Well, I never really realized that a GOOD rx would make 1000% difference in my chances at making good catches. But the HQ-150 is so much better than the Halli. S-120, that it's almost unbelievable. Now if I can get the turns on my loop tightened, try direct-coupling it, & build an FET loop booster, I might hear KOMA, hi. I urge all DXers to be fairly selective in reporting to the DXR's. Most all of us have hrd the 50kw giants on clear channels, so reporting them isn't much of a tip. We need quantity, but not at the expense of QUALITY. A 1-page DXR with all QUALITY tips is much more valuable than 2-pages of catches. And some of you freeloaders (those who never report but DX using other's tips), why not get out a pencil & paper & report some of those elusive catches you've been making. It doesn't take long. You can do it while monitoring a frequency on MM, if you want to. I strongly urge all IRCAers to order the NRC Log. It'll be the best \$1.00+ that you've ever spent on your hobby. 73.

These two states are relatively easy to receive on the West Coast, as the signals travel over areas which are quite free of stations. In addition, many of the most-commonly received stations operate on frequencies which are clear (except for a few Easterners struggling through) channels. And, of course, any QRM originating from a different bearing can be looped out. For the DXers of the East, the best bets are KFQD-750 and KICY-850 from Alaska, and KORL-650, KIKI-830, and KIMO-850 from Hawaii, when the normally-dominant stations are off the air on Sunday and Monday mornings.

Alaska is divided into four time zones (moving west): Pacific Local Time (Ketchikan and Sitka); Yukon Local Time (no U.S. stations); Alaska Local Time (all other radio markets, except Nome); and Bering Local Time (Nome.)

Hawaii is entirely on Hawaiian Local Time, which is the same as Alaskan Local Time.

Alaska uses Daylight Savings Time (Standard minus one hour) from the third Sunday in April to the third Saturday in October. Since this list is on Eastern Standard Time, one hour is thus added when the local time changes in the Spring (Spring ahead) and left unchanged after the change in the Fall (Fall back -- to S.T.)

Hawaii recognizes only one time zone, so their time is always five hours behind this list.

## How Radio Came To Seattle

Many who are hardly in their dotage remembers watching fathers or grandfathers fiddling for hours with the dials of huge, monstrosly howling radio sets in the 1920's. It was said that one needed to be a three handed man to tune a station.

Eventually, through the whistles and static, something would emerge resembling a voice.

"I got Everett," the radio buff would shout.

Today's youngsters, reared to expect instantaneous music from their transistorized radios, cannot imagine a world in which "hearing Bellingham" was an event worthy of rejoicing.

Vincent Kraft, 7025 18th Ave. N. E., has lived in Seattle 55 years. He is a highly successful businessman in the field of electronics engineering today.

But Kraft is more than that. It was he who began Seattle's first radio station (KJR) August 16th, 1921, one month before KFC began broadcasting.

Not only did Kraft get in on the ground floor, but he rode the crest of the exciting "new medium", eventually building more than a dozen radio stations in the Pacific Northwest.

If radio was a rather crude thing, by modern standards, when Kraft began, it certainly was highly sophisticated, a giant employer of personalities and technicians, before Kraft bowed out some 25 years later.

By 1910 a lot of wireless buffs in Seattle were playing around with spark coils and transformers, sending dots and dashes into the air to be picked up by others. Kraft was fascinated by wireless.

After the end of the first world war, the amateurs began experimenting further, with a thing called "radio telephone." By 1919, Vincent Kraft had opened a radio store in downtown Seattle to cater to the needs of this new breed of hobbyist.

Several years earlier, William Dubilier, later manufacturer of the Dubilier condenser, had put a radio telephone on the air from the Maritime Building.

Tinkerers had a field day. Before long they would be wrapping coils of wire around a cereal or salt box and adding crystals and earphones.

When voices could be transmitted, amateurs sat up into the wee hours to swap shoptalk. Then some got the idea of playing phonograph records. It was a pleasant diversion.

By about 1920, the Radio Commission (later to become the Federal Communications Commission) decided to outlaw music on amateurs stations.

Radio buffs were given the choice of limiting themselves to conversation, and retaining and retaining "ham" call letters, or going ahead as 100% entertainment mediums.

Kraft wanted to broadcast. He relinquished his 7XC license and received a spanking new one--KJR. His "broadcasting" station was in his basement.

Kraft was a "Santa Claus" at the outset. There was no advertising, just music to entertain the radio buffs. Then American Telephone & Telegraph Co. of New York got the idea of sponsoring programs and "charging for the time".

Commercialism had reared its head. Soon an official of a local music store went to Kraft with a proposition. He would provide "all the records you can use, if you mention our place on your station."

Shortly after Kraft began KJR, the Seattle Post-Intelligencer established KFC. Soon there was a third station, KFOA, run by Rhodes Department Store. This station later became KOL.

Radio KTW, often written about as Seattle's first radio station, actually was the fourth, Kraft says. It was begun by J. D. Ross, the head of Seattle City light, to provide an outlet for Seattle pastor, the fiery and controversial Rev. Mark A. Matthews of the First Presbyterian Church.

Radio was not what you could call highly competitive at the outset. Kraft says all local broadcasting station licensees operated on the same "meter length". There were no kilocycles yet. Hence, no two broadcasters could transmit at the same time.

"Seattle Radio" continued

"We'd hold a meeting of the broadcasters and divide up the time," Kraft says. "Mostly it was, you take Wednesday and Thursday evening and I'll take Monday and Tuesday. Radio wasn't an all-day thing. Housewives couldn't operate the sets, we figured."

Eventually the government, sensing the birth of a powerful new communications system, declared that transmitting stations would be divided up into two groups, Class A and Class B.

Class B stations were the "really good ones." But they could no longer rely on phonograph music. Everything had to be live talent.

As broadcasting became better, so did radio sets. Wires wrapped around boxes and bedspring aerials were discarded in favor of component radio sets. If you think a stereo buff is gone on components, you should have seen those old radio sets.

They had huge tuners, with single dials at first and then plastered with dials. Headphones were replaced by speakers, and the really high class radio buff had a big horn mounted on a separate stand. Wired to the boxes and speakers from under the table were the A battery to light the filaments and the B battery (90 to 100 volts) to provide power for the speaker.

KJR got along nicely with a then powerful 50 watts until Kraft made a deal with the Post-Intelligencer to sponsor live music four or five nights a week for several hours. He moved his transmitter atop the Terminal Sales Building and boosted it to 1,000 watts.

Almost immediately, the Seattle Times made a similar deal with KFOA. Kraft recalls. The "live" music era was good. Fine local dance bands and orchestras were featured. Among the best, Kraft says, were Henry Damski's Imperial Orchestra, Herbert Preeg's Concert Orchestra and, "live from the Butler Hotel," Victor A. Meyers and his orchestra.

In addition, broadcasters provided lectures and readings.

As Kraft remembers, it was 1925 or 1926 that "we broke into kilocycles" and didn't have to worry anymore about dividing up the time slots.

By 1925, many in the nation heard--through the squeaks and howls--President Coolidge's inaugural address. Two years later, the Rose Bowl football game was broadcast on the first transcontinental hookup.

Radio grew, and Kraft grew with it. He built and sold radio stations, his last (KXA) in 1946.

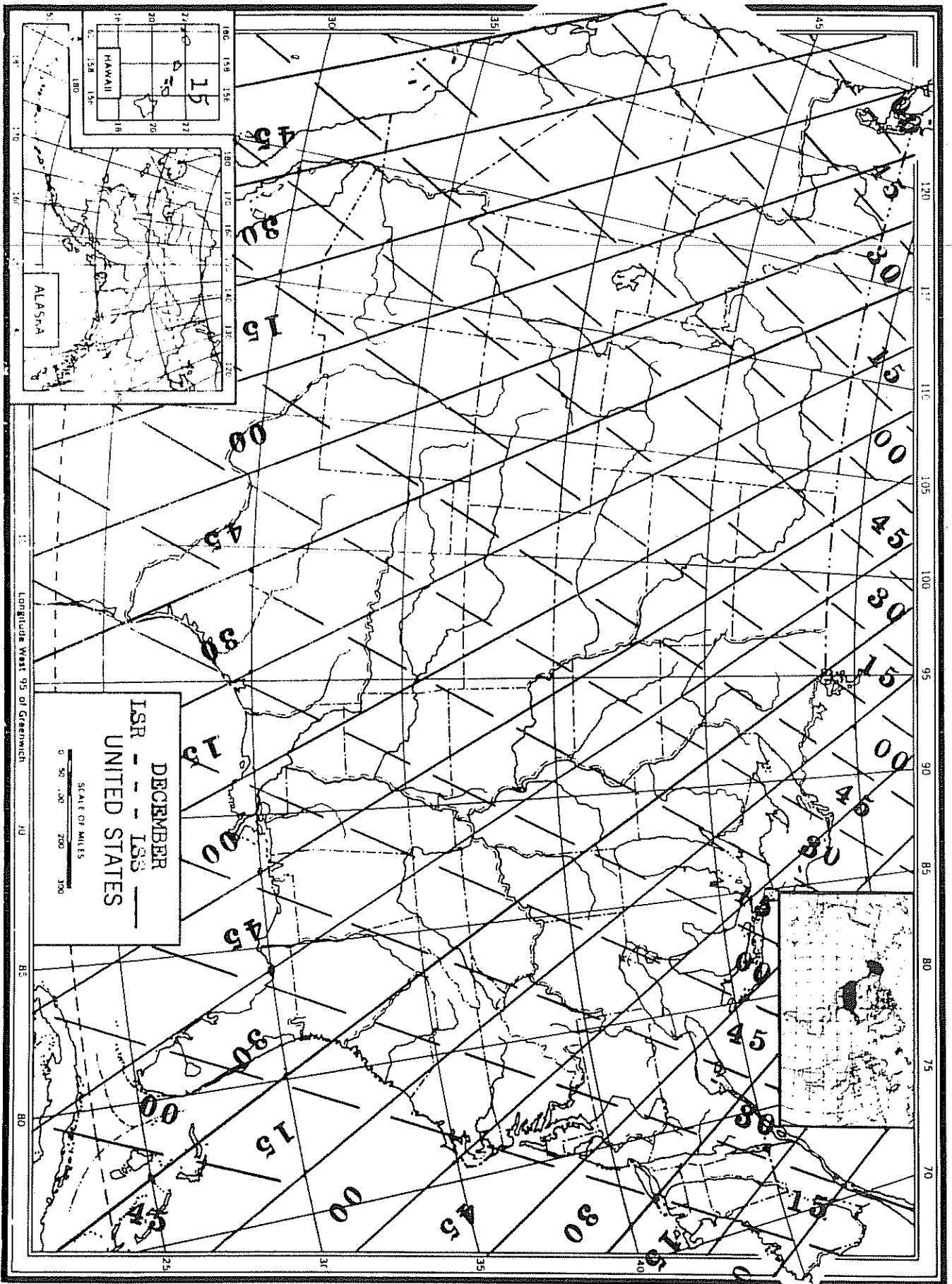
That's about it--one of man's great inventions and how it came to Seattle. Only yesterday.

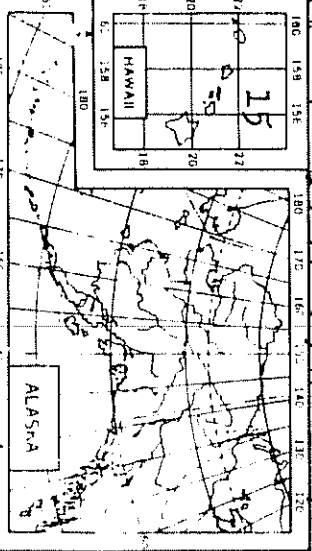
