Some old stations that don't have the money use Gates for spots. While in Orygun I toured KATR and KTIL (as well as mbn's QTH) and it was very interesting. Dan Nimbles CE/DJ on KTIL does not really take his job very seriously and more often than not he forgets to cut the power to lkw at sunset. Good bet just after sunset. WCBS and WNDC lose tower in plane crash! On Sunday, Aug. 27, a single-engine plane crashed into a transmitting tower in the late afternoon immediately silencing 50kw WCBS and WNDC. At least two aboard the plane were killed. With the 50kw antenna of WCBS destroyed, they used the facilities of WCBS-FM. Immediately following the crash, switchboards at the 2 stns were flooded by sympathetic callers, both listeners, and competing stns with offers of standby transmitting facilities. WCBS decided to use WLJB's auxiliary tower in Astoria, Queens and on Monday evening broadcasting was resumed with 10kw. WNDC used WADC's auxiliary transmitter in Lodi, NJ with 5kw though it is rated for 10kw. The reduction in power was to minimize interference with the arrangement made by WCBS. A 200 foot emergency tower was arranged for; it arrived Tuesday and by 1:30 PM Wednesday was in use, WCBS using 10kw and WNDC 5kw. Officials of both WNDC and WCBS believed it would take several months to construct a tower capable of handling 50kw.

Denver was the Scene

Yes, Denver was the scene of the fourth annual IRCA Convention August 25-27. The weather cooperated with us and it was truly a successful and memorable weekend.

The first members to officially arrive were Frank Kennedy, followed by Ed Krejny. Thursday evening we had a rather unusual dinner at the Apple Tree Shanty, where the quaint young waitresses provided an entertaining floorshow for a nominal 50¢ service charge. Larry Godwin joined the group after an emergency repair to his harmony balancer. We all went to the airport around 2130 to meet Mike Northam, Don Erickson and Bob Jacoby, but somehow missed Paul Lotsof who later joined us at the King's Inn. There was a late-night party in room 101 (rented by Bill Lipis). Garry Stoklas and Bill L. went out for a late supper down the block, and as soon as they entered the cafe, the waitress called the police. Finally, MBN's bags mysteriously disappeared at the motel, but turned up the next day in LBG's trunk.

Friday morning began early, around 0800, with breakfast at the Inn. At 0930 two mountain tours commenced. Dallas John and his group went up to Devil's Head Lookout Tower for a fine picnic, and were the first to arrive at Glen Isle to install our long-wire antennas. Cars driven by John England and LBG drove to Estes Park (where they found the new KKEP on the air) and Rocky Mountain National Park, ending up at Glen Isle around 1830. Mike Reynolds took three members on a tour of KOA Friday afternoon and later joined the group at Glen Isle. We all ate together at the Lodge, where a large table was especially set for us. Around sunset we adjourned to our DX cabin where we proceeded to set up our two receivers, a Hammarlund HQ-150 and a Halli-crafters S20R. The antennas worked surprisingly well and members logged a number of Latin American countries during the evening and following morning. There was plenty of pop and beer, and the fellowship was great. A few DXers managed to sleep despite the noise of the receivers and a few choicely timed firecrackers. Ernie Wesolowski, Mike Worst and Len Lockwood had the right idea, and stayed in the lodge overnight.

We had an early breakfast at the Lodge and headed back toward Denver on Saturday. The first stop was Red Rocks Park, an amphitheater in natural surroundings, followed by a jaunt up Lookout Mountain. Saturday afternoon, Charles Buckley was in charge of registration in our meeting room, which had been set up during the morning by Dave Johnson. Many used this period to catch a few winks before the banquet at 1930. After a meal of roast beef, the official IRCA business meeting was held. Sheldon Remington of Hamden, Connecticut, although not present at the banquet, was awarded a road atlas for coming the greatest distance to the convention. Ernie Wesolowski won an electric timer in the convention raffle. Just after dinner we received long-distance phone call greetings from Larry Colton and Phil Sullivan.

During the business meeting, the chairmen of IRCA committees reported on their activities of the preceding year and plans for the coming season; election and contest results were announced; and several important items of new business were discussed. (A full summary of the business meeting, to be written by Secretary-Treasurer Mike Northam, will appear shortly in the DX Monitor.) Dave Roys arrived in Denver in time to join us for most of the meeting. Afterwards, a representative of Radio Shack demonstrated one of his company's new receivers. Then a greetings tape from Ralph Vatalaro and Paul Zec was played, and a spontaneous talkathon began which lasted far into the night.

Sunday morning we discovered we had been evicted from our rented meeting room by the King's Inn management. However, we immediately set up our displays anew in the King's Loft, a much larger room at the Inn with a limited amount of "free" beer on tap. We attempted to phone our member in Quito Dave Gleason to no avail, and saw slides of past IRCA conventions and Ernie's slides of the recent ANARC convention in Chicago.

In the afternoon we observed an IRCA tradition by playing the All-Star Softball Game. The teams were basically East vs. West, and Randy Seaver's group won by some 15 runs. The two pitchers were Eddie Spaulding and Mike Worst. After the game, we promptly drove a few blocks to a park where Mountain Man Nittler was busy charcoal broiling IRCA hamburgers. It sprinkled a bit, but the food was abundant and delicious.

OVERSEAS MAILBAG

From Our Man on holiday in Edinburgh, Ken Brownless writes: (dated 8/21/67)

The Marine Offences Act came into force on the 15th and all except the Carolines went SILENT. Caroline had a minute's silence at midnight for the demised pirates and then gave the following piece of oddity: "Radio Caroline would like to extend its thanks to Mr. Harold Wilson and his Labour Government for at last, after over 3½ years of broadcasting, recognizing this station's legality, its right to be here, its right to be broadcasting to Great Britain and the Continent, its right to give the music service to the peoples of Europe which we have been doing since Easter Sunday, 1964, and we, in turn, recognize your right as our listeners to have freedom of choice in your radio entertainment and of course the Radio Caroline belongs to you. It is your radio station even though it costs you nothing; and as we enter this new phase in our broadcasting history you naturally have our assurance that we intend to stay on the air because we belong to you..."

The Order in Council to extend the Marine Offences Act to the Isle of Man comes into force on Sept. 1st, and has been described by one member of the House of Keys as "British aggression". On August 20th comes news that the Dutch Ministry of Justice had completed the draft of the law to outlaw pirates in Holland. This is mainly directed at Radio Veronica, but will affect Caroline, which moved to offices in Amsterdam. O'Rahilly of Caroline expressed his bland disbelief that Holland would outlaw pirates, obviously a statement for his public but he and his co-workers were in secret conclave over the weekend... Caroline talks of the application of the Law as DOMESTIC politics, which it is not. It is an EXTERNAL matter and the U.K. has control over the I.O.M. in that respect. Caroline is still carrying many adverts and CLAIMS that ALL have been paid for. This may apply to those for International companies whose products are on sale over here, e.g., Coca-Cola, Pepsi Cola, Bulova, Pernod (French) Gillette, Schick, etc, that are probably arranged in Canada and USA. They claimed that they had 300,000 pounds worth of advertising, also adverts heard for Consulate Cigarettes, Chislehurst Caves, in both these cases these people denied that they had given permission for these adverts to be broadcast. I have also heard adverts for Kent Messenger (newspaper), a camera shop in Leatherhead, Sterling Cigarettes, MacLeans Toothpaste. The Institute of Practitioners in Advertising has asked its 278 members to insist that Caroline stops broadcasting adverts for British firms - it appears that what Caroline DJ's say is true, they are being monitored by the GPO station at Caversham (near Reading, Berkshire). The opinion is that Consulate adverts, etc., are being put out deliberately to confuse the authorities - O'Rahilly has asserted that some British firms would try to break the law - this is RUBBISH. There will be some prosecutions, will keep you informed. 73, Ken.

So, all but one of the pirates are gone, and some prime DX, I might add, at least for us in North America.

Word from New Zealand...Theo Donnelly, 77 Fox Street, Hamilton, New Zealand

Another hi from one of the faithful readers from down under with a few moments to spare on this Sunday evening, 3rd Sept. with a little DX news. I've finally made my first logs on DCB since Hauraki commenced back in November of last year, and for this I think I should thank Rich Heald up in Sitka for restoring some of my faith in this part of the hobby. Anyway, logs are off to two Asian stations, Rangoon-955 and Singapore-790, both heard around 1000 EST at excellent strengths. Some other listening in our early evening around 0100 EST has shown a great improvement from transmitters in the Western States and Hawaii with KNBR, KOB, KOA, KHJ, KTRG, KWJJ/KRLD, KING/KHAI, KVOO, KZOO, KPOI, WLAC, KOMA (easily readable thru one of the locals, LZU in Taumarunui) KFBK and naturally XERF, all at various readable levels. What I think is CBR whooshes in and out too, but haven't been heard with definite ID, not that it matters as I have him verified already. Later around 0800 EST Hawaiians came in well along with KNX and KFRE. Strangely no veries are to hand, yet. It seems August has disappeared with me still in NZ, too. Necessary paperwork with the Canadian authorities is well advanced, but I won't commit myself this time to a definite date of arrival seeing I fell down on my last estimate; all I can do is live in hope! Right, space seems to be running against me, maybe I'll be able to make another effort a bit sooner than before to keep the NZ flag up. '73's and good DX to all.

I only have one comment: When WAS the last time we heard LZU under KOMA???

Theo also sends some pertinent New Zealand pirate info:

Radio Hauraki is still on, and they're now on 1480 again. One of the Sunday papers announced the Govt is threatening action against them, now that it seems certain Radio Pegasus (to operate off Christchurch, South Island) is serious about an opening date in January, '68, but somehow I don't think they will be able to get much done in this year's Parliamentary session and by next year, the Govt. reckons it will have introduced legislation for an independent radio and TV licensing authority to set up private stations in the main centres, much against the will of the NZBC. The first step of this comes into effect on this Thursday morning, when airtime on 1VD 1250 in Auckland will be leased to one of Hauraki's arch-rivals, Radio International.

Angola Emisora Oficial de Angola has changed freqs from 872 to 1088 kc (10 kw) and 1295 to 1367 (1 kw). A Voz de Luanda uses 1546 kHz; Radio Clube de Huambo is using 1594 kHz, replacing 1500/1259 kHz.

# CONSTITUTION OF THE INTERNATIONAL RADIO CLUB OF AMERICA, INC.

## ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the International Radio Club of America, Inc.

## ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of the International Radio Club of America shall be to promote the hobby of radio listening on the AM Broadcast Band.

## ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Membership in the International Radio Club of America shall be open to anyone in any nation interested in the hobby of broadcast-band DXing.

## ARTICLE IV - DUES

Dues in the International Radio Club of America shall be enacted on an annual basis, the amount to be determined by the appropriate governing body, to be known as the Board of Directors.

## ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

The government of the International Radio Club of America shall be comprised of the following officers:

1. President
2. Secretary-Treasurer
3. Board of Directors (seven members)

## ARTICLE VI - ELECTIONS

Elections for President, Sec'y-Treas. and Directors will be held every two years.

## ARTICLE VII - CONVENTIONS

The one official meeting of the International Radio Club of America shall be the annual convention.

## ARTICLE VIII - AMENDMENTS

Amendments may be made to this Constitution by submitting a proposal in written form to the President of the International Radio Club of America at least 60 days prior to the beginning of the annual convention. To become enacted as an amendment, the proposal must receive a full hearing before the members assembled at the business meeting at the annual convention, and announcement must be made at that time to express the intent to have the full club membership vote on the proposal. In addition, to become enacted, a proposal must receive a two-thirds majority of the total club membership.

## BYLAWS OF THE INTERNATIONAL RADIO CLUB OF AMERICA, INC. (Revised to 9/1/67)

### ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this organization shall be the International Radio Club of America, Inc., and the official abbreviation IRCA may be used in reference to this organization.

### ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of the IRCA shall be to promote the hobby of radio listening on the broadcast band (AM), 510 to 1630 kilocycles.

### ARTICLE III - ELECTIONS

#### Section 1 - Frequency

Elections in the IRCA shall be held in odd-numbered years to elect the officer listed in Article V.

#### Section 2 - Dates

Part 1 - Nominations: April 1 to May 15

Part 2 - Campaign statements: due to be submitted to the Chairman of the Election Committee one week prior to the date of the June DX Monitor. The same deadline applies to nominees who wish their names withdrawn from the ballot.

Part 3 - Elections: Ballots and the printed campaign statements are to be mailed to all members with the June issue of the DX Monitor in the election year and are to be returned to the Chairman of the Election Committee by August 1.

Part 4 - Results: The results of the above elections are to be announced at the IRCA Convention and published in the following issue of DX Monitor. Results of other elections are to be published within 30 days of the ballot deadline. In case of a tie in the balloting for (cont'd.)

Part 4 - (continued) any office, a run-off election among the nominees tied will be executed immediately by the Election Committee, and results announced as soon as possible thereafter. In case of a tie in the run-off election, or in case there are no persons nominated to fill a particular position and no write-in candidate receives an undisputed majority of the votes cast, the newly elected members of the Board will appoint from the candidates that tied (if any) an officer to fill the position within 30 days of the election. A Director vacancy must be filled by a member from the geographical Region in which the vacancy exists. In case of a deadlock in balloting on the Board, the President shall cast the deciding vote.

Section 3 - Scope

Part 1 - The President and Sec'y-Treas. shall be elected by the membership-at-large.

Part 2 - The Board of Directors shall be elected on the following basis:

- a. The World shall be divided into seven Regions, each representing as nearly as possible an equal number of IRCA members.
- b. Each region may contain as few as 10% but not more than 20% of all IRCA members.
- c. One Director shall be elected from each of these Regions.
- d. Region boundaries will be reviewed by the Election Committee before each election and, if necessary, revised.
- e. Eligibility: no member shall be eligible to election to any office without having held one year's membership in the IRCA; no member shall be eligible for more than one elective office concurrently.
- f. If a Board member moves permanently from his Region within one year of election, he shall be relieved of his duties at the time of such move; if the move occurs after the first year of his term has elapsed, he will be allowed to fulfill the term but will not be eligible for re-election from his former Region.

Section 4 - Nominations

Part 1 - All nominations for officers must be submitted in written form to the Chairman of the Election Committee.

Part 2 - Nominations for President and Sec'y-Treas. may be made by any member regardless of location.

Part 3 - Nominations for Director must be made by a member or members residing in the appropriate Region.

Part 4 - An IRCA member may be nominated for more than one office, but must decide for which he prefers to run and so inform the Election Committee.

Part 5 - Only one nomination per office shall be allowed any one member. If a member signs a nomination as a group, this will be considered his one nomination.

Part 6 - All candidates will be notified of their nomination by the Chairman of the Election Committee shortly after May 15 of election year. Nominees may submit campaign statements to the Election Committee Chairman with limits as follows: President and Sec'y-Treas: 20 lines; Directors on the Board: 15 lines.

Section 5 - Determining Winners, Election Committee

An Election Committee appointed by the President with the Board's approval will handle all aspects of each election with complete authority.

ARTICLE IV - DUES

Dues will be collected on an annual basis and the amount will be determined and subject to change by action of the Board of Directors. Dues are collected by the Secretary-Treasurer.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS AND DUTIES

Section 1 - Officers

The government of the IRCA shall be comprised of the following officers: President, Sec'y-Treas., and seven members of a Board of Directors.

Section 2 - Duties of Officers

Part 1 - President

- a. Shall preside at all official club functions, including the annual business meeting, when in attendance. If he is not to be present at the annual business meeting, he will appoint at least two weeks in advance of the meeting date a member who does plan to attend, to preside over the meeting; this appointment is not subject to Board approval.
- b. Shall be responsible for protecting the reputation and dignity of the IRCA, and promote and administer the affairs of the club to the best of his ability.
- c. Shall, with the approval of the Board, have the power to bring reprimand and revocation proceedings against any member who he deems is not adhering to the rules of the organization; he must submit in written form any findings to the Board for their action.
- d. Shall have the power to appoint the chairman for committees, with the approval of the Board.
- e. Shall have the power to remove a chairman of any committee for neglect of duty; this action must in turn be approved by the Board.
- f. Shall have the power to appoint any contest managers, with the consent of the Board.
- g. May create any additional committees which he may deem necessary with the approval of the Board.
- h. Shall have the power to bring action to remove editors of the club publication DX Monitor with the approval of the Board of Directors.
- i. Shall have the power to appoint or remove the Publisher of DX Monitor with the final approval of the Board of Directors.
- j. Shall have the authority to act on any suggestions or proposals, making any recommendations if he so desires, but also submitting the primary proposal to the Board of Directors; any action on a suggestion or proposal is subject to the final approval of the Board.
- k. Shall have the power to vote on any proposal that does not receive a majority decision by the Board of Directors during the contemporary administration so as to break any deadlock that would result.
- l. Shall not have the power of pocket veto.
- m. Shall be responsible for the inclusion of the complete IRCA Constitution and Bylaws, as amended during the previous year, in one of the summer issues of the DX Monitor each year.
- n. Shall be responsible for reporting the results of voting by the Board of Directors in the DX Monitor; such reports must be made by the time a ballot is circulated among the membership dealing with matters that were presented to the Board for decision.

Part 2 - Secretary-Treasurer

- a. Will be in charge of collecting all dues for membership and membership renewal.
- b. Shall issue IRCA membership cards.
- c. Shall keep an up-to-date list of all members.
- d. Shall keep a complete financial record of all monies received and spent.
- e. Shall submit every six months a condensed financial statement to the Board for their examination, and at the time of said submission, shall present the statement to the membership through the official club publication.
- f. May, with the consent of the Board, appoint members to assist him in some of the book-keeping work.
- g. Shall be responsible for recording and filing minutes of the annual business meeting. In his absence at the business meeting, he shall appoint another member to record said minutes.

Part 3 - Board of Directors

- a. Shall be responsible for protecting the reputation and dignity of the IRCA, and promote the affairs of the club to the best of their ability.
- b. Shall have the final power in ruling on any club affairs, suggestions, proposals, recommendations, or findings submitted by the President; the Board shall have the power to present legislation and findings as well as make rulings.

- c. Shall not have the power to appoint chairmen of the various committees, contest managers, publishers, or editors, but shall have the power to confirm their appointment.
- d. Can conduct most of their business by mail, but if five are present during an annual convention, a quorum for business shall be said to exist.
- e. Shall have the power, if they deem it necessary, to call for a special election to submit a major issue to the membership-at-large; the Election Committee then will handle all aspects of the special election.
- f. The Chairman of the Election Committee shall ballot the Board of Directors soon after each election to determine the Chairman of the Board, who will be the spokesman for the Board and will be responsible for assuming the President's office in case it is vacated during the current term; a tie in balloting will be broken by the President. In the case where the Chairman of the Board becomes club President, he shall be required to resign as Chairman of the Board and a new Director from his Region must be selected to fill the position vacated by his succession, in accordance with Article V, Section 4; should the Chairman of the Board resign from the Board of Directors with such resignation not subsequent to succession to the Presidency by him, or when the Chairman of the Board succeeds to the Presidency due to a vacancy of the office of the President, he must immediately hand down the Chairmanship of the Board to the remaining Director who has been a member of the IRCA for the greatest length of time, this to be determined by the official records maintained by the IRCA Secretary-Treasurer.
- g. Shall have the power, if they deem it necessary, to submit a decision to the vote of those present at the business meeting with a simple majority prevailing.
- h. All decisions of the Board of Directors including the names of the representatives voting for and against each proposal must be published in DX Monitor as soon as possible after the decision is made. No member shall be held responsible for such decision until they are made public through the DX Monitor.
- i. All members of the Board shall submit to the President their votes on all proposals no later than 30 days after the mailing of the proposals to them by the President. All votes not received within the 30 day period will be considered abstentions from voting by the Board member(s) in question.

**Section 3 - Term of Office**

All terms of elective office in the IRCA begin on September 15 in the year the nominee is elected and expire on September 14 two years hence unless re-election takes place.

**Section 4 - Replacements**

**Part 1** - When the Presidency becomes vacant, the Chairman of the Board will assume the Presidency for the remainder of the current term.

**Part 2** - When the office of Secretary-Treasurer becomes vacant, the President shall appoint a new Secretary-Treasurer, with the approval of the Board, for the remainder of the current term.

**Part 3** - When a seat on the Board of Directors becomes vacant, the Board must appoint a successor to complete the unexpired term as soon as possible. A Director vacancy must be filled by a member from the geographical region in which the vacancy exists (see Article III, Section 3, Part 2). In the case of a deadlock in balloting on the Board, the President will cast the deciding vote.

**Part 4** - If a Director on the Board moves permanently from his Region within one year after his term of office begins, or in the event a Director fails on two consecutive occasions to communicate to the President his vote on club matters within three weeks after the President's letter to the Board, his seat on the Board will be declared vacant and the procedure outlined in Part 3 (above) will apply.

Part 5 - If an IRCA officer's membership in the club expires during his term of office and he fails to renew it within two weeks after such expiration, his office will be declared vacant and the relevant procedure outlined above will be applicable.

ARTICLE VI - PUBLICATION

The official publication of the IRCA shall be known as DX Monitor. It shall be issued 34 times each year, except in cases of emergency. With the permission of the Board the number of issues may be changed. DX Monitor will normally be published beginning with the first Tuesday in October, up to and including the last Tuesday in March, twice in April and September, once in May, June, July and August.

ARTICLE VII - PUBLISHING COMMITTEE

The President shall have the authority with the final approval of the Board to appoint a chairman of the Publishing Committee. Publishing proposals should be submitted to the President in written form and should include the qualifications of the publisher as follows: amount of time available for the job; availability of helpers (should include at least two helpers in addition to the chairman); access to mail schedules; availability of necessary space for duplicating equipment. The job of Chairman of the Publishing Committee shall not be terminated until such times as continuance is no longer deemed beneficial to the organization according to the Board, or until such time as the publisher is no longer able to continue in his capacity.

ARTICLE VIII - OTHER COMMITTEES

Functions of other committees shall be determined by the Board of Directors. Committee chairmen shall have complete authority over the activities of their committees (contest managers are considered chairmen of their respective committees).

ARTICLE IX - EDITORS OF CLUB BULLETIN

The Editors of the club bulletin shall be appointed by the President with the final approval of the Board of Directors. When an editorship vacancy is announced, volunteers will be sought by the President. A reasonable time limit will be established for names to be submitted. After the time limit expires, the President will select one person from the list of volunteers, appointing him as the new editor; immediately, he will send to the Board of Directors a proposal to that effect, listing in his proposal the names of the other volunteers (if any) from which the editor could be chosen if the President's choice is not approved. A majority vote by the Board will make the President's appointment official; if the proposal is defeated, the President will appoint another person from the list of volunteers to be the new editor. The process will be repeated until the Board confirms an appointment by the President. If necessary, the President shall have the power to appoint a temporary editor to serve during the selection process, without approval by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X - CONVENTIONS

At its annual meeting the IRCA shall select a convention site for its next annual meeting on the basis of bids submitted by those wishing to host it. The date of the annual convention shall be determined as early as possible by the hosts.

ARTICLE XI - SUGGESTIONS AND PROPOSALS

All suggestions and proposals shall be submitted to the President in written form, who will then submit them to the Board for action (along with any specific recommendations he may care to make). The final decision as to any action to be taken rests with the Board of Directors. A proposal that receives more "yes" votes than "no" votes will be considered passed.

ARTICLE XII - IRREGULARITIES, REPRIMANDS, DISMISSALS

Section 1 - Irregularities

Any irregularity of club policy must be brought to the attention of the President. A statement of the irregularity and a member or members charged must be made in written form and must bear the signature or signatures of the members making such charge. Any action the President may take, if necessary, must be approved by the Board.

Section 2 - Reprimands

In case of irregularities the IRCA President must with the approval of the Board issue a letter of reprimand to be sent by registered mail to any officer or member of the IRCA, clearly stating the nature of the offense and the proper means of rectifying said offense.

Section 3 - Dismissals

If the nature of the offense is serious enough to cause further action than a reprimand the President must, with the final approval of the Board issue a letter or letters clearly stating the nature of the offense and that dismissal proceedings are being taken. The afore-mentioned letter(s) are to be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. A sufficient amount of time must be allowed for the accused to answer the serious charges. If the reply is not forthcoming or if it does not meet with the satisfaction of the President, a letter or letters of dismissal may be sent with the final approval of the Board of Directors, removing the membership of the accused.

ARTICLE XIII - REFERENDUM/INITIATIVE

If a member cannot get action on a proposal in the prescribed manner, he can submit a petition bearing 20% of the signatures of the club membership to the Election Committee to effect a special election on the matter. This pertains to matters other than those concerning the contents of these documents.

ARTICLE XIV - RECALL

If a petition is presented to the Election Committee bearing the signatures of 20% of the members, asking for removal of office of the President or Secretary-Treasurer, the Committee shall call a special election at which the membership will be able to vote for or against such removal. If the removal of the officer is approved by 75% of the members voting, the office shall be declared vacant. If a petition is presented to the Election Committee bearing the signatures of 20% of the members of a certain Region, asking for removal from office of the member of the Board of Directors from that Region, the Committee shall call a special election at which the members in that region will have the opportunity to vote for or against such removal. If the removal of the representative is approved by 75% of the members voting in that Region, the office will be declared vacant.

ARTICLE XV - AMENDMENTS AND CHANGES

These Bylaws may be amended by the submission of a By-Law amendment in written form to the President. He, in turn, must submit the proposal to the Board for consideration. With the approval of the Board, the proposal is then submitted to the Election Committee who shall arrange a special election. A proposed By-Law amendment petition containing the signatures of 20% or more of the membership must be presented by the Election Committee to a vote before the entire membership. To be enacted as an amendment, the proposal must receive a simple majority of those members voting. An amendment to the Bylaws goes into effect immediately after its adoption, unless the proposal to adopt specifies a date for its going into effect.

ARTICLE XVI - RATIFICATION

The ratification of a 2/3 majority of those members voting shall be sufficient to establish these Bylaws and Constitution as the official documents of the International Radio Club of America, Inc.

The above documents reflect all changes or amendments to the Bylaws of the IRCA up to and including September 1, 1967, that have been approved by the IRCA membership.
