With some stations these days discouraged at the poor showing in quantity of reports, it is important that as many listen and report these DX programs as possible. KFXM TRANSMITTER SITE GUTTED BY ARSON (Riverside PRESS, 11-21-68) A deliberately set fire destroyed "all the transmitting equipment" and knocked the station off the air on the morning of Nov. 21, Thursday. The fire, which was set between 3 am and 4 am, PST, was determined to be arson; damage is estimated at \$100,000. KFXM and sister station KDUO (FM) are the present targets of a strike by AFTRA and have been since 10-25. The station's programming is presently done by a new set of announcers, calling themselves the "Jones Boys". While the newspaper article indicates KFXM will be off the air for some time to come, transmitting was apparently resumed within 12 hours and they remain all-night without hints of decreasing their NSP sked. The power of the tx being used is not known but the signal appears somewhat weaker in Riverside. It might be a good bet to watch the frequency in the mornings in case they should leave for transmitter repair; this should provide an exceptional opportunity since 590 has long been occupied by a consistently NSP signal of KFXM which is heard throughout the west. -Don Erickson

Much confusion could conceivably be eliminated by sending a follow-up letter to the CE a few days before the scheduled test to refresh his memory. Concerning my financial report which appeared in the 10/5 DXM: the report reflected the general condition of the club at the end of the fiscal year. Announcing the 1969 World Radio TV Handbook

The 1968 WRTH is now available to IRCA members at the usual discount. This volume is probably the single most valuable reference for the foreign DXer, whether on BCB, SW, FM or TV. For the BCB listener, the WRTH lists all stations by country, giving frequency, power -- and the most unique feature -- the address for sending reception reports. Other interesting information includes whether the station verifies by letter or QSL card, whether or not tape recordings are accepted, and future power increases. The slogans for Latin American and other foreign stations are given, of course, and often the name of the person to whom reception reports might be addressed as well. If the 1969 edition is similar to the 1968, other features will include a world time conversion chart and maps by continent. The operating schedules for many stations are listed, as well as BCB and shortwave parallel frequencies. Although relatively little data is included on United States MW stations, this publication is an absolute must for the foreign DXer. A summer supplement will be published in June of 1969. Prices are listed below.

Other World Publications, 1969

Many other useful publications for the BCB DXer are offered to IRCA members at a special discount. The Medium Wave Guide is an excellent listing of BCB stations in North America and the rest of the world, by continent by frequency. North American stations are also listed alphabetically by call letters and by city. Slogans are given for the foreign stations listed. (Note that the WRTH does not list foreign stations by frequency, but rather by country). The North American section will be prepared by the NRC this year so should be very accurate. The Guide is compact and well worth the money.

The World Radio Bulletin lists unusual receptions and changes in station data, primarily of shortwave stations, and is published twice a month in Denmark.

All publications are published in Denmark and will be available in December, except as noted.

I am very pleased that I have been asked to take over as DXWW Editor. It is gratifying to know that, in the brief time I have been a member of IRCA, that I have made a good enough impression to warrant this position. I hope that I can do justice to it. To fill you in on my background, I am 34, a Catholic priest, teacher of Physics and Math at Villanova Prep School, a small (160) boys boarding school 80 miles NW of Los Angeles. I started DXing SW about two years ago, but gradually shifted over to BCB until now I devote time almost exclusively to BCB. Since I live on campus and prefect in one of the dorms, most of my DXing is done after the majority of the kids have hit the rack. My equipment includes a HQ100A, Ampex 1050 and Concertone 801 recorders, 70' long-wire and 3' loop (with NRC FET pre-amp) antennas.

In the November 9 issue, Hank Ward raised the question of whether a separate foreign section was needed. He suggested reporting all DX, foreign and domestic, simply to three Roundups, divided by time zones. I would disagree with this idea, not just because I now am Foreign Editor, but because I feel that there is a real need for a separate section. Lynn Brooks gave some reasons in that issue why he felt a foreign editor was needed. To this, I would add the following idea. For most DXers, foreign DX is only a small portion of the total DX received. If these catches were simply thrown in with all others in common Roundups, they would easily be overlooked. In trying at some later date to identify a foreign station, I would much prefer to search through a relatively small list of exclusively foreign stations than wade through many domestic reports, possibly from all three Roundups in each issue, trying to sift out what might be useful to me. Convenience is one of the major reasons why I favor separate foreign sections.

Hank's objection, however, raises two interesting points which I will attempt as features of DXWW. First, if sufficient reports are received, foreign DX will be broken down by time zone of the DXers reporting. This will give DXers a better idea of what sort of foreign DX he might expect to capture. Secondly, I will attempt to make up a list of domestic stations broadcasting in languages other than English. To my knowledge, no such list has been published by any radio club. This list could help eliminate some of the mistakes in IDing.

The deadline for DXWW will be Saturday before publication. Please list your catches by frequency, following the same basic format as before. Leave a double space between items, and put your name after each item. Also, once in a while, indicate what type of receiver, antenna, and other equipment you are using. Along with your reports, please list all stations that you know of which broadcast in languages other than English, and the schedule of non-English transmission, if known.

You should be able to get your reports to me by phone practically any time of day or night. After the school switchboard closes at 4:30 PM PST, we have a tape recorder on which you'll have an opportunity to leave a message (after listening to a pre-recorded message). If you do leave messages this way, please indicate that they are for me--otherwise the school secretary won't know what to make of these calls. If you wish to speak to me personally in the evenings, you might try calling the phone in the dorm where I live, between 7 and 9 PM PST.

The work that Randy Seaver did as editor of this column certainly will be hard to emulate. In my mind, DXWW has been one of the outstanding features of DX Monitor. I know that it will be a long time before I can equal the output of good solid DX information which he put out. I will attempt to maintain such features as tips on what to expect on certain frequencies but the success of such features depends on your co-operation. My lack of experience demands that you send an ample supply of reports to keep me informed on present conditions. At the present time, I would appreciate reports of all foreign DX, even the most common garden variety, so that I'll become familiar with what might be expected. Later on, I'll try to print a log of the most common foreign catches, so that a newcomer to foreign DXing will have an idea of what to start with.

#### Verifications for Free Czech Radio -- C.M. Stanbury II

By October 10, R. Prague's SW transmissions had returned to normal and therefore, as Free Czech Radio had reportedly been operated by regular Czech personnel, I wrote to R. Prague's NA service, reporting reception on 7345 kc on August 25 and 701 kc on Nov. 1, asking for the locations of these stations as well as confirming my receptions. In reply I have received two standard R. Prague QSL cards. The one for the SW reception lists the correct date and frequency. Unfortunately, the other, for that much rarer MW reception, is of dubious validity. It does confirm reception of a Czech MW station on 11/1 but the frequency listed is 638 kc. This could be an accidental error on the part of the verie signer, (however, in view of those extraordinary circumstances surrounding the transmission this seems unlikely) or it may be the signers way of indicating that the station normally on 638 (Prague) was the one heard. FCR transmissions reportedly interchanged frequencies and locations regularly to avoid detection. There's no way of knowing for certain that this "interpretation" of Mr. Kucera's QSL is the correct one. Basically it comes down to the old but still important (DXwise) question--what invalidates a QSL under what circumstances? Whatever the answer (or answers), it seems that QSLs can presently be obtained for FCR from R. Prague.
