It can hardly come as a great surprise to most of you that I am wholeheartedly in favor of the proposed merger. Nonetheless, I would like to take this opportunity to present my feelings on the matter. Given the promise that the new club will be governed democratically (without this guarantee I doubt that even the staunchest supporters within the IRCA would back the merger), one should ask himself two questions to ascertain whether or not to vote for the proposal. Firstly, does it aid him as a DXer, and secondly, does it aid the DX fraternity as a whole. Those considerations are similar to those a congressman must make when evaluating a bill; i.e. is it good for my district, and is it good for the country as a whole? In my opinion, the answer to both of these questions is resoundingly affirmative. The specifics going into this judgement have been presented in these pages at great length in the past few weeks. I really believe that this club's members have much to gain through the merger, and nothing to lose but a kind of "IRCA provincialism". As a charter member, I admit to a great deal of pride in our accomplishments, and I think we could continue to improve in the future. Is the new club then worth setting aside this achievement? I say YES! The same efforts which went into making the IRCA the success it is today can work within the new club to make it the great MW DX club in history. The potential is virtually boundless. In closing, I'd like to set another point straight. Detractors of the proposed merger have argued that the proposed By-Laws amendment is illegal. In fact (Quoting from our By-Laws), the BOD "...shall have the final power in ruling on any club affairs, suggestions, proposals, recommendations...". Also, since this proposal was submitted as outlined in By-Laws article XV, I submit that there is nothing illegal about this procedure. I strongly urge everyone to support this proposal - vote FOR the merger.

It seems that some can write at length about their views on the merger, incl. full-page at end of 10/5 DXWW, so will use my views as filler material. Lest there be any question, let me state that I am AGAINST the merger. I find, after much serious thinking & corresponding, that I cannot accept it as it is proposed. May I call to your attention, that in this MW-DXF we have two(2) of our BoD members who are AGAINST the merger. This should quieten any reports that our BoD unanimously supports this merger. Keene showed that he had your interest at heart when he voted as he did. And DEE & two Editors (JMK, IdB) are against it. My opinion is based on many reasons...will list what I can here: (1)The IRCAer who is primarily a domestic DXer(over 80% of us) stands to benefit VERY LITTLE. The DXM since 1/13/68 has averaged 19.9 pages per issue of information for the domestic DXer(incl. reports, contest standings, dom records, govt matters, etc). The merger will only give you 18 pages(or 22 at most) of such info. Add the NRC members-& you see how much editing would have to be done to keep within the page limits. Thus this merger is primarily beneficial to the foreign oriented DXer
 2)Technical articles are fine, but those who use them can usually afford both clubs, if they can afford to make such modifications to their rx's, etc. 3)As an NRC member of 3 yrs standing, I highly respect some of their fine DXers. Would that we had some of them in our club. But the latest DX News indicates that these fine DXers are very much for retaining their NRC format. Several of them made it quite clear that they desired a club as close to the present NRC as possible. Fellows, we have no"assurance"(as one IRCAer puts it) that our present formats & fine committees will be retained. Most likely they won't since the NRC far out-numbers us. Even some dual NRC/IRCA members expressed their preference of the "musings" format. I think that we have shown our format to be far superior to the NRC's as a method of presenting DX info.
 4)One of the reasons the IRCA has come so far in the last year or so, is the competition between the 2 clubs. They are constantly striving to improve, which might not be true if there were only one club. Why hasn't NRC instituted such columns as State-Of-The-Month, Province-OTM, Canadian Stn Info, FOW, etc.? The NRC has been a fairly conservative, stand-pat club, and election of some of their leaders to a new BoD might make the new club this way. 5)Although the NRC has come out w/ a new Log, there is no reason why the IRCA can't put out one, if the membership desires one. Certainly we shouldn't merge just to get this log, as one of the reason's put forth in the last DXWW put it. 6)Our CPC did such a fine job last year, that a united CPC would be of little benefit. With Eric Floden at the helm, our CPC should be GREAT this year. All of this is to point out one thing, that YOU as a member of the IRCA stand to benefit VERY little from a merger as it is proposed, and you stand to lose a lot depending on how the new club is set-up, and the BoD elected. I SECOND Hank Ward's report, and have \$10 to give toward better equipment. We can afford the type equipemnt that will enable us to produce a larger bulletin w/less work on the publisher's shoulder. Having read thoroughly all the material concerning the proposed IRCA/NRC merger, I am offering my comments. This matter is of grave importance to us all, and I hope many members will take time to offer pro/con arguments. I have several reasons why I oppose this proposal: (1) The dues will increase. According to the favorable editorial in the 9/21 DXM, 3rd Class dues will be \$8.00 (as opposed to \$5.50, or a 45% rise) and 1st Class dues jump to \$12 (a full 50% rise from \$8). (2) The proposed arrangement wastes a good amount of money. Publishing from two sites uses twice as many labels & envelopes & much more postage. (3) The merger cannot be practically effected. A merger (according to the aforementioned article) would require a new constitution; the clubs would have to be completely audited; dues already paid would have to be credited to each individual member & indebtedness would be split in an equally complicated fashion. What of the so-called advantages? Is the info increased in proportion to the dues increase? I seriously doubt it. The main advantage is that it would lower the work load on our unsung heroes, the publishing crew...or would it? There would be twice as many envelopes to address, seal, & stamp. (I would like to hear DEE's & the crew's opinion). I agree with the substance of Mssrs. Ward's & Lotsof's letters in the 9/21 DXM. If the NRC must disband, let their members join the IRCA. I have been led to believe that more members equals lower fixed costs equals more money for the treasury. But after a time, we might have a solution, and the committee present a constitution, bulletin format, names of special columns, special committees, etc. and present this to the members of the two clubs for a vote. It has been brought to my attention that the submerger people are seriously thinking of not allowing cash refund of dues to "dissenting members" who do not vote in favor of the submerger. May I point out that such an underhanded retaliation would be in direct conflict with the Incorporation Laws of Colorado (in which the IRCA is incorporated). Under the Incorporation laws of Colo. a "dissenting member" can make a written demand for payment in cash of the "fair value of his remaining membership. This is clearly outlined in Article VII "Merger and Consolidation", part 46, @31-33-8 (1). I might also point out that the BoD have not even attempted to comply with Article VII, part 46, @31-33-1 thru @31-33-3. Especially as related to sending the Sec. of State of Colo. the official forms outlining the terms and conditions of the proposed merger, a statement of any changes in the articles of incorporation of the surviving corporation to be effected by such merger, and manner and basis of converting memberships of each merging organization into share in the new or surviving organization, etc. Also the submerger violates @31-33-3 in that the BoD must submit the merger proposal to a vote of the members present at an annual or a special meeting and in a general election after the annual convention at least 2/3 of the entire outstanding membership must approve the merger (not 2/3 of the members voting). The submerger proposal has not followed the amendment procedures set forth in the Constitution (refer to LCM's forum) or in @31-33-3; with respect to not having presented the proposal to the annual IRCA Convention or informing the voting membership of the 2/3 requirement. Under Article VIII "Voluntary Dissolution", part 48, @31-34-2 thru 10, we find that every member must sign a "consent of dissolution" which must be sent along with details of dissolution to the Sec. of State per @31-34-2. If the BoD wanted to dissolve the club under @31-34-3 it would require approval by 2/3 of the entire membership, and any such proposal clearly must, by law, be presented at the annual IRCA Convention. Since much criticism, editing, and complete censorship of forum reports has taken place in the bulletin of late, the "Committee to Oppose subMerging" will be mailing out the uncensored facts to all thinking IRCA members. If by accident you don't get a copy, just mail me a card asking for the material. If you have any trouble whatsoever in getting your forum report printed, we will gladly print it and mail it out to all. To this end--facts--we stand. Vote NO and save the hobby from lawsuits.

As those of you who have received copies of a proposal which I have submitted to the Board of Directors know, THE PROPOSED subMERGER OF THE IRCA IS IN DIRECT VIOLATION OF OUR CLUB CONSTITUTION. There are several reasons: 1) In that the Constitution establishes and sets the guidelines for the IRCA, and that any changes in our club's existence are only possible when the proper procedures of amendment are followed. Of these 4 procedures stated in Article VIII of the Constitution, no attempt was made to follow the first three. To be enacted as an amendment, all four procedures must be followed; 2) the Bylaws Proposal 3.2-1 (submerger) serves no purpose, in that the powers it assumes are not possible of even being given to it. The Bylaws are merely to draw upon and embellish the Constitution--and they thus cannot cause the dissolution or submerger of the IRCA; 3) As Parts 1, 2, and 3 of Proposal 3.2-1 are in violation of the Constitution and Bylaws, it was illegally submitted since Article II of the Guidelines for Submitting Proposals, as approved by the BoD, so orders. In addition, Part 4 of Proposal 3.2-1, as it is part of the whole, is also illegally submitted since Article II would also apply. If you believe in our Constitutional government, I ask that you vote NO ON PROPOSAL 3.2-1, and also send a card to me asking for a special form, in case you havn't received it, to order the Election Committee chairman to call a special election on the above proposal which I have submitted, in case the BoD refuses to act on the above proposals (see Article XIII - Referendum/Initiative.) VOTE NO ON PROPOSAL 3.2-1, AND SEND YOUR SIGNED FORMS BACK TO ME. WE CANNOT LEGALLY subMERGE.

Hi! Time to come out of hiding on the "Happy Hanna" as we bob about on Yankee Station here in the Tonkin Gulf. DX is, and will be, nil due to present assignment to KHAN-TV-3, the Hancock's closed circuit TV station, as a technician. It is probably one of the best programmed and run stations abroad any ship. I also do a two hour show "The Al Taylor Fiasco" daily 6-3 PM on KHAN radio (utilizes 2 closed circuit wired AF channels plus TV channels 3 (when KHAN-TV is not on) and 6) which are designated FM and AM, respectively, and which are separately programmed for about 50% of the broadcast day. The AM and FM designations are purely programming designations. AM is highly formatized with cw and Top 40 plus blocks of classical and MOR. FM is primarily easy listening with the highlight being the CBS-FM Youngsoud. Simulcasting is done mainly during AFRTS tapes and transcripts. Schedule is NSP when at sea, live programming is 0600-2400 and the rest automated. So about 85% of my working day is devoted to broadcasting. I am indeed a lucky man! Now to the most important remarks - involving the proposed IRCA-NRC merger which took me by surprise. I have given much thought to the matter since the word first appeared. I am very much in favor of the merger. It should be beneficial to the DX hobby overall. NRC's existence is threatened by problems outside its control. Letting NRC collapse because we won't merge with them would be a mistake attributable to our selfish pride and childishness. If this does happen, we will have lost too, as well as the rest of the MW DX world. The NRC is an honorable and equal competitor with a 35 yr. tradition. While we rightfully share in that tradition to an extent, we would be guilty of allowing it to be lost if we vote down the merger and cause the collapse of NRC. The DX world would benefit from the merger. You and I and every other NRC'er and IRCA'er would also benefit. I admit the dues are high, but maybe they could be worked downward. The alternative is far too clear in its non-dollar and cents price to us. Neither IRCA or NRC stand to lose, in my opinion, from the merger. We both stand to gain. I will certainly vote for the merger.

Bill Lipis' editorial in last issue started me thinking. I dug out the IRCA Constitution and Bylaws and read them over again. It now seems to me that the BoD acted too hastily in making their proposal for merger. In such an important matter as dissolution of IRCA to form a new club, I feel that a Constitutional Amendment, not merely a Bylaw amendment, is required. According to the Constitution, however, such an amendment could not be voted upon until after next summer's convention. Consequently, unless someone can convince me that the BoD was justified in using a Bylaw amendment to bring about the merger, I feel I must cast a no vote at this time. Let me repeat--I am fully in favor of this merger and would like to see it happen as soon as possible, but I am also in favor of following the Constitution. I have made the following proposals to Larry Godwin for presentation to the Bod: 1) the government of the two clubs remain separate until the IRCA can legally pass an amendment approving the merger; 2) Articles VI through IX of the Bylaws be amended to allow joint publication of a bulletin and committees with the NRC. We have been told that the NRC is in no danger of collapse. Why not wait until we can do this thing legally. Besides, the delay will give everyone a chance to discuss the format of the new club more fully, instead of having to put up with a makeshift interim government.

President's Report

The IRCA Board of Directors has voted to postpone the balloting on the merger until November 16, 1968, as per a proposal submitted by Dave Martin.

There are several reasons for the postponement. Some feel there should be more time allowed to evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of a merger. A budget for the new club has not been finalized and it is not known whether the announced dues will be sufficient to cover the costs of the larger bulletins. The "Committee of 10" has not yet approved a proposed constitution and bylaws for the new club, and has not voted on an interim format.

The postponement will allow the Board of Directors time to entertain a proposal submitted by Lance Muller concerning the propriety of the Board's vote to dissolve the Constitution of the IRCA.

Also the Board has voted to establish new IRCA dues immediately rather than wait until November 16. Effective the next bulletin (October 26), the new domestic dues will be:

1st-class	\$9.50	Airmail	\$14.00
3rd-class	6.50		

These new dues will not be sufficient to eliminate the current deficit of approximately \$500 (as reported in Mike Northam's financial report in the October 5 DX Monitor). This deficit amounts to about \$2.00 per member, and the dues would have to be increased an additional dollar in order for us to move into the black in the foreseeable future.

I am hoping we can come up with some money-making projects that will at least help eliminate our deficit. The IRCA auction is one such project, and it added \$261 of cash and receivables to the treasury last August. If you have any ideas that might produce money for the club, please let me know about them and I'll pass them along to the Board.

If you are interested in volunteering for DXWW editor (in the event the merger is not approved) please contact Larry Godwin. The basic qualifications are: a background and interest in foreign DXing and the time, patience and ability to cut 6-8 stencils per week. Past support of the DXWW might also be included as a qualification also.

On another topic - I have received yet another manuscript (sic-my 'sic'-RJS) from G.M. Stanbury II dealing with the Botswana BBC Mw outlet (you remember it, don't you - it went off the air March 31, 1968) which I cannot print in good conscience - not having the time nor inclination to cut it, and quite frankly, it doesn't rate the space it would take up, a trait that most recent Stanbury articles seem to have in common.

Keep Up With The Times...

Political events and natural disasters often provide some extraordinary opportunities for foreign DX that would not otherwise be available - especially in Latin America. For instance, since the last DXWW, the elected government of Peru (President Belaunde) was overthrown and the President exiled to Argentina. It is not known at this time if radio broadcasting was disrupted during this period. It is likely some stations ran AN during the crisis. On October 11, President Arias of Panama was overthrown in a bloodless coup instigated by the former and current head of the National Guard in Panama. Some of the pro-Arias radio stations are operating "clandestinely" according to press reports. It is likely that these stations may be broadcasting from within the Canal Zone where Pres. Arias is living. Some unscheduled AN activity from this country may develop along with the crisis.

And, in a similar vein, as I cut this hurricane Gladys approaches the Florida Keys. Quite often some of the Caribbean stations run AN when a tropical storm or hurricane approaches the area. In addition, when the storm hits, some pests (such as was the case with CMC-640 several years ago) may be off the air for some time.

The point is - watch the newspapers, know what's happening in the real world, and determine what the event means and what opportunities it presents to the BCB foreign DXer.

Australia - The Australian Broadcasting Control Board advises the following changes in frequency to take effect in the near future:

- 6BS Busselton - 2 kw, 760 to 680 kHz (not yet in operation)
- 6WF Perth - 50 kw, 690 to 720 kHz (best opportunity for West Auss)
- 6CA Carnarvon - 200 w., 720 to 650 kHz

All 3 are Australian Broadcasting Commission (ABC) National network stations.

Two stations are granted licenses: Gladstone, Queensland on 930 khz, and Port Lincoln, South Australia on 1220 khz.

Nauru Island - The new station operates on 1320 khz with 130 watts! Signs off at 0500 EST weekdays, 0630 Sundays, 0400 Mondays.

Tarawa Island - Radio Tarawa on 844 khz has a new call, sounds like VSZ1 with 0420 s/off.

Fiji - Radio Fiji, Sigatoka in parallel with 710/890 in Hindi and Fijian signs off in English at 0530 daily except Saturdays at 0600 as does the English outlets on 560/1320. Evening service on 930 khz: Saturday, Hindi 0200-0500, Fijian 0500-0600, Sunday - Hindi 0030-0530; Monday - Fijian to 0300, Hindi 0300-0530; Tuesday - Fijian -115-0530; Wednesday - Hindi 0100-0530; Thursday - Hindi to 0100, Fijian 0100-0530; Friday - Hindi 0100-0400, Fijian 0400-0530; The English service carries ABC (Australian B.C.) news and local weather at 0400.

How to Use the IRCA Frequency Check List

Dates on this list are literal. For example, a station listed on the Second Saturday at 0100 EST means that it checks on early Saturday morning, although in the PST zone it would be 10:00 PM of the preceeding Friday night.

Not all of the times on the list are precise. A DXer may have reported hearing a station at 0105 EST in the DX Roundup, and it appears on the list as 0100-0115. The check may actually begin at 0055 or 0105 rather than 0100. It's a good idea to listen to a frequency several minutes before and after the listed times to increase your chances of hearing the check.

Many checks conducted by Vir James are listed 0200-0300, but they do not last a full hour. For example, on the Fourth Saturday all stations listed 0200-0300 check during the 1-hour period, but at different times.

During Daylight Savings Time, this list can be used literally since virtually the entire country observes DST. A station that tests at 0100 EST in December will test at 0100 EDT in June, etc. The exceptions are those stations with the () symbol.

What are your chances of hearing a station per this list? If the station has a * or @ in front of it, your chances are good. Stations with no symbols before the call letters are "untried" and are probably not regular; the ones that are will appear with an asterisk on next year's list. (Stations with a dash before the call letters are more likely to be regular than those with no symbol.)

There is some repetition in the list, e.g., KVIO is listed both the 1st and 2nd Monday. That's because the station was reported as heard on both days. Probably the regular check is conducted on one day or the other; maybe next year we will know.

If you don't hear a station at the listed time, there are several possible explanations. The most obvious is that static or interference did not permit reception. Maybe the check is made quarterly and you listened the wrong month. (Probably many of the stations in the list that don't have a Q symbol do check quarterly.) Or perhaps the check as listed is not regular. A final possibility is that the station was scheduled to check but forgot to come on the air or made other arrangements with the monitor.

You can help make the 1970 f/c list more accurate and useful by placing a check mark by every check you hear in the current list, and by noting separately all f/c's not contained in this list. Then during the summer of 1969, let me know what you've heard during the past season. If possible, note the full time of the check, not just the time of one ID, and make a note if tone or music was used. Also, ask about f/c schedules in your reception reports.

Finally, please don't send a tentative report to a station if you hear a tone at the listed time but no ID. Many of the checks listed here were contributed by monitors on condition that only definite reports be sent.

Frequency Check Trends

Each year the number of checks in this list decreases, and I believe the main reason is the trend for stations to rely on daytime tests. Many monitoring companies have mobile equipment and travel from town to town on a regular basis to make tests during regular programming. Increased interference due to all-night stations, and the obviously more pleasant alternative of testing during RS rather than at 2:00 in the morning, probably account for much of the trend.

By the way, perhaps a definition of a frequency check is in order. A f/c is a special kind of test of short duration designed to provide reception by a monitoring company that will precisely measure the frequency of the testing station. It is not an ordinary equipment test (ET); ET's are often of longer duration than f/c's and are usually not regular. They do not fall within the scope of this f/c list.
