Further Items of Interest...

Regarding The Voice of America and Rhodesia, by C.M. Stanbury II

In the 9/16/67 issue of the WRC's DX NEWS (IDXN) under the heading "BOTS WAMA" and referring to the BBC station, appears the following statement: "The station was built at a cost of 1.4 million dollars, a fact that by implication seems to refute claims that the relay station used one of the VO's transmitters on loan". This statement is credited to WSAW's Don Jensen. In response to it, I submit the following:

- 1) I hereby state unequivocally that the U.C.'s Botswana station was put on the air with the use of American equipment (transmitter or transmitters). This statement is based upon an unimpeachable government source which I am not at liberty to reveal. Let us just say that secret agent T.X. Thrush told us out behind the U.S. Pavilion at Expo '67.
- 2) I do not know for a fact the exact nature of this equipment but, based on other evidence, I presume it includes the VOA's portable 50 kW BBC unit. I do not know what significance, if any, that 1.4 million dollar figure has. (It's a nice round 500,000 pounds sterling, Stan-RJS) Possibly the portable unit has now been replaced with permanent gear although I doubt it.
- 3) If anyone challenges point 1, I hereby invite them to write the VO and ask for themselves. Of course while writing they will also want to ask (A) exactly when the portable unit was secretly removed from Harare, (B) why was it removed secretly, and (C) why Washington is keeping its part in the Botswana operation secret?--C.M. Stanbury II

From Broadcasting, 9/25/67 comes the following article:

KUAM, Agaña, Guam, has asked the FCC to waive rules and grant the station 250 kW since the 50-kw power limitation for KUAM "has no relationship to conditions existing in the remote area of Guam". The station on 610 kc has 1 kw and a permit for 10 kw. In its Sept. 3 filing KUAM noted that Guam is the most developed island in the U.S. Pacific Trust area, which covers more than 2000 islands and over 3 million square miles. The only other regular radio services in the area are six 1-kw government operated stations. Some service is provided, however, via long-range skywave from the Philippines, Japan, China, Australia and USSR, but this is erratic. Approval of the 250-kw request, KUAM added, will provide "the first and only" clear-channel type service in the trust territory. Cost of the project is estimated at more than 350,000.

Major Changes In Rules Should Make Foreign Singleton-Eliminator Contest Inviting!

In consideration of the views of many members in both clubs, and the lack of serious-minded Foreign DX fans in certain portions of the country, the contest judge agree that a few changes in the rules might be in order at this time. Please note that this change is retroactive to September 1st, which was the starting date for the contest. If carbon copy of report has not been kept for the many stations now eligible with the lower minimum mileage, be prepared to submit actual verification (or reproduction) IF REQUESTED BY CONTEST MANAGER as outlined in rule 2. If carbon is lacking for these stations (2000-3000 miles), give following information as your entry: Reception date; Verification date; call; location; frequency. However, from now on, carbon copy of report must accompany entry. A question has arisen regarding taped reports to stations. A carbon copy of your letter that was sent with the tape will suffice as your entry, but keep a copy of your tape in case further proof is needed. (Don, what if the DXer has only one tape recorder?-RJS) Original rules were contained in the foreign section of the August bulletin. Please note the following changes:

- RULE 1: Eliminate all zones for the present season. They may be re-established in a future year if there are enough contestants. Those outside the adjacent 48 states and Canada (but still in the Western and Northern Hemisphere) may participate with the same rules as U.S. and Canadian members plus any handicap imposed by judges.
- RULE 4: With the elimination of zones, the prize awards will be as follows: There will be a GRAND PRIZE (Value over \$50.00), SECOND and THIRD prizes and possibly other SPECIAL AWARDS for countries, greatest mileage, etc.
- RULE 5: The minimum mileage will be lowered from 3000 to 2000 MILES (thus opening up Latin America and even parts of Mexico for almost everyone). This is a foreign reception contest and U.S. and Canadian stations will not be eligible for anyone regardless of mileage. (This handicap is also imposed on the Hawaii and Jamaica contestants).
