If the XMTR which operated at Sugar Loaf is WBAI's former ancient auxiliary rig (thus not exactly a vital piece of gear) and in limbo at Key West, the second 50 KWer used by the BBC in Botswana which went on the air a couple months after the first, is probably indeed British owned. FCC Bans Interference On WBEN's Wavelength--Washington, Oct. 27 - The FCC announced Thursday that it has ordered all radio stns operating on the same wavelength as WBEN in Buffalo to discontinue pre-sunrise operations. WBEN, owned by WBEN, Inc., has asked court review of recent authority by the FCC to daytime only stns to begin operations in the morning as early as 6 AM on a year-round basis--sometimes before sunrise--instead of having to follow sunrise. The Second Circuit Court of Appeals on Oct. 2 stayed the grant by the FCC of any pre-sunrise service authority to stns on 930 kc/s "which would cause interference within the protected service area of WBEN, Buffalo." On Oct. 11, the FCC authorized existing pre-sunrise operations to continue pending the outcome of the WBEN suit, but Thursday the commission reversed that ruling. The FCC said there are 47 standard broadcast stns on 930 kc/s which are eligible for the new pre-sunrise authority. The commission said 2 stns, WITN in Washington, N.C., and WSEV in Sevierville, Tenn., have been operating pre-sunrise and would be required to cease under the new order.

Note A We currently exchange 2 bulletins with the NRC. This proposal would shift the exchange to editors of both clubs who are not members of the other club. However, although this proposal passed, I have recommended to the Board that action be delayed pending appointment of our two new Roundup editors.

Note B The IRCA advertising policy, as amended, is as follows: "Advertising may appear in the DX Monitor provided it deals with radio, reception reporting or other club activities. Members are allowed 2 lines per issue free, to be included in their DX Forum reports. Other advertisements from members, and all advertisements from non-members, must be submitted to the Publisher for approval and stenciling. Non-members are to be charged at the rate of \$1.50 per stencil line; however, publishers and others who offer IRCA members a substantial discount on their products may advertise in the bulletin free of charge."

Note C The official IRCA report form will be included in the bulletin soon, and will be offered for sale at cost. It is to be mimeographed on the IRCA machine on IRCA stationery.

Note D The Board has adopted an official IRCA club description, written by Paul Kirkpatrick. We are obtaining bids for printing and a final proposal will be presented to the Board soon. The description will be sold at cost to IRCA members to be included in their reception reports.

Note E Larry Colton, as Program Research Director, will investigate the possibility of running 1 or 2 minute spots and 10-15 minute programs about the IRCA on radio stations. After Larry has had a chance to make a few contacts, he will present a report to the Board with his recommendations. Possibly a committee will be organized in the future to arrange and coordinate the spots and programs.

Note F Although the Club has arranged to purchase 10,000 2-color mastheads, the Treasury will be charged for 1-color printing, the balance to be paid by contributions.

Guidelines for Submitting Proposals

- I. The IRCA government has jurisdiction over the following matters, to which proposals may refer:
 - A. Initiation of additions, changes or deletions to the IRCA Constitution and Bylaws.
 - B. The IRCA Editorial Policy.
 - C. The IRCA Bulletin, DX MONITOR.
 - D. Club policies.
 - E. Club activities.
 - F. Charges of irregularities.
 - G. Actions performed by a member that involve the club, or reflect upon the club name, other than those reasonably expected in the normal activities of membership.
 - H. Appointments or removals by the President.
 - I. Creation or dissolution of committees.
- II. Requirements of proposals submitted to the President:
 - A. Name of the member submitting the proposal.
 - B. Date of submission of the proposal to the President.
 - C. A proposal must not violate procedures established by the IRCA Constitution and Bylaws.
 - D. A proposal may be accompanied by comments of explanation or justification.
- III. Procedure for submitting proposals:
 - A. Eight copies of each proposal should be submitted in written form to the President. (Only seven copies are necessary when Board members submit proposals.)
 - B. Upon receipt of the proposals, the President will send one copy to each Board member as soon as feasible, with his own comments and recommendations if he wishes. Board members will communicate their decisions to the President within thirty days.
 - C. (Exception to the above.) Proposals concerning certain special areas for which committees exist will be sent to the appropriate committee chairman by the President for recommendations. Then the proposal, together with the committee's recommendations, will be sent by the President to the Board for action.
 - D. After the Board's decision is obtained, the President will have the results published in the club bulletin as soon as possible. If the member who submitted the proposal desires to know the outcome immediately, he may send the President a self-addressed stamped envelope.
 - E. A proposal that is passed by the Board becomes effective immediately, unless otherwise specified in the body of the proposal. Exception: proposals dealing with additions, changes or deletions to the IRCA Bylaws, which must be approved by the club membership as well as by the Board. (Note: Proposals amending the Constitution are not sent to the Board of Directors.)
 - F. A proposal that is defeated by the Board may not be resubmitted in identical form for a period of one year from the date of announcement of the Board's decision.

These guidelines have been approved by the Board of Directors, and should be followed in all instances. Naturally, all proposals are welcome and will be carefully considered by the Board of Directors. You may wish to discuss the wording of a proposal with your representative on the Board, or with the President, before it is submitted. - 680 CP34 BOLIVIA, La Paz heard with "Hora Mendez" TC 0428 (EST +1 hour) MM 10/30. The program was in an Indian dialect, and the station seems to use a different signature melody this year. Signal was poor. (Larry Godwin, 6559 S. Clayton St., Littleton, Colo 80120)
- WAPA PUERTO RICO, San Juan with "Revista Agricola del Dia" 0420 11/6. No sign of CP34 this AM. (Godwin, Colo) Apparently rel. pgm 2130-2200 11/5. ID "WAPA Radio" at 2155. S/off w/SSB. Local WRKO weak underneath. (Sullivan, Mass)
