Few Dxers appear to realize the importance of the FCC's new pre-sunrise rules for daytimers which takes effect in a few more weeks: Virtually all daytimers will be able to s/on at 5a.m. local standard time, but with no more than 500 watts. Consequently, many stns which have been on before s/rise with more than 500 watts will have to make changes in s/on and power. Also, many stns that were not on at all will be on the air. I think that the new rule should permit many catches which heretofore would have been much more difficult--or we might find much more annoying interference; Time will tell! President Larry Godwin called the meeting to order at 9:12 PM MDT August 26, 1967 at Denver, Colorado. Greetings to the Convention were read from: ANARC Convention (31 signatures, Illinois); Tom Stoltmann (et al.), Ray Hartman (Wisconsin); Ferdinando Martino (California); Paul Kirkpatrick (Germany); Jon Pearkings (B.C.); Don Roller (Indiana); Ralph Vatalaro and Paul Zec (tape, Massachusetts).

President Godwin gave a summary of the past year's activities. During the past year, IRCA has increased its membership from 197 to 223 persons. The CPC, under the chairmanship of Larry Colton, arranged a total of 57 DX programs. Publishing has gone smoothly under the jurisdiction of Bill Lipis. "Principles of BCB DX," under the editorship of Gray Scrimgeour, was deemed an outstanding success. The Publications Format Committee, Paul Kirkpatrick, Chairman, this year introduced the new format of the Monitor. Committees active this year included the aforementioned, plus the Report Form Committee (Ferdinando Martino), Report Improvement Committee (Dave Johnson), Sunrise/Sunset Maps (Ernie Wesolowski), Achievement Certificates (Mike Northam), Rubber Stamps (Don Erickson), and Prepared Cards (Tony Bratton).

#### Old Business:

Secretary-Treasurer, Bill Nittler reported that the financial picture is good.

Publishing Committee, Bill Lipis announced that the publishing has been running smoothly. Publishing headquarters will move to Riverside, CA this year.

Courtesy Programs Committee, Dale Wing, reported on the new organization of the CPC this year and the new awards program of the CPC.

Countries Committee, Mike Worst, explained that the ANARC Countries List contained some items not appropriate for BCB, and therefore a revised list was distributed by his committee.

ANARC Representative, Gray Scrimgeour, stated that Tom Stoltmann, our other ANARC representative, will report on ANARC activities this year.

Report Improvement Committee, Dave Johnson reported that this committee has been recently formed and is in the initial planning phase at present. Among the problems to be dealt with are the setting up of criteria for determining what is (and is not) a bad report and what to do about the bad reports thus identified.

Contest Manager, Ed Krejny, reported the results of the past year's contests.

Elections Committee, Randy Seaver announced the election results.

Report Form Committee, Ferdinando Martino presented the alternative report form formats that his committee has developed. The Convention recommended to the Board of Directors a simple, yet adequate form with a description of the club to appear on a separate sheet. The Convention recommended that the report form be mimeographed on IRCA stationery on a trial basis. Bill Lipis volunteered to do a relative cost study on the various report form alternatives.

Prepared cards, Tony Bratton submitted a draft of the proposed prepared card form to be used with follow-up reports. The Convention recommended that the committee deal further with the problem of improper use of these cards, emphasizing particularly that they be used for follow-up purposes only.

Achievement Awards, Mike Northam announced the formation of a new Achievement Awards program for states, provinces, and countries verified and for total number of verifications. Details will be announced soon in the Monitor.

#### New Business:

Larry Godwin announced the formation of the first IRCA Chapter, located in Chicago.

The Convention recommended that no changes be made in the Monitor mastheads when the next order is printed.

The Convention recommended to the Board that the Verie Signers List (proposed by Bruce Collier) need not be established, particularly because the personnel at radio stations changes rapidly and it would be difficult to keep such a list up-to-date.

1968 Convention: Ralph Vatalaro and Paul Zec suggested a joint IRCA/NRC Convention to be held in Boston, with the date to be determined at a future time, although no firm bid was made. Bill Lipis presented a bid for Los Angeles as the site with Don Erickson to act as chairman of the host committee. In the ensuing discussion, it was pointed out that although it has been traditional for the convention to be held in the east and west in alternate years, this is not necessarily a binding rule. Since members of both clubs have been welcome at both the IRCA and NRC conventions in the past, it was felt that the IRCA should continue to choose its own convention site regardless of the (probable) site of the NRC convention. Bill Nittler moved that the

IRCA choose Los Angeles as the site of the 1968 Convention. The motion carried unanimously.

Frank Kennedy proposed that a list be prepared of DXers and their receivers. The Convention decided that this listing should be incorporated into the DXWW and Roundup columns.

President Godwin adjourned the meeting at 10:52 PM MDT.

#### FCC ADOPTS PRE-SUNRISE RULES

From the FCC's Public Notice 2569 B, Revision June 30, 1967:

New rules, for pre-sunrise operation by AM stations, have been adopted by the FCC. The rules, to benefit both daytime-only and fulltime stations, were made possible by an agreement concluded between the US and Canada.

The new regulations bring to an end the permissive system of operation, in effect since 1941. Under this system, most stations could operate with their daytime facilities between 4:00AM and local sunrise unless there were skywave interference complaints from fulltime station assigned to the same channel. In such cases the operation would be subject to termination. The new rules provide, generally, for operation from 6:00 AM to local sunrise, with no more than 500 watts of power into the daytime antenna. Fulltime stations have the option of operating under the new rules or maintaining their licensed nighttime operations.

Class III standard broadcast stations, and Class II stations on most Class I Clear Channels, both daytime and fulltime, may operate under the provisions of the new rules. They are required to file for operating permission under Pre-Sunrise Service Authority (PSA), submitting necessary engineering data. The greatest benefit from the changed regulations will be felt by daytime-only stations in northern latitudes where seasonal variations in daylight hours are most pronounced.

The new rules are the result of a rule making proceeding (Docket 11419) initiated in 1961, stemming from increased interference complaints from pre-sunrise operating practices. Agreement with Canada was required with regard to permissible radiation toward Canadian co-channel stations. Following intensive negotiations by FCC staff members and Canadian officials, an accord was reached providing for the 6:00AM limitation. The 500-watt power limit was not included in the agreement, but was imposed to control domestic pre-sunrise interference.

The new pre-sunrise regulations went into effect on August 15, 1967, although existing permissive pre-sunrise operations may continue through October 28, 1967--when daylight saving time ends. Applicants for Pre-Sunrise Service Authority must have their requests on file by August 31, 1967, in order that they may be processed before the October 28 deadline. (A list of accepted PSA's will be printed soon in DXM. -b1)

In setting up the new regulations, the Commission was faced with the problem of striking a realistic balance between vital early morning AM radio services and the resulting nighttime skywave interference to distant fulltime stations. This was accomplished, for Class III stations, by disregarding early morning interference among domestic stns assigned to the same channels. Canadian co-channel interference is evaluated in these circumstances under a new family of curves contained in the new agreement, with provision for selective power reductions to transborder radiation. The operation of Class II stations assigned to 1-B Clear Channels continues to be keyed to the sunrise time at the dominant station on the same channel to the east, but allowing for full interference protection of the dominant station (if any) to the west. Permissible radiation to Canadian Class II fulltime stations will also be calculated under the new curves, with provision for selective power reduction if needed.

As at present, Class II stations on US 1-A Clear Channels located east of the dominant station will not be permitted to operate pre-sunrise under the new regulations, nor will Class II stations assigned to foreign 1-A Channels. Class IV stations assigned to local channels are not affected by this proceeding.

Next issue we will continue with the above and have the actual rules (Section 73.99).

Hi gang. Since last report, the ship has sailed from Japan to Hong Kong for a 6-day stay and has moved on to the famed Gulf of Tonkin, Vietnam. DX in Hong Kong was rather rewarding.
