Conditions over the past month have improved from the summer months, but high noise levels seem to be prevalent. I note Gordon Nelson has had reception on some 89 TA channels, with audio on 63 of these. He reports reception, in general from Western, Central and Southern European areas, Iberia and N. Africa. Some Mideast and Scandinavian reception has been experienced. Here in the West, the TP's seem to be coming thru for Don Reynolds in the L.A. area. Your editor has had severe noise problems, which seems to loop roughly north-south, making TP reception difficult. Little Down Under activity has been noted, and the Latins are not up to par yet. Larry Godwin in Colorado is hearing good DX from both TP and TA regions, in addition to the LA's.

### DXWW FORUM... from Jack Weber...

Hi. Once again all my well-laid plans have gone awry, I was so busy enjoying myself in Spain I forgot all about the report I was supposed to have sent in. Anyway, here is some belated news about my activities. While there I took the opportunity of visiting two of Spain's rarer DX stations - EAJ23 Radio Gandia and EAJ53 Radio Elche. The first of these consists of two taperecorders and two turntables feeding a home-made transmitter standing in a closet, the whole thing takes up one room of a 19th century house in the center of Gandia. The second goes to the opposite extreme with its own 5 story building, luxury studios, and large transmitting site outside of town, it even has a tiny private bar to provide free refreshments for the staff. I was extremely well-received at both of these and at Radio Elche I had the opportunity of examining their report file; what I saw was pretty terrible, out of 50-60 reports they had received no more than a dozen were acceptable. Anyhow, it was great to see these stations and being in Spain also gave me the chance to check out s/off times and frequencies of several badly-needed stations. Back here in England, DX conditions have been rather variable from day to day but in general the openings have been good and my countries score has gone up three slots with the addition of Chile, Guatemala and Angola. If interference from some of the commoner NA stations, which are currently messing up several good LA frequencies, can be overcome it could really first-rate LA season. The Angola reception also points to the improved Southern Africa conditions which we can expect over the next few years when South Africa and Mozambique should be coming in much more regularly, both of them badly-needed countries. Enough for now, hope to have more DX soon. 73

### More Notes...

The 656 kHz station in the 9/23 issue mentioned as a new RNE transmitter is in fact EAJ103 Radio Sahara which, in common with all Spanish stations, relays RNE for news and information programs. (It would be likely the newly reported 998 outlet would do the same-RJS. Have you heard 998 yet, Jack?)

A Second Station in Antarctica has been uncovered: From Arthur Cushen we learn that KOLD, Wilkes Base (Australia), Antarctica, 1410 kcs, 30 watts, has been operating since 1963 and has been heard up to 300 miles from the base. (New Zealand DX Times)

And From the Other End of the World... Jon Pearkins, Jr sends this fascinating item from THE (Vancouver) PROVINCE, 10/19/67: "Cool Radio Pirates" Canadian Press, Ottawa - "Inuit Neepingit", a radio station operated by Eskimos on Gaffin Island, has been ordered off the air by the federal transport department. Bud Orange (L-Northwest Terr.) tried to find out why in the Commons Wednesday. But his question on the Arctic broadcasting outlet 2000 miles north of Montreal were ruled out of order by Speaker Lucien Lamoureux. Outside the Commons, Orange said the outlet is one of several pirate stations operating in the Canadian north without a license. The apparently are tolerated as long as they don't interfere with communications systems, or with broadcasting signals from other countries. "Inuit Neepingit" or, in English, the Voice of the Eskimos, still continues to broadcast disc jockey shows and news items, such as the coming of doctors and dentists, so that hunters in the camps can bring their families into the settlement of Pond Inlet for treatment. Orange, administrator for the Mackenzie district of the Northwest Territories until elected to the Commons in 1965 said efforts of Baker Lake Eskimos to launch a station in the Keewatin area are a good example of how red tape is strangling Eskimo initiative and forcing communities to operate pirate stations. He said the community association there wanted to establish a station as a centennial project and went about it "the proper way". They started in June, 1966. Despite the mass of correspondence, they still have no station.

#### World Radio Bulletin Items

Guadeloupe - Radio Aruonville-640 and Radio Basse-Terre-1420 broadcast in FF from Monday-Saturday at 0515-0700, 1000-1300. Thursday, Saturday, at 1300-2100, Sunday at 0515-2100. Mon, Tues, Wed, Fri at 15-2100.

Japan - JOER-1350, Radio Chugoku Co., Hiroshima has changed its name to Chugoku Hoso, and now station IS is "JOER, Chugoku Hoso desu, RCC" JOHR-1290, Sapporo has plans to increase power from 10 to 150 kw according to a program sked.

Jordan - A programme sked from the Hashemite Kingdom Broadcasting Service shows that programmes originated from Amman in Arabic at 2230-1800 on 800 khz (200 kw), omnidirectional. In English at 0530-0730, 1030-1330 on 870 (5 kw).

Malta - Test transmissions by Radio Malta are to be stopped ~~xx~~/23 according to the contract between Radio Malta and the Malta Govt., which has agreed in principle that the station will be run by one of the ex-British radio pirate companies. No more details issued. (Quite possible this will be medium-wave-RJS)

New Caledonia - Radio Noumea on 1420 khz broadcasts Monday-Saturday at 1400-1600 and 1830-2030, and daily 0100-0600. Sunday 1600-2100.

Philippines - PBS-Manila now uses VOA-920 khz for programmes of DZRP to 1000 EST. Then VOA is heard 1000-1130.

Sweden - On 11/5/67, Radio Sweden will have a Russian program on 1178 khz (Horl at 1715 EST, followed by German (1745) and English (1815).

Our Professional Country-Watcher, Dan d. Receiver, reports the following:

Faroe Islands - Thorshavn-584 (5 kw) broadcasts 0215-0300, 0700-1100, 1330-1600. Programming consists of weather, news from the Faroes, foreign news, lectures, music, radioplays, interviews, morning prayer. Language is Faroese; announcement as "Utvarp Faroya" a six note IS on a xylophon is the IS. If you're in Thorshavn, phone 2437.

Dan reports regularly on his travels. Word is that he is ~~seeing~~ steaming toward the island of Spitzbergen in the Arctic to check on Svalbard-1466.
