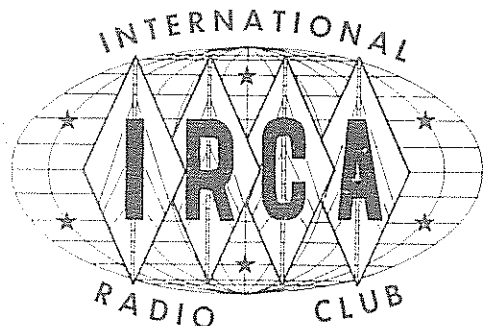

In reply to Greg Scheurman's report; don't feel so much of a Greenhorn, Greg. This is also my first report. Please note: I double-spaced. (That I did, tnx. mbn) I don't have anything totally great here in the station, but I guess it does the job. My main receiver is a Realistic (Radio Shack) DX-150. I use it for BCB and SW. It's new this year and I really like it. It's solid state, AC or DC. For FM I use a Bogen FM-50 receiver w/a Bogen DB-115 amp. For VHF I use a Lafayette FS-305; AM-VHF portable. Finally, for TV DX I use one of two TVs. A Packard Bell 2116 (which is older than I am!) and an Airline Television (that's what it says), really it's put out by Montgomery Ward, model 05GSE. I also have a Webcor EP-2202-1 tape recorder, but I haven't used it for QSLs yet. I'm still doing it the hard way. I won't mention how many QSLs I've got. SW and BCB veries are equal, with my latest AM being WLS Chicago hrd on 10/21 @ 2200 PST. Latest SW was BBC. Waiting now for cards from Radio Havana and Radio Moscow. (BCB or SW? mbn) Well, guess I've used up my 15 lines, so CUL and 73s. (How's that for a start?) (Fine, welcome, Dan. mbn)

Last Sat night/SM I did manage some DX with reports out to: KAIM KOFI KQOT KINY KALL CKKC. CKKC is the new call of CKLN, and in my opinion is one of the best rr stations around. It doesn't seem to be the usual Top 40 type of station which plays a grand total of 40 records repeated all day, but plays all types of rr around (soul, rhythm and blues, etc.) They don't seem to play that many spots and have even enlisted the help of the "Winged Weekend Warrior" who appears on the radio every week-day to "strike fear into the hearts of criminals everywhere" (note MFS). Will be up trying for CKYL-DX tonight and it should be easy, barring any interference from CJOR (co-channel). Finally will hear them and with them it will leave only one station left to hear and that is their FF station - CHFA. Have heard 95% of the Albertans. Veries: v/1 KRNR (+ OK on CPC test) KINY (after 3 reports, two of them over an hour in length) CKKC (ex-CKLN) v/q KALL v/cc KOFI. Last report out to CJOY and tentative to CKNX. To quote my CKKC letter from J.P. Haines, PD: "As you are no doubt aware, CKKC has recently replaced CKLN in Nelson. WHDH has been noted off recently, 10/29 and 9/17, for instance, while WRAP is apparently NSP. KOA s/off at 0200 opens the frequency for those in the West, and CJJC's 0310 s/off opens it even more.
