Marathon (it has been replaced by a permanent facility) clearly indicates that the Voice of America has to an extent become involved in clandestine activities and this seems to indicate a definite change in VOA policy. END.

I have on hand a list of AFKN stations from the well-informed pen of Mike Reynolds in Denver. I'll save this until next month, plus the PAL Revisions, plus that Venezuelan list promised several months ago...wonder if I'll ever get caught up? Well, the end of another bulletin, and I hope Bill doesn't mind all pages of my stuff...how about a stationary ad? A slogan?

The IRCA Board of Directors have passed the following proposals, and are herein presented to the membership for their approval.

1) Proposal 2.2-24 is a revision of Article V, Section 4 of the IRCA By-Laws.

The section now reads: "In case of an emergency where an officer cannot fulfill his duties, a new election shall be arranged and held in order to refill the vacant position, the election to be executed according to the fitting clauses of Article III of these By-Laws and the nature of the office in question. This section of the By-Laws shall not apply during and between the months of April and June (of the election year). In case a member of the Board moves permanently from his Region within one year of election, the Board must appoint a successor to complete the unexpired term within 30 days. A Director vacancy must be filled by a member from the geographical region in which the vacancy exists (see Article III, Section 3, Part 2). In case of a deadlock in balloting on the Board, the President will cast the deciding vote."

The revision would be:

Part 1 - When the Presidency becomes vacant, the Chairman of the Board will assume the Presidency for the remainder of the current term.

Part 2 - When the office of Secretary-Treasurer becomes vacant, the President shall appoint a new Secretary-Treasurer, with the approval of the Board, for the remainder of the current term.

Part 3 - When a seat on the Board of Directors becomes vacant, or in case a member of the Board moves permanently from his region within one year of election, the Board must appoint a successor to complete the unexpired term as soon as possible. A Director vacancy must be filled by a member from the geographical region in which the vacancy exists (see Article III, Section 3, Part 2). In the case of a deadlock in balloting on the Board, the President shall cast the deciding vote.

2) Proposal 2.2-41 amends the IRCA By-Laws in the following manner:

Article III would be amended as follows: (Changes are underlined)

Section 2 - Dates

Part 1 - Nominations: April 1 to May 15

Part 2 - (to be added) Campaign statements: due to be submitted to the Chairman of the Election Committee one week prior to the date of the June DX Monitor. The same deadline applies to nominees who wish their names withdrawn from the ballot.

Part 3 - (the old Part 2 - to be revised as follows) Elections: Ballots and the printed campaign statements are to be mailed to all members with the June issue of the DX Monitor in the election year and are to be returned to the Chairman of the Election Committee by August 1.

Part 4 - (the old part 3 unchanged)

Section 4 - Nominations

Part 1 - All nominations for officers must be submitted in written form to the Chairman of the Election Committee. (Delete the remainder of the old form as redundant)

Part 6 - (an addition) All candidates will be notified of their nomination by the Chairman of the Election Committee shortly after May 15 of election year. Nominees may submit campaign statements to the Election Committee Chairman with limits as follows: President and Secretary-Treasurer: 20 lines; Directors on the Board: 15 lines.

3) Proposal 2.2-48 amends the Bylaws, Article V, Section 4, in this manner:

Part 3 - (Delete the following: "or in case a member of the Board moves permanently from his Region within one year of election"-This is from Proposal 2.2-24 above)

Part 4 - (to be added) If a Director on the Board moves permanently from his region within one year after his term of office begins, or in the event a Director fails on two consecutive occasions to communicate to the President his vote on club matters within three weeks after the President's letter to the Board, his seat on the Board will be declared vacant and the procedure outlined in Part 3 (above) will apply.

Part 5 - (to be added) If an IRCA officer's membership in the club expires during his term of office and he fails to renew it within two weeks after such expiration, his office will be declared vacant and the relevant procedure outlined above will be applicable.

Editor's note: If you vote for 2.2-48, you must vote for 2.2-24, since it is a precedent for 2.2-48. On the other hand, you may vote for 2.2-24, and not 2.2-48 if you wish.

4) A recent Special Election was held to choose a Signature Melody, to be the Club's "theme song", which could be played on appropriate occasions, or on DX Specials broadcasts, initiated by IRCA members. Of the several tunes, the following two garnered the most votes and are presented to the membership in a run-off election.

- 1) Hands Across the Sea - John Phillip Sousa
- 2) Monday, Monday - Mamas and Papas

5) The final order of business is the Ted Vasilopoulos Award. This award is in memory of our late Charter member and one of our finest DX friends, and was created to promote the improvement of BCB DXing through DX clubs - a goal that Ted held dear. The TVA will be presented at the Denver convention to the one IRCAer selected by the membership whom you feel has done the most in promoting our club, its programs and goals. The TVA consists of an inscribed plaque and a free year's membership. We ask you to make your choice in the space provided on the ballot.
