Greetings from the underground... If KRLA's programming has gotten more liberal, then RKO*General is heading the other direction. Last week their voice here in the Big Bay, KFRC, dropped the popular "Mustard Seed" program, a ½ hour of psychedelic sounds heard every Sunday night "in the community's spiritual interest." Reasons for the purge (as rumored by the reliable gossip Herb Caen of the S.F. CHRONICLE): moral support given to the recent anti-draft demonstrations, and airing the Fugs' song "Kill For Peace." Fortunately, KRLA still comes in strong on my rx... Speaking of receivers, I don't believe that I've ever described mine. It's a 7-tube Grundig AM-FM-SW table model #3262U which was purchased in 1963. Though it can't compare with the power of an HQ180, this Grundig has given me many enjoyable hours of music and DX. The set has sockets for outside antenna and ground, and at present I'm using a 50-foot longwire strung about 20 feet above the earth. I also have a 2'x2' loop which works fairly well on frequencies below 1200 kc. DX here was good until last weekend; a threatening storm has left nothing but static. Permission has been granted for a 250 w. daytimer in Mountlake Terrace, north of Seattle, on 1510 kHz with expected airtime still several months away. Does anybody know of a KBBA or similar call for a stn on about 1350 in the San Francisco area? Doubt if it was KDIA as I had 'em for 5 or 10 minutes and never was bothered w/KOL slopover. (Nothing like that in V-J. mbn) Latest veries are v/1 KIKI-830, KAPS-1470, v/q KGHL-790. I surpassed my goal for this year already in stations hrd., hoped for 400 & now have 404. The Perim Island Myth...by C.M. Stanbury II

In the Oct. 21 issue of NRC's DX NEWS appears a report based on unidentified sources, apparently South African, which alleges that the BBC's high-powered XMTR on Perim Island had been sent to Botswana and, by implication at least, that this was the reason the Perim Island relay was using only 10 kw. The facts in this matter are as follows:

- 1) When the BBC's East African relay was closed by the Somali government in 1963, the BBC transferred their 600 KW XMTR to Perim Island where a relay station was built. On Perim, this XMTR operated with a power of 400 KW.
- 2) Both of the MW XMTR currently used by the BBC in Botswana are 50 Kw. Thus it is clear that neither can be the high powered XMTR formerly on Perim, at least not as of Nov. 5, 1967.
- 3) In mid-1967 a fire severely damaged the 400 KW XMTR and it was this which necessitated the substitution of that 10 Kw rig mentioned in the BBC report.
- 4) As of Nov. 5, 1967 the Perim Island relay has been deleted from the official BBC schedule. Whether the 400 KW XMTR can be repaired, and whether it will be replaced in service at another location are of course matters of speculation.
