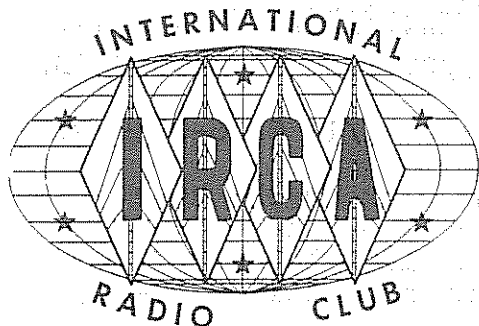

I am, needless to say, against Hank Ward's suggestion that we drop DXWW. For one thing, this would accomplish essentially the same thing that the now discredited merger proposal was supposed to - put all meaningful foreign coverage under the control of one man or, at best, one small group of DXers. I believe it is clear that a majority of IRCAnS oppose such a scheme and should IRCAnS be deprived of an alternate to the NRC's international approach, a third club would simply appear on the Medium Wave Scene. TIP! Last-minute word from Larry Godwin includes tip that Venezuela stations are expected to be AN with election returns on MM 12/2, as elections are customarily held the 1st Sunday of December every 5 years. Larry mentions having heard commercials for the elections on YVNA-660. He adds that in 1958 and 1963 many YV's were heard on clear channels with special broadcasts. Many stns are in parallel with Radio Continente in Caracas. You might also watch for Colombian stns with the broadcasts. This "once-every-five-years tip" will be too late for many of you but if this bulletin goes out a bit early, some of you will have a chance. Checking the latest DXM and DXN as this is typed (11-26-68), there is no mention of this topic. If auroral conditions hold over until then, there could be the potential for a lot of new catches.

Please try to follow the format established by the particular editors you report to; it will make their jobs easier. 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I kind of got off on the wrong foot last week. I used the wrong size stencils and DEE told me he had to retype at least one page. I've got the proper size now so everything should go smoothly, I hope.

It was somewhat disappointing to note that less than 16 IRCans signed up for the foreign contest and that only two out of the entire combined membership of NRC and IRCA signed up for the Singleton-Eliminator contest. Perhaps some felt that they didn't stand a chance against the real pros and consequently didn't bother to enter. To my mind, contests serve two purposes. They engender competition and consequently interest in one aspect of DXing. Secondly (and to me more importantly) they are one of the best ways of rating yourself as a DXer. Personally, I know that with my equipment and inexperience I don't stand much of a chance of winning a contest. However, I am interested in comparing my ability as a DXer with what it was last year. If you make the effort to try and catch the difficult DX, you might only wind up eighth or ninth in the contest, but perhaps you were tenth last year. You've improved. (Remember, too, that it becomes harder for the pros--they can't use stations already logged in previous years.) If you are consistent in trying to log the hard ones, sooner or later your patience will pay off. Try to devote at least one Monday morning a month to foreign DX and see what happens. Don Reynolds had indicated that the S-E contest will be resumed if a sufficient number sign up; perhaps Ed Krejny will do the same. Let's keep these contests going!

Remember to send in your list of domestic stations broadcasting in languages other than English, so that a master list can be compiled. Include schedules of non-English broadcasts if possible.
