TO MUSIC

Chicago (UPI) --- The nation's first all-news radio station, WNUS, is going "good music" because it's not making enough money. General manager Dennis Israel announced yesterday that WNUS, which broadcasts news around the clock, will switch to a good music format Monday for "economic reasons." Israel said the former rock 'n' roll station had a "fairly good rating" but since area stations had increased their news, WNUS had not been as profitable as the management would like. The station discontinued its rock 'n' roll in Sept. '64 and went all-news, the first stn in the US to do so.

I think I would go crazy if I had to put up with all that. Only thing we have down, or up here, depends on where you live, HiHi, are 2 semi-locals, from Astoria, KAST-1370, KVAS-1230, and they give very little trouble. Seaside is going to get a station

soon, they are building on the building now. It should be in operation soon. It will be, as most of you probably know, KSWB-930 KHZ-I KW (daytime). And they shouldn't give too much interference, it depends on where they build the transmitter. The studio is going in about 3 block from here. Let's hope that the transmitter is far, far away, at least 10 miles. Well, I finally built myself a loop. All the DXers are saying they are so good. I built by the directions in the IRCA bulletin, except the amount of wire and size. I made a 4-foot loop, instead of a 3-footer, and used about 120 feet of wire. It works quite well, too. For clear frequencies, & TP's I prefer to use my long wire though. It works better.

Reports from the members: John Gifford in Illinois reports that on 2/28 and 2/29 reception to the west, north and east was almost non-existent; on 3/12, the TA's made an appearance, but static was rough. John Navin in North Carolina writes that 60 and 70 weather has virtually ruined decent DXing conditions, the last good TA evening was 2/18. Nelson in Massachusetts reports very poor on MM 3/11 and quite good on TA paths on 3/13; TA's are being heard nightly on most TA channels, although levels are rather weak. In the West, MM 3/11 was very poor in Denver and San Diego; MM 3/18 was fair in Colorado for Larry Godwin, and excellent for Don Kaskey in Sacramento who pulled in a batch of Far Eastern stations. I suspect that the A values of geomagnetic activity were quite low for the period March 13-19, ranging between 2 and 6, thereby accounting for the improved long distance high-latitude-path trans-oceanic reception. The outlook: Would seem to indicate a steady worsening of conditions as spring progresses and the noise levels go up. In the immediate future, a lessening of TA and TP (Far East) activity, with an increasing possibility of South Africa and Oceanic (Down Under) reception. Continued fair to good on the North South American area, and improving reception on the West Coast of Deep South American stations as spring progresses. Perhaps the last period of European and Far Eastern reception this year will occur around April 5-8, and April 18-22. (Back in the box, oh magic prognosticator...RJS)

John Gifford, who is an amateur astronomer, has some interesting news re sunspot phenomena and solar rotation. "I've been checking the sun during the last two weeks with my 6-inch reflector for the number and size of sunspots. For the 25-28 day cycle supposedly produced by the rotation of the sun, the sunspots would have to be fairly stable entities. On three consecutive days, 3/6-3/8, I was able to observe the sun. On 3/6, only one major sunspot group was visible; By 3/7 at the same time a new major sunspot was visible which certainly couldn't be explained by the contention that it had been there before and had just now rotated into sight; On 3/8 this new sunspot had shrunk considerably. This seems to point out that sunspots can be highly variable creatures. If there is a cyclic occurrence of enhanced reception, it seems to be due to a cyclic nature of the sun's generation of geomagnetic activity, rather than the 25-28 day rotation of the sun bringing the same sunspots into view time after time."

Very well said, John, and this points out something that is important, and which makes prediction of low solar activity so hazardous: Solar rotation plays only a part in the production of visible sunspots and the ensuing havoc on the Earth's BCB frequencies. The life of a sunspot is highly variable; some spots last only a few days, whereas a few may survive four or five solar rotations, sayeth Kenneth Davies in Ionospheric Radio Propagation.

So, are we any closer to prediction of reception conditions, or more specifically, extended periods of enhanced reception? I don't have the answer, and would welcome comments on the subject. The inter-relationships between the Sun's spots and the Earth's geomagnetic field is clear, as is the relation between the geomagnetic field and quality of long-distance reception. More next week?

(Larry Godwin, Colorado) (HCAP5-Cuenca???-RjS)
- 1178 -VOA- Okinawa, VOA S-8 at 0907 3/18, separable from and louder than KOFI. (Don Kaskey, Calif.)
- 1180 XEFR Mexico, Mexico, DF, "Radio Felicidad" heard 3/17 at 0400. (Kaskey) +XEFR ID as Mexico City and commercial on 3/15 at 0320, KOFI off as usual. (Patrick Martin, Oregon)
- 1190 XE.. Mexico, UnID SS mentioning "en Mexico" on 3/9 at 2350 with WQWD looped. (John Gifford, Illinois)
- ? Panama, nothing listed for this country here; fair signal election format // w/others and AN that AM, hrd from 0204 3/4. (Silvera/NRC)
- 1200 YNC Nicaragua, Managua "Radio Capital" in with ID at 0300 MM 3/18. Listed at 500 watts and I believe it! (Larry Godwin, Colo)
- ? UnID, heard 0820-30 3/3 with Chinese singing and talk. At 0830 fanfarish orchestral music and ID which was unreadable because of QRM. Could this be BCC-Taiwan? (Art Peterson, Vietnam)
- 1210 JOGR Japan, Tokyo heard at 0810 very nice 3/18, S-7 at 0910. (Kaskey)
- 1212 HJBE Colombia, Cucuta heard with TODELAR and "Radio Internacional" IDs at s/off 2356 3/12. This one is really drifting. (Godwin, Colo)

- 1241A ? UnID SS strong at 0101 on 2/24, but no ID heard; fade-out but het still audible until 0110 when it went off abruptly, so this must be normal weekday s/off time. (Gifford, Illinois)
- 1268 YNUX? Nicaragua?? SS heard here on 3/10 from 2045-2145 (tune-out). One ID heard which sounded like "Musica, mas musica...Radio Atena(s)". (John Gifford, Ill.)(would seem to be YNUX-Good catch-RjS)
- 1270 KNDI Hawaii, Honolulu, Candy Radio heard 3/16 0420-0500, no s/off, jazz station. (Don Kaskey, Calif)
- 1300 HJNB Colombia, Bucaramanga almost positive the stn IDing as R. Reloj, ex-Transmisoras Guias. NSP like other HJ R. Reloj's. (NRC)
- 1310 XE.? Mexico, SS heard on 3/2 from 2240-2315 (fade-out) with many mentions of "de Mexico". It seemed to be broadcasting a sports event and the name "Tony Morales" was mentioned several times. (John Gifford, Illinois)
- 1315 ? UnID SS with IDs as "Radio Recuerdo" and EST TC between each record on 2/27 at 2025. SS signal but very weak audio. (John Navin, North Carolina)(HOL55-Chitre-R. Reforma?-RjS)
- 1340 ? UnID SS heard at 0220 on 2/26, the same AM KLBK was dominating 1340, XENV-Monterrey probably the most likely. (Gifford, Ill)
- 1350 XEQK Mexico, Mexico, DF, ID at 0349 on 3/15, music after ID (Martin, Ore)
- 1370 JO.. Japan, NHK2 synchros S-7 at 0527 with EE lessons. (Kaskey, Calif)
- 1380 KPDI Hawaii, Honolulu heard 0458-0517 3/18 with KRKO looped. (Kaskey, Cal +KPDI with KRKO not too strong in background, at 0257 3/11. (Martin)
- 1400 ? UnID SS heard at 0130 on 3/4, what Mexicans would still be on? (John Gifford, Ill.)(Most in north and west would still be on-RjS)
- 1410 XEKB Mexico, Guadalajara, Jal. heard 2/26 0429½-0447 with a few IDs when CFUN OC off, as R. Jalisco. No report, what's the power? (Jon Pearkins, B.C.) (.25 nights acc. to SRDS/Schatz-RjS)
- 1420 KCCN Hawaii, Honolulu freq. clear, except for KCCN at 0410 3/10. (Patrick Martin, Oregon) (FBK, KSTN off MM now? Watch for 2AP if so-RjS)
- 1440 XELZ Mexico, Mexico, DF 0418-0428 call ID at 0420 3/4. (Frank Kennedy, Cal)
- 1468 ZYK22 Brazil, R. Libertade do Caruaru noted here 2/21. (ARC/NRC)
- 1490 -VTVN- South Vietnam, Hue monitored 0840-0906, had EE lessons to 0902, orchestral music, then more EE lessons afterward. Good signal. (Art Peterson, Tonkin Gulf, Vietnam)
- XEDR Mexico, Guaymas, with other stations in background, ID at 2204 3/7. Quite surprised for XEDR this clear. (Martin, Oregon)
- 1520 DBX4D Peru, Lima is AN per the WRTN-68. Unfortunately, so is HJLQ. Still, in late spring this one may make it. (Larry Godwin, Colo) (Ah, but HJLQ is reported on 1526 now-RjS)
- 1543A ? UnID SS, at 0535 3/18. Possibly HJLE-R. Armero?(Kennedy, Calif) (Either HJLE or HJBV-Turbaco, R. Canoa which has been drifting 1540-1545 recently-RjS)
- 1550 40D Australia, Emerald, Qsld., heard 0508-0551 3/18, MoR music, and light classical; ID at 0530. (Frank Kennedy, Calif.)
- +40D heard 3/18 at 0420 with fair signal, 0530 ABC net ID. (Kaskey)
- ? UnID SS, probably XEBG is the SS I heard under KKJD on 3/3 at 0145. Too weak for IDs, but music was familiar. (Scrimgeour, Ont)
- ? UnID SS on top at 0737 3/18. No ID. (Kaskey, Cal) (XENU-RjS)
- ? UFO, unID 0520-0550 3/4 with weird programming, didn't sound like the Russian. Philippines? (Don Kaskey, Calif.)(Possible, in these days of high ionospheric absorption, that low-latitude TP's would be heard rather than stations further north. Interesting theory, at any rate. Just thought I'd throw that in...RjS)
