Approach it from "one man's DX is another's QRM" and put those catches in the appropriate member's round-up & you put what is actually being heard by IRCA members in the place where others may more readily determine if they can hear the station, too...which, after all, is the purpose of the Round-up columns. For example, Hawaii & Japan are frequently heard by the West Coast group; Mexico & Central America dominate the "foreign" DX for Midwesterners...etc. Why, then, "sweat out" finding a replacement for Randy...why maintain this fascinated aura of fantastic accomplishment over fundamental DX catches. After all, how many DXers actually monitor a frequency for 219 hours to hear Panama or beautiful downtown Burbank? This is being sent to some of the more active IRCA Domestic Alerts in hopes of obtaining some additional information for the next issue of the Condition of Frequencies List. Many of you have the information needed but don't get around to mailing it to the CoF List editor. To help save you trouble in submitting the information and to make compilation easier, this sheet lists all those specific stations on which exact information is desired. In some cases, no information is known; in others, that which has been reported is conflictual or thought to be outdated. In addition to these specific stns listed, you might also thumb through your CoF List (extra copies available from publishing hq) and check for any changes that may have taken place. On those stns that are listed as off one or more mornings a week, the sign-off and sign-on times would be appreciated, in terms of EST. In most cases, sign-off will be midnight local time; it is especially desirable to have the sign-off time if it is later than midnight (or earlier, for that matter). Please list sign-on times only if you have noted that time being used more than once. It is important that inaccurate information be avoided to prevent unnecessary conflicts in information and the possible changing of accurate info to incorrect info. This is especially the case where a stn may be off just once because of equipment failure or may be on for a short period of time with special programming. Long range information is most desirable; info on changes of shorter duration should be published in DK Roundup, or in DX Forum; DKF makes a fine place to mention changes in schedule that might be of special interest to DXers, such as a stn that has long been NSP dropping its all-night programming or a station going all-night for the first time. Even if the stn is common to you and not worthy of reporting to DXR as a 'catch', the word on its new sked can be very helpful to a lot of DXers---some who are temporarily inactive and might never notice a stn sked change if not mentioned in DKF.
