Rules Common to Both Contests

1. These contests are open to all U.S. and Canadian members in good standing. Entrants will be automatically disqualified if they cease to be members. A separate division will be set up for members living outside of these two countries (in either or both contests) if enough express an interest in competing.
2. The entry fee for each contest is 25¢. Entries will be accepted until 31 October 1967. NO entries will be accepted after that date; for any reason.
3. The contests will run from 0000 (Local Time) on 1 July 1967 to 2359 (Local Time) on 30 June 1968. Note the retroactive starting date and the year long contest period.
4. Stations may be submitted for scoring credit until 12 August 1968.
5. The Contest Manager reserves the right to request for inspection the actual verie, or a reproduction of it, from any station being submitted for scoring. This information will not normally be required, however.
6. The Contest Manager will have the final word on all scoring and rules interpretations, including whether or not a station will be accepted for scoring.
7. Standings will be in order of points scored, and will be published monthly in the DX MONITOR.
8. Winners will be announced at the 1968 IRCA Convention, and final contest standings will be published in the issue of the DX MONITOR following the Convention.
9. No stations may be re-verified for either contest.

FOREIGN CONTEST

1. The idea of this contest is to verify as many different foreign stations as possible. Bonus points will be awarded for different continents and countries verified. Stations will also be graded on the basis of their distance from the DXer's location. Note that U.S. (Except Alaska and Hawaii) and Canadian stations are NOT eligible.
2. Along with their entry fees entrants must include their current "Countries Heard" total. The Official IRCA Countries List (22 July 67) should be used for this purpose. Note that both the U.S. and Canada should be included in your total.
3. There will be two separate contest divisions: Senior and Junior. Only entrants with 25 or fewer countries heard will be eligible to compete in the Junior division although they may compete in the Senior division if they desire to. If enough entries are received to warrant it, separate Eastern and Western leagues will be set up in the Senior and/or Junior divisions.
4. Station entries must include the following: (a) Station call and slogan, if any; (b) Frequency on which the station was heard; and (c) Dates heard and verified (The date the actual verie was received).
5. Scoring will be as follows:

Each new continent verified	10 points
Each new country verified	5 points
Each 1000 miles (or fraction thereof) the station is distant from the DXer	1 point
(A maximum of 5 distance points will be awarded for each station.)	
6. The winner in each division (or league, if applicable) will be awarded a prize along with each runner-up. Prizes will be announced in November, and will depend on the number of entries received.

DOMESTIC CONTEST

1. The idea of this contest will be to verify up to three stations in each of the 50 states of the United States and the 10 provinces of Canada. A premium will be placed on verifying stations NOT operating on Clear Channels.
2. The first station verified in each state or province will count 5 points; the second 3; and the third 1 point. A bonus award of 2 points will be given for each Regional Channel station verified, and a bonus of 5 points will be awarded for

each Local Channel station verified. If a Clear Channel station (no bonus) or a Regional Channel station (2 bonus points) are among the first three stations entered for a given state or province they may be replaced at a later date by stations worth more bonus points. (A perfect score would consist of 3 Local Channel stations for each state and province.)

Explanations of Spanish Report Form

This is the second edition of the IRCA SS Report Form, revising the one published in 1964. Grammatically the Spanish should be flawless, as the form was carefully checked by the club's good friend César E. Quiroga of Santiago, Chile (now living in Denver). The English translations are only approximate, but the Spanish does convey the message we wish to present in our reception reports.

A few comments on the form are in order. First, on both the definite and tentative forms, you must choose between paragraphs (1) and (2), depending on whether your report is by tape or not. Each time parentheses appear in the forms, a choice must be made. For example, on the first definite report (Page 1) you must choose which adjective best describes reception conditions, etc.: strong, fair or weak.

Here are the translations of the months of the year, for use in the first paragraph:

January	Enero	May	Mayo	September	Septiembre

Also in the first paragraph, when reporting the time it is best to use the zone of the station. Mexico has 3 time zones: Most of the country is on CST, but Sonora, Sinaloa, Nayarit and Baja California Sur are on MST, and Baja California Norte is on PST. All the Central American republics except Panamá are on CST. Panamá, Colombia, Ecuador, Perú, Cuba and the Dominican Republic are normally on EST. Venezuela, Chile, Bolivia, Argentina and Paraguay are normally EST plus 1 hour. Uruguay is 2 hours ahead of EST. Note that some South American countries observe DST from approximately October 15 to April 15, making the time 1 hour later.

Also in the first paragraph, you will see a blank following the word "hora," and it should be filled with the adjective that corresponds to the country in question. Below are the Spanish words that should be used to fill the blank:

VN, we will head for the US; expect to be stateside in December. I am not per-
mitted to be more specific than that, but it will give you some idea of what's
ahead for me. DX will be difficult aboard ship, but I will pass along what info
I can as this tour continues. Good luck in a new DX season, 73. (Addenda...)
Lots happening since my last dispatch a few days ago. I now can DX on a Navy
URR receiver which tunes 500 kc to 32 mc with 1 kc digital readout. Also has
crystal calibrator and variable bandwidth mechanical IF filters. The main weak-
ness is a 35-foot whip antenna instead of an old reliable longwire. Soon to try
Viet DX when the ship gets to "Yankee station". Your letters are most welcome
out here and will be answered 100%. Good DX, 73. (Nice to hear from you, Art,
and thanks for a good DX report. Check and see if Hanoi is on 1010 and 1240,
could you please? NZDXT says Cambodia-1540 moved to 740. AFVN-540 going 50 kw in
