The listings are the most accurate and comprehensive list that this editor has ever seen, including recent Medium Wave Guides and FBIS logs. The Supplement list can be described as being a combination of the brevity of the Medium Wave Guide, and the accuracy of the FBIS, Pacific Asian Log, Vane Jones Log, and the SACCA (well, what ever became of SACCA??) logbooks. For quick reference it is currently the best on the market.

Individual country listings that appear to have undergone extensive revision are the People's Republic of China, Thailand, the African states, Japan and Colombia.

If you missed out on the recent IRCA Special Price order, the WRTVH Summer Supplement can be obtained from Gilfer Associates, P.O. Box 239, Park Ridge, New Jersey, 07656 for \$2.50.

DX Conditions

In general, have seemed to deteriorated as the summer slump has peaked. Not everyone has been staying away from the dials, however; in the northeast, TA's are being heard nightly, some Africans have been heard, and several excellent Deep South American catches have been reported by Gordon Nelson. From Colorado, Larry Godwin reports "This is the most depressing 4 weeks I can remember for reception conditions. I'm sure I wouldn't have heard DAX4U if it hadn't been for the tremendous power...". And IRCA member Bill Wilson appears to have been the first to hear DAX4U-1010 on June 27.

Interestingly, we have more reports of verifications than we do of tips contributed by the membership this month. If you can wade through all the material on the next seven pages, the tip section will start on page 9.

DXWW Overseas ReportersA. Mervyn Branks, 5 Dublin Street, Invercargill, New Zealand

This week we welcome to DXWW, Merv Branks of Invercargill, New Zealand, who has been DXing since 1927. Merv was for more than 20 years editor of The N.Z. DX Times and its predecessor, and as editor of the valuable Pacific-Asian Log and is considered an authority on DX in that area. His total of 825 QCCB verifications of Asian and Oceania stations is more than 150 ahead of his nearest contemporary. Recent veries include 6BE(50w), 1ZT(100w), RFA-1580, AIR-Cuttack-965, Singapore-1370, KCCN, AIR Sambalpur-860, K88Q, Cluj, Romania, HongKong-905, DZRP-920. Reported are Broadcasting Service of Saudi Arabia-1594, AIR Jeypore-1460, Calicut-880, Delhi A-810, XEUR, AIR Calcutta-670, Sigatoka-930, and DXDC-1490. Other information by frequency:

- 600 6PH Australia, Port Hedland, West Australia, operates with 2 kw, sked is 1700-1100 EST. Port Hedland is on the northwest coast of W.A.
- 790 Singapore, English Service until 1130 EST, s/off is one of the strongest signals in New Zealand.
- 905 Hong Kong Commercial Radio advises that this transmitter was used to conduct tests on 905 kcs and was one of those normally operating on 1530, 1170 and 1050 kcs. The transmitter on 1530 was suspended during the tests. "Our English Service is now back on 1530 kcs and we have no intention of opening a second English service for the time being." Hong Kong is at present on Summer Time, 14 hours ahead of EST and signs off at midnight local time.
- 930 Fiji, Sigatoka, Radio Fiji new signal on this channel // 890. 2 kw. Heard closing at 0415 but may be later Saturday AM. A further Fijian station is planned for Rakiraki on 1470 kcs at the end of the year.
- 1090 Hawaii, Alan Roycroft of Broadcast Services Inc., 2877 Kalakaua Avenue, Honolulu, Chief Engineer of KOKL, KKUA, KIKI, KTRG, KLEI, KNDI, KCCN, and KUMU advises that another station will replace the defunct KHAI with a power of 5 kw.
- 1235 Radio Pegasus, This N.Z. pirate has verified a Christchurch listener but has been put out of business by the Post and Telegraph Department who confiscated their gear.
- 1370 Singapore, Radio Singapura broadcasts in Chinese/Tamil to s/off at 1130 EST with anthem, power 20 kw.
- 1420 New Caledonia, Noumea to increase power to 20 kw next year.
- 1570 Hawaii, new station using 10 kw proposed on this channel according to Allan Roycroft.
- 1594 Saudi Arabia, The Broadcasting Service of Saudi Arabia has been heard on this announced frequency with an all-English program with news on the half-hour, commentary and request session. Frequent announcements by man, and woman comper for requests. Believe 1000 kilowatts.

Pakistan - The Soviet Union is to supply a number of high-powered transmitters under an agreement signed on May 1, 1968. It provides for two 1000 kw at Islamabad and Dacca, 150 kw at Quetta, other stations are in course of erection at Khulna-10 kw, Multan-100kw, Hyderabad-100kw and Khairpur-10kw.

India - Jullundur A-890, ex-710 with 50 kw, Jullundur B-1350 1 kw is new, as is Ranchi B-1230, 1 kw; an unidentified but strong AIR transmitter is being heard on 980 kc. Raipur, formerly 980, is now on 1000 kc.

Radio Hauraki is again in the news. To recap events of this year:

January 27: Tiri wrecked on the coast of Grand Barrier Island.

February 27 - Tiri II, formerly the Kapuni, put to sea and broadcasts resumed.

April 3 - Moorings snapped and was towed into Auckland for repairs.

April 11 - Tiri II was forced onto a shoal near Whangaparapara jetty, Great Barrier Island, lost here \$4000 transmitting mast. (Continued)

Thailand National Broadcast Network

Among the many Thailand radio stations, the National Net, next to Radio Free Asia, is composed of the country's most powerful radio stations. This fact, plus fortuitous frequency allocation, make the National Net the best opportunity (except for RFA) for the NA DXer interested in hearing Thailand. There are numerous low-powered relays, but I have listed only the most powerful outlets and only those I have heard and positively IDed. These are:

Note the prevalence of split frequencies. The 1320 outlet was discovered purely by chance, but I noted very strong signals on 3/26/68. The best time for a positive ID of the National Net is 0800 EST (8 PM Thai Time). Only at this time (which coincides beautifully with the best time to DX Thailand from WQNA) the following ID sequence is used on all outlets:

0758 Music which I have nicknamed "Thai Time Music" which features a tick-tock tempo complete with tick-tocks. Real title unknown.

0759.5 The "Big Ben" sequence of 8 chimes familiar to us all. Six pips (monotone, one per second) the last pip coinciding with the first chime of...

0800 Eight chimes marking the hour of 8 P.M. Followed by march music.

0801 ID and news in Thai.

Some of the above details are difficult to describe in words, but a tape has been sent to the Convention in Los Angeles, and I'm sure copies will be circulating around afterward for those interested. Larry Godwin was successful a few years ago in getting a verie from the address in WRTVH for his reception of 843, so Thailand will verify. Thailand stations are fascinating to listen to and are a challenging goal for the DXer. Good luck. - Art Peterson

Comments

In Peterson's July report, the location of the 843 station is listed as Khon Kaen. However, I believe it has been positively established that Sakon Nakhon (R. 909) is operating here. Right? - C.N. Stanbury II

In answer to the above, I contend that since the latest published lists (WRTVH SSupplement) are not quite accurate (Cf. NBS outlet listed 660 in both WRTVHSS and Arctic info) is actually on 630 (per Peterson). The situation in Thai radio circles is highly fluid at the present time, and while the 843 outlet may not be in Khon Kaen, it does carry NBS programming (and not "R. 909" during the evening hours).

The WRTVH Summer Supplement has updated the Thai lists and shows NBS outlets also on 910-Thon Buri (1 kw), 1130-Lampang (10 kw), and Surat Thani-1210(10 kw)

As for the 1320 outlet Art reports, the listed station there is Thai Royal Air Force, and may have been included in NBS' expansion recently.

Aside: I note that Harriet, the NRC's blank pages editor is accused of defecting to the IRCA, recently. At least she knows where the action is...right Kaskey?

June 14, - Tiri II aground near Waipu on sandy Uretiti Beach after another stormy ordeal. The ship was driven over 50 miles across the Hauraki Gulf by high winds, after losing the steerage. The transmitting mast was saved, but the 20-foot whip aerial was lost. It was hoped that the station would return to the air June 23.

I was so sick of that place by the time we left. I'm now out in the Gulf of Tonkin again. On Pyongyang SW I noted only "news" (hai) during 0600 and 0900 B/C - no Pueblo sailors on the air. Perhaps other times. I have sent the IRCA Convention via RJS a tape of some DX I've heard over here. Hope you enjoy it. DX is a little slow these days since Singapore, but now and then I give it a whirl. Have a good time in L.A. and here's hoping for a great DX season this fall. 73. (I just listened to the tape, very nice time signals from several exotic stations-RJS)

Here's Art's DX:

760 UNID, probably in South Vietnam. This outlet heard 0657-0705, 7/28 played some characteristic music before the news that I have heard on both VOA-1140 and RFA-1580. Leads me to believe this new station is connected with VOA somehow. Looks like the old VOA-760 has been revived but not as a "VOA" per se. (Vietnam) (CMS, can you help???? Seriously, I think a rational guess would be the Voice of Freedom, 200 kw from Hue, highlighted several months ago has taken the VOA frequency. When was the first time you heard this station, Art?-RJS)

B43 HSK909 Thailand, Khon Kaen, Thai Nat'l B/C heard particularly strong 0750-0805 7/28, with "Caissions Go Rolling Along" leading into the usual ID sequence. Often this network plays pro-U.S. music.

1140 -VOA- Philippines, Poro, caught this one at 0559 7/28, 0559: "Columbia, Gem of the Ocean", then "This is the VOA resuming its transmission on this frequency". More CGO. 0600 going to news in UNID Asian language. Only EE was that one sentence.

Many thanks to Merv, Theo and Art for their fine support. A hearty welcome to our New Zealand friend, Merv Branks, 'tis a fine job you do on the PAL.

Haiti - To follow up our query on the fate of 4VEH following the abortive revolution in Haiti where the station was seized by the rebels, C.M. Stanbury sends the following:

4VEH-1035 has been audible here and on // 2450 since July 8. Prior to July 7, (when I didn't check) neither channel had been audible although evening reception on both frequencies is normally possible almost every evening. Therefore, as previously suggested by the Ottawa Citizen account, it is possible that the station was off the air for a period. However, if there was a silencing, it must have occurred after May 23 as they were heard on SW -6120 by one of my most reliable reporters that date. (Thanks, Stan-RJS)

NRC reports that 4VEC is now on 830 khz per announcements on 4VEF-1035.

Rules for the 1969 Singleton-Eliminator Foreign Contest

1. Contestants - Any member in good standing of the NRC or/and IRCA who resides in the Western and Northern hemisphere may compete in this contest by observing the following rules.
2. Stations Eligible - Any regular broadcasting station operating within the 535-1605 kcs range of the standard broadcast band is eligible providing it is located at a distance of 2000 miles or more from contestant's receiver (by Great Circle Air Distance) and is located outside of Canada and the adjacent 48 states of USA (Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, etc are eligible if beyond the 2000 mile minimum distance). Utility stations, harmonics, images, etc. are ineligible. Contestants may not enter stations entered in previous year's contest.
3. Submitting Entries - Verifications must be for reception of stations between Sept. 1, 1968, and August 31, 1969 (contestant's local time). To allow time for verifications to arrive, the deadline for receiving entries will be October 31, 1969. What is generally accepted to be a "genuine verification" must have been received by contestant before it can be entered. Then, a carbon copy, or other acceptable duplicate, of the original reception report to the station must be sent to the CONTEST MANAGER within seven (7) days from time verification is received. Those who send tape reports should send carbon copy of their original letter to the station and be prepared to submit copy of the actual reception tape if so requested by JUDGES PANEL. All contestants must agree to submit actual verifications (or acceptable reproductions) if so requested by JUDGES PANEL. Failure to comply with such requests may result in contestant's disqualification.
4. Method of Scoring - The FIRST person reporting acceptable verification from a station will be awarded 10 POINTS for a SINGLETON plus 2 POINTS for each 1000 miles of air distance to the station. The NEXT person reporting acceptable verification from the same station operating on the same frequency (5 kc. variation allowable) will be awarded 5 POINTS for an ELIMINATOR plus 1 POINT for each 1000 miles of air distance to the station. When both awards have been made for any one station, that station is then ineligible and is listed as a "DEAD STATION" at the end of the published standings. Any station that is not eliminated and remains a SINGLETON for a period of 3 months will earn a BONUS AWARD of 10 POINTS if it continues to operate on the same frequency. This BONUS AWARD will be repeated at the end of each 3 month period that SINGLETON status continues. Contestants may estimate their own mileage which is subject to correction by CONTEST MANAGER'S measurements on a large world globe. Any disagreements may be submitted to JUDGES PANEL for final settlement.
5. Judges Panel - This panel will consist of the Foreign editors of NRC/IRCA (or individuals appointed by them) and the CONTEST MANAGER who is the basic sponsor of this contest - a total of 3 Judges. Their majority decision will be final in every situation. The CONTEST MANAGER will maintain all records of contestants, monies, entries and scores. He will compute mileage and award Singletons and Eliminators and final prizes. He will protect and return all carbon copies, verifications, etc. in reasonable time.
6. Prizes - With the final deadline date for entries on October 31, 1969, final standings will be computed and prizes awarded during November 1969. A fund of \$75 to \$100 or more will be used to purchase really worthwhile prizes to be awarded for first three places in contest and possibly there will be other awards for various categories. The CONTEST MANAGER will provide a large basic contribution to the PRIZE FUND and will welcome all other contributions both large and small from anyone who wishes to further the hobby of foreign DXing and stimulate competitive interest among old-timers and newcomers alike to the hobby. Such contributions should be labeled "PRIZE FUND" and sent to Contest MANAGER.
7. Entry Fee - A fee of 50¢ must be paid by each contestant upon entry into the contest. These fees will be used for postage and other expenses necessary in conducting the contest. At the close of the contest, any balance will be added to the prize fund. (continued overleaf...)

Proposed Interclub Listening Contest

As promised in the June issue of DXWU, here is a broad outline of a new contest which I hope will provide a listening contest in which all DXers can participate.

Basic Premises: All radio stations, save U.S. and Canadian (for North American contestants) are eligible. The BCB stations of the world will be separated into six geographical regions: 1) North American/Caribbean; 2) South America; 3) Europe; 4) Africa/Near East; 5) The Far East; 6) Oceania. Within each region countries will be assigned a point value depending on distance, difficulty of reception, and listener's location. Obviously, the more difficult stations will receive higher priority. Bonuses for low-powered catches will be awarded. (The contest manager reserves the right to re-evaluate point values). The contestant may submit a maximum of three stations from each region. Hence, up to 18 stations may be entered during each contest period. All stations entered in one contest are eligible for the other periods.

Entries: All entries must: 1) appear in either DX Monitor's DXWU or DX News' IDX. 2) be submitted to the contest manager. All entries must be for positively identified stations. NO EXCEPTIONS. Penalties for faulty reports will be assessed by the contest manager. No proof of reception will be required unless the contest manager deems it necessary; in that event, either DX notes or, preferably, a tape recording will suffice.

Contest Period: Each contest period will be for a calendar month. The deadline for entries will be the 15th of the following month. Contest results will be printed in DXWU/IDX.

Entry Fee/Prizes: There will be no entry fee and therefore no prizes.

Purpose and Intent: The purpose of this contest is to provide a contest in which every DXer can take part in without going through the time-consuming, often costly, and at times very frustrating procedure of obtaining a verie from BCB stations. The short duration of each contest should stimulate interest and enable DXers who may have been "left at the gate" in verification contests a chance to actively participate. The individual DXer can enter any or all of the contests, and since there are no prizes, is competing only for the satisfaction that his accomplishments provide. In that light, it is fervently hoped that no inquiries on the validity of contest entries will be required.

Country Values and Power Bonuses: will be included next month, pending acceptance of the contest idea by the individual clubs. RJS will discuss this contest at both the Los Angeles and Boston conventions. Tentative Starting contest period would be OCTOBER

The 1040 Caper...C.M. Stabury II

In the April-May RADIO-TV EXPERIMENTER appears an article entitled "DX On Wings" which concludes that the original unit carrying VOA XMSNs on 1040 kHz was airborne. Also as noted in this article the original 1040 unit received VOA XMSNs off the air and from, among others, famous Radio Americas - a most unusual arrangement as RA, in addition to being heavily jammed those days (the Cuban missile crisis) itself received VOA XMSNs off the air. Therefore, had the original unit been at SugarLoaf, then at that time RA must have been considerably closer to the Florida Keys than Swan Island. Or, if the RTVE article contends, the original 1040 kHz unit was airborne then we know that Radio Americas was involved in, and in some respects at least, equipped for airborne operations.

In their reply to our initial query on this subject the VOA volunteered the following information: "The 'surplus' transmitter and antenna were not in good enough condition to be shipped by air." This clearly indicates that the antenna already existed at another location and had been shipped to SugarLoaf in some fashion. Further, if the VOA conducts its business in a rational manner this statement also implies that the array used at SL was a portable unit which would explain, as an alternate to the airborne theory, how the 1040 outlet was put on the air just as rapidly as the publicized Marathon portable. The 1040 unit could only have been put on the air in such a short time by using portable gear. And, if the SL antenna system was not portable, then another portable unit must have been operating in the interval; under such circumstances, it seems completely unreasonable for the VOA to ship this antique system to the SL site when, with another unit already on the air, Washington would have had time to build new and structurally sound towers on the Sugar Loaf site (as it happened, the old "surplus" towers did fall down Sept. 8, 1965 - during Hurricane Betsy).

When queried on the portability of SL's towers, a VOA spokesman replied "The Sugar Loaf antenna array consisted of three tall towers, which were transported to Florida by truck, and as far as I know they were not intended as a portable antenna system and I doubt because of their weight and height whether they could have been conveniently used as such". But when queried on the history of these giant towers, which just happened to be available, the VOA replied: "I do not know the previous uses or ownership of the towers, if any". But obviously, as the towers were "surplus", they must have been owned by somebody, and it seems unlikely that the structure of the towers deteriorated (to the point where they could not be shipped by air) while merely in storage. At this point, the "towers mystery" begins to sound like something dreamed up by the Man from Uncle.

Turning to the alternative, airborne, theory, here now is a complete rundown on our queries to a Voice of America spokesman and his replies on this subject:

CMS Can you confirm, or deny, that the original unit carrying Voice of America transmissions on 1040 kc, beginning in mid-Nov., 1962 was airborne?
If this unit was not airborne, can you explain why it relayed transmission from Radio Americas?

VOA No. The VOA is not now and has never operated any airborne transmitters in any part of the radio spectrum. (NOTE that the 2 statements in the above answer are not separated by a comma but with a period and therefore are ambiguous-CMS). The VOA has no connection with Radio Americas and I have no knowledge of its operations.

CMS My original question read (as above-CMS), to which you have replied..(as above). Now, as we are both aware, from time to time transmitters have carried VOA transmission which are not operated by the VOA. For example, you state, and correctly, of course, "The VOA has no connection with Radio Americas.

The 1040 Caper (Continued)

However, during the first month and a half of the Cuban missile crisis, Radio Americas did relay VOA transmissions. Thus, it is unclear whether the "no" in your answer means no, the unit was not airborne, or, taking it literally, no you can neither confirm nor deny it. Therefore let me rephrase the question: "On what date did the Voice of America first operate from Sugar Loaf?"

VOA - The Sugar Loaf station began relaying Voice of America Spanish language programs to Cuba during 1962 and about the same time as the Marathon station. It continued to operate until hit by hurricane Betsy September 8, 1965. I can assure you that the Sugar Loaf operation of the Voice of America was certainly not airborne.

In point of fact, the original 1040 unit went on at exactly the same time as did the Marathon portable (Nov. 13, 1962), not merely "about" the same time. Further, it had previously been estimated that SL took over from the airborne unit "during 1962" (around Dec. 15, 1962), and that final statement in the VOA's answer so completely evades the issue that it verges on the ridiculous (obviously, Sugar Loaf Key is not capable of flight, hi).

Thus, based primarily on this information provided (and withheld) by the VOA itself, but also on evidence previously published, we conclude that the original unit carrying VOA XMSNs on 1040 khz was airborne (and therefore Radio Americas WAS involved in airborne operations), that the use of the antique and structurally weakened towers at SL was simply an error in judgment on the part of the VOA, and the mystery about those towers' origin which the Voice of America seems to be deliberately trying to create, although amusing, is a red herring.

We believe that these are the only reasonable conclusions which can be reached based on the evidence. However, if anyone disagrees with our reconstruction of these events, CMS invites and urges them to try to refute us by turning up new and additional factual evidence such as the EXACT date SL went on the air and the origin of its giant towers.

Listener's Loggings

593 Turkey, UnID strong Turk on this channel, could be Cukurova. (Ericson, Near East, NRC) GPN notes new 300 kw has been heard on 647, but they could well be testing-NRC.

602A Spain, seems to be an interesting situation here, Benelux reports that a powerful RNE station was heard on this channel 1915 on 5/16 - and of course there's no listing on this freq. NZDXT reports that this one has also been heard in NZ and comment: "Running the same program on several SW freqs. Some mornings there is a lot of static on the signal where there is none anywhere on the band else and some mornings just a carrier. I was wondering if we could be getting it thru Saudi Arabia. They have a SW transmitter on one of the SW frequencies currently being used by RNE and it might just relay what was on the freq after their master transmitter went off". That's a good guess on the part of the Zedders - this could well be another "VOA-960". (Nelson/NRC)

782 South Africa (?), Springbok Radio, Bloombfontain tentatively logged July 3 at 2156 s/on. On 7/4 was heard very briefly at 2201 seemingly // 2376 (which unlike 782 is AN). Previously, a carrier had been noted on 782 at various times between 2130 and 2155 5/17, 5/18, 19, 20, and 6/3, 4, but either had completely faded out by 2155 or was so weak that no audio could be heard at s/on. On ALL of these dates Springbok Radio was audible on 2376, and on 7/4 2376 was the strongest it has been all season. (C.M. Stanbury II, P.O. DF is that expected for Calama and there seems to be some correlation between reception of this one and nights when HCEW2-995 is particularly good. This may well be the only chance for Chile on the East Coast now that CKAC is AN. Will keep trying for an ID on this one. (Nelson/NRC)

1000V Cyprus, "Radio Sancek" the clandestine Turkish-Cypriot station is back on the air after a brief absence. This station is almost certainly located on Cyprus proper. (Nelson/NRC)

1010 Peru, Lima, was in well with sometimes excellent signals 0312-0355 6/27, poor afterwards with CFRB QRM; ID's 0328 and 0358 with marimba music, "Transmite Radio America... desde Lima, la Radio-difusora mas potente del Peru". Program was international SA music with TC and ID between each selection. Poor same time 6/28, better again 7/1. Tape of 15 IDs sent. (William Wilson, 5815 Banks Road, Duncan, B.C., Canada) (Excellent catch, Bill, it looks like you're the first to hear this outlet which evidently increased power-RjS)

Peru, Lima heard for the first time with a fine signal MM 7/29 0320-0400 thanks to Bill Wilson's tip. Also heard through the static about the same time MM 8/5 and 8/12. The sponsor of the program at this hour seems to be Havoline motor oil. Frequent IDs are "Radio Victoria" (Radio America, Larry???-RjS) The signal completed dominated at this hour, so it should be the easiest Peruvian from the west by far. This move(s) have nothing to do with getting away from interference, it's just a stabilization of the allocations to every 30 kHz. Please note Nelson/relay to Bruce Reynolds.

Take heart, good people, DX Conditions are likely to improve after August. The TA's become more regular for the Easterner's, the Far East booms in for the Westerners, and this is one of the best times for everybody to get the Oceania stations.
