KCAP did not test as scheduled last fall apparently due to a staff change. Mr. Blodgett is now the CE and he has made a 15 minute tape that will be run at 0400, then repeated at 0415, 0430, and 0445 with sign-off at 0500 EST. The tape consists of 6 IDs, 3 periods of music, 2 periods of 1000 cycle tone, and one period of 500 cycle tone. CBC DROPS AN PROGRAM

(The Edmonton Journal & CBC News Services) On March 1, 1968, the CBC dropped its all-night "Music Only" program. The service, set up in 1963 after the Cuban missile crisis, was designed to disseminate information quickly across the nation in case of a national emergency. Programming originated in Ottawa. The cut is being made in view of current economic problems--it may be reinstated at any time on short notice should the need arise. (Percy R. Kesteven). The word on the above development 1st reached pub. HQ via Percy, Eric Floden, Jon Pearkins, Jr. and since then, 14 ltrs and post cards have been received at HQ with the news. This is good news to all DXers and IRCA is happy to be first with this news flash.

Postmark on 2/24 issue was 2/22 PM. Finally hrd PJB. They don't accept tapes, do they? (No, DEE). The loop seems to eliminate many spurs for me but, alas, nothing is 100% perfect. I think that an article on modifications to rx's to eliminate spurs would make a good Special Features article, with mbn's article (Principles of BCB DXing) being a good basis for it. DX at high noon can be very interesting. Have hrd KGA CKOK CFRN CFAC and many others over the years. Interesting to note that CHQB completely dominates 1280 all day with KIT loud AN, NSP. Whereas, before CHQB came on the air, KMAS was dominant most of the summer days and KIT most of the winter days. Nostalgia: Remember when KGON and KYMN were rr? I always remember turning on the radio every night at 2130 EST and wondering why, for a week straight, they played the same records at the same times. It was not until last spring when my mystery was solved from a KYMN SC from Frank Merrill which stated they played their SC nightly. KGA filled the gap left by KYMN on Jan. 1, 1965 and are definitely AN. One of the only things left that reminds everyone of the 'old days' is the line on KGON/KYMN/KYXI's v/q's for DJ. I've lately come across an old White's Radio Log, published in the Fall of 1942. Back then, CBM Montreal 940 kc/s was 5kw instead of 50kw. CFAC Calgary 960 was 1kw; now 10. CKWX-1130 was 980 w/1kw. KOMO-1000 Seattle was 5kw. WINS-1010 was 10kw. KFVB-1020 was 1kw (now KGBS w/50kw). KWJJ Portland 1080 was 1kw, now 50kw. KING Seattle 1090 50kw was 250w. KFAX was then KJBS w/500w. CBR Calgary 1010 was 1130 Vancouver w/5kw. KEX Portland 1190 was 5kw. WGAR Cleveland 1220 was 5kw. CJCJ was a stn in Calgary w/100w 1230kc/s. KFXD Nampa, ID was 1230 kc/s w/250w. CFPR Prince Rupert 860 was 1240 w/50w! CFRN Edmonton 1260 was 1kw. KSLM Salem was 1kw. CFUN Vancouver 1410 was CKMO w/100w. KINY Juneau 800 5kw was 1460 w/1kw. CJVI Victoria 900 was 1480 w/500w. KOMA OKC 1520 was 5kw. KPNC Bakersfield 1560 was 1kw. On 1960, the only stn operating in USA-Canada was WWRL Woodside, New York w/250w. Then there were 9 comm. TV stns in US, 2 in Chi., 1 in Hollywood, 1 in Milw., 2 in NYC, 1 nr NYC, 1 in Philly, 1 in Pittsburgh. There were several experimental TV stns w/call ltrs like W9XXB, W2XGE, etc. There were only a handful of FM stns, many experimental. Radio programs in those days consisted of Amos and Andy, Jimmy Fidler, Doctor I.Q., Kate Smith Speaks, Ma Perkins, etc. If anyone has specific questions on stns, programs, etc., let me know and I'll try to help. 73's and Gud DX to all.

KDZA is 100% r&r. KFEL is 100% religious, owned by several churches. KKAM is MoR, and largest station between Pueblo and Lamar. KCSJ is directional, North, South protecting WOW, or so it was said. This is not a great selection of stations, but all will verify, C. Buckley notice, with KAPI, KCSJ, KFEL and KDZA being quite anxious for reports. KKAM is non-concerned about anything. I'd like to make a few comments on the proposed monetary support for ANARC, and why IRCA voted for it. Those clubs who voted to support ANARC with a 10¢ per member supplement (including IRCA) have been asked to send their donations to ANARC HQ. Thus, IRCA's board will soon be asked to ratify its club vote to ANARC. IRCA's 2 ANARC votes were cast in favour under these circumstances: Tom Stoltmann explained the "taxation" in his ANARC report, and asked those members with opinions on the matter to write to him. Totals he forwarded to me by voting deadline were unanimously in favour. I noted our publisher's "no" vote, and added my own "yes". On this basis (overwhelming support) both Tom and I as reps sent ballots to Gerry Dexter with "yes" votes. Larry Goodwin expressed the view to me that IRCA's board would be guided by Tom's and my vote to ANARC on the matter; our votes were based on replies received. As reps, we did what you - the club - told us to do. Now, I notice some saying "no" in the DXF. If you felt like commenting, why didn't you write Tom when asked? a letter from Gerry Dexter says funds will go to support ANARC committees (now completely paid for out of committee chairmen's pockets). Some funds will therefore go to the BCB Reports committee, who are sending letters to people writing poor DX reports to some stations, and to non-verifying stations attempting to get them to change their policies. Definitely of benefit to many IRCAs. So are some of the other committees and activities. ANARC has no funds, save those used to produce and mail its monthly newsletter. Therefore, I hope IRCA's board will support ANARC and Tom's and my vote for IRCA, by finding some way to raise 10¢ per member. 73.

Focus on El Salvador

The country of El Salvador in Central America has scheduled national elections to select a new 52 member assembly and mayors for over 250 cities, including San Salvador, on Sunday, March 10, 1968. As is the custom in most Latin American countries, most stations will remain on the air past their usual closedown times, and some (likely the major networks) will probably run all night. With this in mind, we are printing a revised list of El Salvador stations below to use as a guide in your Sunday evening and Monday morning DX on their election day. Some of the split frequency stations in the list have not been heard recently and their nominal frequencies are also listed.

On election night, the major stations to look for are: YSS-655; the YSR network (730 outlet most powerful); the YSKL network (YSKLA most likely to be heard after 0100 EST); the YSU network (Cadena 1050); if they run AN, the following non-network outlets will be heard well: YSDR-820, YSF-840, YSLA-890, YSQJ-905 (nominal 910), YSC-1015, YSCB-1175, YSEW-1220; It is highly likely that some of the smaller stations in the outlying cities may use one of the networks to relay the election news.
