Comment

To continue the debate started by Hank Ward on the necessity of a separate DXWW section: I don't think it is fair to judge the support of club members for DXWW on the basis of the 11/30 issue, my first as editor. Marc deLorenzo also had only 3 contributors for his first issue as editor of ECDXR. Now that people have gotten used to me as DXWW Editor, let's look at some statistics, just for Listeners' Logs and for the three Roundup sections. (I have eliminated the Forum sections from consideration in these statistics, because there really is nothing that corresponds to it in DXWW.)

There were 65 contributors in all, of which 12 contributed to both domestic and foreign sections. 60, or 92% contributed to domestic Roundups, 17, or 26%, gave to DXWW, and 12, or 18%, contributed to both. The inference to be drawn from this is that, although almost all contributing IRCA members are domestic DXers (because this is the vast majority of the DX we catch), still one fourth of contributors do support DXWW. I might seem to be somewhat defensive in making the above comment (as DXWW Editor, I think I should be), but I feel that a considerable number of members do support DXWW, enough to justify its existence. Your comments, please.

The news yesterday included the item that Brazilian president Arthur da Costa e Silva had clamped down in securing his dictatorial powers. Military censors were sent into all newspaper offices and radio stations. The president was angered by congressional defiance of the country's armed forces, whose backing is considered vital to his government. Tom Hartloff sent the following item from the Nyack, N.Y. newspaper via AP, abbreviated here:

Brazil's lowest-rated radio program, officially known as the "Voice of Brazil," is broadcast for an hour every night on every radio station in the country. To most Brazilians it's known as the hour of silence. Some pride themselves on being able to turn off their set just before the first bar of the program's theme music, Carlos Gomes' "Guarani." The government, which produces the program in Brasilia and requires its broadcast by all commercial stations, considers the program a key factor in national integration. It's a kind of spoken official gazette which is supposed to bring the public up to date. The Jornal da Brasil said it was part of a government scheme to polish its public image. The paper linked the plan with creation of a public relations commission within the presidency to produce government news. The government has replied that it is only interested in "bringing to the public in a systematic fashion the basic news of the government's work." The program's coverage of Congress reflects opposition views as well as those of government supporters, but is presented in such a dull fashion that it does little to inspire faith or interest. Occasionally the program yields a bombshell. The government's decision to strip former President Juscelino Kubitschek of his political rights four years ago was announced on the program, as was the abolition of the so-called "broad front" of opposition earlier this year. Both were sandwiched in between routine announcements.

Frequency and Callsign Allocations in the Americas-Ronald F. Schatz- continuation
Chile--Under the deep-SA treaty, Chile is assigned the following international frequencies: 570, 660, 760, 1140, and 1380 khz. The first letter of the IP is C, followed by a regional sign: CA, for "Norte" or the area north of the Santiago area; CB, for "Centro," or the immediate vicinity of Santiago, Valparaiso and Vina del Mar; CC for "Sur" south of Santiago to the CD, or "Antartida" or southern half of Chile. The callsign is composed of IP plus frequency in 10 khz; e.g., CB114 is on 1140 khz. A letter is added if two stations in the same region share the same frequency; CD 135 and CD135B.
