KLAC-570 Los Angeles 5kw has been struck by its audio engineers; regular announcers and DJs are honoring the picket lines. KLAC was noted off last MM, 4/14, one of the rare times this NSPer has been off. 570 might bear watching in So. Calif. if they remain off MMs though KVI-Seattle and KLUB-Salt Lake City are both AN MM. This from 4/10/69 Wall Street Journal. -DEE

KFBK-1530 Sacramento, Calif. 50kw, normally AN exc. MM 0400-0800, was off daily as of last check; however station mentions as part of s/off ann. nightly their intention of returning to 24-hour sked in the near future; get in on 1530 DX while the getting is still good. Maritimes

There are quite a few stations in Canada's Eastern-most provinces -- Newfoundland, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island. However, only a few choice stations will be picked from these provinces - the ones that have the best chance of getting out.

All powers are in kilowatts. Asterisks indicate that the station is a CBC station, either by affiliation or ownership.

- 540 CBT Grand Falls - 10 ND-U \* - QRA is High St. & Mill Road.
- 550 CFNB Fredricton - 50 DA-2 - ID's as R. Atlantic. Regular to Great Lakes area w/WGR eves and WKRC/CMAN morns; best about 0000. Plays cw and rr depending on time of day. Sends v/q.
- 590 VOUM St. John's - 10 DA-N - Format is mor. QRA is Box 1-590.
- 680 CJCN Grand Falls - 10 DA-2 - NSP. //CJOX-710//CJON-930.
- 920 CJCH Halifax - 10d 5n DA-N - NSP. Heard w/WOKY after CKCY s/off in Great Lakes and dominates MM's in MW. Nx @ :55.
- 1070 CBA Sackville - 50 ND-U \* - //CBH-860. Best @ MM s/on @ 0500 on WC w/KNX off. Only QRM is CFAX. Great in Great Lakes evenings. QRA is Box 3000, Halifax. Sends stan. CBC v/q.
- 1150 CHSJ Saint John - 10d 5n DA-2 - was hrd in Great Lakes before CJRC(NSP'er) came on. Format is rr and sends v/q.
- 1220 CKCW Moncton - 10 DA-N - always good @ SM s/on 0627 to WGAR 0715 s/on in Great Lakes. QRA is Gordon St. Sends fast v/q.

Time Zones: Atlantic Standard Time (EST + 1 hr.) is observed in New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and the following places in Quebec - Gaspé Peninsula(dividing line is from Cabano to Rivière du Loup(both on AST)) ; all points east of 68° Long.

Newfoundland Standard Time (EST + 1½ hrs.) is observed in Labrador, St. Pierre et Miquelon, Langlade, and, of course, Newfoundland.

All points observe DST with the exception of St. Pierre et Miquelon Langlade. NST becomes DST 24 hours local time after the rest of the continent. Change from DST to Standard Time is also a day late.

Some recent changes for those who use the Canadian postal system:

- 1) those who mail material to Canada - there is no longer Saturday delivery to homes. The PO is open for essential services and has one delivery to the Post Office Boxes.
- 2) those who use return postage for reception reports to Canada - rates look as follows, as of November 1st, 1968:
  - FIRST CLASS - First oz. is 6¢; each ounce after is 4¢
  - AIR MAIL - (to U.S. only) Each ounce is 10¢
  - THIRD CLASS - First 2 oz. is 5¢; each 2 oz. after (up to and including 16 oz.) is 3¢.

N.B. - tapes, unless blank, must be sent FIRST CLASS. There is no fourth class, educational rate in Canada. If tape is blank, it is subject to duty, as is anything of value. Third class, printed matter becomes parcel post after 16 oz. Between 16 and 32 oz. cost 65¢ parcel post. ## Deep South American Sunrise Reception

The DX season isn't over yet! For those of us west of the Mississippi, our late spring and early summer can be a good time to hear stations in Chile, Argentina and other South American countries south of the equator.

Sunrise reception of these distant catches is possible because of the long nights south of the equator this time of the year, and the fact that stations east of the Mississippi fade out around 0500-0530 EST, leaving many frequencies clear. The dates to watch are approximately April 15 to the end of July, with the best reception occurring between May 15 and June 15, probably. The best times are 0500-0630 EST (although DST is in effect), and as an added bonus, between 0600-0700 you may hear some DX from South Pacific on these same clear channels.

Following is a list of the best bets for sunrise DSA reception. Some of them (like CB76) have been heard every year since 1962; others are pretty rare. But all are good catches, and provide some interesting experiences after the so-called DX season has passed.

If you do hear some of these stations, or others in DSA or in the Australia/New Zealand area, send your tips to Father Jack!

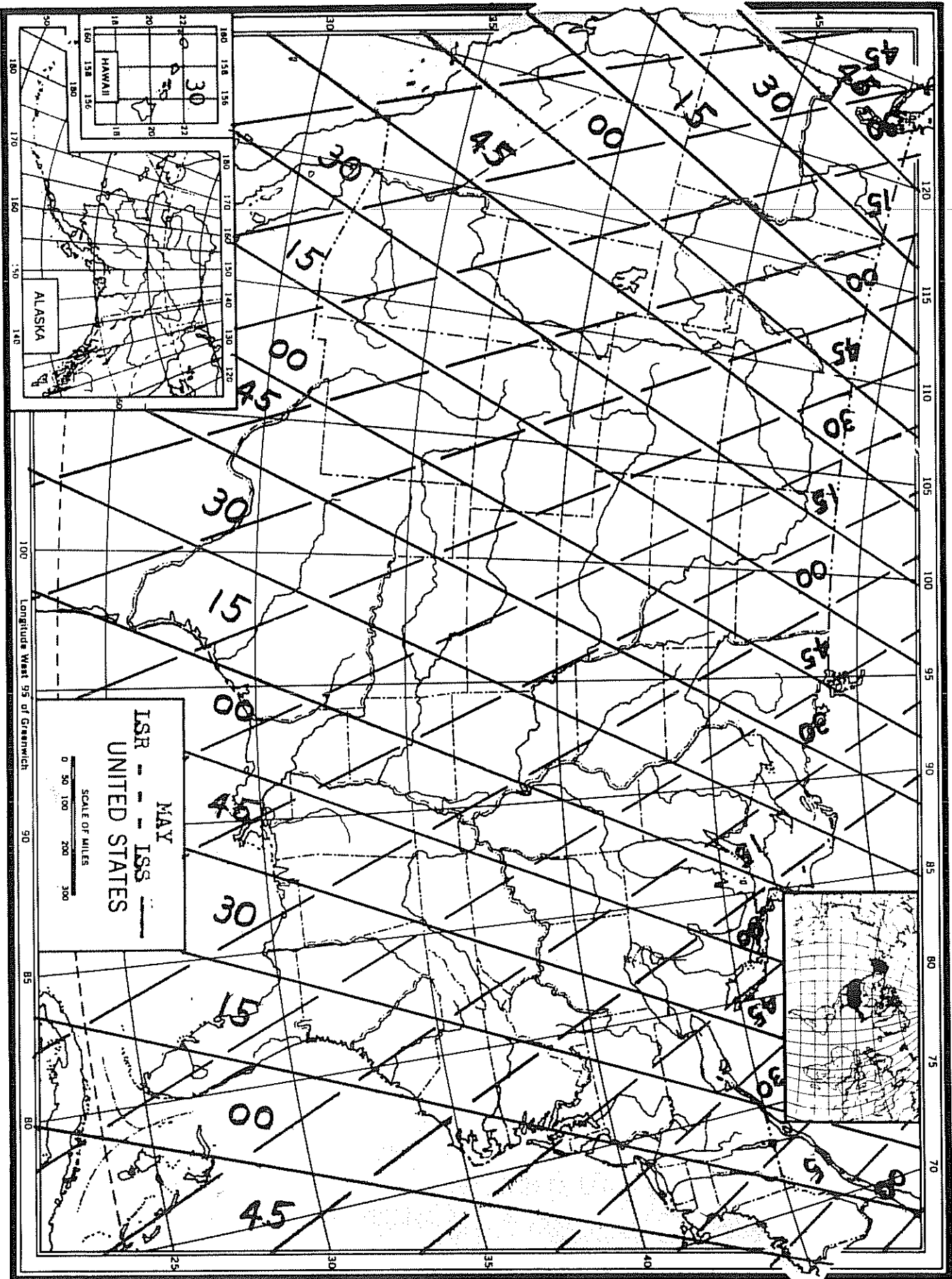

World Radio TV Handbook-1969 I finally received my copy by what must have been the slowest rowboat in the Danish fleet. I presume that everyone who had their copy sent by surface mail finally has received the current issue. This, of course, is the reference book for DXers. The Arctic Radio Club has compiled the medium wave station lists for the world; the NRC has contributed the lists for North America. IRCA has its ad on page 198.

BBC Domestic Services in Europe—information sent out by BBC, relayed by Angel Garcia  
Radio 1 is broadcast on 247 meters medium wave (1214 kHz) and provides a program of "pop" and popular music from 0530 to 1930 and 2200 to 0200 GET (2330-1330 and 1600-2000 EST) Between 1330 and 1600 EST Radio 1 normally radiates the same programmes as Radio 2.

Radio 2, the Light Programme, is broadcast on 1500 metres long wave (200 kHz) and VHF. Its programmes consist mainly of light music and light entertainment.

Radio 3 consists of the Third Programme, the Music Programme, Study Session and the Sports Service. Of these, the Third Programme occupies the main evening period (in England) and is designed for the serious listener to drama, music, and talks on current events and the arts. The Music Programme occupies most of the remainder of the day and is devoted to good music. Study Session is an educational service broadcast on weekdays between 1230 and 1330 EST. Radio 3 is broadcast on 464 metres, medium wave, (647 kHz) and on VHF.

Radio 4, the Home Service, which is broadcast on medium waves and VHF, contains a wide variety of types of programmes, but above all it is the network which gives comprehensive coverage to news and comment on the news. Radio 4 provides a basic national pattern, but this is varied by each of the three national regions, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland, and the three English regions, the North, the Midlands, and the South and West. The frequencies of the main Radio 4 station in London and the regions are as follows:

Of all these BBC Domestic Services, the one which can be heard best in Europe is Radio 2 on long waves, 1500 metres. Radio 3 on medium waves 464 meters can often also be heard quite well. Some of the Radio 4 stations are swamped by other stations on the same wavelengths in parts of Europe, but reception is sometimes possible, particularly on 1088, 1151, 1052, and 1340 kHz. Radio 1, on 247 metres, can usually be heard in Europe only late at night.

Brazil Emissora de Educacao Rural in Natal has received authorization to increase MW outlet on 1090 kHz to 5 kw. WRTH lists power as 10kw already. (World Radio Bulletin)

Botswana A new 1 kw transmitter will replace the old 2 kw transmitter on 971 kHz, which presently gives poor modulation. Five 1 kw transmitters are planned on MW for the major population centres. (World Radio Bulletin)

Congo According to the BBC World Radio Club, the RTVC is operating a new station at Pointe Noire on 1475 kHz, so Brazzaville is possibly still on 1484 kHz. (World Radio Bulletin)

Lesotho Radio Lesotho has been testing a news transmitter on 899 kHz irregularly at 0100, 0200, or 0300-0500 and beyond, EST. Mostly tapes in English used for the Commercial Service nearly a year ago. This transmitter is more powerful than the one used previously (WRB)

Swaziland Radio Swaziland on 881 KHz now broadcasts from 2330-0100, 0530-0630, 1030-1430 during the school term, from Monday to Friday. (WRB)

Mozambique "RCM," "A Voz de Mocambique" is on 1223 kHz in parallel with 1184.5 kHz from 0000-0200, Mon-Sat., and 0430-0700 Mon-Fri. (WRB)

Philippines- DXJO, Jolo, on the island of Mindanao, has been on 1460 kHz with 1 kw since October. The station is supposed to serve the southern Philippines and Sabah. (WRB)
