There is no actual proof of reception except to the person(s) hearing the station. A tape can be faked just as easily as a written verie. But I don't think there are any members in IRCA or NRC that would even consider faking any type of verie. I do agree that the imagination can get carried away, however, as it has happened to me several times. But I do not think that a screening committee for heard totals would be the answer (freak receptions do happen often and may not be believed). But I don't have any answer, either. All we could do is listen carefully and believe each other's word. Incidentally, Dan Myers and I visited WWCA-1270 Gary, Ind. last weekend and asked the CE for coverage maps. He said he didn't have any, but gave us each two v/q's. I've never heard WWCA but I have two veries from it. And some people say a verie proves reception? Peace.

PERCY R. KESTEVEN - 13112 134th St. - Edmonton 44, Alberta, Canada

I recently completed the BCB Antenna Tuner featured in the March '68 issue of Pop. Electronics. The effectiveness of this unit varies with the particular type of antenna and receiver used. I have a Lafayette KT-340 & 150' LW. Signals were boosted 4 S-units on 540, this amount diminishing until 900. Then no change until about 1450 when a small gain, increasing to about 1 S-unit was noted at 1600. The fixed capacitor C3 I eliminated as it completely killed all but local signals thruout the dial. Seemed okay on SW (oops!) but I don't DX SW. I made a mistake in tapping the coil & only have 11 leads but this doesn't seem to make much difference--most stations are improved by setting S1 on either the first or last tap (2 or 112). I put in a DPDT switch to cut out the tuner. Usually I tune a stn, then put the tuner on to see if reception would be improved. You will have problems cutting out the tuner unless you ground L1--write me and I'll give you the DPDT wiring as it is a little tricky if you're a novice builder. Altogether a worthwhile project!
